REDBIRD RUNDOWN: The Cardinals continue play on their first homestand post All-Star Break with seven games. Tonight, the Cardinals play the first of four games against the Colorado Rockies...this is the eighth game the Cardinals have played at Busch Stadium in July and have sold out the previous seven...the Cardinals are 5-6 post All-Star Break and 6-6 under interim manager **Mike Shildt** since he took the post on July 15.

TUSNAMI WARNING BACK IN EFFECT: Today, the Cardinals activated pitcher **Carlos Martínez** from the 10-day disabled list (right oblique strain) and he will start tonight's game on the mound. LHP **Chasen Shreve**, acquired from the New York Yankees late Saturday night was also added to the roster today. LHP **Tyler Webb** has been optioned to Memphis (AAA) and RHP **Luke Gregerson** was placed on the 10-day disabled list with a right shoulder impingement.

LATE DATES: The Cardinals are playing the Colorado Rockies for the first time during the 2018 season and it's the latest they have begun a season series with their Rocky Mountains western I-70 opponent since the club's inception in 1993. The previous latest date for a first game between the two clubs was July 6, 2010. The Cardinals latest opponent this season is the Los Angeles Dodgers with the Cardinals first game scheduled for August 20 at Dodger Stadium.

FAN-TASTIC: The Cardinals have sold out all seven July games and their last nine dating back to June 29. Currently the Cardinals lead the Major Leagues with a 96.8% capacity, averaging 42,588 in total attendance. The Cardinals largest announced attendance figure of the season was 47,514, which came on Saturday afternoon vs. the Chicago Cubs.

ROCKIN' THE ROCKIES: **Paul DeJong** made his Major League debut against the Colorado Rockies on May 28, 2017 and did it with an entrance hitting a pinch-hit home run off then-closer **Greg Holland** at Coors Field. In four career games vs. the Rockies, DeJong has hit safely and driven in a run in each of the four games he's played batting .400 (6-15) with 3 HR and 6 RBI. The Cardinals record for consecutive games with an RBI vs. Colorado is seven (**Rick Ankiel**, **Fernando Tatis**, **Mark McGwire**) and the most recent Cardinal with five or more is **Matt Holliday** with six (7/2-8/1/2012).

SECOND HALF SURGES: Since the beginning of the new century in 2001, the Cardinals .569 winning percentage post All-Star Break is the best in the National League trailing only the **New York Yankees** (.594) in MLB.

PITCHING IN: With **Tyler Webb's** appearance last night, the Cardinals set a season record with 27 different pitchers participating in a single season. Previously, the record was 26 established in the 2002 season. With newly acquired southpaw **Chasen Shreve** from the Yankees, the Cardinals could shatter that mark and match the 2002 mark which does not include position players. (The 2018 mark includes pitching appearances by **Greg Garcia** and **Jedd Gyorko**.)

THIS BEAR EATS HOME COOKING: **Marcell Ozuna** has homered in back-to-back games and hit his last four home runs all against the Chicago Cubs. Ozuna leads the Cardinals with a .317 batting average at home, 5th among National League players. He's whacked eight home runs at home, 2nd on the club (Carpenter, 9), and leads the team with 33 home RBI (10th N.L.). The Cardinals lead the National League with 80 home runs hit on the road as opposed to 52 at home.

CAN'T SPELL SHILDT WITHOUT THE "D": Since **Mike Shildt** took over as interim manager on July 15, the team's fielding percentage has been .982, ranking 8th among National League teams and lead the N.L. with 15 double plays turned. Through July 14, encompassing their first 93 games, the Cardinals ranked 15th in the National League with a .978 fielding percentage and T11th in double plays turned (78).

SECRET SALSA: **Matt Carpenter** is tied for 2nd in the National League in home runs with 25 (**Nolan Arenado**, **COL**, 27). Carpenter is three shy of his career high of 28 home runs in 2015. He's five shy of becoming the 15th Cardinals left-handed hitter to whack 30 home runs in a single season and the first since **Jim Edmonds** hit 42 in 2004. Carpenter's 16 home runs hit on the road this season are the most in the National League and one behind **Khris Davis** (OAK) for the Major League lead (17). Carpenter's 10 home runs in July are the most in MLB.

TWO-STRIKE HITTERS: Rookie infielder **Yairo Muñoz** has 52 total hits this season with over half of them (27) coming on two-strike counts (51%). Only four players in MLB have a better two-strike batting average than Muñoz .284 (Betts, BOS, .307; Simmons, LAA, .306; Dickerson, PIT, .295; Freese, PIT, .286). Muñoz is the only Cardinals position player this season with over half his hits coming on two-strike counts, as pitchers **Luke Weaver** (5-of-6) and **Michael Wacha** (2-for-2) have collected the majority of their hits on two-strike counts.

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Senior Special Assistant to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first General Manager from 1991-99...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

Cardinals Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in a combined 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Cardinals infielder **Greg Garcia** served as a Rockies bat boy in 2001...his grandfather, **Dave Garcia**, was a bench coach with the Rockies from 2000-02 working under manager **Buddy Bell**.

Cardinals outfielder **Dexter Fowler** played six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13) and made his Major League debut...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...later traded by Colorado with cash to the Astros for outfielder **Brandon Barnes** and pitcher **Jordan Lyles** (December 3, 2013).

Cardinals infielder **Paul DeJong** made his Major League debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th player in Cardinals history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Cardinals outfielder **Harrison Bader** (July 25, 2017) and pitcher **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Rockies pitcher **Seung-hwan Oh** and Korean Interpreter **Eugene Koo** spent two seasons with the Cardinals (2016-17).

Rockies pitcher **Adam Ottavino** was selected by St. Louis in the first round (30th overall) in the 2006 MLB Draft...pitched in five games for St. Louis in 2010...selected off waivers by Colorado Rockies (April 3, 2012).

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed Cardinals infielder **Jedd Gyorko** (2013-15) and pitchers **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) and **Luke Gregerson** (2009-13) while in San Diego...all three made their MLB debuts under Black.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from nearby Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...previously worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist writer **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

FOX Sports Midwest reporter **Erica Weston** is originally from Highlands Ranch, Colo...attended Colorado State University.

Rockies Vice President Ticket Sales, Operations & Services **Sue Ann McClaren** worked 15 seasons (1978-92) in the Cardinals sales department before joining the Rockies in 1992.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Activated from the 10-day D.L. tonight to make his 18th start of the season and 118th career start (190th appearance).
- Missed just one start after placed on the disabled list on 7/20 with a right oblique strain.
- Has appeared on the 10-day D.L. twice this season with a right lat strain (5/9-6/4) and a right oblique strain (7/20-7/29)...prior to this season, had never been on the DL.
- Needs 7 strikeouts to reach 779 for his career and tie Bill Sherdel (1918-30, '32) for 15th all-time in Cardinals history...is 6.2 innings away from reaching 800.0 for his career.
- Is lifetime 20-12 with a 3.83 ERA in 76 career games (43 starts) post All-Star break.

LAST TIME OUT

- Came away with his second straight losing start in the second half opener at Chicago (7/19). Five of his six runs allowed came in the 5th inning as the Cubs overcame a 3-1 deficit.
- Placed on the 10-day DL the following day (7/20) with a right oblique strain.

- Has issued 49 walks, T9th-most in the NL, and he co-led (Tyler Chatwood-CHI) the NL with 21 walks in June. Has just eight walks over his last six starts (33.0 IP).
- Ranks T2nd in MLB with 11 hit batsmen (Cole Hamels, 12); hit a career-high 3 batters vs. NYM (4/26).
- Limiting opponents to a .211 average (23-109) BA with RISP, 11th-lowest in the N.L.
- Has allowed just 5 homers in 95.2 IP (0.47 HR/9 IP), fewest among Cardinals starters.
- His .334 Opp. SLG pct. is 6th-lowest among NL pitchers (min. 425 BF)...teammate Miles Mikolas (.333) ranks 5th.
- Induced team-leading 12 ground ball double plays, T7th-most in the NL. His 85 GDP induced since 2015 rank T2nd MLB behind Martin Perez (88).
- Missed 23 games while on 10-day D.L. (May 9-June 4) with a right lat strain. It was first time in his career he was on the disabled list. Was leading the NL with his 1.62 ERA at the time he went on the D.L.
- In his next nine starts after being activated from D.L. was 3-4 with a 5.32 ERA (45.2 IP/27 ER), 26 walks and 42 strikeouts.
- Prior to his win on 6/26 vs. CLE, the Cardinals had lost his previous five games started, including each of his first four starts following return from D.L.
- Has a pair of double-digit strikeout games this season, fanning 10 at Milwaukee (4/4) and 11 at Cincinnati (4/15). His 10 career double-digit strikeout games rank T4th in Cardinals history (Gibson 74, Carpenter 14, Carlton 13).
- Walked five or more batters in three straight starts (June 5-16), first time by a Cardinals pitcher since 2005 (Jason Marquis).
- Posted his 2nd consecutive win in a 6-3 victory at Arizona on 7/2, fanning seven in 6.0 IP to improve to 3-1 career against the Diamondbacks & 3-0 at Chase Field.
- Snapped 3-game losing skid with his 50th career win on 6/26 vs. CLE. He became the 10th-youngest Cardinals pitcher to reach the 50-win milestone (since 1900).
