AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the second game of their three-game Subway Series at the Mets (1-0 so far)...are 6-1 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore (postponements on 5/31 and 6/3), a split doubleheader in Detroit on Monday (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15) and a two-game sweep in Toronto from Tues.-Wed...will begin a six-game homestand on Mon., starting with 2G vs. the Nationals (6/12-13) and 4G vs. the Rays (6/14-17)...the team will then make a one-day trip to Washington on 6/18 to resume their suspended game from 5/15 and play a makeup game for their 5/16 rainout before returning to the Bronx for 3G vs. the Mariners (6/19-21).

- ▶ At 41-18 (.695), have the Majors' best winning percentage...is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ Trained Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 26-19, the Yankees are 32-9).
- ▶ Are a season-high 23G over .500...are 23G over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2012 season at 28G over .500 with a 95-67 record.
- ▶ Is the ninth season in franchise history and the second season over the last 65 years (since 1954) that they have reached 23G over within their first 59 decisions of a season (first went 23G over in 1998 after 43G, starting 33-10)...made the World Series in all eight previous instances, winning six times (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42).
- ▶ Marks the ninth time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 41 wins over their first 59 results...each of the other eight Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42)...joins the 1998 team (46-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 59G start over the last 65 seasons (since 1954).
- ▶ Over their last 14 completed series (since 4/19), are 12-1-1.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 10-3 so far.
- ▶ Are 15-9 vs. the AL East and 26-9 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 32-2 (.941) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season.
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-most wins (41) despite playing just 60 games (tied for fewest).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Mets, 4-1, at Citi Field on Friday...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (5.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR) started and exited the game in the sixth with stiffness in both hamstrings after scoring on **RF Aaron Judge's** (0-for-2, 1RBI, 1BB) sac fly...**CF Brett Gardner** (2-for-3) hit a tie-breaking, two-run HR in the eighth inning...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4) hit a solo HR in the ninth, his fourth HR in his last 6G...**Yankees relievers** tossed 4.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1HP, 3K), extending their scoreless inning streak to 12.IP...**RHP Chad Green** (1.0IP, 2H, 2K) picked up his fourth win of the season with a scoreless seventh inning...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 1HP) earned his 16th save of the year.

STANTON ISLAND: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit his 15th home run of the season on Friday at Citi Field...is one of three players with at least 15HR in each of the last nine seasons (since 2010), joining Edwin Encarnación and Justin Upton.

- ▶ Has 22HR in 53G at Citi Field, most by any visiting player...his .621 SLG is the highest at the ballpark among all players (min. 100AB)...has 5HR in his last 6G at Citi Field (since 5/6/17) and 10HR over his last 16G (since 4/11/16).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** lead the Majors in runs per game (5.57), HR (100), HR per game (1.67), SLG (.466), OPS (.800) and walks (238)...rank second in runs (334), OBP (.334), XBHs (229) and total bases (963).

- ▶ Have homered in 48 of their 60 games, the most in the Majors...are on pace to hit 270HR...the MLB single-season HR record was set by the 1997 Mariners (264).
- ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are 16-5 in their last 21 completed road games and 19-9 (.679) away from home in 2018...are 28-15 in 43 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 6-2-2 in their first 10 road series this year and 10-3-2 in 15 road series since 8/22/17.



HOPE WEEK 2018 (June 11-15): This year marks the 10th annual HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of good will provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 30-12 (.714) during the event...have won 18 of their last 22 games during HOPE Week.

SIGNS OF THE TIMES: The Yankees have signed six of their top 10 picks from the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, including their first-round pick **C Anthony Seigler** (23rd overall)...the Yankees have also signed **RHP Frank German** (rd. 4), **OF Brandon Lockridge** (rd. 5), **RHP Connor Van Hoose** (rd. 8), **RHP Mick Vorhof** (rd. 9) and **LHP Josh Maciejewski** (rd. 10).

ALL THAT'S LEFT: The Yankees are a Major League-best 14-4 this season when they face a left-handed starting pitcher.

- ▶ **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is 15-for-35 (.429) with 2 doubles, 5HR and 4BB vs. LHP since 4/27, having reached base safely in 19-of-40 PA...overall, is hitting .368/.406/.825 (21-for-57) with 11XBH vs. LHP this season (3 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR)...is second in the Majors in HR vs. LHP and fourth in SLG.
- ▶ Since 1961, his .644 SLG vs. left-handers is tops in the Majors (min. 1,000PA).

GARDY PARTY: **LF Brett Gardner** has hit safely in 14-of-15G (since 5/18)...is hitting .367 (29-for-79) with 12R, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 8RBI, 9BB and 4SB in his last 19G (since 5/11).

- ▶ Is a career .315 (237-for-753) hitter with 19HR and 75RBI in 210G in June, his highest batting average of any calendar month (next: May - .282).
- ▶ Has 4HR in his last 10G after hitting only 1HR in his first 43G of the season...four of his 5HR this season and 10 of his last 13HR since 6/23/17 have either tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.
- ▶ Since the beginning of 2017, the Yankees are 19-3 when Gardner homers.

PEN PALS: **Yankees relievers** did not allow a run in 4.0IP on Friday at the Mets (3H, 3K, 1HP)...own a 12.1 scoreless inning streak since 6/4 (6H, 3BB, 14K, 1HP).

- ▶ Since 4/21, **Yankees relievers** have posted a 2.42 ERA (134.0IP, 36ER) with 168K...had posted a 4.34 (74.2IP, 36ER) in their first 18G of the season...their 2.42 ERA in that span ranks second in the Majors behind Milwaukee (2.41).
- ▶ **Yankees relievers** lead the Majors with 279K and rank second with a .208 opponents' BA...rank third in the AL and sixth in the Majors with a 3.11 ERA.
- ▶ Three Yankees rank in the top eight in strikeouts in the AL among relievers: **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (46K, T2nd), **Dellin Betances** (46K, T2nd) and **RHP Chad Green** (40K, 7th).

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE: **RHP Jonathan Holder** has not allowed an earned run in 16G since being recalled on 4/21, retiring 55-of-65 batters (18.0IP, 8H, 3R/OER, 2BB/1IBB, 17K).

NATIONAL PASTIME: The Yankees are 2-1 in their first three completed interleague games this season...are 8-1 in Interleague play since 7/25/17.

- ▶ Have won five straight games vs. the Mets, their longest winning streak against them since they won five consecutive games from 6/14/09-5/21/10...are 13-4 in their last 17G vs. the Mets since 5/14/14.
- ▶ Have won seven of their last eight Interleague games on the road (since 5/5/17).

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees have come-from-behind in seven of their last eight wins (since 5/29)...have 18 comeback wins this season, the second-most in the Majors (Boston-19).

ROAD TESTED: **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 1.91 ERA (66.0IP, 14ER) on their current road trip.

YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY

WINNING FORMULA: Tonight the Yankees play their fifth Interleague game of 2018 (are 2-1 so far, their 5/15 game was suspended)...have the second-most wins and the second-highest all-time winning percentage (228-157; .592) in Interleague history (Boston: 231-157, .595)...are 46-30 in their last 76 completed Interleague games since 5/14/14.

- ✦ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season (previous was 13: 13-7 in 2014, 13-5 in 2003, '11, '12, 13-3 in 1998)...went 8-12 in 2016.
- ✦ Have posted a winning Interleague record in 17-of-21 seasons (17-3-1 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span.
- ✦ Have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record in 18-of-21 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.
- ✦ All-time, are .500-or-better against all but two NL teams during the regular season (13-14 vs. the Phillies, 6-7 vs. the Dodgers).

THE SCHEDULE: The Yankees are scheduled to play 20 Interleague games in 2018, with the fifth coming tonight at Citi Field...are 2-1 in Interleague play so far...in addition to their annual Subway Series, which includes three games in Queens this weekend and three in the Bronx in July, the Yankees play the NL East this year...they played a home series vs. the Marlins in April (2G, 1-1) and will later host the Nationals (2G, 6/12-13), Braves (3G, 7/2-4) and Mets (3G, 7/20-22)...in addition to these three games at Citi Field, will play a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia (6/25-27) and a two-game set at Marlins Park in Miami (8/21-22)...began a then-two-game series at Washington on 5/15, but had the game suspended in the sixth...had the resumption of the game, along with their regularly-scheduled contest on 5/16 postponed...will play the resumption and the makeup at Nationals Park on 6/18.

UNFAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS: The Yankees went 7-3 in Interleague road games in 2017 (went 3-7 in 2016)...over the last 10 seasons (since 2008), have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record on the road eight times (4-6 in 2013, 3-7 in 2016)...are 102-89 (.534) in Interleague road games all time.

- ✦ Are 63-48 all time in NL East ballparks (does not include a 2-1 mark against the Rays at Citi Field in September 2017), 21-19 in NL Central parks and 18-22 in NL West parks.

ON THE HILL: Yankees pitchers struck out a Major League-best 203 batters in Interleague play in 2017...Yankees starters posted 3.43 ERA (120.2IP, 46ER) with 113K in 20 starts.

- ✦ **RHP Luis Severino** set a single-season franchise Interleague record with 37K and also tallied a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in four starts in 2017.

AT THE PLATE: In the history of Interleague play (since 1997), the Yankees rank first in walks (1,526) and stolen bases (290), second in OBP (.342), third in runs scored (1,907) and sixth in home runs (455)...have scored at least 9R in six of their last 23 completed Interleague games since the start of 2017...have averaged 5.48 runs per game over their last 54 Interleague games since 6/18/15 (296R/54G).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Yankees are 126-68 (.649) all-time in Interleague play at home, including 54-34 (.614) at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 25 of their last 38 Interleague home games (since 5/17/14)... went 72-34 (.679) against NL teams at the original Yankee Stadium.

PITCHERS AS HITTERS: The original Yankees pitchers are 3-for-their-last-77 in Interleague play since 5/20/14...the only three hits in that span: **Luis Severino** singled and later scored a run on 8/17/17 at New York-NL; **Michael Pineda** snapped a team 0-for-29 with a single on 5/5/17 at Chicago-NL; reliever **Branden Pinder** snapped a team 0-for-28 with an RBI double on 8/30/15 at Atlanta...Pinder's hit is the most recent extra-base hit and hit with an RBI by a Yankees pitcher...was the second Yankees relief pitcher in the DH era (since 1973) to record a hit (also Mike Stanton on 6/6/00 at Montreal)...have batted a combined .085 (37-for-433) with 9 doubles, 13RBI and 49 sacrifice hits in Interleague play.

- ✦ Jordan Montgomery has two career walks, having 1BB in each of his two road Interleague starts in 2017...matches Jason Grimsley, Darrell Rasner and Javier Vazquez for the most career BB by a Yankees pitcher in the DH era.
- ✦ The last HR by a Yankees pitcher came in the pre-DH era (Lindy McDaniel solo HR on 9/28/72 at Detroit).

LAST START: Took the loss in the Yankees' 4-2 loss in Game 2 of Monday's doubleheader at Detroit (6.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HP)...threw a career-high 6.2IP, faced a career-high 30 batters and allowed a career-high 7H...held Detroit to a .125 BA (1-for-8) with 1BB and 2K with runners in scoring position...is now winless in five career starts.

2018: Has appeared in 10 games (five starts) this season, going 0-4 with a 5.44 ERA (41.1IP, 25ER)...opponents are hitting .231 (36-for-156) off him, the seventh-lowest opponents' BA among all AL rookies (min. 20.0IP)...is third in the AL among rookies with 44K.
