PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (32-27) vs CHICAGO CUBS (34-24)

Thursday, June 7, 2018 – Wrigley Field – 2:20 EDT – Game 60; Road 32

RHP Nick Pivetta (4-4, 3.48) vs RHP Tyler Chatwood (3-4, 4.02)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies lost a heartbreaker, 7-5, at venerable Wrigley Field ... Starter Aaron Nola (ND) went 6.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on only 4 hits with 4 walks (1 intentional) and 6 strikeouts ... The Phils trailed 3-0 as Cubs starter Jose Quintana was lifted in place of reliever Steve Cishek to face Aaron Altherr in the 6th inning ... Altherr crushed a 3-run home run on the first pitch he saw to tie the game at 3-3 ... The clubs would trade zeroes until the 9th when Dylan Cozens belted his first career home run to left field to give the Phils a 7-5 lead ... Jason Heyward would follow in the bottom of the 9th with a walk-off grand slam.
- I'M COMING HOME:** Today marks the conclusion of a 10-game, 11-day road trip that began at Dodger Stadium for four games (2-2, 5/28-31), then continued with a three-game set against the Giants in San Francisco (0-3, 6/1-3), before concluding with this three-game series against the Cubs at Wrigley (1-1, 6/5-7) ... Following this trip, the Phillies will finally head home where they will play 15 of their final 21 games of the month of June at Citizens Bank Park ... Philadelphia's six remaining road games this month will come over parts of two brief three-game series, June 15-17 at MIL and June 22-24 at WSH ... The Phillies, at 19-9 (.679) at CBP this season, own the best home record in the National League, third-best in the majors, behind only the Red Sox (22-8, .733) and Yankees (22-9, .710).
- YES SER!** Prior to allowing two runs in his second inning of work last night, **Seranthony Dominguez** extended his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to begin his career to 15.2 with a perfect 8th ... **Per Elias, it was the longest scoreless streak by a Phillies' pitcher to begin a career since Marty Bystrom began his with 20.0 scoreless innings in 1980** ... During the streak, he faced 49 batters, allowed 3 baserunners (2 H, HB) and struck out 16 ... Additionally, Dominguez drew a walk in his first career plate appearance in the top of the ninth, recording his first walk at the plate before walking his first batter of his career on the mound.
- MY KIND OF TOWN:** Since 2007, the Phillies are 20-18 (.526 win %) in 38 games at Wrigley Field ... That is the highest win percentage for any visiting Major League team with at least 10 games played on the North Side ... In fact, the Phillies are one of only four visiting teams with a record of .500 or better at Wrigley since 2007: Dodgers (20-19, .513), Reds (51-50, .505) and White Sox (16-16, .500) ... Philadelphia has a 5-4-2 series record in their 11 series against the Cubs at Wrigley in that span as well as a +22 run differential in those 38 contests ... A win today would secure Philadelphia's first series win at The Friendly Confines since July 24-26, 2105, when the Phils swept the Cubs 3-0 ... Jerome Williams started the first game of that series, Cole Hamels tossed a no-hitter in game two and Aaron Nola made his second career start and picked up his first career win in game three.
- DRAFT RECAP:** After the conclusion of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, the Phillies selected 20 pitchers (17 RHP, 3 LHP), five catchers, five outfielders, four third basemen, three shortstops and one first baseman ... Philadelphia selected **Alec Bohm** with their first pick (3rd overall) out of Wichita State ... With their 39th round pick, the Phillies selected **Matheu Nelson**, a catcher from Calvary Christian High School in Clearwater, FL ... Nelson was coached by **Roy Halladay**.
- DAY DAY, IS THIS YOUR COZEN?:** Last night, **Dylan Cozens** belted his first career home run off Brandon Morrow ... The opposite field blast, which gave the Phillies a 5-3 lead in the top of the 9th inning, left Cozens' bat at 111.3 MPH ... It was the second-hardest opposite field home run by a Phillies player since Statcast began tracking data in 2015, shy of only Jorge Alfaró's 114.5 MPH shot, April 7 versus Miami ... Additionally, it marked the first time a Phillies player hit his first career home run to give the team a lead in the 9th inning or later since David Doster, June 21, 1996, when he hit a walk-off, solo home run in the bottom of the 10th inning off Colorado's Bruce Ruffin ... Ruffin pitched for the Phillies from 1986-91.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 55 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just three teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 58 straight games (3/29-current) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since August 30, 2008-June 25, 2009 when they did so in 97 straight games.
- HAPPY BIRTHDAY, VINNY:** Today, we send birthday wishes to **Vince Velasquez** as he celebrates his 26th birthday ... Velasquez, who will start tomorrow night's game against the Brewers at Citizens Bank Park, has posted a 2.14 ERA (8 ER, 33.2 IP) over his last six starts (since 5/5) with 45 strikeouts (32.6% SO rate).
- STAFF NOTES:** Over their last 28 games (5/5-current), the Phillies starting rotation has posted a 2.52 ERA (46 ER, 164.0 IP) and has struck out 176 of the 661 batters they have faced (26.6%) ... **Philadelphia's 2.52 ERA in that span ranks 2nd in the majors by the slimmest of margins (best: WSH, 2.52 ERA, 49 ER, 175.0 IP) and their 26.6 % strikeout rate ranks 4th (best: WSH, 28.5%)** ... The staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 24 of those 28 games and 2 ER or fewer in 21 of 28.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 8,923 pitches over 2,220 plate appearances this season and their 4.02 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL (best: LAD, 4.05) and 4th in the majors (best: LAD, 4.05) ... Philadelphia has the 2nd-best walk rate in the majors at 10.1% (best: NYY, 10.2%) and rank 4th among all ML teams this season in walks (224).

LAST START: 6/1 at SF: L, 4.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO, HB ... Pivetta vs Stratton ... Philadelphia's offense was shut out for just the second time this season as their six-game winning streak against the Giants was snapped.

TODAY'S START:

- **Saint Nick: Pivetta is 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA (6 ER, 28.0 IP), 0.93 WHIP (7 BB, 19 H) and 35 SO in his last 5 starts ...** He has allowed 1 HR in those 28.0 innings and none in his last 27.0 IP
- **Striking:** Is 10th among qualifying NL starters in strikeout rate (27.6 %), and is 1 of 12 NL starters to post a SO/9.0 IP above 10.00 (10.16) thus far
- **Rough Road: His 6.00 road ERA is 92nd among 109 starters with at least 5 road starts, whereas his 2.20 home ERA is 16th among the 113 pitchers with at least 5 home starts**
- **Reverse, Reverse:** The Phillies went just 5-14 in Pivetta's first 19 career starts (6.73 ERA), and have gone 14-5 in his 19 starts since (3.78 ERA)
- **Last 14: Is 7-4, 2.96 ERA (26 ER, 79.0 IP) with 89 SO in his last 15 starts since 9/18/17 ...** Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in 14 of those 15 starts
- **Going Off-Base:** Pivetta's 1.15 WHIP (17 BB, 54 H) is 36 points lower than his WHIP in 2017 (1.51) ... He has allowed 5 or fewer hits in 11 of his 12 starts and 2 or fewer walks in 9 of 12, whereas in 2017 allowed 5 or fewer hits just 14 times all season (26 starts) and 2 or fewer walks 15 times
- **vs NL Central:** 1-2, 5.77 ERA (22 ER, 34.1 IP) in 6 starts

ROAD:

- **2018:** 1-2, 6.00 ERA (14 ER, 21.0 IP) in 5 starts
- **Career:** 5-9, 6.50 ERA (65 ER, 90.0 IP) in 19 starts
- Has a 6.50 ERA with 84 strikeouts and 46 walks in 90.0 IP in 19 career road starts and a 4.11 ERA with 126 strikeouts and 28 walks in 105.0 IP in 19 home starts

2018 SEASON:

- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Tied a career-high with 11 SO on 5/16 at BAL ... Became 3rd PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Mark Leiter Jr. accomplished the feat in relief, 8/5/17 vs COL and the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)

CAREER:

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
