**RAY MATTER**—The Rays are 5-1 in their last 6 games and 14-3 in their last 17 games to improve to a season-high-tying 12 games under .500 (also 75-63 at the end of play on Tues at TOR)...they have outscored opponents, 93-49, over this 17-game stretch...with a win tonight, they would improve to 13 games over for the first time since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71...in the first three seasons under Manager **Kevin Cash** (2015-17), their high-water mark was 10 games over .500, at 40-30 in June 2015.

- + Last night the Rays scored 14 runs, their 2nd-highest total this season behind a club-record-tying 19 runs on July 14 at MIN, and their most in a home game since June 23, 2017 vs. BAL (15)...the Rays drew 11 BB, their most since May 2, 2017 at MIA (11) and one shy of tying the club record (12, June 19, 2010 at FLA, 11 innings).
- + 15 of the club's remaining 22 games this season are at home.
- + The Rays are 27-17 (.614) since the All-Star break, 4th-best winning pct. in the majors behind the A's, Red Sox and Cardinals.

**DOME SWEET DOME**—The Rays have won nine consecutive home games since Aug 9, their longest home winning streak since June 29–July 11, 2013 (9), tied for the 3rd-longest in club history and two shy of tying the club record...they have outscored opponents, 58-18, in these 9 games.

- + Since June 11, the Rays are 30-8 (.789) at home, the best home winning pct. in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (25-8, .758)...they were 12-16 (.429) at home before this stretch.
- + From Aug 20-26, the Rays swept a multi-series homestand for the first time in club history, going 7-0 against the Royals and Red Sox.
- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion eight times this season, tied for most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit four walk-off home runs, tied for most in the AL.
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 44 games at home: 33 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

**WHERE WE STAND**—Both the Rays and Athletics won last night, so the Rays remain 8 GB of the A's with 22 games remaining...the Rays did gain a game on the Mariners, who lost 4-0 to the Yankees...the Rays have a 1.4 pct. chance of making the postseason according to Baseball Prospectus, a 0.2 pct. chance according to FanGraphs and 0.1 pct. chance per ESPN.

- + The Rays are on pace for 88 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + It's worth noting that with 22 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were 77-63 and 7.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL's lone Wild Card...that season, the Rays passed the Red Sox on the final day.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be 0.5 GB in the NL East, 1.0 GB in the NL West and 3.5 GB in the AL Central.

**POWER SURGE**—Last night the Rays hit 4 HR, tying a season high (3rd time, last May 29 at OAK), and their most at home since Sep 15, 2017 at BOS (4, 15-inning game)...it was their most at home in a 9-inning game since June 9, 2017 vs. OAK (5)...the Rays have 6 HR in their last 2 games, matching their total from the previous 6 games...this is the first time they have hit multiple homers in back-to-back games since July 13-14 at MIN—the only time this season they did that in three straight is April 26-28.

- + Last night the home run accounted for 11 of 14 runs scored (solo, two 3-run, grand slam)...it was the second time in club history they hit at least 3 HR with 2 runner(s) or more on base, following July 20, 2003 vs. TEX (3)...the grand slam was the fourth hit by the Rays this season, first since **Daniel Robertson** on July 22 vs. MIA.
- + Last night **Nick Ciuffo** became the sixth player to hit his first career homer for the Rays this season, tied for most in the majors.

**RAYS vs. ORIOLES**—This weekend wraps up the season series between the Rays and Orioles, and the Rays are 9-8 so far (5-2 at home, 4-6 on the road)...the Rays have allowed 104 runs and 33 HR in the season series,

averages of 6.12 runs and 1.94 HR per game...the 33 HR ties their most allowed to any opponent in a season...the Rays are outscoring the Orioles, 40-20, in 7 games at home but were outscored, 84-51, and outscored, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue.

- + The Rays have lost by 9+ runs three times against the O's, and their margin of defeat has been 9+ runs once in their other 123 games.
- + Four times this season the Rays have allowed back-to-back homers to the Orioles, and they've done it twice against all other teams.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 43rd time the Rays will use an opener and fifth time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 75 of 140 games (53.6 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.34 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 41-35 with traditional starters and 35-29 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 57 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 48 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—55.5 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 557 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 693.2 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 51 apps of at least 50 pitches and 25 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 77 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 125 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1996 Pirates (126);
- + 61 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 40 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (40);
- + 28 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .257 avg. and 2nd in the AL with a .330 OBP...in the last 15 games, the Rays are averaging 6.00 runs, including 4 runs or more 13 times and 5 runs or more 10 times...they have recorded double-digit hits in 11 of their last 15 games.

- + **Mallex Smith** ranks 8th in the AL with a .301 avg. and is attempting to become the first qualifying Ray to hit .300 or better since **Casey Kotchman** (.306) in 2011...**Joey Wendle** leads ML rookies with a .296 avg. and is attempting to become the first Ray to lead rookie qualifiers in avg. ...**Rocco Baldelli's** club-rookie-record .289 avg. in 2003 led AL rookies but ranked 3rd among ML rookies.
- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 100 SB and 1st with a club-record 85 HBP...they are on pace for 98 HBP, which would rank 2nd in AL history behind the 2008 Indians (103).

**BY THE NUMBERS**—The Rays have used 53 different players this season, tied with 2017 for the club record...they have used 31 pitchers, 16 starting pitchers and 22 rookies, all club records...15 of the 31 players (48.8 pct) on the active roster are rookies, including nine of the 16 pitchers (56.3 pct.).

- + 23 different Rays pitchers have recorded a win this season, most in the majors and a single-season club record ahead of 2017 (20).
- + Only two of the club's last 22 games have been decided by 1 run, and none of the last 12 games (last Aug 23 vs. KC)...the Rays have played 52 1-run games (24-28), tied for most in the majors.

### TONIGHT'S START

- + Last pitched on Tues at TOR and retired all 6 BF, incl. 3 SO, on 23 pitches...on Sun at CLE, made his fourth start and was replaced after a 2nd-inning single.
- + Has pitched to a 4.26 ERA (6.1-IP, 3-ER) in 4 starts, with all of the runs scoring on a 3-run homer by **Johan Camargo** in the 1st inning on Aug 29 at ATL...has gone 1.2, 1.2, 2.0 and 1.0 IP in his first 4 starts, with 6, 7, 9 and 4 BF in those starts.
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.37 ERA (19-IP, 5-ER) in his last 13 apps (4 starts), including 11 scoreless outings, after allowing 9 runs in his previous 5 apps from July 15-29.
- + Has gone 1.1 IP or longer 14 times this season, and 2 IP or longer nine times...has thrown as many as 36 pitches, 2x-last Aug 29 at ATL (2 IP).
- + In his last 6 apps (4 starts) since Aug 19 at BOS, has thrown 11 pitches clocked at 100 mph or more...did this once in his first 29 apps this season.
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.1 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 101.3 mph in his start on Sun at CLE.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5...went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER), 4 saves, 32 SO and .167 opp avg. in 19 apps for the Bulls.
- + Is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (15)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

### SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inning...struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat and got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Neftalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

### 2017 SEASON

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept. ...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

### X-RAY REPORT

- + Diego is one of 10 children—and all of them are married...he has six brothers and three sisters.
- + Diego is known to cook for his teammates...he learned to cook as a 10-year-old by watching his mother in the kitchen...he once shared his special family recipe of chicken, rice and plantains in a November 2016 cooking video on the Rays Twitter account.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
