**RAY MATTER**—Last night the Rays allowed 2 runs in the 9th inning for a 5-4 loss, falling to 46-3 (.939) when leading after 8 innings, with the other losses coming on June 18 at HOU and April 5 at BOS...it was their first such loss at home since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS...they dropped to .500 for the 12th time this season, and fell to 1-4 in their last 5 games—with the tie-breaking run scoring in the 9th inning or later in all of those games.

- + The Rays would need a win tonight to avoid falling below .500 for the first time since the end of play on July 6 at NYM (43-44).
- + The Rays are 8-10 since the All-Star break and 9-13 in their last 22 games, incl. 4-12 against teams entering the series under .500.
- + The Rays enter tonight's rubber match having lost two of their last four home series (Marlins, White Sox) following a stretch of five consecutive series wins at home...they are 7-7 in their last 14 games at Tropicana Field after going 14-1 at home from June 11-July 11... tonight's game concludes a stretch of 15 of 19 games at home.
- + The Rays are 18-18-0 in series play this season (11-7-0 at home).

**UNDER THE LEATHER**—Last night was the third time in club history a Rays opponent made 5 errors in a game, following May 18, 2011 at TOR (6-5 win) and Aug 5, 1998 vs. CWS (7-3 win)...while it was the first time the Rays lost with their opponent doing so, it was also the first time they lost with their opponent making 4 errors since Aug 11, 2013 at LAD, and it was the third time the Rays lost at home with their opponent making 4 errors, following Sep 10, 2003 vs. TOR and Sep 2, 2003 vs. SEA.

**RAYS vs. ORIOLES**—The Rays are 7-8 this season against the Orioles (3-2 at home, 4-6 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards)...the remaining 4 games in the season series are at home, as they host the Orioles again from Sep 7-9... the Rays have allowed 98 runs and 31 HR in the season series, averages of 6.53 runs and 2.07 HR per game...their highest marks against a single opponent in a season are 136 runs in 2002 against the Blue Jays and 33 HR (twice, see chart)...the Rays were outscored, 84-51, and outthundered, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue.

- + Last night the Rays allowed back-to-back homers to **Tim Beckham** and **Adam Jones** on consecutive pitches in the 1st inning...it was the sixth time the Rays allowed back-to-back homers this season and the fourth time they've done that against the Orioles.
- + The Rays have lost by 9+ runs three times against the O's, and their margin of defeat has been 9+ runs once in their other 99 games.
- + 22.9 pct. of the Orioles wins this season have come vs. TB.

**UP NEXT: BLUE JAYS**—Starting tomorrow, 13 of the club's final 47 games are against the Blue Jays...they will visit Rogers Centre on each of the final three road trips, and host the Blue Jays in the final series of the season, Sep 28-30...this will be their first trip to Toronto since Aug 14-17, 2017—and it is the latest into a season they have ever made their first trip there... previously, they were there before the end of May in 16 of 20 seasons, including the last eight years, and their latest trip to Toronto was July 19-20, 2000...the Rays are 5-1 against the Blue Jays this season, most recently a 3-game sweep from June 11-13...they went 9-10 last season, just their second losing season against the Blue Jays in the Rays era (2014)...they are 190-168 (.531) all-time, their most wins against any opponent.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—The Rays are 21-27 (.438) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 42) and 1-run losses (Mets/Orioles, 21)...the Rays have played five straight 1-run games, matching their longest streak of the season (April 8-13 at BOS/CWS, vs. PHI)...for the record, only once in club history have they played six straight 1-run games: Sep 12-18, 2010 at TOR, vs. NYY/LAA...the 48 1-run games are the most for a team through 114 games since the 1994 Dodgers (50) and most for an AL team since the 1993 Royals (51)...42.1 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.7 pct. of games in the majors...47.4

pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest rate in the majors.

- + The Rays are on pace for 38 1-run losses, which hasn't been done by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a single season is 30 (2015)...40.7 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 35 games at home: 24 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by **Hunter Wood**, the 30th time the Rays will use an opener and their sixth time using Wood in that role...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 5th in the majors and 4th in the AL with a 3.56 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays announced in spring a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer** (traded), **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** (traded) and **Jake Faria**, but they have used other starters in 56 of 114 games (49.1 pct.).
- + The Rays have used an opener in 29 games, and they are 13-16 in these games...the openers have pitched to a 4.20 ERA (40.2-IP, 19-ER), including a 2.20 ERA (32.2-IP, 8-ER) in the last 21 games...the team has a 3.99 ERA (259.1-IP, 115-ER) in games started by openers.
- + The Rays have employed a bullpen day in an additional 21 games this season, and are 11-10 when doing so...they have used a traditional starter in 64 games, and have gone 33-31 in those games.
- + For clarification, an opener is used to face 3-9 batters, depending on matchups, while a "bullpen day" starter tends to pitch deeper but generally no more than two times through the order.

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled 40 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors since the 1992 Tigers (41), and 18 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors since the 1953 Brooklyn Dodgers (22) and most in the AL since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...their 99 apps of at least 2 IP are most in the majors since the 2004 Expos (106), 46 apps of at least 3 IP are most since the 1996 Mariners (46) and 29 apps of at least 4 IP are most since the 1983 Athletics (32).

- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 551.2 IP, most in the majors by 106 IP (Padres) and most in the AL by 117.1 IP (Angels).

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**—The Rays have used 20 different rookies this season, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (19) and a club record (18, 2015)...10 players have made their major league debut for the Rays this season, tied for 3rd in the majors and tying the club record (2002, 2003).

- + Rays rookies have combined for 456 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (434)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 44 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (51)...the Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher in 12 of their 18 games since the All-Star break.
- + 17 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 12 players with less than 1 year of service time... the only pitchers on the active roster with more than 2 years of service time are **Sergio Romo** (10.059) and **Blake Snell** (2.034).
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 26 years, 8 months.

**RAYS ON THE TUBE**—"Inside the Rays: In the Community" will premiere on FOX Sports Sun following Saturday's Rays-Blue Jays game...the episode takes viewers behind the scenes of the organization's year-round pledge to making a Major League impact on the lives of thousands of fans across Tampa Bay, and includes a trio of features spotlighting Hurricane Maria relief efforts, youth ballpark renovations and the "Reading With The Rays" program...among those interviewed were Rays President **Brian Auld**, Rays Baseball Foundation Executive Director **Stephen Thomas**, bench coach **Charlie Montoyo** and field coordinator **Rocco Baldelli**.

**PLAYERS' WEEKEND**—Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association announced today that Players' Weekend will return for its second year for games scheduled from Aug 24-26... Players' Weekend will showcase the personalities and interests of players by allowing them to select a nickname for the back of their jersey as well as wear and use uniquely colored and designed equipment...players will wear specially designed uniforms created for the three games with jerseys by Majestic, caps by New Era and socks from Stance.

**LAST OUTING**—On Sun vs. CWS, pitched around a 2-out single for a scoreless 1st, then allowed a run in the 2nd on a leadoff walk, strikeout, steal, groundout and RBI single by **Tim Anderson**...allowed another steal and another walk and was replaced with 2-on, 2-out...threw 26 pitches to record 2 outs in the 2nd inning, and only 55.8 pct. of pitches in his outing were strikes...was the first time in his career he allowed multiple walks in an app...his line: ND, 1.2 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 3 SO, 43 pit, 24 str.

**A NEW LOOK**—Will be making the sixth start of his career, all since July 11, and a third start in an 8-day span...has a 2.16 ERA (8.1-IP, 2-ER) with 15 SO and 0 HR in his 5 starts, compared to a 3.86 ERA (14-IP, 6-ER) with 14 SO and 3 HR in 8 apps out of the bullpen...the Rays have used an opener in 29 games, and they are 13-16 when doing so...has gone 1 IP, 2 IP, 1.2 IP, 2 IP and 1.2 IP in his 5 starts, all between 5-9 BF.

**THIRD STINT**—Has a 3.15 ERA (20-IP, 7-ER) in 12 apps (5 starts) since his June 30 recall, his first extended action in the majors...all 3 HR allowed have been solo (MIA **JT Riddle**, MIA **Cameron Maybin**, BAL **Austin Wynn**)...was in the majors earlier this season from April 17-24, pitching once, and a 1-day stint on May 14 (did not pitch).

- + Has gone at least 2 IP in six of his 13 apps (5 starts) this season, and has recorded 4 outs or more in 9 apps, including four of his 5 starts.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Went 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (42-IP, 14-ER) and 63 SO in 24 apps (2 starts) with Triple-A Durham...went at least 2 IP in 14 of his 24 outings there, and his season high was 3 IP (twice, last June 7) and 49 pitches (May 6).

- + After his last option, pitched to a 1.75 ERA (25.2-IP, 5-ER) in 14 apps (1 start).
- + Has spent parts of the last two seasons with the Bulls, and is 5-3 with a 3.78 ERA (95.1-IP, 40-ER) and 110 SO in his career at the Triple-A level.
- + Has made 73 career starts in the minor leagues.

**MIX & MATCH**—Is one of 15 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Athletics (13)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2004 (14) and 2003 (14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...the Rays have used 31 different pitchers this season, 2nd in the majors behind the Cubs (32)...this is also a club record for an entire season, passing 2017 (30)...this will be the 45th time the Rays start a rookie pitcher, 2nd in the majors behind the Marlins (51).

**LAST SEASON**—Spent all of last season in the minors aside from a one-day stint on May 30 at TEX...made his major league debut that night, retiring **No-mar Mazara** for the final out of the 8th inn. ...received the news of his call up with roughly an hour to catch the flight...the family missed baggage check-in at the Montgomery airport by two minutes and had to drive to Birmingham for an alternate flight...he arrived at Globe Life Park in the 2nd inning.

- + He and **José Alvarado** both bypassed Triple-A for their major league debuts, the first Rays to do that since **Scott Kazmir** in 2004.
- + Optioned back to Montgomery after his debut...made 12 starts with the Biscuits and was promoted to Triple-A Durham on June 16...combined for a career-high 115 SO...made 6 starts with the Bulls before making his final 13 apps of the season out of the bullpen.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (12-5, 2.27 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Sat vs. CWS, was reinstated from the 10-day DL (left shoulder fatigue) and made his first start since July 12 at MIN...his only run allowed was a solo homer by **José Abreu** in the 4th...it was his 12th consecutive home start yielding 1 ER or fewer, dating back to Sep 12, 2017 vs. NYY, tied for the longest such streak in the majors since 1913—when earned runs were officially kept in both leagues, according to the Elias Sports Bureau...his line: ND, 4 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 59 pit, 34 str.

**WHEN HE'S ON**—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 17 starts, tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind HOU **Justin Verlander** (18), including 2 runs or fewer in 10 of his last 12 starts since May 18...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 13 starts, tied with Verlander and BOS **Chris Sale** for 2nd-most in the AL behind TB **Ryne Stanek** (15)...has allowed 1 run or fewer in five of his last 6 starts since June 19 and in eight of his last 11 starts.

**LEADERBOARDS**—Ranks 4th in the AL with a 2.27 ERA, behind BOS **Chris Sale** (2.04), HOU **Justin Verlander** (2.19) and CLE **Trevor Bauer** (2.25), and is tied for 5th in the AL with 12 wins...also ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.190, 3rd), WHIP (1.07, 8th) and wild pitches (13, tied for 2nd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .076 opp avg. with RISP, and .049 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...is averaging a career-high 95.5 mph on his fastball, 5th in the AL and tied for 1st among major league lefties...13.5 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 6th-highest in the AL.

**vs. TORONTO**—Is 2-2 with a 4.62 ERA (25.1-IP, 13-ER) in 5 starts against the Blue Jays, but hasn't faced them since Aug 15, 2017 at TOR (W, 6-IP, 4-ER)...has a 1.40 SO/BB ratio in those 5 starts, with 15 BB to 21 SO...is 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA (12.2-IP, 8-ER) in 3 starts at Rogers Centre.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
