The Mariners have not committed an error in 11 consecutive games (5/23-c)...during this span, the Mariners have successfully converted 430 total chances (315 putouts, 115 assists).

VS. TAMPA BAY

The Mariners and Rays meet for the 3rd (2-0) of 7 games this season...Seattle will travel to Tampa Bay for a 4-game series, June 7-10...the Mariners have won 8 straight games vs. Tampa Bay at Safeco Field, dating back to May 9, 2016...overall, the Mariners are 11-3 in their last 14 games vs. the Rays, dating back to the start of the 2016 season:

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a 10-day, 10-game homestand with the final (2-0) of 3 games vs. Tampa Bay...opened the homestand by sweeping a 3-game series from Minnesota and splitting a 4-game series with Texas...following this homestand, will embark on a 7-day, 6-game, 2-city road trip to Houston (2 G) and Tampa Bay (4 G)...today's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 12 of their last 15 games, and 14 of their last 19...Seattle is 22-11 in its last 33 games, 27-14 over its last 41 games and 32-18 in its last 50 games...Seattle is 11-10 during the day and 25-12 at night...Seattle is 19-12 at Safeco Field, 17-10 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...lead the ML in extra-inning wins.
- **Walk it Off** - the Mariners have 5 walk-off wins this season, tied with the Braves and Yankees for 2nd-most in the ML, trailing only the Cardinals (6)...each of the Mariners 5 walk-off wins have come during extra-innings.
- **Righting the Ship** - over his last 6 outings (5/18-c), Juan Nicasio has retired 25-of-28 batters faced... during that span, he has allowed only 3 hits (.107/3x28) while striking out 16 without issuing a walk...he has struck out 16 of the 28 batters he has faced, including 14-of-the-last-19, dating back to May 26.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - Jean Segura leads the Major Leagues with 25 multi-hit games, ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (24)...Segura is tied for the ML lead with 11 games of 3+ hits (also: Nicholas Castellanos-DET).
- **Jean, Jean the Hit Collector** - since May 9, Jean Segura is batting .427 (38x89) with 20 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 13 RBI and 7 stolen bases in 21 games...during that span, he leads the Major Leagues in hits and average, while also ranking 2nd in runs scored and T2nd in stolen bases.
- **Heredia Heating Up** - since May 15, Guillermo Heredia is batting .316 (18x57) with 5 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 RBI, 1 HBP, 8 walks and a .409 on-base percentage in 18 games.
- **Seventh Heaven** - Ben Gamel has hit safely in a season-high 7 straight games (5/24-c), batting .458 (11x24) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 HBP, 1 walk and 2 stolen bases.
- **Welcome to Seattle** - Since joining the Mariners on May 27, Alex Colomé has appeared in 4 of the Mariners 7 games, including recording the save in his Mariners debut on April 27 vs. MIN...overall he has retired 13 of the 15 batters faced (1 H, 1 HBP) while striking out 4 over 4.0 scoreless innings.
- **20** - Edwin Díaz is the 9th pitcher (done 11x) in Mariners club history to record at least 20 saves prior to the All-Star break...Díaz's 20 saves are the most prior the ASG since Steve Cishek (21 SV) in 2016.
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 25-7 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 11-15 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

CATCHING SOME RAYS...Félix Hernández, who is making his first start vs. Tampa Bay since May 9, 2016 at Safeco Field, is 8-2 with a 1.94 ERA (26 ER, 120.2 IP) with 128 strikeouts in 16 career starts...the Mariners are 13-3 in those 16 starts...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 11 of those 16 starts...tossed the 23rd perfect game in MLB history vs. TB on Aug. 15, 2012 (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...recorded a career-high 15 strikeouts on June 8, 2014 at TB (ND,7.0,4,0,0,1,15).

CRUZ CONTROL...Nelson Cruz has an active 6-game hitting streak (5/28-c), batting .458 (11x24) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 1 HBP and 1 walk...he has also recorded a RBI in each of the last 6 games (8 RBI)...marks the 9th time in his career (T3rd-longest) to record a RBI in at least 6 consecutive games and longest since driving in at least 1 run in a career-high 8 straight games, Aug. 8-15, 2017...the Mariners are 15-3 in games when Cruz drives in at least 1 run this season.

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 14 games over .500 at 36-22...with a win today, Seattle would be 15 games over .500 for the first time since being 79-64 (.552) after game #143 of the 2015 season...also marks the 9th season in club history to be at least 14 games over .500 at any point in a season.

HOT START...Seattle is 36-22 (.621) through its first 58 games of the season, its 4th-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (46-12/.793), 2003 (40-18/.690) and 2002 (37-21/.638)...with a win last night vs. the Rays, the Mariners moved into a tie for first place in the American League West...the last time the Mariners were tied for the AL West lead after May was at the end of play on June 2, 2016 and the last Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

SWEEPING SUCCESS...Seattle has a chance to sweep this 3-game set against Tampa Bay with a win today...the Mariners are looking for their 7th all-time 3-game sweep of the Rays (last: 6/2-4/17)...the Mariners have also won 8 straight home games vs. the Rays, dating back to May 9, 2016...marks the longest active home winning streak vs. any single opponent.

NO FREE PASSES...James Pazos has not issued a walk since his first appearance of the season on April 4, a span of 22 appearances without a walk...Pazos' streak of 22 consecutive games without issuing a walk is the 2nd-longest streak of games without a walk among Major League relievers this season...Kansas City's Kelvin Herrera has an active streak of 24 straight games without issuing a walk, dating back to the beginning of the season...Pazos' streak is the 2nd-longest by a reliever in club history, trailing only Charlie Furbush, who did not walk a batter in 26 straight outings, May 20 - July 29, 2014.

I FEEL A DRAFT...the Mariners will select 14th overall in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft, then 54th (2nd round), 90th (3rd round) and 118th (4th round)...former Mariner All-Star Mike Moore (1st round selection by Seattle in 1978 June Draft) and Southeast Area Scout Dan Rovetto will represent Seattle in this year's Draft, which will begin live on MLB Network and MLB.com on Monday, June 4 at 4:00 p.m. (PT)...the selection order of the Draft is determined by the reverse order of finish at the close of the previous championship season...the 2018 Draft will have 40 rounds that span three days, as it has since 2009...the first day will consist of Round 1, Competitive Balance Round A and Round 2, followed by rounds 3-10 on Tuesday and concluding with rounds 11-40 on Wednesday.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Félix Hernández is 8-2 with a 1.94 ERA (26 ER, 120.2 IP) in 16 career starts vs. the Tampa Bay Rays...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that his 1.94 ERA is the lowest by an active player and 2nd-lowest all-time ERA vs. the Rays (min. 100 IP)?...Félix trails only Mariano Rivera's 1.69 career ERA (20 ER, 106.1 IP) vs. the Rays, while ranking ahead of Pedro Martinez (1.99/30 ER, 135.2 IP), Orlando Hernandez (2.54 ERA/32 ER, 113.1 IP) and Clay Buchholz (2.67 ERA/35 ER, 113.1 IP).

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 388th career start and his 17th career start vs. Tampa Bay today.
• Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
• Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
• Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
• In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
• ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
• At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
• Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
• A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
• Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
• Is 25-27 with a 4.23 ERA (200 ER, 426.2 IP) in 67 career GS in May.

LAST OUTING...

...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 5-9 loss to Texas on May 29...allowed 5 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks while striking out 4 batters across 5+ innings...allowed 2 runs in the first 2 innings but held the Rangers scoreless through the end of the 5th...allowed the first 3 batters to reach in the 6th inning (double, single, walk) before being relieved by James Pazos; all three baserunners subsequently scored, increasing Félix's run total to 5.

IT'S NOT SHOCKING...

Félix's 1.94 ERA (26 ER, 120.2 IP) and 9.5 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings vs. the Rays are his best marks against any American League team... in 17 career starts vs. Tampa Bay, he has struck out 128 batters, tied with his 128 strikeouts against the Yankees for his most against any non-AL West opponent.

OUT OF THE GATE...

...in the 1st inning, opponents are batting .346 (18x52) with a .419 on-base percentage and a .673 slugging percentage against Félix, compared to a .233 (47x202) average, .320 OBP and .391 slugging mark in the 2nd inning and later...has posted a 12.00 ERA (16 ER, 12.0 IP) in the 1st inning, while earning a 4.47 ERA (27 ER, 54.3 IP) in the 2nd inning and later...Félix has allowed 3-or-more runs in the 1st inning in 3 of his 12 starts; he's 0-2 in those games & the Mariners are 1-2...has allowed 1 (2 G) or 0 (5 G) runs in 7 of his 12 starts; he's 4-1 in those games & the Mariners are 5-2.

CLIMBING THE RANKS...

...has 2,397 career strikeouts, T44th-most in Major League history...with 4 more strikeouts, Félix will tie Hall of Famer Dennis Eckersley for 43rd-most strikeouts in MLB history with 2,401.

HOMEBODY...

...is 2-2 with a 4.72 ERA in 6 starts in Safeco Field this season, compared to 3-2, 7.03 in 6 road starts...for his career, is 88-59, 3.21 in 196 starts in Safeco Field (77-59, 3.34 in 191 road starts).

IMPRESSIVE START...

...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest pitcher is Justin Verlander with 51...during this stretch Félix has recorded 251 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (264).

HE'S OUR LEADER...

...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...

Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins (165), starts (387), innings pitched (2,568.2) and strikeouts (2,397).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

CAREER...

...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner... is 165-118 with a 3.27 ERA (928 ER, 2568.2 IP) in 387 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins (165), starts (387), quality starts (251), innings pitched (2568.2) and strikeouts (2,397).

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JAMES PAXTON (4-1, 3.13)

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season tomorrow against the Astros...no decision in his last start, a 6-7 Mariners loss on 5/30 vs. TEX (5.0,4,2,2,4,5)...is 4-0 with a 1.67 ERA (8 ER, 43.0 IP) in the month of May and 6 of his last 7 outings have been quality starts...tossed second complete game of his career on 5/19 vs. DET (9.0,3,2,2,1,8,HR-1)...pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history, needing just 99 pitches in W#2, a 5-0 Mariners win on 5/8 at TOR (9.0,0,0,0,3,7); first complete game and first shutout of his career...notched a career-high 16 strikeouts in the Mariners 2-3 loss to OAK on 5/2 (7.0,5,0,0,1,16)... SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-0 with an 8.27 ERA (15 ER, 16.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts...2017: Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)... CAREER: 34-21 with a 3.26 ERA (180 ER, 496.2 IP) in 86 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...vs. HOU: Is making his 10th career start vs. Houston...is 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA (18 ER, 51.1 IP) in 9 career starts against the Astros...earned the win in his start vs. Houston on 4/16 (6.0,3,1,1,3,7,HR-1).
