Spring Training Game Notes

San Diego Padres (6-5-1) @ Kansas City Royals (6-2-1)
Tuesday, March 6, 2018

BACK TO WORK--The Royals enjoyed their first off day of the spring on Monday and return to action with the first of five contests under the lights while in Arizona...Kansas City recorded a 10-3 win over the Reds in Goodyear on Sunday, snapping a two-game slide and running the spring mark to 6-2 with a tie...the Royals spread out a 15-hit attack that was led by Jorge Bonifacio, Cheslor Cuthbert, Ryan Goins and Donnie Dewees all collecting a pair of hits, while Boni's day included a double and two RBI...KC gave starter Jason Hammel an early cushion by plating four first inning runs and then the veteran hurler responded by retiring all six Reds he faced over his first 2.0 innings of the spring, including a pair of strikeouts...Wily Peralta, Blaine Boyer, Seth Maness, Miguel Almonte, Glenn Sparkman and Kevin Lenik each worked a scoreless frame, while Eric Stout was charged with all three Cincy runs in his inning of work.

JON JAY SIGNED--The Royals today added to their outfield depth with the free agent signing of Jon Jay...the 32-year old lefthanded hitter spent last season with the Chicago Cubs batting .296 with a .374 on-base percentage in 141 games...he came up with the St. Louis Cardinals in 2010, playing there for six seasons, then was with the Padres in 2016 before joining Chicago last year...to make room on the 40-man roster the Royals have placed right-handed pitcher Jesse Hahn on the 60-day disabled list (right ulnar collateral ligament sprain)...Hahn will be eligible for reinstatement on May 28...Jay will wear #25, which is also the same jersey number as Cody Asche, so KC will have duplicate numbers for the time being.

VS. PADRES--Tonight is the second of four spring tilts vs. the Friars, with San Diego handing the Royals their first loss of the spring last Friday in Peoria by a 13-5 count...these clubs will meet again on March 12 for a noon contest on a split-squad Monday for KC and then the Royals will return to Peoria on March 16 for the final affair with San Diego...the Royals and Friars will not see each other during the regular season, as Kansas City is slated for N.L. Central duty during Interleague play.

DENNY BACK FOR #50--The one common thread between the start of the Royals' franchise in 1969 and the start of 2018 is the voice of Denny Matthews, who will be in the booth tonight for this contest with the Padres...the 2007 Ford Frick Award winner will be at the mic for his 50th season this year, the same anniversary the organization is celebrating, with only the Dodgers' Vin Scully (67 years) and Jaime Jarrin (60 years) having longer stretches in the baseball broadcast booth.

TUBE TIME--Tonight's game is being beamed back to Kansas City via our partners at FOX Sports Kansas City with Ryan Lefebvre and Jeff Montgomery manning the mics...next weekend will be a busy one on the tube, with Saturday at the Diamondbacks, Sunday in Surprise vs. the Tribe and next Monday, March 12, the night game of the split-doubleheader against Texas all being carried on FSKC.

50TH SEASON OF ROYALS BASEBALL--The 2018 campaign is the Golden Anniversary season of the Royals who began play in 1969 in Ft. Myers, FL...this 33-game exhibition slate will feature 32 games here in Arizona and then will be capped with a stop in Omaha against KC's AAA affiliate for all 50 seasons of the franchise's existence...KC has 13 games remaining in Surprise, 12 of which will be as the home club...the 2018 spring slate also features four split-squad days, including two (March 9 and 23) with 1:05 starts (Arizona time) and a pair of day/night doubleheaders (March 12 and 19) with starts at noon and 6:05 (Arizona time)...the 2018 slate is a strange one in that the Royals will not play the Los Angeles Angels or the Colorado Rockies...there are a pair of off days in the spring slate on March 5 and 19...the 2018 regular season starts on Thursday, March 29 in Kauffman Stadium against the White Sox in the first of a 3-game series.

SURPRISE STADIUM RATED NUMERO UNO--At USA TODAY's request, ReviewTrackers conducted a study of more than 36,000 online reviews of the 23 spring training ballparks and analyzed 130,000 key words used in the reviews...the study provided a look at how baseball fans feel about the ballparks used for exhibition games...to create a score for each spring training stadium, ReviewTrackers examined how fans felt about four aspects of their visits: the facility; family friendliness; food; and the fan experience...to no surprise (pun intended), the Surprise Stadium, spring home of the Royals and Rangers, generated the highest overall score of the 10 Cactus League venues, finishing first in family friendliness...the park also topped all 23 spring parks (Arizona and Florida combined) in the facility and fan-experience categories.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN--With the addition of Jon Jay and the non-roster return of Billy Burns, the Royals to have 66 players in camp, though pitcher Jesse Hahn has been placed on the 60-day D.L...the breakdown includes 32 pitchers (9 non-roster), 7 catchers (5 non-roster), 16 infielders (8 non-roster) and 11 outfielders (5 non-roster)...among the 32 pitchers in camp, 7 are left-handed...of the 27 non-roster players in camp with Kansas City, nine have previous Major League experience, including seven who had time in "The Show" in 2017...of the 37 roster players in camp, nine have yet to accrue any big league service time.

COMING OFF SUB .500 CAMPAIGN--The Royals had their first sub-.500 season since 2012 with last year's 80-82 ledger, finishing in third place in the A.L. Central, 22 games in back of the division winning Indians...Kansas City has gone 431-379 in its last five seasons, tying the New York Yankees for the third best record in the American League in that span, trailing Cleveland (454-354) and Boston (432-378).

SPRING WORK--After Sunday's win over the Reds, the Royals have an all-time exhibition record of 687-627 with 41 ties for a .523 winning pct...the 2018 exhibition season is the 16th here in the Valley of the Sun where the club has posted a 256-203 mark with 19 ties for a .558 mark...the Royals spent their first 34 seasons training in Florida, beginning with Fort Myers (1969-87), followed by a 15-year stint in Baseball City (1988-2002).

WORKING TOWARD THE START OF A NEW YEAR--The 2018 campaign will see the earliest start for the Royals, with the lid-lifter scheduled for Thursday, March 29 against the Chicago White Sox...that 3:15 contest will be the first of a 3-game series, that will see a "weather" off day on Friday, March 30, then resumption with games on Saturday (6:15 p.m.) and Sunday (1:15 p.m.)...KC will then depart on its first road swing of the year with a 6-game journey through Detroit (3) and Cleveland (3)...the first two trips of the campaign will include 3-game stops in the Motor City to battle the Tigers, then the Royals will not travel to Detroit again until the final trip of the year in late September...Kansas City will take on the National League Central in Interleague action, playing home & home 2-game sets with Milwaukee and Cincinnati, a home & home 3-game series with St. Louis and then a 3-game series in Kauffman Stadium against the Chicago Cubs (August 6-8) and 3-game road trip to Pittsburgh (September 17-19).

AT THE HELM--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost begins his eighth full season with the club, taking the reins on May 13, 2010...he has a 629-632 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, surpassing Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and enters this year sixth among active managers in games (2,220) and wins (1,086)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

THE WEEK AHEAD--The Royals will be right back here tomorrow at 1:05 for a contest with Milwaukee then head to Glendale on Thursday for the final spring meeting with the White Sox...KC's first split-squad action of the spring will be Friday when the Royals host Arizona with one club and travel to Glendale to meet the Dodgers with a second squad.

ON THE AIRWAVES--Today's game is the sixth of 20 spring radio broadcasts on KCSP Radio (610 Sports) and the Royals Radio Network...Denny Matthews, Ryan Lefebvre, Steve Physioc and Steve Stewart will be mikeside all spring...tomorrow against the Brewers will also be on 610 Sports and then next Thursday, Friday vs. Arizona and Saturday are all slated for the web.

#55 NATE KARNs, 30, will make his first start of the spring tonight...made nine appearances (eight starts) in 2017, his first year in Kansas City...placed on the DL May 24 with nerve irritation in his right arm and missed the remainder of the season...went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5 ER in 22.1 IP) in four May starts prior to the injury...recorded a career-high 12 strikeouts on May 13 vs. Baltimore, becoming the first in the Majors to record that many strikeouts in 5.0 innings or less since the Cubs' Jake Arrieta on June 5, 2016 vs. Arizona...also had 10 strikeouts on May 8 at Tampa Bay, becoming the sixth Royals pitcher to record double-digit strikeouts in consecutive outings.

#49 HEATH FILLMYER, 23, is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring today...recorded a scoreless inning on Thursday in Peoria vs. Seattle...acquired from Oakland on Jan. 29 with RHP Jesse Hahn in exchange for 1B/OF Brandon Moss and LHP Ryan Buchter...spent all of 2017 in Midland (AA), where he tied for the Texas League lead in starts (29), tied for second in wins (11) and ranked fifth in ERA (3.49)...went 5-0 during a six-start stretch from July 25-Aug. 23, posting a 2.33 ERA (10 ER in 38.2 IP)...attended Mercer County Community College (N.J.), where he was an infielder as a freshman, before going 9-0 with a 0.68 ERA (5 ER in 66.0 IP) as a sophomore.

#56 BRAD KELLER, 22, is scheduled to make his third appearance today...recorded a scoreless inning on Feb. 26 in Scottsdale vs. San Francisco and Thursday in Peoria vs. Seattle...in his first camp with the Royals after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati after they selected him from Arizona in the Rule 5 Draft...spent all of 2017 with Jackson (AA) in the Diamondbacks' organization, going 10-9 with a 4.68 ERA in 26 starts...entered 2017 rated as the No. 7 prospect in Arizona's system, according to *Baseball America*...originally selected by Arizona in the eighth round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
