**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue their 42nd spring training with a Cactus League match-up tonight against the Chicago White Sox at Peoria Stadium...tonight's game is the 18th of a 32-game Cactus League schedule for the Mariners that concludes March 27 vs. the Colorado Rockies at Salt River Fields...the Mariners will open the 2018 season March 29 vs. Cleveland at Safeco Field.

**BRINGING VOGELBACH**...Daniel Vogelbach has reached base safely in 9 of his last 11 plate appearances, dating back to the 4th inning on March 7 vs. Oakland...he is 6-for-10 with 4 doubles, 1 home run and 3 walks during that span...Vogelbach went 1-for-3 with 1 walk yesterday vs. Cincinnati and is now batting .478 (11x23) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI and 7 walks in 10 games this spring...among Spring Training leaders, he ranks T5th in walks and T2nd in doubles.

**LAWRENCE OF THE BULLPEN**...Casey Lawrence has retired 12 of the last 13 batters he has faced, beginning with the 6th inning on March 1 vs. Kansas City...during this span (4.0 IP), he has retired 7 batters via strikeout and allowed only 1 hit...overall this spring, he has posted a 1.13 ERA (1 ER, 8.0 IP) while allowing 6 hits and 1 walk with 9 strikeouts in 4 relief appearances.

**THAT NAME SOUNDS FAMILIAR**...Mariners outfielder **Beau Amaral** is a minor league call-up for tonight's game...Beau is the son of former Mariners infielder/outfielder **Rich Amaral**, who appeared with the Mariners from 1991-98...Beau was selected by Cincinnati in the 7th round of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of UCLA...he signed with the Mariners on March 6.

**VS. THE WHITE SOX**...the Mariners and White Sox meet tonight in the second of 3 Cactus League match-ups this spring...Chicago won the first meeting between these two clubs, 5-3, on Feb. 24 in Peoria...Seattle will travel to Camelback Ranch on March 23...the two clubs will meet six times this season: April 23-25 in Chicago and July 20-22 in Seattle...the White Sox lead the all-time regular season series, 237-201.

**UNDER THE LIGHTS**...tonight marks the Mariners 6th of 12 night games this spring...Seattle is 2-3 in night games so far this spring...of the club's 16 home games, nine will start at 6:40 p.m., the most night games in Mariners Spring Training history...Seattle will also play three night games on the road for a total of 12 night games this spring...the additional night games are designed to prepare players for the routine of regular season start times.

**#EDGARHOF**...legendary Mariners designated hitter **Edgar Martinez** received 70.4% of the vote in the Class of 2018 Hall of Fame balloting...it marked Martinez's highest percentage in his nine years on the ballot...of the 422 votes cast by voters from the BBWAA, Edgar was included on 297 ballots...among the 28 players who have ever eclipsed 70 percent on the BBWAA ballot without gaining election that year, all 28 are Hall of Famers...Martinez, who is entering his 4th year, his 3rd full season, as the Mariners hitting coach, has one year of eligibility remaining on the BBWAA ballot.

**PIÑEIRO JOINS CAMP**...former Mariners right-hander **Joel Piñeiro** has arrived in camp to serve as a guest instructor for the next week...Piñeiro earned the win in his Major League debut with the Mariners on Aug. 8, 2000 at Chicago-AL, tossing 6.0 innings while allowing 2 runs and striking out 4...he is one of 13 pitchers in Mariners history to start in his MLB debut and earn the win...Piñeiro appeared in parts of 12 Major League seasons with the Mariners (2000-06), Red Sox (2007), Cardinals (2007-09) and Angels (2010-11).

**WELCOME BACK, ICHIRO**...the Mariners agreed to terms with free agent outfielder **Ichiro Suzuki** on Wednesday...Ichiro is the active Major League hits leader, ranking 22nd all-time in MLB history with 3,080 career hits...after amassing 1,278 hits during a 9-year career (1992-2000) with the Orix Blue Wave, Ichiro has totaled 4,358 between MLB and Japan...Ichiro has appeared in 17 Major League seasons with Seattle (2001-12), New York-AL (2012-14) and Miami (2015-17).

**ON THE AIR**...tonight's telecast on **ROOT SPORTS NW** will feature in-game interviews with bench coach **Manny Acta**, right-hander **Chasen Bradford** and right-hander **Art Warren**...**Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** will call the action on TV today.

**PLAY-BY-PLAY**...all radio broadcasts, including tonight's game vs. the White Sox, can be heard live on Mariners.com...tonight's broadcast will also be aired live on **710 ESPN Seattle** at 6:30 p.m. PT...**Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** will call the action on radio tonight.

**GAME TIME CHANGE**...the Mariners Cactus League finale, March 27 at Colorado, will now start at **12:10 p.m.**...it was originally slated for a 1:10 p.m. first pitch.

**HEY JESSE, DID YOU KNOW?**...that **Marco Gonzales** is one of three pitchers in all of Spring Training to have worked at least 9.0 innings without allowing a run?...he is joined by Atlanta's Mike Foltynewicz (0 R, 9.0 IP) and Atlanta's Julio Teheran (0 R, 9.0 IP).

**2018 Spring Training** - 0-0, 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 9.0 IP) in 3 GS...allowed 1 BB and struck out 4 in 2.0 hitless inning in Spring Training debut on 2/25 vs. LAD...ND in Mariners 4-2 win on 3/2 at MIL, allowing 3 H and 4 K in 3.0 ShO IP...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings on 3/7 vs. OAK (4.0,2,0,0,2,1).

- **Last Season** - Went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) in 11 games, including 8 starts with St. Louis (1 G) and Seattle (10 G, 8 GS).
- **September Surge** - In 5 games, including 2 starts, in September, went 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 ER, 16.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts.
- **Mariners Debut** - Made his Mariners debut on Aug. 6 at Kansas City, getting a no-decision despite leaving with a 7-2 lead but did not complete 5.0 innings.
- **The Trade** - Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor leaguer Tyler O'Neill (OF) on July 21, 2017.
- **Tacome Time** -Went 2-0 with 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) while striking out 9 in 2 starts with AAA Tacoma...both of his starts were quality starts.
- **AAA Recap** - Was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts in 13 starts with AAA Memphis (11 GS) and AAA Tacoma (2 GS).
- **Career** - Has appeared in parts of 3 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...over 3 seasons at Gonzaga, compiled a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013.

- **Last Season** - Missed season while recovering from "Tommy John" surgery.
- **2016 Recap** - Appeared in 1 game on rehab assignment with AZL Mariners...60-day DL (strained right latissimus dorsi muscle), Mar. 12-end of season.
- **Career** - Has appeared in parts of 5 ML seasons with Arizona (2011), Oakland (2012-15) and Boston (2015)...named to the AL All-Star Team in 2012.

#### #39 — Edwin Díaz (RHP):

**2018 Spring Training:** 0-1, 4.50 ERA (2 ER, 4.0 IP) in 4 G...allowed 1 BB in scoreless 4th inning in Cactus League debut on 2/25 vs. LAD...#1 on 2/28 at CLE (1.0,2,2,2,1,2,HR)...K'd 2 in 1-2-3 3rd inning 3/4 at TEX...K'd 2 in 1-2-3 6th inning on 3/8 vs. SF.

- **Last Season** - 4-6-34, 3.27 (24 ER, 66.0 IP) with 89 strikeouts in 66 games.
- **Save It** - His 34 saves were 7th in AL (also: Ken Giles-HOU), trailing Alex Colome-TB (47), Roberto Osuna-TOR (39) and Craig Kimbrel-BOS (35).
- **Career** - Originally selected by the Mariners in the 3rd round (98th overall) of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Caguas Military Academy.

#### #12 — Juan Nicasio (RHP):

**2018 Spring Training:** 1-0, 2.25 (1 ER, 4.0 IP) in 4 G...W#1 on 2/25 vs. LAD, allowing 1 H & 1 K in scoreless 3rd inning...tossed scoreless 4th inning on 2/28 at CLE (1.0,1,0,0,1,1)...allowed 1 R on 1 H in 4th inning, 3/3 vs. LAA...1-2-3 5th inning with 2 K's on 3/8 vs. SF.

- **Last Season** - Went 5-5 with 6 saves and a 2.61 ERA (21 ER, 72.1 IP) in 76 appearances with Pittsburgh (65 G), Philadelphia (2 G) and St. Louis (9 G).
- **Leader** - Tied for National League lead with career-high 76 appearances.
- **Career** - Has appeared in 7 ML seasons with Colorado (2011-14), Los Angeles-NL (2015), Pittsburgh (2016-17), Philadelphia (2017) and St. Louis (2017)...signed with Colorado as a non-drafted free agent on Aug. 21, 2006.

#### #25 — Marc Rzepczynski (LHP):

**2018 Spring Training:** 2-0, 4.50 ERA (2 ER, 4.0 IP) in 4 G...tossed 1-2-3 3rd inning with 2 K's in Cactus League debut on 2/27 vs. SD...W#1 on 3/2 at MIL (1.0,2,2,2,2,1)...K'd 2 in 1-2-3 5th inning on 3/7 vs. OAK...W #2 3/10 at CIN with 1-2-3 5th inning (1 SO).

- **Last Season** - Went 2-2 with 1 save and a 4.02 ERA (14 ER, 31.1 IP) with 25 strikeouts in 64 relief appearances with the Mariners.
- **Dependable** - His 64 relief appearances were 3rd on the club behind Nick Vincent (69) and Edwin Díaz (66).
- **Stranded** - Stranded 85% (44 of 52) of inherited base runners; best mark in MLB (min. 50 inherited runners).
- **In a Holding Pattern** - His 20 holds ranked T12th in the American League.
- **Career** - Enters his 10th Major League season...originally selected by Toronto in the 5th round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of UC Riverside.

#### #50 — Nick Vincent (RHP):

**2018 Spring Training:** Making his first Cactus League appearance tonight.

- **Last Season** - Was 3-3 with 29 holds and a 3.20 ERA (23 ER, 64.2 IP) with 50 strikeouts in 69 games with the Mariners.
- **Honors** - Named Mariners Unsung Hero by the Seattle chapter of BBWAA.
- **Hold It** - Had 29 holds, 2nd-most in the Majors (Taylor Rogers, 30)...the 29 holds are 2nd-best in club history behind Arthur Rhodes (32 in 2001).
- **Career Year** - Recorded career-highs in games (69), innings (64.2) and holds (29).
- **Strong Start** - Had 1.87 ERA (12 ER, 57.2 IP) and 44 strikeouts in first 60 games...was 0-2 with 14.14 ERA (11 ER, 7.0 IP) over final 9 outings.
- **Home Field** - Did not allow a run at home until Sept. 5 vs. Houston, going 28.0 scoreless innings at home to start season, longest since Hisashi Iwakuma (29.0, 9/25/13-5/25/14).
- **Career** - Has appeared in 6 ML seasons with the Padres (2012-15) and Mariners (2016-c)...selected by San Diego in the 18th round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Long Beach State University.
