SUNDAY FUNDAY: The Dodgers will take on their division rivals, the San Francisco Giants, this afternoon at Scottsdale Stadium as the clubs will meet for the final time this spring. Los Angeles last faced San Francisco in Cactus League play on February 24 at CR-G, losing to the Giants 9-3. The Boys in Blue will matchup up against their arch rivals 19 times in the upcoming season (March 29-April 1, June 15-17 and Aug. 13-15 in Los Angeles and April 6-8, April 27-29 and Sept. 28-30), including this year's lid lifter on March 29 at Dodger Stadium, which will be nationally broadcasted on ESPN. The Dodgers have 22 more exhibition games this spring; including 10 at Camelback Ranch on three Spring Training weekends and will head back to Los Angeles for a three-game Freeway Series against the Angels on March 25-27.

📌 The Dodgers took the 2017 season series from the Giants for the first time since 2014, as they went 11-8 against their NL West rivals.

OFFENSIVE SURGE: The Dodger offense led the way in yesterday's contest, as the club beat the Diamondbacks, 14-6, to record their second straight win and their fourth victory this spring. Los Angeles scored six runs in the first inning, five off of Arizona starter Robbie Ray, and never looked back. **Matt Kemp** stroked his second homer of Cactus League play with a two-run shot in the first inning and two batters later, **Kyle Farmer** followed with his own with a solo home run. **Justin Turner** also added a run with a solo blast of his own in the fourth inning for his second longball of the spring. Eight Dodger players drove in a run in yesterday's contest, with non-roster invitee **Jake Peter** leading the way with three RBI. Dodger starter **Alex Wood** recorded his second win of the spring, allowing two runs on three hits with three strikeouts in 2.1 innings. Dodger relievers **J.T. Chargois**, **CC Lee** and **Joe Broussard** each tossed a scoreless inning of relief in yesterday's ballgame.

📌 Peter, who homered for the third consecutive game with a two-run shot in the eighth inning yesterday, currently leads all big league players with 11 RBI this spring. In eight games, the non-roster invitee has gone 6-for-16 (.375) with five runs, a triple and three homers.

📌 The Dodger offense currently ranks among the top teams this spring in hits (102, T-3rd), doubles (24, 4th), home runs (17, 4th), RBI (64, 4th) and OPS (.881, 5th).

CLARK KENT-A: Right-handed pitcher **Kenta Maeda** will take the mound today for his second start of the spring after tossing 2.0 scoreless innings with one strikeout on Feb. 27 against the Rangers. Maeda, who enters his third big league season, went 13-6 with one save and posted a 4.22 ERA in 29 games (25 starts) in 2017. The Japan native struck out 140 batters against just 34 walks in 134.1 innings last year, while holding hitters to a .238 average. He made his first career stint in the bullpen, going 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP) and also recorded his first career save in his first career relief appearance on June 9 against the Reds. Over two big league seasons, he has gone 29-17 with a 3.80 ERA and has posted a 1.15 WHIP in 61 games (57 starts).

THE RING IS THE THING: The Dodgers will celebrate their 2017 pennant-winning team with a special pregame video tribute and National League championship ring ceremony prior to their 6:10 p.m. game on Saturday, March 31 against the San Francisco Giants. Los Angeles won a record fifth consecutive National League West title in 2017, while setting a Los Angeles record with 104 wins. In the postseason, the Dodgers swept the Arizona Diamondbacks in the National League Division Series before defeating the Chicago Cubs, 4-1, in the NLCS to advance to the World Series, where they fell to the Houston Astros in seven games.

A LOOK BACK: The Dodgers posted a 104-58 record in 2017, becoming the first team in NL West history to win the division in five consecutive seasons. The team earned a World Series berth after defeating the Chicago Cubs in the NLCS, 4 games to 1, and finished the season with their first NL Pennant since 1988.

📌 The Dodgers posted the seventh 100-win season in franchise history (third in Los Angeles history) and first since 1974 (102-60). The Dodgers won 90+ games for the fifth consecutive season, a feat that had only previously been accomplished once in franchise history, 1951-56 (6).

📌 Los Angeles finished with the best record in the Majors for the first time since 1974 and the National League's best record for the first time since 2009. The Dodgers set a Los Angeles record for victories with 104 (104-58), tying for the second most in franchise history (also: 1942, 104-50) and finishing one shy of the club record of 105 (105-49), set in 1953.

📌 The Dodgers topped the National League in ERA (3.38), opponents' batting average (.228, 1st MLB), strikeouts (1,549), WHIP (1.15, 1st MLB) and shutouts (16). Los Angeles' 3.39 starters' ERA topped the Majors, while the 3.38 ERA by the club's relievers led the NL (4th, MLB).

📌 The Dodgers established franchise records with 553 extra-base hits (previous high: 541 in 1953), 312 doubles (previous high: 307 in 2006) and 221 home runs (4th, NL), which topped the club's previous high of 211 set in 2000. The club also set a Los Angeles record with a .437 slugging percentage, outpacing the previous high of .432 set in 2006.

COLLEGE BASEBALL CLASSIC: Dodger Stadium will host the annual College Baseball Classic on Sunday, March 11, as three of college baseball's top 15 ranked teams will take the field at Chavez Ravine. Seventh-ranked Texas Christian University will face 14th-ranked Vanderbilt at 10:30 a.m. followed by the annual local matchup of UCLA (#11) vs. USC at 3:00p.m. Tickets begin at just \$10 for both matchups (student tickets are \$5) and can be purchased at Dodgers.com/classic.

TODAY'S PITCHING PROBABLES

- 🇺🇸 Left-hander **Henry Owens** will make his second appearance of the spring today, after allowing a run on one hit with two walks in an inning of relief on Wednesday against the Padres. Owens, who spent the past six years with the Red Sox organization (2012-17), made 26 combined starts with Double-A Portland and Triple-A Pawtucket in 2017, going 7-11 with a 4.21 ERA. He held hitters to a .216 average, while striking out 121 batters in 126.0 combined innings.
- 🇺🇸 Right-hander **Daniel Corcino** will appear in his fourth outing of Cactus League play today, after last pitching on Thursday against the Indians, allowing just one hit and striking out two in an inning of relief. Corcino has allowed one run in 2.2 innings this spring (3.38 ERA), while striking out three against two walks. The Dominican Republic native enters his 11th professional season and returns to the Dodger organization for this third stints after pitching for the clubs' minor league squads from 2015-17.
- 🇺🇸 Veteran right-hander **Mark Lowe** will make his third appearances this spring, after allowing six runs on five hits in a third of an inning on Wednesday against the Padres. Lowe is entering his 11th major league season and second stint with the Dodgers (2013) after spending last season with the White Sox and Mariners organizations. Last season, he went 3-4 with one save and posted a 6.66 ERA in a combined 40 games with Triple-A Tacoma (Mariners) and Triple-A Charlotte (White Sox), striking out 43 batters against 23 walks in 48.2 innings.
- 🇺🇸 Southpaw reliever **Brian Moran** will make his fourth appearance in Cactus League play, as he has tossed 3.2 perfect innings with five strikeouts this spring. Moran was signed by the Dodgers on July 15, 2017 and appeared in 19 games with Double-A Tulsa last year, going 0-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) and one save. He struck out 27 batters against just three walks, while posting a 0.79 WHIP.
- 🇺🇸 Cuban native **Yaisel Sierra** is set to make his third appearance of the spring, after allowing two runs on three hits in an inning of relief on Tuesday against the Rangers. In 1.2 innings of relief this spring, he has allowed four runs (two earned), while striking out one against two walks. Sierra is in his third season in the Dodgers organization and last year, he went 5-1 with a 3.04 ERA in 39 combined games with Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City.
