OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-19) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (26-11)

FRIDAY, MAY 11, 2018 — YANKEE STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series by Houston to start the week, which is the first time the A's have been swept this year...that followed a three-game sweep of Baltimore last weekend...are 13-9 (.591) over the last 22 games dating back to April 15 after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 16th consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 32 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

FIRST PLACE AND OTHER TOUGH TEAMS: Tonight's game marks the A's third straight contest against a team with at least a share of the lead in its division...are currently in a 19-game stretch that began on Monday and runs through May 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 141-83 (.629)...the A's are 0-3 during this stretch.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 5-1 against the American League East after winning two of three from Boston last month and sweeping a three-game series from Baltimore last homestand...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East...Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 9-2 (.818) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the second worst intradivision record in the AL to Baltimore (4-8)...are batting .235 (202-for-861) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (96 runs in 26 games) against the AL West, .274 (111-for-405) with an average of 6.00 runs per game (66 runs in 11 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.92 ERA (124 er in 277.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.06 (36 er in 106.0 ip) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Boston (three games) and Toronto (four games) tonight...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 4-5 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 7-10 (.412) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...the A's have compiled a 5.10 ERA (81 er in 143.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have the third highest road ERA in the American League and the fourth lowest home ERA...have allowed 27 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in the AL...the offense has hit 28 home runs on the road, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 33), compared to 14 at home, which is tied for second fewest...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored two runs or fewer in each of the last five games, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 39 years (fourth time, last: April 13-17, 2008)...the last longer streak was an eight-game streak from May 10-18, 1979...are batting .178 (29-for-163) with nine runs scored during the streak...are hitting .196 (70-for-358) with 26 runs scored over the last 11 games (2.4 runs per game) after hitting .268 and average 5.2 runs per game over the first 26 contests...rank fifth in the American League in walks (120), tied for fifth in hit by pitches (17) and sixth in extra base hits (122)...also have the fourth most strikeouts (340) and the fifth most grounded into double plays (31).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 24 runs on 42 hits in the three games series against Houston after yielding five runs on 19 hits in the previous three-game series against Baltimore...now have a 3.85 ERA (86 er in 201.0 ip) over the last 22 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.46 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors ahead of Cleveland (2.58)...have 27 wild pitches, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 30)...have the fourth fewest strikeouts in the AL (287).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-7 with a 4.91 ERA (32 er in 58.2 ip) over the last 11 games (the one win was by Andrew Triggs on May 6)...that follows an 11-game stretch from April 15-27 where the starters went 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA...are now 10-17 with a 4.51 ERA (102 er in 203.1 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in losses (Baltimore, 20)...starters have not walked a batter in three of the last four games and have issued two free passes or fewer in 33 of the 37 games this year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last six games but it led to four unearned runs...now have 18 unearned runs for the season, which is third most in the American League...have turned 26 double plays, tied for third fewest in the AL...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied with Minnesota for the fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have stolen 27 bases, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (New York, 33)...however, they have been caught stealing 13 times, which is second most in the AL (Chicago, 15)...the offense is 1-for-6 (16.7%) in stolen base attempts over the last 13 games...are 7-for-14 (50.0%) for the season and the stolen base percentage is the lowest in the majors...have the second fewest steals and attempts in the majors to the Cubs (6-for-11).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of their last five one-run games and are 6-1 (.857) in one-run decisions for the season...including 3-0 on the road...the A's .857 winning percentage in one-run games is the best in the majors, but the seven decisions are tied with Minnesota for second fewest (Texas, 6)...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 3-0 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning wins (Texas and Toronto, 4)...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors with a .271 (117-for-431) batting average in the seventh inning or later and are tied for fifth with 63 runs scored...are hitting .235 (196-for-835) over the first six innings...the pitching staff has a 3.32 ERA (41 er in 111.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.70)...have a 4.82 (119 er in 222.0 ip) over innings one through six...have 17 runs scored in the ninth inning, which is tied for third most in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-4 following a day off...have won six of the last nine games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 7-8 against left-handed starters and the 15 games are tied with Kansas City for the most in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: The have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cahill, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Monday and Wednesday against Boston and May 22 against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A'S vs. YANKEES: The A's won the season series last year, 5-2...swept a four-game series in Oakland and lost two of three at New York...have now won the season series four times in the previous five years and are 21-12 (.636) over that span, which dates back to 2013...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 247-278 against the Yankees...that includes 136-127 in Oakland and 111-151 in New York...are 14-20 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 788-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Santiago Casilla has the lowest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.125), the second best opponent's on-base percentage (.200), and the third lowest batting average (.104)...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third baseman with 136 total chances, which is 30 more than any other third baseman...**Khris Davis** has 31 RBI, which is tied for second most in the AL to teammate Jed Lowrie...**Jed Lowrie** leads the AL in RBI (32) and go-ahead RBI (11) and is tied for second in hits (49) and multiple hit games (15)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in eight of his nine appearances and his 0.75 ERA ranks fourth lowest among AL relievers.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **2012** Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931...in **2014** Derek Norris hits two three-run home runs on a 3-0 count in consecutive innings in the A's 9-1 win over Washington.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-5, 8.89 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's...was Oakland's Opening Day starting pitcher and went 0-5 with an 8.89 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26.

LOSSES: His five losses are tied for the most in the majors...had just four losses in 19 starts all last year...is the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the year 0-5 since Joe Blanton in 2005...the only Oakland pitcher over the last 39 years to start the year worse than 0-5 is Mike Mohler, who started 0-8 in 1997.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his last five starts and the five-game losing streak is one short of his career high of six (July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016)...has an 8.87 ERA (23 er in 23.1 ip) and .340 (34-for-100) opponents batting average during the losing streak...is the first A's pitcher to lose five consecutive starts since he did it from April 25-May 19, 2016...the last A's pitcher to lose six straight starts is Vin Mazzaro (June 23-July 23, 2009).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .286 (20-for-70) opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .404 (21-for-52) with runners on...opponents are 12-for-32 (.375) with runners in scoring position...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning but has allowed a .355 (11-for-31) batting average and three home runs in that situation...has a .306 (19-for-62) average against right-handed hitters compared to .367 (22-for-60) with eight of his 11 walks against left-handers...held lefties to a .238 batting average last year...opponents are 10-for-14 (.714) with two home runs when putting the first pitch in play...the opponents five hitter is 9-for-10 (.900) with two doubles, a triple and a home run.

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in his last start after yielding at least one in each of his first five...has surrendered seven home runs in 28.1 innings this year (2.22 per nine innings) after allowing 12 in 105.1 innings last year (1.03 per nine innings)...five of the seven home runs are solo shots.

IN APRIL: Went 0-5 with an 8.87 ERA in five starts in April...became the first pitcher in Athletics history to lose five games in April...was the only pitcher in the majors this year to lose five games in April...had the second highest April ERA in Oakland history by a pitcher with 20 or more innings...the highest is 9.24 by Gil Heredia in 2001

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER, FOUR RUNS OR MORE: Allowed three runs in 6.0 innings in his last start after yielding at least four runs while tossing 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first five starts...that matched the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher at any point in the season since at least 1908...was the sixth pitcher to do it, the first since Daniel Gossett (Sept. 19, 2017-April 6, 2018)...the only one to do it to start the A's season is Rick Langford in 1983 but he had two stints in the minors over that stretch, which spanned from April 4 to July 17 (0-4, 13.50 ERA)...Graveman is the only one to do it while allowing at least one home run in each start.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win on Opening Day, March 29 in Oakland...it was his second consecutive Opening Day start and he joins Sonny Gray (2014-15) as the only A's pitchers to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Simmons RBI single and a Maldonado RBI double...then surrendered solo home runs to Calhoun in the fourth, Cozart in the fifth and Pujols in the sixth...the three home runs allowed matched the Oakland Opening Day record set by Carlos Reyes in 1996...left trailing 5-4 but the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Texas on April 3 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Chirinos RBI ground out and an Odor RBI single, and one more in the third on a solo home run by Gallo...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the third, but he allowed another run in the fourth inning on an Odor RBI single.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 8...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Pujols and a RBI single by Calhoun...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Trout in the third and was charged with two more runs in the fourth...yielded a RBI single to Trout and was relieved by Hendriks who allowed one inherited runner to score.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-8 loss at Seattle April 14...allowed a three-run home run to Segura in the second inning but Oakland tied the game with three runs in the third...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a two-run single by Haniger...was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's trailing 5-4.

FIFTH START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 7-3 loss to Boston April 20 in Oakland...the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the second...retired 11 straight batters following the homer but then allowed three straight hits

to start the sixth inning and load the bases...was relieved by Pagán with the scored tied 3-3 and he allowed a first pitch grand slam to Moreland.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He lost his fifth consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss at Texas on April 25...issued a career-high tying four walks...Oakland scored twice in the third inning but he allowed a run in the fourth when Gallo scored on a Centeno fielders choice...then allowed RBI singles to Mazara and Kiner-Falefa in the fifth for the loss.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA and .373 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...yielded five doubles, two triples and two home runs for a .667 slugging percentage...righties went 15-for-41 (.366) with both of his home runs and all eight of his RBIs...lefties were 4-for-10 (.400)...opponents went 6-for-13 (.462) with runners in scoring position.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 8-2 win over Memphis last Sunday in Nashville...allowed a solo home run to Tyler O'Neill in the third inning but the Sounds came back with three in the bottom of the third and two more in the fifth to take a 5-1 lead...retired 11 of the next 13 following the homer before allowing an Adolis Garcia double and a Wilfredo Tovar RBI single to start the seventh...was relieved by Pagán with one out in the seventh, runners on first and second and a 5-2 lead.

2017 RECAP: Went 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder...the ERA was a career high as was his opponents batting average (.280), on-base percentage (.338), slugging percentage (.442) and OPS (.780)...allowed 12 home runs and his average of 1.03 home runs per nine innings was a career low...his 19 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland...his opponents batting average broke down to .238 (44-for-185) against left-handed hitters compared to .315 (70-for-222) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against lefties, .272 against righties...opponents batted .266 with runners in scoring position but just .186 with RISP and two outs.

RHP Andrew Triggs (3-1, 4.41 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...logged a 2.87 ERA over his first three starts but has a 5.68 ERA in four starts since then...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his seven starts and six hits or fewer in all seven starts...has held the opposition to a .197 batting average with runners on base, but has surrendered three of his four home runs...opponents are 8-for-33 (.242) with runners in scoring position but they are 2-for-15 (.133) with RISP and two outs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Baltimore last Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 0 bb, 9 so)...matched his career high in innings pitched and strikeouts...is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against New York...his last outing was a start and loss last year on May 28 at New York in a 9-5 decision (6.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
