SAN DIEGO NOTES

- **Joey Lucchesi** has tossed at least 5.0 IP and three runs-or-less in seven of his nine starts...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER, 16.0 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks in his first three career starts against the Rockies.
- **Manuel Margot** is riding a six-game hitting streak vs. Colorado (6-for-23, .261) with two doubles and a home run and four RBI.
- **Freddy Galvis** logged his first three-hit game of the season...went 3-for-4 tonight with a double, a triple and two runs scored.
- **Christian Villanueva** snapped his 0-for-37 hitless streak with a single in the fourth inning...it was the longest skid in franchise history for a position player and the longest active streak by any non-pitcher.
- **Franmil Reyes** made his Major League debut.
- Tonight's game marked the first time in Padres history that all three starting outfielders (Franchy Cordero, Manuel Margot, Franmil Reyes) were born in the Dominican Republic (per ELIAS).

COLORADO NOTES

- This was the seventh time this season (sixth on the road) the Rockies hit three-or-more home runs in a single game.
- **Tyler Anderson** improves to 2-1 with a 2.27 ERA (9 ER, 35.2 IP), six walks and 30 strikeouts in six career starts vs. San Diego, allowing just two home runs in that time.
- **Nolan Arenado** has reached base in 24 consecutive games since April 12, tied for the second-longest active streak in the Majors and the second-longest streak of his career (longest: 30 games, April 9-May 10, 2014).
 - Recorded his third three-hit game of the season and extended his hitting streak to four games, batting .389 (7-for-18) with a double, triple, and two RBI during that span.
- **Noel Cuevas** belted his first Major League homer...has at least one hit in eight of his 17 games played and is batting .258 (8-for-31) as a starter.
