CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- The 30-year-old catcher has played in the Majors for six seasons with the Dodgers (2011-14), Cubs (2016) and Giants (2017)...has posted a career .196 (57x291) average with 13 doubles, seven homers, 28 RBI and a .558 OPS (.245 OBP/.313 SLG) in 119 Major League games.
- Has caught 94 games, 74 which were starts...has thrown out 34.3 percent of would be base stealers, with 23 CS in 67 attempts.
- Played in a career-high 56 games, including 38 starts at catcher, with the Dodgers in 2013...batted .231 with eight doubles, four homers and 16 RBI...threw out 10 would be base stealers in 34 attempts (29.4 CS%).
- Has batted .291 (804x2765) with 203 doubles, 87 homers, 443 RBI and an .816 OPS (.356 OBP/.461) in 749 career minor league games.
- Was named a mid-season and post-season PCL All-Star in 2012 with Triple A Albuquerque...batted .294 (121x412) with 34 doubles, 11 homers, and a career-high 76 RBI in 115 games.
- Was named a post-season South Atlantic League All-Star in 2009 with Class A Greenville...batted .345 (78x226) with 19 doubles, 10 homers and 34 RBI in 55 games...was also named by *Baseball America* as the Best Defensive Catcher in the Red Sox farm system following the campaign.



NOTES

- Hit .319 with 21 home runs and 125 RBI over his three-year career (2006-08) at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill... ranks sixth all-time at UNC in doubles (57) and ninth in RBI...reached the College Baseball World Series finals twice in his collegiate career (2006 and 2007) but fell both times to Oregon State.
- Was a 2006 Freshman All-American and was named to the 2006 All-College World Series team.
- Was a member of the U.S. National team that won the 2006 FISU World Championship in Havana, Cuba
- Was drafted out of UNC by Boston in the seventh round of the June 2008 draft... signed by Red Sox scout Quincy Boyd.
- Signed with the Astros as a minor league free agent with an invite to Spring Training on Dec. 11, 2017...is signed through the 2018 season.

2017: The veteran backstop had two separate stints with San Francisco, hitting .231 (3x3) with two homers and three RBI in 13 games (one start)...had his contract purchased from Triple A Sacramento on April 11, taking the roster spot of Buster Posey who was placed on the seven-day DL with concussion symptoms...was designated for assignment on April 18 when Posey came off the DL...had his contract purchased from Triple A Sacramento on Sept. 1...hit .300 (85-for-283) with 19 doubles, nine home runs and 43 RBI in 77 games for triple-A Sacramento.

2016: Had two stints with the Cubs, April 28-June 17 and from September 6 through the end of the season...went 6-for-31 (.194) with two doubles, three runs scored and three RBI in 17 games with Chicago...also appeared in 65 games with Triple A Iowa...batted .293 with 12 doubles, eight homers and 39 RBI in 65 games with Triple A Iowa...recorded a 13-game hitting streak with Iowa, April 21-July 9 (with major league call-up in the middle), in which he batted .432 (19x44) with six doubles and 10 RBI.

2015: Underwent surgery to repair a complete tear of the lateral meniscus in his right knee on March 13 at Scripps Clinic in La Jolla, Calif...played in a combined 27 rehab games with Class A Fort Wayne and Triple A El Paso, batting .202 (19x94) with four homers and nine RBI...was traded from the Dodgers to the Padres with outfielder Matt Kemp and cash considerations for right-handed pitchers Zach Eflin and Joe Wieland and catcher Yasmani Grandal on December

18, 2014.

2014: Spent the majority of the season with Triple A Albuquerque, hitting .328 with 26 doubles, 14 home runs and 48 RBI in 78 games...also saw time with the Major League club, playing in 23 games for the Dodgers, batting .113 (8x71) with three doubles, one home run and five RBI...optioned to Albuquerque on March 21 during Spring Training, beginning the season with the Isotopes before being recalled on April 8 (after A.J. Ellis had right knee surgery)...optioned back to Albuquerque on April 30 (in order to clear a spot for C Miguel Olivo).

2013: Spent the majority of the season with the big league club after making his first career Opening Day roster, batting .231 (37x160) with eight doubles, a career-high four home runs and 16 RBI in 56 games...hit his first career big league HR on June 1 at Colorado off Jhoulys Chacin in the third inning...made the Dodgers' roster for the National League Division and Championship series but did not play in any games...in 21 games with Albuquerque hit .418 with eight HRs, 25 RBI, a .500 OBP and a .848 SLG...named the Pacific Coast League Player of the Week for April 29-May 5.

2012: With Triple A Albuquerque, hit .294 with a team-high 34 doubles, 11 home runs and a career-high 76 RBI in 115 games, garnering Pacific Coast League mid-season All-Star honors...appeared in just three big league games with the Dodgers, going 1-for-3...started behind the plate for the PCL in the Triple A All-Star Game...before the All-Star break, hit .301 with 21 doubles, seven homers and 48 RBI for the Isotopes...led the entire PCL with a 39% caught-stealing percentage.

2011: Played in 90 games for Double A Portland in the Red Sox system before being acquired by the Dodgers, July 31, with pitchers Stephen Fife and Juan Rodriguez for outfielder Trayvon Robinson...combined to hit .287 with 27 doubles, 14 home runs and 69 RBI between Portland and Triple A Albuquerque, including a .325 batting average in 25 games with Albuquerque following the trade...recalled by the Dodgers on September 6 for his first call-up and made his debut as a pinch-hitter, September 11 at San Francisco, striking out...made his first Major League start, September 15 vs. Pittsburgh, going 1-for-2 with a single off of Ross Ohlendorf for his first career hit...named by *Baseball America* as the Dodgers' best defensive catcher after the season.

MINOR LEAGUES:

2010: Spent the entire season with Class A Salem, hitting .251 with four home runs and 61 RBI in 109 games... finished third in the Carolina League and fifth overall in Boston's farm system with 34 doubles...named the best defensive catcher in the Red Sox system by *Baseball America* following the season...**2009:** Split season between Class A Greenville and Class A Salem, leading all Red Sox farmhands with a combined .305 average while hitting 14 homers and collecting 58 RBI...earned a promotion to Salem after leading the South Atlantic League with a .345 average and 10 home runs in the league's first half with Greenville, earning mid-season South Atlantic League All-Star honors...named South Atlantic League Player of the Week for June 15-21, hitting .529 during that span...after the season, named best defensive catcher in the Red Sox farm system by *Baseball America*...**2008:** Made his professional debut with Class A Lowell after signing as a seventh-round selection of the Red Sox in the First-Year Player Draft...batted .244 (31x127) with one homer, 15 RBI and 10 stolen bases in 36 games...tossed out attempted base stealers at a 41 percent rate.
