**THE CAPTAIN:** David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87)...Wright hit .171 (7-41) with one double, two RBI, two walks and four runs scored in 12 rehabilitation games between St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...He last played on August 29 for the 51s vs. Tacoma...Wright's last major league game was May 27, 2016 vs. the Dodgers, going 1-4 with a solo homer.

**SATURDAY DETAILS:** The gates will open at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday so fans can watch the Mets take BP...The game will be simulcast on SNY and PIX11.

**INTERESTING TO NOTE:** Wright has homered in his last three major league games - May 23-27, 2016...Wright has homered in four straight games once during his career (June 7-10, 2007).

**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets are 6-4 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 31-21 in their last 52 games and 43-36 since July 1...New York is 38-35 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 35-43 overall at home...New York is 11-3-2 in its last 16 series.

**SEPTEMBER:** The Mets are 16-9 this month, the sixth-best winning percentage (.640) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.42 ERA this month, the fifth-lowest in the majors.

**CONFORTO CONNECTS:** Michael Conforto has 17 homers (tied for the seventh-most in the majors) and 52 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is third in the majors with 43 RBI since August 1 and tied for sixth in homers (14) during that span...Conforto has 82 RBI, extending his career-high...He also has a career-high 28 homers (one more than last year).

**SIZZLING SEPTEMBER:** Conforto leads the majors with 29 RBI, and 18 extra-base hits this month and is tied for the major league lead with nine homers with Trevor Story...Only two other Mets players have had 29 or more RBI in September: Gary Carter (34 in 1985) and Darryl Strawberry (30 in 1984)...The last Met with 30 or more RBI in a month was Carlos Beltran (32 RBI in July, 2006).

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 26-19 vs. the Marlins at Citi Field since 2014.

**SEPTEMBER STARTERS:** Mets starting pitchers are 10-4 with a 2.60 ERA (43 earned runs/148.2 innings), the lowest ERA in the majors this month.

**MLB RECORDS:** Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 29 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 24 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

**LEADERBOARD:** DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.70), FanGraphs WAR (8.8), RA-9 WAR (9.3), FIP (1.98), HR/9 (0.41), Opponent's Slugging (.277), Opponent's OPS (.521), ERA+ (219) and Road ERA (1.87)...He is tied for the major league lead in WHIP (0.91)...DeGrom leads the NL in DRA (2.14), Home ERA (1.54), Opponent's OBP (.244), Home ERA (1.54) and leads the NL in Baseball-Reference WAR (10.1).

**BRANDON NIMMO:** Has walked nine times in his last four games...He has at least one walk in 13 of his last 14 games (19 total)...Has 28 walks this month, the second-most in the majors and is fifth in September with a .461 on-base percentage...Overall, ranks fifth in the majors with a .402 OBP, which would be the highest by a Met since David Wright had a .416 OBP in 2007...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples...Leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...Nimmo has a career-high 17 homers.

**HIT MACHINE:** Jeff McNeil has a .329 (70-213) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the eighth-highest in the majors (min. 200 PA)...He is tied for eighth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for third in the majors with 32 hits this month...Has the eighth-highest batting average (.340) in the majors this month (min. 70 AB)...McNeil's .329 average in his first 60 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 185 PA).

**AMED ROSARIO:** Has 70 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the 10th-most in the NL...Rosario is tied for fifth in the NL with 30 hits in September...Overall, ranks 10th in the NL with 22 stolen bases...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples.

**TAYLOR HOOTON:** Prior to tonight's game, the Taylor Hooton Foundation, which is the nation's leader in providing education programs for America's youngsters about the dangers of performance enhancing drugs, will present Jay Bruce a print of it's "All Me" PSA...Bruce is one of 30 Advisory Board members from each MLB team that encourage kids to achieve their goals without PED's.

**FIRST PITCH:** Roy Wang, named one of the 30 Most Influential Teens of 2017 by Time Magazine, will throw a honorary first pitch.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Oswalt tonight makes his 12th start of the season...In his last start, tossed 5.0 innings at Nationals Park...Allowed two runs, earned, on four hits with two walks and four punchouts...Was his longest outing since his 6.0-inning effort in game one of a doubleheader at Philadelphia on August 16.

**VS. MIAMI:** Oswalt tonight will make his third start versus the Marlins...In his last start against the Fish, August 11 at Marlins Park, tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, on six hits while walking a batter and striking out three...Also made his first career start against the Marlins on June 29 (2.2 IP, 6 ER)...In his two career starts against the Marlins, Oswalt has a 9.35 ERA (nine earned runs/8.2 innings).

**IN THE MAJORS:** Oswalt will be making his 17th-career major league appearance (12th start)...Will be his eighth appearance at Citi Field and his sixth home start...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his MLB debut in team history...Is one of two Mets hurlers in franchise history to record four or more strikeouts in a relief outing for his major league debut (also, Buzz Capra in game one of a doubleheader on September 15, 1971).

**2018 SEASON:** Oswalt has appeared in 16 games (11 starts) over six stints with the Mets...Made 11 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 6.02 ERA (35 earned runs/52.1 innings)...Has 52 strikeouts and 20 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso...Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Had four quality starts in 11 outings at Triple-A.

**SPRING RECAP:** Posted a 2.84 ERA (two earned runs/6.1 innings) this spring in four Grapefruit League games, striking out five and walking none...Did not allow a run in three of his four Grapefruit League outings, all of which came in relief.

**IN THE MINORS:** In 97 games (91 starts) in the Mets minor league system, Oswalt is 41-22 with a 3.64 ERA (202 earned runs/500.0 innings)...Went 12-5 with a 2.28 ERA (34 earned runs/134.1 innings) in 24 starts with Double-A Binghamton in 2017 en route to being named a Mid-Season and Post-Season Eastern League All-Star as well as the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year.

### OSWALT'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Graduated from Madison (CA) High School in 2012...Was committed to UC Santa Barbara as a position player (third base/shortstop).
- » Selected by the New York Mets as a pitcher in the seventh round of 2012 First-Year Player Draft.
- » In 2014, his first season at the A-level, was named to the Mid-Season New York-Penn League All-Star Team representing the Brooklyn Cyclones.
- » In 2016, he pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League, going 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 earned runs/27.0 innings) in seven starts for the Scorpions.
- » Was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after going 12-5 with a league-leading 2.28 ERA with Binghamton...His 2.28 ERA led all Double-A pitchers.
- » Was tabbed as the Mets' Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year for his 2017 campaign at Binghamton.
- » In 2017, finished second in the Eastern League in victories (12), third in WHIP (1.18) and fifth in opponents average against (.236)
- » Also in 2017 was named to the Eastern League's mid-season and post-season All-Star teams.
- » Made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings out of the bullpen with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his major league debut.
