## D-BACKS FOURTH OF JULY GAME SOLD OUT

The D-backs sold out Wednesday's Fourth of July game, and fans are encouraged to arrive early as gates will open at 5 p.m. to accommodate the expected large crowds.

## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 21-12 (.636) since May 28, tied for the Majors' second-best record with the Red Sox, behind the Mariners (22-11, .667), Astros (21-11, .656), Yankees (21-11, .656) and Dodgers (21-11, .656).
- ♦ The D-backs are 7-5 in their last 12 games, 15-9 in their last 24 and 19-11 in their last 30.
- ♦ The D-backs took 2 of 3 @ Cardinals from April 5-8 and are 8-7 in the last 15 games since April 28, 2016.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has a franchise-record 25-game scoreless streak (22.1 IP) [SEE NOTE], also the Majors' longest active streak (by games).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 25 games, is batting .410 (41-for-100)/.500 OBP/.810 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 10 homers, 25 RBI and 17 walks...in his last 11 home games, is hitting .381 (16-for-42) with 3 homers, 6 RBI and 7 walks.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has an active 13.0-inning scoreless streak with back-to-back scoreless outings June 23 @ Pirates (6.0 IP) and June 28 @ Marlins (7.0 IP)...in 8 home starts, is 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .204 opponent average and 50 strikeouts, highlighted by 6 starts with 1 run allowed.

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost, 6-3, vs. Cardinals.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 4-for-4 with a RBI, tying his career high 4 hits for the 13th time.
- ♦ **David Peralta** was 2-for-4 with a triple and a RBI.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** (3-1) endured his first loss since July 23, 2017 after allowing 6 runs in 5.0 innings with 7 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Joey Krehbiel** threw 1.2 shutout frames in his Major League debut.

- ♦ The D-backs agreed to terms with 13th-round draft pick INF **Anthony Tolbert** on June 30.
- ♦ The D-backs have signed 10 of their first 11 picks, 22 of their first 23 picks and 29 of their overall 41 selections.

- ♦ **Joey Krehbiel** worked 1.2 scoreless frames (1 H, 1 BB) in his Major League debut last night to become the 12th D-back to make his debut with 1.2 scoreless innings or more:

## GOLDSCHMIDT NAMED NL PLAYER OF THE MONTH

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** was named NL Player of the Month for June, his first monthly award, and ninth by a D-backs position player (last: A.J. Pollock in April).
- ♦ Since May 23, Goldschmidt leads the Majors in average (.370, 51-for-138), slugging pct. (.746) and OPS (1.209), is tied for second in homers (13) and extra-base hits (24), third in on-base percentage (.463) and tied for seventh in RBI (32).

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 25-game scoreless streak (22.1 IP) established a franchise record, surpassing 24-game scoreless streaks by J.J. Putz (June 23-August 31, 2012) and Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008).
  - ♦ His 25-gamer is the longest active streak in the Majors.

- ♦ **Randall Delgado** (strained left oblique) threw 1.0 inning with 1 run on 3 hits and 1 walk for Triple-A Reno last night @ Tacoma.  
 • In 14 rehab games at Triple-A Reno and Single-A Advanced Visalia, is 2-1 with a 3.45 ERA (6 ER in 15.2 IP), .233 opponent average (7-for-30) and 9 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** (strained right pectoral) went 1-for-4 with a solo homer in his third rehab appearance for Triple-A Reno last night @ Tacoma.  
 • In 5 rehab games at Triple-A Reno and Single-A Advanced Visalia, is hitting .400 (8-for-20) with 1 double, 2 triples, 1 homer, 4 RBI and 3 walks.

## GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

## SNAKEBITES

- ◆ Has a 3-game winning streak, going 3-0 with a 1.40 ERA (3 ER in 19.1 IP), a .219 opponent average (16-for-73) and 18 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has a 13.0-inning scoreless streak over his last 2 starts.
- ◆ His 2,344 career strikeouts are 49th all-time and fifth among active players.
- ◆ In 8 home games, has held lefties to a .192 average (15-for-78) with 23 strikeouts (5 BB) and righties to a .214 average (22-for-103) with 27 strikeouts (5 BB).
- ◆ In his last 3 starts, has allowed 1 hit with runners in scoring position (1-for-9).

## LAST START

- ◆ Tossed 7.0 shutout innings with 7 hits and 6 strikeouts in a 4-0 win @ Marlins on June 28.

## VS. CARDINALS

- ◆ In 17 career starts vs. Cardinals, is 11-5 with a 3.43 ERA and 97 strikeouts.

## HOME SWEET HOME

- ◆ In 8 home starts (5 quality), is 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA (13 ER in 48.2 IP), .204 opponent average (37-for-181) and 50 strikeouts, including 6 starts with 1 run allowed.
- ◆ Among NL pitchers at home, is ninth in ERA (2.40) and 10th in opponent average (.204) and WHIP (0.97).

## PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year at Apopka (Fla.) High School...played shortstop...transitioned to pitcher as a senior.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University.

## DUCKS ON THE POND

- ◆ Among NL pitchers with runners on base, is tied for sixth with a .178 opponent average (24-for-135) with 12 walks and 42 strikeouts.

## CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 108 strikeouts are fifth in the NL.
- ◆ His 2,344 career strikeouts are 49th on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Early Wynn (50th, 2,334)...next is Robin Roberts (48th, 2,357).
- ◆ His 2,344 career strikeouts are fifth among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,912), Justin Verlander (2,560), Bartolo Colon (2,510) and Felix Hernandez (2,427).

## QUALITY STARTS

- ◆ Since joining the D-backs in 2016, has had 3-or-more quality starts in a row 4 times:
  - 3 straight (September 11-21, 2016; **June 18-28, 2018**).
  - 4 straight (June 2-18, 2016); and
  - 5 straight (April 19-May 11, 2017; August 25-September 16, 2017);

## ON REGULAR REST

- ◆ When starting with 4 days between starts, is 4-1 with a 2.40 ERA (13 ER in 48.2 IP), .208 opponent average (38-for-183) and 51 strikeouts.

## JUNE FLASHBACK

- ◆ In 6 starts (4 quality) in June, went 5-1 with a 2.97 ERA (12 ER in 36.1 IP), .250 opponent average and 36 strikeouts.
