TODAY'S GAME: The Giants and Cardinals play the middle game of this weekend's three-game series this afternoon with the Giants looking to even up the series at a game apiece...the Giants are 7-7 in the regular season at Busch Stadium since 2014 and have not won a season series with St. Louis since 2014 (4-3).

ON THE MOUND: RHP Dereck Rodríguez takes the hill for his 18th start (20th appearance)...last pitched Sunday versus Colorado and allowed three runs (one earned) on five hits in 6.0 innings of a 3-2 loss and has now lost his last three decisions, the longest losing streak of his brief MLB career despite a 1.47 ERA (3er, 18.1ip) in that span...is 2-0, 1.39 ERA (5er, 32.1ip) with a .216 average against in his last five road starts.

DYNAMIC DERECK: Entering play today, **RHP Dereck Rodríguez** leads all qualified rookies with his 2.30 ERA, is third among rookies with his .211 opponents batting average against and is seventh among NL rookies with 109.1 IP... since the break, he owns a 1.87 ERA (13er, 62.2ip), fourth-best in the Majors in that time behind Trevor Williams (1.19), Clay Buchholz (1.66) and Zack Wheeler (1.68).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: After last night's loss, the Giants have endured back-to-back losing seasons for the first time since four consecutive losing campaigns from 2005-2008.

TOUGH FINISHES: With the Cardinals pushing the go-ahead runs across in the eighth inning yesterday, the Giants have now suffered 21 losses in which the opponent has won the game in their last at-bat, tied for the most such losses in the Majors...Arizona and Tampa Bay also have 21 last at-bat losses.

GIANTS PITCHERS: Beginning June 1, the Giants have posted a 3.38 ERA, which ranks as the second-best figure in the Majors behind Los Angeles-NL (3.31)...the starting staff has fashioned a 3.49 ERA in that span, the fourth-best in the Majors behind Los Angeles-NL (3.19), Tampa Bay (3.30) and Cleveland (3.44) while the bullpen has combined for a 3.20 ERA, second-best in MLB behind Houston (3.09).

IN THE 'PEN: Giants relievers have combined for a 3.00 ERA (12er, 36.0ip) and a .219 opponents' average against in the last 13 games...in fact, SF's bullpen has allowed five runs in its last 18.1 innings pitched for a 2.45 ERA...the Giants' bullpen ERA of 3.61 is fifth-best in the NL behind Chicago (3.37), San Diego (3.51), Milwaukee (3.56) and Arizona (3.57).

SOUTHPAW STATS: With **LHP Madison Bumgarner's** start last night, the Giants have had 89 games this season started by a left-handed pitcher, the fourth-most in a single-season by a Giants' team all-time...**LHP Andrew Suárez** is scheduled to start Sunday, which would tie this year's club for third-most (see *chart, courtesy of STATS, LLC*).

CENTRAL OVEREXPOSURE: Entering play this afternoon, the Giants have lost each of their last eight road games to NL Central division opponents dating to May 27...SF's last win against an NL Central team on the road came May 26 at Chicago-NL...the Giants are 2-11 on the road this year vs. NL Central foes.

CLOSE CALLS: The Giants have played 106 games this season that have been decided by just three runs or fewer, the most such games of any MLB team this year...SF is 51-55 (.481) in such contests.

SCORE AT LEAST FOUR: San Francisco is 21-64 (.247) when scoring three runs or fewer compared to 51-18 (.739) when plating four-or-more runs.

This Date in Giants History: September 22, 2012

Madison Bumgarner picked up his 16th win of the season as the Giants locked up the NL West title with an 8-4 win over the Padres...it was the Giants' sixth-straight win as part of a stretch where they won 18-of-24 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#57 RHP Dereck Rodriguez
6-1, 215, 26 years old (June 5, 1992)
6-4 Record, 2.30 ERA

- 26-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 18th Major League start (20th appearance)...the Giants are 9-8 overall when he takes the hill as a starter, going 5-6 at home and 4-2 on the road...has received a total of just four runs of support in his last four starts.
- Last pitched Sunday versus Colorado and allowed three runs (one earned) on five hits in 6.0 innings of a 3-2 loss... has now lost his last three decisions, the longest losing streak of his brief MLB career.
- Among NL rookie pitchers he ranks first in ERA (2.30), third in opponents batting average against (.211), tied for third in wins (6), seventh in innings pitched (109.1ip), and 10th in strikeouts (86).
- His 2.30 ERA is the fifth-lowest among MLB pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched and the second-lowest in the NL behind Jacob deGrom (1.77).
- Has allowed one earned run in each of his last three starts, fashioning a 1.47 ERA (3er, 18.1ip) in that span.
- Last five road starts: 2-0, 1.39 ERA (5er, 32.1ip), .216 average against...has just one road loss this year and that came June 9 at Washington.
- Has 14 quality starts in 17 outings this year (82.4%)...the only big league pitchers who have a higher quality start percentage are deGrom (87.1%) and Scherzer (84.3%).
- He's the first Giants pitcher since 1900 to pitch 6+ innings and allow two or fewer runs in at least 13 of his first 16 career starts.
- Missed 10 games from Aug. 16-23 with a right hamstring strain, an injury he suffered Aug. 14 at Los Angeles-NL during an on field incident involving teammate **Nick Hundley** and Yasiel Puig that cleared the benches.
- Opponents are just 16-for-78 (.205) off him with RISP, including a .125 clip (6-for-48) in his last 13 games.
- Faces the Cardinals for the second time in his career...last faced them July 6 at AT&T Park and did not factor into the decision after giving up a pair of runs on five hits in 6.1 innings of a 3-2 Giants win...matched up with John Gant.
- Signed a minor league contract with the Giants on November 15, 2017...was invited to Major League camp as a non-roster invitee.
- Is the son of former Major League catcher and Hall of Famer, Ivan Rodriguez.
- Was drafted in the sixth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft by the Minnesota Twins...spent his first three professional seasons as an outfielder before converting into a pitcher in 2014.
- Did not pitch above double-A last season while in the Twins organization.
