### TRIBE HEADLINES

» **COREY KLUBER** owns the lowest intradivisional ERA in MLB (min. 40.0IP), going 6-1 with a 1.32 ERA (7ER/47.2IP) in seven starts vs. A.L. Central opponents this season.

» **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** (24 HR), **FRANCISCO LINDOR** (21) and **EDWIN ENCARNACION** (20) have combined for 65 homers, as Cleveland is the only team in MLB with three 20-homer hitters...the 2001 Indians are the only other team in franchise history with three such players before the All-Star break.

» Cleveland has won each of its last seven games against the A.L. Central (25-13 overall), holding divisional opponents to three-or-fewer runs in all seven of those wins.

### ROYAL WELCOME

» The Indians travel to Kansas City this week for the first of three trips this season to Kauffman Stadium...coming in game 83 of the campaign, tonight's game marks the Tribe's latest opener at Kansas City since the 1996 campaign (July 15, Game 92).

» Cleveland has gone 4-2 thus far against the Royals, taking two of three games in a pair of series at Progressive Field (April 6-8, May 11-13)...the Indians went 12-7 against Kansas City in their 2017 slate, including a record of 5-4 at Kauffman Stadium.

» In a rivalry that dates back to 1969, the Indians own an all-time record of 362-330 (.523) vs. the Royals, as well as a 59-42 (.584) mark since **Terry Francona** became Tribe manager in 2013.

» The two clubs have combined to win each of the last three A.L. Central titles, and the American League has been represented by the Indians or Royals in three of the past four World Series.

### CENTRAL FOCUS

» Cleveland has gone 25-13 against the A.L. Central, with a series record of 7-3-2...the Indians' .658 intradivisional winning percentage ranks 3rd in the A.L. (4th in MLB)...the Tribe has gone 18-4 in divisional home games and 7-9 on the road.

» The Indians have allowed three-or-fewer runs in 26 of their 38 divisional contests this season, including each of their last seven...the Tribe owns a 23-3 record across those 26 games.

» In 38 intradivisional games, Tribe pitchers have posted a 2.85 ERA (109ER/343.2IP), marking the 2nd-lowest intradivisional ERA in the American League and the 3rd-lowest in MLB.

### YESTERDAY'S RECAP

» The Indians improved to 20-8 in series finales and set a number of 2018 season-highs in a 15-3 victory at Oakland...the Tribe's 15 runs, 20 hits, 11 doubles and 13 extra-base hits were all season highs...six different players recorded multi-hit games.

» **FRANCISCO LINDOR** again paced the Tribe offense, going 3-for-4 with a solo homer and two doubles...**YONDER ALONSO** went 4-for-6 with two doubles and three RBI...**EDWIN ENCARNACION** was 2-for-4 and hit his 20th homer of the season with a 7th-inning solo shot.

» **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** and **LONNIE CHISENHALL** each collected three hits with two doubles and two RBI, while **MICHAEL BRANTLEY** chipped in a 2-for-5 effort with a double and two RBI.

» **MIKE CLEVERING** improved to 7-3, holding the A's to three runs on eight hits in 6.0+ innings of work (2BB, 5K)...the Tribe bullpen held Oakland to one hit over 3.0 shutout innings, with **MARC RZEPZYNSKI** making his return to the Tribe (0.1IP, 1K).

### A DAY TO REMEMBER

» The Tribe's offensive performance yesterday afternoon set a number of season highs at both the club and league levels.

» Cleveland's 20 hits yesterday were T2nd-most in an MLB game this season (OAK: 21 hits on April 11 at LAD) and the team's most since recording 22 in a 15-4 win on May 14, 2014 at Toronto.

» The Indians' 13 extra-base hits and 11 doubles were both single-game highs by any MLB team this season...Cleveland last had 13 extra-base hits in a game in a 22-4 rout at Yankee Stadium on April 18, 2009 (also 13 XBH), while the Tribe's 11 doubles were 2nd-most in club history (12 doubles, July 13, 1996 at Minnesota) and the most in MLB since Kansas City also hit 11 on August 11, 2003 vs. New York-AL.

» Cleveland's season-high 15 runs also matched their highest output from the 2017 campaign (June 26 vs. Texas).

Mitch Reeves went 3-for-5 with a double and an RBI...Hosea Nelson was 2-for-4 with two doubles and a run scored.

### KLUBER DAY

» **COREY KLUBER** is set to make his second start this season against the Kansas City Royals...won his first start on May 13 at Progressive Field, allowing two runs (both unearned) on eight hits over 7.0 innings (0BB, 4K) in the Tribe's 11-2 victory.

» In 21 career starts against Kansas City, Kluber has gone 10-6 with a 2.82 ERA (43ER/137.0IP), with wins in each of his last four starts (dating back to September 21, 2016).

» **Kluber owns a 6-1 record with a 1.32 ERA (7ER/47.2IP) in seven starts against the A.L. Central, marking the lowest intradivisional ERA in MLB (min. 40.0IP)**...Central foes are hitting just .166 against him, good for the 4th-lowest intradivisional opponent batting average in MLB (min. 40.0IP).

» He is also making his 9th start of the season on the road, where he has gone 4-3 with a 3.68 ERA (21ER/51.1IP)...he is 2-0 in two divisional road starts with a 1.84 ERA (3ER/14.2IP).

» Kluber continues to lead the American League with 1.03 walks per 9.0 innings (13BB/113.1IP), while he also sits T2nd in wins (11), 5th in innings pitched (113.1), 7th in ERA, 7th in opponent batting average (.203) and 9th in strikeouts (115).

### 20/20 VISION

» **EDWIN ENCARNACION's** solo homer yesterday marked his 20th of the season (T8th in A.L.)...became the 3rd Tribe batter to reach the milestone this season, joining **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** (24, T2nd in A.L.) and **FRANCISCO LINDOR** (21, T5th in A.L.).

» The three players' 65 combined homers are the most of any trio in MLB this season, and Cleveland is the only team boasting three players with 20-or-more home runs.

» The trio is also just the second in franchise history to each sit at 20 home runs before the All-Star break, joining the 2001 club...in that season, **Jim Thome** (26 first-half homers), **Juan González** (23) and **Ellis Burks** (21) reached the All-Star break with 70 combined homers, needing just 77 team games for all three to hit 20.

» Reaching the feat in 82 team games, the 2018 Tribe are the fastest team to have three players eclipse 20 home runs since the 2006 White Sox, who did so in 80 games (**Thome**, **Jermaine Dye** and **Paul Konerko**).

### DYNAMIC DUO

» **FRANCISCO LINDOR** and **JOSÉ RAMÍREZ** combined for four doubles, a homer, four RBI and six runs scored in yesterday's game...Lindor ranks T1st in MLB this season with 48 extra-base hits (tied with MIN's **Eduardo Escobar**) while Ramírez is 3rd at 47.

» Lindor's performance yesterday was already his 3rd game this season with three-or-more extra-base hits (T2nd in A.L. & MLB)...with 80 games left in the season, Lindor needs just one more such game to match the club single-season record in the *Baseball Reference Play Index era (1908-)*...**Shoeless Joe Jackson** (1912), **Earl Averill** (1934), **Jeff Heath** (1941), **Manny Ramirez** (1998) and **Travis Hafner** (2004) each had seasons with four games of three-or-more extra-base hits.

» 20 of Lindor's 21 home runs this season have come from the leadoff spot in the batting order, tied with Boston's **Mookie Betts** for the most in MLB...he also leads Major League Baseball with 70 runs scored, the most by a Tribe batter through 82 team games since **Grady Sizemore** in 2006 (also 70 runs).

» Ramírez continues to rank 3rd in the A.L. in total bases (187), 4th in walks (51), 4th in on-base percentage (.399), 4th in slugging percentage (.607), 4th in OPS (1.007) and T6th in runs scored (58).

### STARTING STRONG

» Tribe starting pitchers rank 2nd in the American League (3rd in MLB) with a combined 3.39 ERA this season...the club's 53 quality starts this season rank 2nd in MLB (Houston - 62).

» Indians starters have also struck out 527 batters (2nd-most in MLB) against just 125 walks (3rd-fewest in MLB), good for a collective 4.22 K/BB ratio that is 2nd-best in MLB (LAD - 4.24).

### MISC. BATTING NOTES

» **LONNIE CHISENHALL** has hit .392 (20-51) across 18 games since June 10 with four doubles, a triple, a homer and seven RBI.

» **YONDER ALONSO** is batting .308 (20-65) over his past 16 games with seven doubles, a homer, 12 RBI and eight runs scored.

### TONIGHT'S START VS. KANSAS CITY

» Kluber is scheduled to make his 18th start of the year in the opener of the Tribe's three-contest series against the Kansas City Royals...will mark his 186th career outing and 181st start.

» Will be pitching on extended five days' rest after his last outing on June 26 at St. Louis...recorded the shortest start of his career, taking the loss after allowing six runs on six hits (two home runs), with one walk and two strikeouts across 1.2 innings.

» Tonight will mark Kluber's second start of the season against the Royals...last faced them on May 13 at Progressive Field, notching his sixth win of the season after tossing 7.0 strong innings (8H, 2R/0ER, 4K)...owns a career 10-6 record and 2.82 ERA (43ER/137.0IP) in 21 starts vs. the Royals.

» Kluber owns a 1.32 ERA (7ER/47.2IP) in eight starts against the A.L. Central this season...his 1.32 mark is the lowest ERA vs. the Central (min. 40.0IP), as well as the lowest intradivisional ERA in MLB.

### VS. KANSAS CITY | A.L. CENTRAL

» Tonight will mark Kluber's second start of the year vs. Kansas City...held the Royals to two unearned runs on eight hits over 7.0 innings (0BB, 4K) on May 13 at home.

» Kluber has won each of his last four starts vs. the Royals, dating back to September 21, 2016...has allowed just three earned runs across those four starts, posting a 1.05 ERA (3ER/25.2IP), with 26 strikeouts and three walks in that span.

» Owns a career 10-6 record and 2.82 ERA (43ER/137.0IP) in 21 starts against the Royals...his 2.82 career ERA vs. Kansas City is his lowest against any A.L. Central opponent.

» Is due to make his 12th career start at Kauffman Stadium, compiling a 2-4 mark and 4.48 ERA (33ER/66.1IP) in his 11 prior starts...his 4.48 ERA at Kauffman Stadium is his 2nd-highest at an opposing ballpark in which he's made at least four career starts...in 2017, won his lone start at Kauffman on August 18, holding the Royals to one run on six hits (one home run) over 5.1 innings, with one walk and four strikeouts.

» Kluber is due to make his ninth start of the year vs. an A.L. Central opponent tonight...has recorded a 6-1 mark and 1.32 ERA (7ER/47.2IP) in his prior outings...Kluber's 1.32 ERA vs. the Central is the lowest intradivisional ERA in MLB.

» He is also holding A.L. Central hitters to a .166 batting average, which is the 4th-lowest intradivisional opponent batting average in the Majors this season, behind ARI's Patrick Corbin (.151 AVG vs. N.L. West), BOS's Chris Sale (.151 AVG vs. A.L. East) and HOU's Justin Verlander (.157 AVG vs. A.L. West).

» Kluber has won 12 of his last 13 decisions against a divisional opponent, dating back to June 9, 2017...owns a 1.43 ERA (20ER/121.1IP) in that span.

### ON THE ROAD

» Kluber will make his ninth road start of the season this evening...has compiled a 4-3 mark and 3.68 ERA (21ER/51.1IP) in his eight starts away from Progressive Field.

» Two of his eight prior road starts came against an A.L. Central opponent, on April 17 at Minnesota (in Puerto Rico) and June 10 at Detroit...won both of those starts, posting a 1.84 ERA (3ER/14.2IP) combined across the outings.

### LAST TIME OUT & 2018 RECAP

» Kluber enters play tonight among the American League pitching leaders in opponent on-base percentage (.229, 1st), walks-per-9.0IP (1.0, 1st), wins (11, T2nd), innings pitched (113.1, 5th), ERA (2.54, 7th), opponent batting average (.203, 7th) and games started (17, T7th).

» He will be pitching on extended five days' rest after his last outing on June 26 at St. Louis...recorded the shortest start of his career, taking the loss after tossing just 1.2 innings (6H, 6R/ER, 2HR, 1BB, 2K)...despite the loss, with his two strikeouts Kluber now has 168 career punchouts in Interleague play, passing CC Sabathia (167) for tops among all Indians pitchers since the inception of Interleague play in 1997.

» Had his career-long walkless innings streak snapped at 46.1 innings on June 15 vs. Minnesota, after issuing a free pass in the 4th inning...streak marked the longest such run by a Tribe pitcher since Paul Byrd's stretch of 48.0 innings from April 26-June 6, 2007...also had his quality start streak snapped at 14, the longest streak of quality starts to begin a season by a Tribe starting pitcher since Hall-of-Famer Stan Coveleski began the 1918 campaign with a string of 16 consecutive quality starts.

» From August 3, 2017 - June 15, 2018, Kluber recorded a string of 26 starts that marked the longest streak in American League history and tied with Philadelphia's Chris Short (also 26G from 1967-68) for the 2nd-longest such streak in the Baseball-Reference Play Index era (1908-), behind Chicago-NL's Jake Arrieta (29G from 2015-16).

» Tossed his 16th career complete game in his first start of the year on March 29 at Seattle...marked the first Opening Day complete-game by a Cleveland pitcher since Jake Westbrook on April 4, 2005 at Chicago-AL (1-0 loss), and the first such complete game in MLB since Clayton Kershaw threw a complete-game shutout on April 1, 2013 vs. San Francisco...struck out eight batters, the 2nd-most by a Tribe starter on Opening Day over the last 14 seasons (2005-18), behind Justin Masterson (10K on April 5, 2012 vs. Toronto).

» Kluber threw just 91 pitches in the game, marking the second-lowest complete-game pitch count of his career...needed just 85 pitches to shut out the Mariners on July 30, 2014 (9.0IP, 3H, 8K) in Cleveland.

### 2017 HIGHLIGHTS & CAREER SNAPSHOT

» Won his second career American League Cy Young Award in 2017, becoming the first pitcher in club history to win the award multiple times, and the 19th multiple winner in MLB since 1956.

» Became the first Indians pitcher since Mike Garcia in 1949 to lead MLB in ERA (2.25), and ranked near the top of the A.L. leaderboard in virtually every other pitching category (see chart), including wins (18, T1st), pitcher bWAR (8.2), strikeouts (265, 2nd) and opponent batting average (.193, 141-732).

» Won the A.L. Pitcher of the Month award three times, June (4-0, 1.26ERA), August (5-1, 1.96 ERA) and September (5-0, 0.84 ERA), becoming the first triple winner since Houston's Dallas Keuchel in 2015.

» Kluber is in his ninth season with the Cleveland organization after being acquired from the San Diego Padres on July 31, 2010 in a three-team trade that sent RHP Jake Westbrook (from Cleveland) & LHP Nicholas Greenwood (from San Diego) to the St. Louis Cardinals and moved OF Ryan Ludwick from St. Louis to San Diego.

» Signed a five-year contract extension with the Indians through 2019 on April 5, 2015...the deal includes club options for 2020 & 2021.

» Made his MLB debut on September 1, 2011 in relief against the Oakland Athletics...made three relief appearances as a September call-up with Cleveland in 2011...has five career relief appearances, last on April 20, 2013 at Houston.

» Kluber was originally selected by San Diego in the 4th round of the 2007 June draft out of Stetson (FL) University, where he played three seasons...the Birmingham, Alabama native attended Coppell (TX) High School, located in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.
