TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the third (1-1) of 3 games vs. Los Angeles-AL...began the homestand with a 3-game sweep of Kansas City...will also face Colorado (3 G) on this homestand...went 5-5 on a recently-concluded 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip to New York-AL (0-3), Boston (1-2) and Baltimore (4-0)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle lost yesterday, snapping a season-high 8-game winning streak...the Mariners are 9-7 over their last 16 contests...they have also won 15 of their last 23 games, 22 of their last 32, 26 of their last 38, 31 of their last 44 and 33 of their last 48...Seattle is 41-21 in its last 62 games, 46-24 over its last 70 games and 51-28 in its last 79 games...Seattle is 16-15 during the day and 39-17 at night...Seattle is 29-15 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Corner of Edgar & Dave** - the Mariners are 29-15 (.659) at Safeco Field this season, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...they trail New York-AL (.717/33-13), Boston (.700/28-12) and Cleveland (.675/27-13), while ranking ahead of Philadelphia (.652/30-16)...the Mariners have won 13 of their last 16 home games (5/31-c) and are 20-5 (.800) at home since May 18.
- **Get Used to It** - 7 of the Mariners next 18 games will be against the Los Angeles Angels...the Mariners are 1-1 so far in this 3-game series vs. the Halos at Safeco Field, which marks the final meeting between these clubs in Seattle this season...the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series July 10-12 and again July 27-29...Seattle will also travel to Anaheim during the final road trip of the regular season...the Mariners (54-32) currently lead the Angels (44-43) by 11.0 games for the 2nd AL Wild Card.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** has 35 multi-hit games this season, tied for 2nd-most in the Majors and tied for the top spot in the American League (also: Francisco Lindor-CLE & J.D. Martinez-BOS), trailing Nick Markakis-ATL (36)...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12) and Francisco Lindor-CLE (12).
- **First Things First** - **Dee Gordon** is batting .333 (24x72) when leading off a game this season.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 40-11 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 33 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 72 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 83)...**Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break**, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)... Díaz's 33 saves rank T3rd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break (also: Danny Graves-CIN, 2004, and Jim Johnson-BAL, 2013), behind Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38) and John Smoltz in 2003 with the Braves (34)...of Díaz's 33 saves, 20 have come in one-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 one-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 41-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .667 (36-18) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail Houston (.686/35-16), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.664/312-18) and Boston (.630/34-20)...**the Mariners 36 wins are the most in the Majors since May 8**, ranking ahead of the Astros (35-16).

BULLPEN BULLY...LHP **James Pazos** is 2-1 with 1.84 ERA (6 ER, 29.1 IP) in his 34 relief appearances this season, including allowing only 4 earned runs over his last 27.1 innings in relief (32 games), dating back to April 10...among American League relievers, Pazos ranks T6th in strikeouts/walks (6.75) and 8th in ERA (1.84) and walks per 9.0 innings (1.23)...his 1.84 ERA is the 2nd-lowest among left-hander relievers in the AL, trailing only Aroldis Chapman's 1.43 ERA...Pazos also is 0-1 with a 0.77 ERA (1 ER, 11.2 IP) in 16 relief appearances at Safeco Field, including tossing 6.2 scoreless innings over his last 10 games, dating back to May 20.

COMFORTS OF HOME...starter **Marco Gonzales** is 3-1 with a 3.06 ERA (16 ER, 47.0 IP) in 8 starts at Safeco Field, including going 3-0 with a 1.36 ERA (95 ER, 33.0 IP) over his last 5 home starts, dating back to May 17...Gonzales tossed his first career complete game in the Mariners 4-1 win over Kansas City in his last start on June 29 (9.0,6,1,1,0,7,HB).

HALF DOZEN...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in 7 of 8 games vs. the Angels this season, batting .419 (13x31) with 8 runs scored, 1 double, 6 home runs, 10 RBI and 1 walk...his 6 home runs vs. a single opponent are T3rd-most in the Majors this season (also: Eddie Rosario, 6 HR vs. CLE), trailing only Matt Davidson's 7 home runs vs. the Royals and A.J. Pollock's 7 home runs vs. the Dodgers...his 6 home runs vs. the Angels in a single season are also T3rd-most by a Mariners player in club history (also: Bret Boone, 6 HR in 2003), trailing only **Nelson Cruz's** 10 home runs in 2016 and Alex Rodriguez's 7 home runs in 2000.

#VOTEMARINERS...All-Star Balloting for the 2018 MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard closes at 8:59 p.m. PT tonight...the 89th Midsummer Classic will be held on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, DC...for the fourth consecutive season, voting has been conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at MLB.com, all 30 Club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark mobile apps...fans around the world can cast their votes for starters a total of 35 times with the 2018 Camping World MLB All-Star Ballot, including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in any 24-hour period...on Sunday, July 8th, the 2018 All-Star rosters will be announced on the All-Star Game Selection Show presented by Camping World from 4:00-5:00 p.m. PT on ESPN.

RUBBER-GAME RECORDS...the Mariners are 5-3 in rubber games this season (game to decide outcome of a 3-game series), winning the final game of the series vs. Cleveland (3/29-4/1), at Kansas City (4/9-11), vs. Oakland (4/13-15), at Chicago-AL (4/23-25) and at Toronto (5/4-6)...the Mariners have won or tied 23 of their first 28 series this season, posting a series record of 17-5-6.

AS YOU KNOW...**Jean Segura** is batting .375 (39x104) with 20 runs scored, 8 doubles, 3 home runs, 12 RBI, 2 HBP, 6 walks and 6 stolen bases in 25 games vs. the Angels over the last 2 season (2017-current)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Segura's .375 batting average vs. the Angels since 2017 is the 3rd-highest vs. any opponent (min. 100 AB)...Segura trails only José Ramírez's .422 (46x109) average vs. Detroit and José Altuve's .380 (41x108) average vs. Oakland and ranks ahead of **Nelson Cruz's** .370 (39x104) average vs. Texas.

ABOUT GONZALES...

- 26-year-old left-hander is making his 18th start of season, 40th career appearance (32nd start) and 5th career start vs. the Angels.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 seasons (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign... drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program.
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado.
- Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

LAST OUTING...pitched the 1st complete game of his career, holding the Royals to just 1 run on 6 hits and 0 walks while striking out 7 batters in 9.0 innings; became 2nd Mariners pitcher to throw a complete game this season (James Paxton, 2x)... held the Royals scoreless until the 9th inning.

GAS IN THE TANK...has pitched 6.0-or-more innings in 11 of his last 13 starts and 12 of his 17 starts overall this season...is 7-3 with a 3.01 ERA (28 ER, 83.2 IP) with 17 walks and 68 strikeouts in his last 13 outings...prior to 2018, Gonzales had only reached the 6.0 inning mark in 1 start, on Aug. 30, 2014 vs. Chicago-NL with St. Louis (6.0,3,1,1,2,5).

NO FREE PASSES...has issued just 20 walks across 100.1 innings pitched this season, posting a 1.79 walks-per-9.0-innings ratio, the 4th-best mark in the American League (9th in MLB), and a 4.35 strikeouts-to-walks ratio, 8th-best in the American League (15th in MLB).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle.

2017 AAA RECAP...combined for 13 AAA starts last season, 11 with AAA Memphis in the Cardinals organization and 2 with AAA Tacoma after being acquired by the Mariners...was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 22 walks in 13 combined starts...went 6-4 with a 2.90 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 17 walks in 11 starts with Memphis...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts and 5 walks in 2 starts with Tacoma.

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, compiling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program when he was selected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, earned John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

POSTSEASON GLORY...added to the Cardinals roster for the 2014 National League Division Series vs. Los Angeles-NL...made 3 appearances in the NLDS, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk...picked up the wins in Game 1 and Game 4 vs. the Dodgers...became the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002)...in the 2014 NLCS vs. San Francisco, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (3 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk in 3 appearances.

ML CAREER...in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c), is 13-8 with a 4.51 ERA (89 ER, 177.2 IP) with 151 strikeouts and 53 walks in 39 games (31 starts)...originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University.

Gonzales is making his 5th career start vs. the Angels...is 0-0 with a 4.66 ERA (10 ER, 19.1 IP) in 4 career starts vs. Los Angeles-AL...faced the Angels on May 5 (6.0,9,4,4,1,7,HR-1) and June 13 (5.0,7,3,3,2,7), both Mariners wins...here is how Gonzales has fared vs. current Angels batters:

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP FÉLIX HERNÁNDEZ (8-6, 5.11 ERA)

32-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 393rd Major League start tomorrow vs. Colorado...has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 5 of his last 6 starts and 4 of his 6 starts in June were quality starts...has tossed 5.0+ innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in 12 of his 18 starts this season...W#8 in his last start, a 6-4 Mariners win vs. KC on 6/30 (5.0,6,3,3,1,5,HR-1)...W#1 on Opening Day, a 2-1 Mariners win, on March 29 vs. CLE (5.1,2,0,0,2,4); was 11th Opening Day start, building on Mariners record...**2017:** Went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14...**CAREER:** Signed as a non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002...has played his entire 14-year career with Seattle, going 168-120 with a 3.27 ERA (947 ER, 2602.2 IP)...is Seattle's all-time leader in wins (168), innings (2602.2), strikeouts (2,427) and starts (393)...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time AL ERA champ (2010-2.27, 2014-2.14)...**vs. COL:** Will be making his 2nd career start against the Rockies...earned the win in sole start vs. Colorado on Aug. 3, 2015 (6.2,11,4,4,1,9)...he is one of 11 pitchers all-time to win at least 23 games in Interleague play...his 3.12 career ERA (104 ER, 300.0 IP) in Interleague games ranks 9th all-time.
