MILWAUKEE BREWERS (38-25) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (32-29)

Saturday, June 9, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:05 EDT – Game 62; Home 30

LHP Brent Suter (5-4, 4.55) RHP Jake Arrieta (5-3, 2.66)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Milwaukee Brewers, 12-4, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Vince Velasquez (L, 4-7), went 3.2 innings and allowed 10 runs on 9 hits with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts ... Carlos Santana (HR, B, 2 RBI) and Cesar Hernandez (3-5) led the Phils offensively.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to today's game, the Phillies activated **OF/1B Rhys Hoskins** (fractured jaw) off the 10-day DL ... To make room on the 25-man roster, **OF Dylan Cozens** was placed on the 10-day DL (left quadriceps strain).
- ARRIETA DAY IN SOUTH PHILLY:** The Phils send **Jake Arrieta** to the hill today as he looks to extend his active 15.0-inning scoreless streak at Citizens Bank Park (4/25-current) ... Arrieta has posted a 0.84 ERA (3 ER, 32.0 IP) at home this season which is the lowest home ERA of any qualifying pitcher in the majors ... Overall, in his career at CBP, he has posted a 0.77 ERA (4 ER, 47.0 IP) which is the lowest among any pitcher with at least five starts since the ballpark opened its doors in 2004 ... Arrieta (5-0) has never lost a game at CBP and has allowed 2 ER or fewer in all seven starts and 1 ER or none in six of seven ... He has held opponents to a .173/.227/.235 slash line in 178 plate appearances in South Philly ... Finally, today marks Arrieta's 65th career start against the National League Central – he is 34-17 with a 2.78 ERA (120 ER, 388.0 IP) against the division in his career and has allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of his last 12 starts ... Since the division's inception in 1994, Arrieta is tied with Greg Maddux for the sixth-lowest ERA against the NL central among all pitchers with at least 30 starts and he ranks second among active starters, behind only WSH's Max Scherzer (2.77 ERA).
- HOME SWEET HOME:** The Phillies return home following a season-long 11-day, 10-game road trip to LAD (2-2), SF (0-3) and CHI (1-2) ... Philadelphia, whose 29 home games are tied for fifth-fewest in baseball will play 17 of their next 23 games at home through July 4 ... **Philadelphia is 19-10 (.655) this season at Citizens Bank Park, the best home winning percentage in the National League and 3rd-best in baseball, trailing only NYY (.710) and BOS (.688) ... On the mound, Phillies pitchers have posted the best home ERA in the National League (3.08) and rank 2nd in the majors to only the Astros (3.06) ... Phillies starters have allowed 1 ER or none in 9 of their last 13 starts at home.**
- GRAND CENTRAL:** The Phillies are in the midst of a 25-game stretch during which they do not play a single divisional opponent (5/26 vs TOR – 6/20 vs STL), but play their National League Central foes 12 times, all of which occur in a span of 15 games, 6/5 at CHI to 6/20 at STL ... Philadelphia is 10-5 against the NL Central this season, starting the year with an eight-game winning streak against teams from the division ... They are 15-7 against the division dating back to 7/6/17 at MIL ... The Phillies are looking to win consecutive series against Milwaukee for the first time since 9/8/11-7/25/12 (3-1, 3-0).
- BREW MASTER:** Centerfielder **Odubel Herrera** has haunted the Brewers since the start of 2015 ... Herrera is batting .392 (29-74) with 9 doubles, 4 home runs, 12 RBI, 9 walks and 5 steals in 20 games against MIL ... In that span, he has the highest batting average against the Brewers in baseball by 25 points (2nd: Nola Arenado, .367), and he ranks 4th in OBP (.452) and SLG (.676) ... Herrera has hit safely in seven of his last eight games against the Brewers, slashing .469/.514/.906 with 8 extra-base hits (5 2B, 3 HR) in 35 plate appearances (6/5/16-current).
- YES SER!** Prior to allowing two runs in his second inning of work on 6/6 at SF, **Seranthony Dominguez** extended his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to begin his career to 15.2 with a perfect 8th ... **Per Elias, it was the longest scoreless streak by a Phillies' pitcher to begin a career since Marty Bystrom began his with 20.0 scoreless innings in 1980** ... During the streak, he faced 49 batters, allowed 3 baserunners (2 H, HB) and struck out 16 ... Additionally, Dominguez drew a walk in his first career plate appearance in the top of the ninth, recording his first walk at the plate before walking his first batter of his career on the mound.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 57 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just four teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 60 straight games (3/29-current), Detroit Tigers – 56 straight games (4/10-6/8) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 7/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 9,265 pitches over 2,301 plate appearances this season and their 4.03 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL and 4th in the majors (best in both: LAD, 4.05) ... **Philadelphia has the best walk in the majors this season at 10.2 % (next: NYY, 10.1 %) and they rank 3rd in the majors in walks with 235 (best: NYY, 238) ... Cesar Hernandez (42, T-2nd), Carlos Santana (41, T-4th) and Rhys Hoskins (34, T-10th) all rank within the top 10 in the NL in walks this season, while Hernandez and Santana rank T-4th and T-6th, respectively, among all ML players ... The Phillies have not led the majors in walks for a full season in over 30 years (last: 1983, 640 BB).**

LAST START: 6/3 at SF: L, 6.0 IP, 8 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 4 SO, HR ... Arrieta vs Rodriguez ... Arrieta cruised through the first 5.0 innings before the Giants plated 5 runs in the 6th ... Arrieta provided the only Phils offense on the day with a solo home run in the 3rd.

TODAY'S START:

- Home Sweet Home:** Has posted a 0.84 ERA (3 ER, 32.0 IP) at home this season, the lowest home ERA among all qualifying pitchers in baseball ... He has not allowed a run in his last 15.0 IP at home ... Overall in his career at CBP, has a 0.77 ERA (4 ER, 47.0 IP), which is the lowest among any pitcher to ever make at least 5 starts at the venue since it opened in 2004 ... Jon Lester is the next-closest with a 1.29 ERA at CBP
- Last 6:** Despite allowing 5 ER in 6.0 IP in his last start, owns a 2.00 ERA (8 ER, 36.0 IP) over his last 6 starts, surrendering just 2 HR in that span ... Three of those starts have been scoreless
- Ground Strike:** Arrieta's 56.3 ground ball percentage is the third-highest among qualifying ML starters (Clayton Richard, 58.4 % and Ty Blach, 56.5 %) and almost 8 points higher than his career % of 48.5 %
- NL Starter Rankings:** 4th in HR/9.0 IP (0.42), 10th in ERA (2.66)
- Limiting Longballs:** Has allowed only 3 HR this season in 64.1 IP, an average of 0.42 HR/9.0 IP ... Since 2014 he has allowed 57 HR in 815.2 IP (0.63/9.0 IP)
- vs NL Central:** 34-17, 2.78 ERA (120 ER, 388.0 IP) in 64 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Posted a 0.90 ERA (3 ER, 30.0 IP) in his 5 starts during May, becoming 1 of just 7 Phillies ever to make 5+ starts in a month with a sub-1.00 ERA (last: Cliff Lee, Aug. 2011)
- Per Elias, was the first Phillies pitcher to allow 1 or 0 home runs in consecutive months in which he made 5 or more starts since 2001 (Brandon Duckworth, Aug.-Sep.)
- Had a 13.1-inning scoreless streak, 5/6-5/18
- Did not allow a homer in 28.1 straight IP in parts of 6 starts, 4/8-5/6
- Had a stretch of 18 straight starts allowing 3 ER or fewer from 7/2/17-4/25/18, the second-longest such streak of his career
- Struck out 10 batters on 4/19 vs PIT, his 14th career double-digit strikeout game and first start of 10+ SO, 1 H or fewer by a Phillie starter since Cole Hamels' no-hitter in his final start as a Phillie, 7/25/15 at CHI
- Pitched in his 200th career game on 4/19 vs PIT and made his 200th start on 5/23 vs ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Led the team in wins (14) and totaled at least 30 starts for the third consecutive season
- In 12 starts following the All-Star break, posted a 2.28 ERA (17 ER, 67.0 IP), which ranked 6th among qualifying NL pitchers (3rd among starters) in that span
- Named NL Pitcher of the Month for August (4-1, 1.21 ERA), when he led all NL starters in ERA and T-1st in wins
- Walked 3 or fewer batters in 29 of 30 starts, averaging 2.94 BB/9.0 IP (55 BB, 168.1 IP)
- Had a stretch of 72 consecutive starts (9/2/14-4/22/17) of at least 5.0 innings snapped, 4/28 at BOS (4.1 IP); that was the longest stretch by a CHI pitcher since 1908
- Went 1-1 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER, 10.2 IP) in two postseason starts: Game 4 of the NLDS, 10/11 vs WSH and Game 4 of the NLCS, 10/18 vs LAD

CAREER:

- Was the 2015 National League Cy Young Award Winner (5th in CHI history), and in 2016 earned his first career All-Star selection and Silver Slugger Award
- Has tossed two career no-hitters: 8/30/15 at LAD and 4/21/16 at CIN
 - Became the 8th pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter in consecutive seasons ... His second came in his 10th start after tossing his first, the third-shortest time between no-hitters in MLB history
- Recorded a career and CHI franchise-best 20 consecutive wins from 8/4/15-5/25/16, which tied for the third-longest streak in MLB history (since 1913)
- In 9 career postseason starts, is 5-3, 3.08 ERA (18 ER, 52.2 IP), 66 SO (most in CHI postseason history), .189 OPP AVG and hit a HR as a batter ... Allowed just 3 ER in 11.1 IP (2.38 ERA) in two starts during the 2016 World Series
- Signed by PHI as a free agent on 3/12/18 ... Originally selected by BAL in the 5th round of the June 2007 draft
