OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-8) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (6-4)

FRIDAY, APRIL 13, 2018 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a two-game series with the Dodgers on Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 0-2-2 over the first four series of the season...this marks the first time the A's have not won one of their first four series of the season since 2001 when they started 0-4-0 before winning series number five...are 2-2 over the last four games but have lost four of the last six...are 5-8 for the season, which matches the A's 13-game record from last year...spent the first day of the season tied for first, the second day tied for second and every day since then in fourth (six days) or tied for fourth (seven days)...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world titles (7).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 16 runs on 21 hits on Wednesday to defeat the Dodgers 16-6...the runs scored were Oakland's most in a game since Sept. 12, 2016 at Kansas City (also 16) and the hits were the most since Sept. 11, 2013 when they had 22 at Minnesota...have scored 33 runs over the first five games of the road trip (6.60 per game), which includes one run last Sunday and no runs on Tuesday, after tallying 27 in eight games on the last homestand (3.38 per game)...the 21-hit performance on Wednesday boosted the A's season batting average 20 points to .265, which is second best in the American League (Los Angeles, .290) and third best in the majors (Pittsburgh, .278)...rank third in the AL in on-base percentage (.337)...went 8-for-17 with runners in scoring position on Wednesday after going 6-for-41 (.146) with RISP over the previous seven games...are fourth in the AL with a .260 (25-for-96) average with RISP overall...have stolen just three bases, which is the fewest in the AL tied for the fewest in the majors (Dodgers, Marlins, Mets).

PITCHING: The A's did not walk a batter on Wednesday and have issued a Major League low 26 walks in 116.0 innings (2.02 per nine innings)...however, allowed 12 hits and have a .274 opponents batting average, which is second highest in the majors to Texas (.285)...allowed two home runs on Wednesday and now have a streak of five consecutive games with two or more home runs allowed (11 home runs total)...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 30-June 4, 2000 when they also had a five-game streak...the Oakland record is seven games from April 29-May 5, 1997...have surrendered 18 round-trippers for the season, which is tied with Colorado for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 21)...lead the majors with 12 wild pitches...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors...have a 5.57 ERA (26 er in 42.0 ip) over the first five games of the road trip after posting a 3.89 ERA in eight games on the first homestand.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last five games and are 2-2 with a 6.85 ERA (17 er in 22.2 ip) and .298 (28-for-94) opponents batting average over that span...are 3-7 with a 5.43 ERA (41 er in 68.0 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (Texas, 9) and the third highest ERA to the Mariners (5.61) and Rangers (5.64)...Sean Manaea and Andrew Triggs are a combined 2-2 with a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts while the rest of the A's starters are 1-5 with an 8.35 ERA (34 er in 36.2 ip) in eight starts...starters have just two outings longer than 5.2 innings this season, both by Manaea.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors, which is tied for sixth most in the American League...however, those errors have led to nine unearned runs, which is tied with Texas for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 15)...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on the first road trip of the season, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING: The A's have scored just three runs in the first inning, which is tied for second fewest in the American League (Texas, 2)...have the second lowest first inning batting average (8-for-46, .174) to Tampa Bay (.163)...have scored 12 runs in the second inning, which is second

most in the AL, and are batting .339 (19-for-56), which is the best mark in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's venture out of the state of California for the first time today for this three-game series with Seattle...are scheduled to play each of their first 22 games on the west coast and this series is the only one outside of California...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and are currently on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning Monday...had off on Monday and Thursday this week after playing 11 games in 11 days to start the season...will have another off day next Thursday and the A's are scheduled to play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

THIS AND THAT: The A's defeated Alex Wood on Wednesday for their first win in a game started by a left-handed pitcher this year...are 1-4 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-4 against right-handers...the A's are 4-1 when scoring first, 1-7 when the opponent scores first...have a 4-4 record in night games and are 1-4 during the day.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): Monday against the White Sox...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley, Pinder, Powell)...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL and Dull, Núñez and Phegley are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's went 7-12 against Seattle last year and lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 37-58 (.389) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...went 4-5 in Oakland last year and 3-7 in Seattle...have a four-game losing streak at Safeco Field...all-time, the A's are 341-282 against the Mariners...that includes 184-127 in Oakland, 156-154 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-90 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have an all-time record of 19-24 on Friday the 13th, including 11-8 on the road where they have a four-game winning streak...are 4-0 against the Mariners...**Matt Chapman** is tied for the American League lead with seven multiple hit games...**Jed Lowrie** had his third three-hit game of the season Wednesday, which is tied for the Major League lead...**Jonathan Lucroy** has thrown out 5-of-9 (55.6%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are tied for the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span...**Marcus Semien** has a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak (10-for-39, .256) and is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all 13 games...**Jake Smolinski** has a 42-game streak without an RBI, which is one short of the Oakland record of 43 by Ted Martinez from May 26-Sept. 20, 1975...his last RBI came on Aug. 31, 2016 at Houston.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1968 the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in 1994 the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (1-0, 2.53 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...had a no decision in his first start and then picked up the win in his last start...had lost each of his final four starts of 2017 before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...his win last Saturday night at Los Angeles (AL) was his first since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas on April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a leadoff walk to Cozart in the first inning was erased on a double play...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Upton...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

TRIGGS vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-1 with an 8.53 ERA (12.2 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 4 hr) in three career appearances, two starts...went 0-1 with a 5.91 ERA (10.2 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 8 so) in two starts last year...the loss came in an

11-1 decision in Oakland on April 23...allowed six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...then had a no decision in a 9-6 A's win at Seattle May 16...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...blanked the Mariners on two hits and three walks over his final five innings and left with a 4-1 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...his other appearance came in relief on May 25, 2016 at Seattle (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...pitched the final two innings of the A's 13-3 loss...allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the Mariners four runs seventh and a solo home run to Cano in the eighth.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11) and stolen bases allowed (15).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (0-2, 9.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has allowed at least four runs while tossing 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first three starts...is tied for the Major League lead with 14 runs allowed...has surrendered at least one home run in each start and has five for the season, which is tied with Hamels (TEX) for the most in the majors...is also tied for the ML lead in hits (20)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday (3.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...is 1-3 with a 4.81 ERA (48.2 ip, 64 h, 27 r, 26 er, 11 bb, 28 so, 3 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts against Seattle...had no decisions and a 4.76 ERA in two starts last year...went 1-2 with a 7.53 ERA and .305 opponents batting average in five starts this spring...was 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts last year in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers...held the opposition to a .211 batting average with two outs but surrendered six of his nine home runs in that situation...allowed a .188 average against the opponents clean-up hitter and has a .159 (10-for-63) average in that situation in his career...opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded...the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors.

SPLITS: Compiled a 2-2 record and a 3.14 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...went 4-1 with a 2.04 ERA in six starts against AL West competition, 1-5 with a 6.90 ERA in six starts against everyone else...was 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 2.56 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more

THIS AND THAT: Allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 12 starts...walked one batter or fewer six times and has now issued one free pass or fewer in 12 of his 20 career starts...eight of his 19 walks came in the first inning.

MORE 2017: Won each of his first three starts and did not allow an earned run for a season-opening 17.2-inning streak without an earned run...the season-opening streak of no earned runs was the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...since the earned run became an official stat in the AL in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918)...received 16 runs of support in those three starts (8.15 RSA) but had just 16 runs of support over his final nine starts (3.02 RSA)...issued a career-high three walks in his first start April 6 against Los Angeles (AL), his first of three starts with three walks (May 10 vs. Los Angeles-AL, May 21 vs. Boston)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to 2016...allowed his only home run over his first seven starts (40.2 ip) in that outing...surrendered at least one home run in each of his final five starts (8 hr in 24.2 ip)...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings April 29 at Houston...finished April with a 4-1 record, a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts...tied for second in the AL in wins in April and ranked seventh in ERA...the wins matched the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time) and the ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015)...then went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in May...tied for fifth in the AL in May losses...tossed a career-high 105 pitches in a 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) May 10...had his only no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...then allowed at least six runs in each of his final four starts beginning May 21...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow six runs in four consecutive games, the first since Vin Mazzaro (July 18-Aug. 2, 2009)...is the second of those four to take the loss in each start (Bill Krueger, May 26-June 14, 1985)...compiled a 9.61 ERA and .381 opponents batting average during the four-game losing streak, which is the longest of his career...was charged with five unearned runs May 28 at New York (AL), which match the most unearned runs by an A's pitcher over the last eight seasons (last: Milone on June 30, 2012 vs. Texas)...yielded a career-high nine hits in 3.2 innings each of his final two starts on June 2 against Washington and June 9 at Tampa Bay...had career highs in home runs (3) and runs (8) in the latter contest...was placed on the disabled list June 10 with a strained left hip...underwent surgery on July 13 in Vail, Col when Dr. Marc Philippon repaired the labrum in Triggs' left hip.

- Has allowed runs in seven straight games after going two games without allowing a run...has 3.19 ERA overall, the fifth lowest in American League.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss last Friday night...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since June 4, 2017 vs Washington.
- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)... had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

- Allowed his first runs of the season, both unearned on Friday night...with a homer to Luis Valbuena on Saturday night, he allowed his first earned run since Sept. 11, 2017 vs Chicago-AL.
- Had his 19 road game scoreless streak snapped with a homer to Valbuena on Saturday...it was the first run he has allowed on the road since July 20th of last season (16.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 6 bb, 10 so).

- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams... has pitched in 218 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17-18) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
- Is on his 10th Opening Day roster (2008-09, 17-18 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
