#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost nine of the last 12 games and 16 of the last 22 as they continue their final series of the 2018 season with the penultimate game vs. Minnesota.
- LHP Carlos Rodón, who is looking for his first win since 8/27 at Yankee Stadium, will take the mound for the White Sox.
- Chicago opened the series by being swept in Friday's split DH.
- The Sox are currently in fourth place in the American League Central, 2.0 games behind third-place Detroit (64-96).
- The White Sox went 2-4 on their final homestand of the season, losing two of three to both the Cubs and Cleveland ... they finished with a 30-51 record at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The White Sox went 4-5 on their last trip at the Indians (1-2), Baltimore (2-1) and Kansas City (1-2).

#### TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox need to win one of their final two games to avoid the fourth 100-loss season in franchise history.
- The Sox are 15-10 (.652) on the road since 8/3, the seventh-best mark in MLB ... pitchers own a 3.88 ERA (96 ER/222.2 IP) and .237 opp. average with 17 quality starts during that span.
- Chicago has won six of the last 11 games vs. Minnesota after losing five of the first six to start the season series.
- The Sox are hitting .218/.279/.344 with 22 homers and 69 runs scored (3.1 R/G) in the last 22 games ... have left 150 runners on base and own a .228 RISP mark (34-149) during that span.
- Carlos Rodón is 0-4 with a 6.84 ERA (20 ER/26.1 IP), .311 opp. average, 1.82 WHIP, five home runs allowed and 15 walks over his last five starts (one quality start).

#### YESTERDAY'S DOUBLEHEADER RECAP

- Minnesota swept yesterday's doubleheader at Target Field, defeating Chicago 2-1 in the opener and 12-4 in the nightcap.
- In Game 1, José Berríos and two relievers limited the Sox to four singles with 12 strikeouts.
- Willians Astudillo snapped a 1-1 tie with a game-winning sacrifice fly in the sixth ... Leury García drove in the White Sox run with a RBI single in the third.
- Reynaldo López suffered the loss in his final start despite allowing two runs on four hits with five walks over 6.0 IP.
- In Game 2, the Twins scored three times in the first, four times in the second and three times in the third en route to a 10-1 lead.
- Lucas Giolito was charged with the loss in his 2018 finale after surrendering seven runs on five hits with four walks in 1.1 IP.
- Kevan Smith and José Rondón each hit solo home runs.
- The White Sox combined for 12 hits (eight singles), 19 strikeouts and went 2-14 with RISP in the twinbill.

#### DOUBLEHEADER DYNAMICS

- The White Sox yesterday were swept in a doubleheader for the first time since 7/1/14 vs. the Angels ... the last time they were swept in a road DH was 5/7/12 at Cleveland.
- The last time Minnesota swept Chicago in a DH was 8/9/13 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... yesterday also marked the first time the Twins swept the Sox in a DH in Minneapolis since 9/21/80.

#### TWEAK THE STREAK

- Reynaldo López suffered the loss last night despite surrendering two runs on four hits in 6.0 IP ... he allowed one run or less and five hits or less in 6.0-plus IP in each of his previous five GS.
- He is just the third Sox pitcher to allow two runs or less and five hits or less over 6.0-plus IP in six consecutive starts, joining Carlos Rodón (six; 7/5-8/10/18) and Joe Horlen (six; 5/7-29/68).
- López and Rodón are tied for the third-longest such streak in MLB in 2018, trailing Justin Verlander (11) and Max Scherzer (8).

#### RODÓN'S ROLLERCOASTER

- Carlos Rodón is 0-4 with a 6.84 ERA (20 ER/26.1 IP), .311 opponents average, 1.82 WHIP, 17 strikeouts, five home runs allowed and 15 walks over his last five starts since 9/1.
- By comparison, he made nine straight quality starts while allowing five hits or less from 7/5-8/27, the longest such streak by a White Sox pitcher since at least 1908 (Baseball Reference).

- The Sox game will begin on 1160-AM at 6:10 p.m. CT and then switch to WGN 720-AM at the conclusion of the Northwestern game ... White Sox Weekly will air on WGN from 1-3:00 p.m.

#### WHITE SOX VS. MINNESOTA

- The Twins lead the season series, 10-7 ... the Sox are 3-5 at Target Field and went 4-5 at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- Game 1 yesterday marked the final makeup game from three snow postponements at Target Field from 4/13-15.
- The White Sox are batting .241/.300/.395 with 19 home runs, own a 4.09 ERA (69 ER/152.0 IP) with nine quality starts and have been outscored, 78-69, this season.
- The Sox are 8-13 in the last 21 games at Target Field.
- Chicago is 3-13-2 in the last 18 season matchups (2001-18).
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 432-483 ... they are 234-223 at home (120-104 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 198-260 on the road (39-45 at Target Field).

#### RICKY SAYS THANK YOU

- Rick Renteria has donated 200 tickets to tomorrow's game to children who were treated at Hennepin County Medical Center.
- The ticket donation is a thank you from Renteria to the staff who were involved in his care while he was a patient last month ... he also sent a shipment of Nuts on Clark "Chicago mix" popcorn.
- He missed four games from 8/20-23 due to lightheadedness.

#### LACK OF CENTRAL COMMAND

- Chicago is 30-44 against the American League Central in 2018, going 14-23 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 15-22 on the road.
- The White Sox will record a losing record vs. the AL Central for the sixth consecutive season.
- The Sox have lost 10 of the last 13 overall but won 13 of 26.
- Chicago is 8-7 over the last 15 road games vs. the division.
- The White Sox are 320-422 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-36).

#### (DIS)COMFORT OF HOME

- The White Sox lost nine of their last 11 games at Guaranteed Rate Field and finished 30-51 (.370) at home this season, the second-worst mark in MLB ahead of Baltimore (27-50, .351).
- This season marks the Sox fourth-worst home record in club history, ahead of 1948 (27-48), 1932 (28-49) and 1970 (31-53).
- Chicago will finish with a sub-.500 record at home for the fifth time in the last six seasons (45-36 in 2016).

#### POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (20 HR/26 SB) is the first White Sox shortstop to record a 20-HR/20-SB season ... he is four steals shy of joining Alex Ríos (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966) as the only Sox to post 20 homers and 30 steals in one season.
- Anderson, Boston's Mookie Betts, Cleveland's José Ramírez and Colorado's Trevor Story are the only players in MLB with at least 20 home runs and 25 stolen bases this season.

#### PALKA POWER

- Daniel Palka is tied with Zeke Bonura (1934) for third place in White Sox single-season history among rookies with 27 home runs in 2018 ... he is eight shy of Ron Kittle (35 in 1983) for second ... the 27 homers are the most by a Sox left-handed rookie.
- He ranks among MLB rookie leaders in homers (T1st, 27), RBI (3rd, 67), total bases (7th, 198) and extra-base hits (8th, 44).
- Palka is trying to become the first White Sox rookie to lead all MLB rookies in home runs since José Abreu (36) in 2014.
- His four pinch-hit HRs are the most in a season in Sox history.

#### YOUNG AND PRODUCTIVE

- Yoán Moncada needs one double to become the fifth player in White Sox history, age 23 or younger, to record 30-plus doubles, 15-plus home runs and 60-plus RBI in a single season.
- He would join Chet Lemon (1977), Frank Thomas (1991), Paul Konerko (1999) and Carlos Lee (1999) ... also would be the first Sox, 23 or younger, with a 30+ 2B/15+ HR/60+ RBI/10+ SB season.

#### GRAB SOME BENCH

- Chicago has struck out 1,570 times in 2018, the most in MLB this season, the most in a single season in franchise history and the second-most in a season in MLB history.
- Milwaukee owns the single-season mark with 1,571 in 2017.
- Yoán Moncada leads MLB with 215 strikeouts, five more than the Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton (210) ... he is seven shy of tying Adam Dunn (222 in 2012) for the club record.

#### QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- Chicago has made 1,389 QS since 2003, the second-most in MLB behind the Mets (1,390) during that span, and 58 more than Oakland (1,331), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox rank third in the AL with 74 quality starts in 2018 ... RHPs Reynaldo López and James Shields are tied for seventh in the AL with 19 quality starts this season.

**RODÓN AT A GLANCE**

- The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 20th and final start of the season, 11th on the road and second against Minnesota.
- Is 0-4 with a 6.84 ERA (20 ER/26.1 IP), 17 strikeouts and a .311 (33-106) opponents average over his last five starts ... the four-game losing streak matches a career-high (also from 6/3-7/31/16).
- His 471 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 85 career games ... is averaging 8.59 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (493.1 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus seven times in his career.
- Started the 2018 season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.
- Entered the 2014 draft rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

**LAST START**

- Suffered the loss on 9/23 vs. the Cubs, allowing season highs in runs (six) and hits (nine) over a season-low 2.1 IP ... struck out three and walked one.
- Allowed three runs in the first inning, one in the second and two in the third ... allowed a solo home run to Kyle Schwarber in the second.
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 5-0, in the third ... threw a season-low 66 pitches (41 strikes) ... the Sox went on to lose, 6-1.

**ROAD WARRIOR LOS**

- Is 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA (15 ER/47.2 IP), 32 strikeouts and a .186 (29-156) opponents average over his last seven road starts (six quality) ... has allowed just three home runs during that span.
- Has gone 11-14 with a 3.70 ERA (104 ER/252.2) over 42 career appearances (40 starts) on the road ... opponents are hitting .250 (234-936) with 30 home runs lifetime.

**QUALITY IS KEY**

- Has made 11 quality starts in 2018 ... tossed nine consecutive quality starts, going 5-0 with a 1.84 ERA (13 ER/63.2 IP), 49 strikeouts and a .151 (32-212) opponents average ... the nine straight quality starts were the most by a Sox pitcher since he tossed 10 straight from 8/11/15-4/13/16.
- Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21/17.
- Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
- Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
- Is 26-11 with a 2.45 ERA (103 ER/377.2 IP) in 57 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (50 QS).

**LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES**

- Is limiting lefties to a .227 (95-419) average with 10 home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .255 (366-1,434) with 51 homers.
- Charlie Blackmon, Jackie Bradley Jr. (twice), Robinson Canó, Joey Gallo, Jason Kipnis, David Ortiz, Kyle Schwarber, Corey Seager and Shohei Ohtani are the only lefties to homer off Rodón.

**CARLOS ON THE MEND**

- Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

**2018 HIGHLIGHTS**

- Tied his career high with his fifth straight win on 8/17 at New York-AL (2 ER/7.0 IP) ... recorded the victory on 8/22 vs. Minnesota (2 ER/6.0 IP) ... earned his fourth win of the season on 8/15 at Detroit (3 ER/8.0 IP) after recording his seventh straight quality start.
- Threw 8.0 scoreless IP in his sixth quality start on 8/10 vs. Cleveland ... allowed one unearned run over 6.0 IP on 8/4 at Tampa Bay ... went 7.0-plus IP for the third straight start on 7/29 vs. Toronto (ND; 2 ER/7.2 IP) ... struck out a season-high eight batters on 7/24 at Los Angeles-AL.
- Recorded a career-high 15.1 consecutive scoreless IP from 7/5-24 ... earned his second win of the season on 7/11 at St. Louis, allowing just three hits over 7.1 scoreless IP ... recorded his second quality start on 7/5 at Houston (ND; 2 ER/6.0 IP).
- Collected his first win of 2018 on 6/24 vs. Oakland, allowing two runs on seven hits over a career-high tying 8.0 IP ... allowed just two runs over 5.0 IP in his second start on 6/14 vs. Cleveland ... made his season debut on 6/9 at Boston, suffering the loss after allowing four runs (two earned) over 5.0 IP.

**VS. MINNESOTA TWINS**

- Is scheduled to make his 10th career appearance (ninth start) against Minnesota and sixth (fifth) at Target Field ... is 5-2 with a 3.44 ERA (20 ER/52.1 IP) lifetime and 2-2 with a 3.18 ERA (10 ER/28.1 IP) on the road.
- Has gone 4-0 with a 3.20 ERA (9 ER/25.1 IP), 29 strikeouts and a .198 (17-86) opponents average over his last four starts ... earned the win in his last start on 8/22 in Chicago (2 ER/6.0 IP) ... won his last start at Target Field on 9/2/16, allowing four runs (three earned) over 7.0 IP.

**TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER**

- RHP Dylan Covey (5-13, 5.06) is scheduled to make his 27th appearance (21st start) of the season, 13th (11th) on the road and second against the Minnesota Twins.
- Is 0-6 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER/40.0 IP) over his last eight starts, but has tossed 12.0 scoreless IP over his last two starts ... has gone 4-11 with a 5.38 ERA (62 ER/103.2 IP) and .274 (113-412) opponents average in 20 starts this season.
- Received a no decision in his last start on 9/24 vs. Cleveland, allowing six hits with one walk and seven strikeouts over 6.0 scoreless IP ... the Sox lost, 4-0.
- Will make just his second career appearance against the Twins ... received a no decision in his only start on 4/14/17 at Target Field (1 ER/5.1 IP).
