**ROSTER MOVE**—The Rays have designated INF **Brad Miller** for assignment and recalled 1B/OF **Jake Bauers** from Triple-A Durham...Bauers, who will wear No. 9, will be making his major league debut...at 22 years, 244 days old today, he will be the youngest positional player to appear in a game for the Rays since **Wil Myers** in 2013...Bauers hit .279/.357/.426 (55-for-197) with 14 2B, 5 HR, 24 RBI and 10 SB in 52 games (51 starts; 45-1B, 4-LF, 2-RF) with the Bulls, his second season at the Triple-A level.

**IN THE COMMUNITY**—In partnership with Feeding Tampa Bay, the Rays Wives will participate in a children's hunger backpack program event prior to tonight's game...the Backpack Program supplies thousands of local children with bags of shelf-stable, nutritious foods to take home over the weekend and during summer vacation...these child friendly, easy-to-process meals and snacks are given to the one in four children who are at risk of going hungry on days when they are not in school...the Rays Wives will stuff approximately 700 bags.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost six consecutive games, their 2nd-longest losing streak of the season to March 30–April 8 (8)...they haven't held a lead in five of the 6 games during this stretch...this stretch has dropped the Rays from a season-high 2 games over .500 to 28-32, the first time they have been 4 games below .500 since May 15 (18-22)...in addition, they have gone from 4.5 GB of the second Wild Card to 8.5 GB.

- + This is the first time in club history the Rays have had three separate 5-game winning streaks and three separate 5-game losing streaks in the same season...the Rays are one of three teams with three separate 5-game winning streaks, joining the Astros and Yankees...they are one of four teams with three separate 5-game losing streaks, along with the Orioles, Royals and White Sox.
- + The Rays have gone 13-13 thus far over this stretch of 40 games in 41 days from May 11–June 20...they have gone 0-5 over this stretch of 25 out of 28 games from June 1–July 1 against teams currently positioned to make the postseason...they are 10-23 (.303) this season against teams currently .500 or better and 18-9 otherwise.
- + The Rays have played 23 games decided by 1 run, 2nd-most in the majors to the Mariners (27)...they are 9-14 (.391) in 1-run games, and their 14 losses are tied with the White Sox for most in the majors.

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING**—The Rays have been swept in consecutive series, by the Mariners (0-3) and Nationals (0-2)...they have been swept six times this season, tied for 3rd-most in the majors behind the Orioles (9) and White Sox (8)...three of these six sweeps have come in 2-game series...from the other side, the Rays have swept three series this season, matching their total from last year...in addition, five times this season they have lost when a win would have clinched a series sweep.

- + Yesterday at WAS, the Rays allowed 11 runs, their most since May 13 at BAL (17) and tied for their 2nd-most of the season...five of the first 6 BF reached and scored, and the 5 runs allowed in the 1st inning were their most since June 2, 2017 at SEA (5).

**DOMESTIC SWEET DOME**—The Rays went 3-6 on their 3-city, 10-day road trip to Oakland, Seattle and Washington...the Rays have played only 24 games at home, fewest in the majors (Rockies, 27)...while they are 11-13 overall at home, they have 9-6 (.600) in their last 15 games since April 18.

- + The Rays made four straight 3-city road trips to start the season.
- + After missing 4 games due to a personal medical issue, pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** returned to the Rays today...he was discharged from a Seattle-area hospital on Sunday, flew home Monday and was cleared to return to work.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE**—The Rays have scored 6 runs in their last 4 games and 12 runs in their last 6 games...they have scored 2 runs or fewer in four consecutive games, their longest such streak since Aug 4-9, 2017 (5)...they have scored 3 runs or fewer in six consecutive games, their longest such streak since April 27–May 3, 2015 (6)...they haven't been held to 3 runs or fewer in seven straight games since Oct 3, 2010–April 7, 2011.

- + The Rays are batting .196 (40-for-204) during this 6-game losing streak to lower their season avg. from .262 to .255...the Rays are batting .143 (5-for-35) with RISP during their losing streak.

**JOHNNY WHOLESTAFF**—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the third start of his major league career...he is one of a major-league-leading 12 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season...never before in the "Rays" era (2008–current) has the club used 12 different starting pitchers for an entire season...the 12 different starters are their most since they were known as the Devil Rays in 2006 (12).

- + The Rays used only eight starters all of last season.
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 261 IP, 14.2 IP more than any other team (Padres, 246.1 IP)...the Rays starters have covered 275.1 IP, fewest in the majors by 34.2 IP (White Sox, 310 IP).
- + The Rays have already used 25 different pitchers, most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (24).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 19 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of BAL/DET/MIA (8 each), and their most for any season since 2005 (23)
- + 10 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (5), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + 37 apps of at least 2 IP, 3rd-most in the AL (SD 42, NYM 39)
- + 20 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (SD/KC, 11)
- + 15 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 4)

**RAYS vs. MARINERS**—The Rays are 74-96 (.435) all-time against the Mariners (36-44 at home, 38-52 on the road)...they were swept by the Mariners last weekend, extending their losing streak at Safeco Field to nine straight—their first 9-game losing streak at any opposing ballpark since Sep 11, 2007–Sep 8, 2008, when they were 0-9 at Fenway Park...one more loss would give the Rays their fifth straight losing season series against the Mariners...overall, the Rays are 1-9 in their last 10 games against them...they are 3-9 in their last 12 home games and 6-12 in their last 18 after an 8-game winning streak here from Aug 19, 2011–July 20, 2012.

- + Since the start of the 2015 offseason, the Rays and Mariners have made nine trades, including a four-player deal on May 25...former Mariners on Rays 40-man roster include **Andrew Kittredge**, **Andrew Moore** (2017), **Vidal Nuño** (2015-16), **Chaz Roe**, **Mallex Smith**, **Jesús Sucre** (2013-16) and **Ryan Yarbrough**.

**MINOR MATTERS**—The Rays have made the following changes to their coaching staffs at the Short-A and Rookie-levels: **Rafael Valenzuela**, who was previously slated for Short-A Hudson Valley, will coach for Rookie-level Princeton...in his place, **Sean Smedley** will be assigned to Hudson Valley...the Rays have added **Jim Morrison** to the staff of the GCL Rays.

- + Yesterday the Midwest League announced their midseason All-Star Teams...six Hot Rods made the Eastern Division team: **RH Riley O'Brien**, **C Ronaldo Hernández**, **2B Vidal Brujan**, **3B Zach Rutherford**, **SS Taylor Walls** and **OF Moisés Gómez**.
- + Major League Baseball's First-Year Player Draft concluded yesterday with Rounds 11-40...among the Rays selections on the third day were **John Rodriguez** (37th round), an infielder from Stoneman Douglas High School, and **RH David Luethje**, a right-handed pitcher from Vero Beach High School.

**ROSTER MAKEOVER**—Only three players from the Opening Day roster (active or disabled list) for **Kevin Cash**'s managerial debut on April 6, 2015 remain in the organization: **Matt Andriese**, **Chris Archer** and **Kevin Kiermaier** (60-day DL)...Archer and Kiermaier are the only players remaining from the 2013 postseason roster, the last playoff appearance for the Rays...Kiermaier was on the roster for that season's AL Wild Card Game, but not the ALDS...only 11 players from this season's Opening Day roster have been on the active roster all year: **José Alvarado**, **Matt Andriese**, **C.J. Cron**, **Daniel Robertson**, **Rob Refsnyder**, **Chaz Roe**, **Wilson Ramos**, **Sergio Romo**, **Mallex Smith**, **Blake Snell** and **Jesús Sucre**.

**#VOTERAYS**—For the fourth straight season, All-Star balloting is being conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at [mlb.com](http://mlb.com), all 30 club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark apps...fans can cast votes for starters a total of 35 times including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in any 24-hour period...the Midsummer Classic will be held on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C., the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital.

**BETTER OF LATE**—Six of his last 7 apps (2 starts) have been scoreless...has yielded 2 runs in 8.2 IP over this span, bringing his season ERA from 7.36 to 3.65...last pitched on Tues at WAS and struck out **Trea Turner**, **Bryce Harper** and **Anthony Rendon** in a perfect 8th inning, the fifth time in his career he struck out the side.

- + Took his first career loss in his last start, Thurs at OAK...pitched a perfect 1st inning and left with 2-on, 1-out in the 2nd inning, and both runners came around to score with **Ryan Yarbrough** on the mound.
- + Has made a pair of scoreless apps in his career against the Mariners.

**A NEW LOOK**—Will be making the third start of his major league career, following May 26 vs. BAL and Thurs at OAK...he started 41 games in the minors, most recently on June 4, 2016 at Jacksonville (Marlins), with Double-A Montgomery...in that game, he totaled 6 IP, 5 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 100 pitches—just the second game of his career with double-digit strikeouts...is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (3-IP, 2-ER) in his 2 starts.

- + His season high (majors or minors) is 1.2 IP (last Sat at SEA) and 40 pitches (May 8 vs. ATL)...his career highs in the majors are 2 IP (2x-last Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL) and 47 pitches (Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL).

**MAKING THE LEAP**—Recalled on May 19 for his second stint this season (also May 5-12)...opened the season with Triple-A Durham and compiled a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) and 17 SO in 10 apps for the Bulls...over the last two minor league seasons, has recorded a 1.33 ERA (54.1-IP, 8-ER) with 77 SO and 22 BB, good for a 12.75 SO/9 IP ratio and a .210 opp avg. ...in the majors during this time, he has a 5.01 ERA (32.1-IP, 18-ER) with 44 SO, 18 BB and a .256 opp avg. (32-for-125).

**STAR POWER**—Staneck has yielded 2 HR this season, a grand slam to **Manny Machado** on May 11 at BAL and a 2-run shot to **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA...has yielded 8 HR in 32 apps (2 starts) spanning 32.1 IP in his career, but 5 HR came over a stretch of 5 apps and 6 IP, over multiple stints in the majors from June 8-Sep 2, 2017.

**MIX & MATCH**—Is one of 12 starting pitchers already used by the Rays this season, most in the majors—no other team has used more than 10...never before in the "Rays" era (2008-current) has the club used 12 different starting pitchers for an entire season...the 12 different starters are their most since they were known as the Devil Rays in 2006 (12).

**GIVE HIM THE HEATER, RICKY**—Has averaged 98.3 mph on his fastball this season, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...only two other pitchers have reached 100.5 mph in a start this season: LAA **Shohei Ohtani** was clocked between 100.6-101.0 four times on April 24 at HOU, and HOU **Gerrit Cole** was clocked at 100.7 once on June 1 vs. BOS...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** (23) in 2013...last Sep 2 at CWS, he allowed a solo homer to **Avisail Garcia** on a 100.7 mph pitch, according to StatCast—the fastest pitch thrown by a Ray since data is available (2008) that was hit over the fence...ranked by *Baseball America* as having the Best Fastball in the organization each of the past two seasons.

**ELITE COMPANY**—Was named after Hall of Fame 2B **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became just the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

**WOO PIG SOOIE**—As a junior at the University of Arkansas, he was 10-2 with a 1.39 ERA (98.1-IP, 15-ER) in 16 starts...over his collegiate career, went 22-8 with a 2.55 ERA in 48 apps (45 starts).

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
