## NEW YORK YANKEES (57-29) at TORONTO BLUE JAYS (41-47)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will play the rubber game of their three-game set vs. the Blue Jays today...are 1-1 on their 11-game road trip to finish the "first half", which also includes four games at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and four games at Cleveland (7/12-15)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ **At 57-29 (.663), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (61-29, .678).**
- ▶ **Are 28G over .500**, tying their season high...were also 28G over at the end of play on 6/21 (50-22) and 7/4 (56-28).
- ▶ **Are 2.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East...** have been in second place for six straight days...the lead alternated on five straight days from 6/28-7/2 and has changed hands 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (*at least a share of*) the two best records in the Majors on 65 of the last 66 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 44-27, the Yankees are 48-20).
- ▶ **Are 19-3-2 over their last 24 series (since 4/19),** winning three straight and six of their last seven...are 48-20 in their last 68G...are 41-5 (.891) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 36-5 (.878) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Are 21-15 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.**

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 8-5, on Saturday at Rogers Centre...**CF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5, 2R, 1 triple, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) and **RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 2BB) opened the game with back-to-back home runs, marking the second time this season and the ninth time in franchise history the Yankees had back-to-back leadoff home runs to start the game (also Gardner and Judge on 5/26/17 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...**RHP Luis Severino** (5.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 2BB, 5K, 2HR) recorded his 14th win of the season, becoming the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record at least 14 wins before the All-Star break...**2B Brandon Drury** (1-for-5) hit a two-run double in the first...**CF Aaron Hicks** (0-for-1, 1R, 2BB) left the game in fifth inning due to cramping in the left leg...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1R, 2BB) and **1B Greg Bird** (1-for-3, 1R, 2BB) each reached base three times...**SS Didi Gregorius** (1-for-4, 1R, 1BB, 1SB) hit an RBI single in the ninth...**Yankees batters** recorded a season-high 10 walks, their most in a game since 9/4/17 at Baltimore...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (0.1IP, 1K) was removed with discomfort in his left knee.

**GARDY PARTY:** **LF Brett Gardner** hit his 14th career leadoff HR and third of the season (also 5/26 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 5/29 vs. Houston) on Sat. at Toronto...his 14 career leadoff homers are tied for sixth on the Yankees' all-time list (Frank Crosetti-14).

- ▶ Five of his 6HR this season and 11 of his last 14HR since 6/23/17 have either tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.
- ▶ Since the beginning of 2017, the Yankees are 20-3 when Gardner homers.
- ▶ Since 5/13, is hitting .333/.404/.429 (14-for-42) vs. left-handed pitchers.

**ALL THAT'S LEFT:** The Yankees will face a left-handed starter today for the sixth time in their last 9G (since 6/29)...are 10-1 in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers since 5/25...are a Major League-best 22-6 (.786) when they face a left-handed starter in 2018.

▶ **Yankees batters** are hitting .256/.346/.495 vs. left-handers in 2018...**their .841 OPS vs. southpaws leads the Majors**, ahead of Atlanta (.802)...have an MLB-best 49HR and 16.80 AB/HR ratio against lefties.

▶ **DH Giancarlo Stanton** is batting .352/.416/.761 (31-for-88) with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 10HR vs. left-handed pitchers this season...is 10-for-24 (.417) since 6/16...his **AL-high 10HR vs. LHP** are tied for the second-most in the Majors (Christian Villanueva-12HR, Nolan Arenado-10HR), while his 1.177 OPS is fourth-highest...since 1961, his .644 career SLG vs. left-handers is tops in the Majors (min. 1.000PA).

**SEVY SEASON: RHP Luis Severino** recorded his Major League-leading 14th win of the season on Sunday at Toronto, tying his career high in wins (went 14-6 in 2017)...his 14 wins match the most in a season by a Yankees pitcher since 2013...also became the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record 14 wins prior to the All-Star break, joining Mel Stottlemyre (14-7 in 24GS in 1969), Whitey Ford (16-2 in 21GS in 1961) and Lefty Gomez (14-2 in 19G/17GS in 1934)...is only the fourth pitcher in the Majors to record at least 14 wins prior to the All-Star break in the last 16 seasons (since 2003), joining Clayton Kershaw (14-2 in 19GS in 2017), Chris Sale (14-3 in 18GS in 2016) and Ubaldo Jimenez (15-1 in 18GS in 2010).

- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 straight starts, the second-longest streak by a Yankees starter in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 20 start streak from 8/9/1910-5/27/1911.

**NORTH OF THE BORDER:** This series marks the Yankees final of three trips to Toronto this season...have gone 5-3 at Rogers Centre in 2018, their highest single-season win total in Toronto over the last eight seasons (2010-17)...marks their most wins and first winning season series at Rogers Centre since 2009 (6-3).

**FAN FAVORITES:** The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 34,370 per game...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road game.

▶ Through 46 home games, **the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774)**, trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

**ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge** has homered in two of his last 3G, 4-of-6, 5-of-8 and 6-of-10...is hitting .300/.417/.750 (12-for-40) with 12R, 6HR, 7RBI and 8BB in 10G since 6/25.

▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 25HR...along with his 30HR before the break in 2017, is the second Yankee to hit at least 25HR before the All-Star break in consecutive seasons, joining Roger Maris (27HR in 1960, 33HR in 1961)

**STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton** is hitting .308/.387/.579 (49-for-159) with 26R, with 11 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 24RBI and 18BB in 40 road games...owns the sixth-highest road OPS (.965) in the AL.

▶ Is the first Yankee to hit at least 20HR before the All-Star break *during his first season with the club* since Mark Teixeira in 2009 (21HR before the break)...is the first Yankee to do so *after being traded to the team* since Alex Rodriguez in 2004 (22HR)...is the only active player with at least 20HR before the break in each of the last five seasons.

▶ Has hit .353 (18-for-51) with 8R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 7BB in 13G since 6/23...in 20G since 6/16, has hit .346/.420/.641 (27-for-78) with 11R, 5 doubles, 6HR and 15RBI, raising his season slash line from .240/.316/.469 to .265/.340/.509.

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** have hit 16HR in their last six games (since 7/1)...their Major League-leading 147HR this season are tied for the fourth-most by a Major League team prior to the All-Star break...the 1999 Seattle Mariners hold the record with 151HR prior to the break.

▶ Are on pace to hit 277HR this season (MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

**MIGGY, MIGGY, MIGGY: INF Miguel Andújar** has 41XBBH (27 doubles, 2 triples, 12HR) in 80 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 80 games (Joe DiMaggio-58XBBH; Bob Meusel-49)...is hitting .323 (10-for-31) with 2R, 2 doubles, 1HR and 3RBI in his last eight games (since 6/27).

**DELLIN DONUTS: RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 3H with 30K in 17.2 scoreless innings (1BB, 2HP) over his last 18G (since 5/27)...is tied for his longest streak of scoreless appearances (also 18-game scoreless stretch from 7/8-8/19/15 - 20.1IP).

**GREEN DAY:** Over his last 12 games (since 5/25), **RHP Chad Green** has posted a career-best 15.1-inning scoreless stretch (11H, 3BB, 17K).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 8, 2000:** The Yankees and Mets play the first two-stadium, split doubleheader in nearly 100 years, with the Yankees sweeping both games by the score of 4-2. Game 1 took place at Shea Stadium, followed by Game 2 that night at Yankee Stadium. It marked the first day-night doubleheader to take place in different venues since 9/7/1903 (New York Giants vs. Brooklyn Superbas).

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 9, 2011:** Derek Jeter becomes the 28th player all-time to record 3,000 hits, accomplishing the feat with a third-inning solo home run vs. Tampa Bay off David Price.

**July 9, 1937:** Joe DiMaggio goes 5-for-5 with 7RBI and hits his for the cycle w/ 2HR, helping the Yankees defeat the Senators, 16-2.

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 8-4 vs. the Blue Jays in 2018...will play the 13th of 19 games vs. Toronto today (10G in the Bronx, 9G at Toronto)...**IN 2017:** Went 9-10 vs. Toronto in 2017, including 5-4 in the Bronx and 4-6 at Rogers Centre...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost the last three season series, their first streak of consecutive season series losses to Toronto since 1990-94 (9-10 in 2017, 7-12 in 2016, 6-13 in 2015)...have still won 12 of the last 17 season series since 2001 (also went 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...had double-digit losses vs. the Blue Jays just twice in 38 seasons from 1977-2014...**AT ROGERS CENTRE:** Are 5-3 at Rogers Centre in 2018...went 4-6 in Toronto in 2017...are 1-6-2 in their last nine series up north...won a two-game series on 6/5-6/18 their first series win since 8/14-16/15...are 2-9-2 in 13 series since 6/23/14...have recorded their first winning season series at Rogers Centre since 2009 (6-3).

**RHP Domingo Germán** will make his 11th start of the season (and 17th appearance) today's series finale at Toronto...will pitch on extended five days' rest...did not record a decision in his last start on Monday vs. Atlanta (4.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 3BB, 6K, 2HR, 1BK)...earned his first career win on 6/14 vs. Tampa Bay, setting a career high with 10K over 6.0IP (5H, 3ER, 2BB, 1HR, 1WP)...recorded 26 swinging strikes, the sixth pitcher to reach that mark in a Major League game this season...did not allow a hit or run in his first career start on 5/6 vs. Cleveland (6.0IP, 2BB, 9K)...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/7...made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, going 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) in seven relief appearances...was re-signed by the Yankees as minor league free agent on 12/11/15...was originally acquired by the Yankees, along with RHP Nathan Eovaldi and INF Garrett Jones, from the Miami Marlins in exchange for RHP David Phelps, INF/OF Martín Prado and cash considerations on 12/19/14...was originally signed by the Marlins as a non-drafted free agent on 8/8/09.

**LAST START:** Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 8-5 win on Monday vs. Atlanta (4.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 3BB, 6K, 2HR, 1BK)...allowed back-to-back home runs to Inciarte and Albies in the fifth inning, tying his career high in HR (also 2HR on 5/22/18 at Texas and 6/9/18 at the Mets)...has failed to toss 5.0IP in each of his last two starts after doing so in seven of his eight seven career starts.

**2018:** Has appeared in 16 games (10 starts) this season, going 2-4 with a 5.37 ERA (68.2IP, 41ER)...opponents are hitting .238 (63-for-265); LH .228 (29-for-127), RH .246 (34-for-138)...leads AL rookies with 81K (third among MLB rookies).

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .189 (20-for-106) with 4HR, 9BB and 49K in at-bats ending with a curveball (Brooks Baseball).
- ✦ Took a no-decision and went just 3.0IP (9H, 6ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP) on 6/24 at Tampa Bay, a 7-6 loss in 12 innings...tied a career high in R/ER...set a career high in hits allowed, including a career-high 6XBH (3 doubles, 2 triples, 1HR)...was the shortest start of his career.

**VS. TORONTO:** In two career appearances vs. the Blue Jays, has gone 0-2 with an 8.10 ERA (3.1IP, 3ER)...has never made a start against Toronto.

**ON THE ROAD:** Is 0-2 with a 8.84 ERA (19.1IP, 19ER) in four road starts this season, and 0-2 with a 6.26 ERA (27.1IP, 19ER) in seven road appearances overall.

**WALKING...BACK TO THE DUGOUT:** Is one of four rookies to record a start of at least 9K and 0BB this season (also Pittsburgh's Nick Kingham, San Diego's Joey Lucchesi and Miami's Caleb Smith), and the only rookie to accomplish the feat twice...was the first AL rookie since Detroit's Michael Fulmer in 2016 to record two such starts in the same season.

- ✦ Is one of seven Yankees rookies in franchise history to record a start of at least 9K and 0BB and the first to have two such starts in a single season (see chart at right).
