**LEADING OFF:** Tonight the Halos play the second contest (1-0) of six-game home stand vs. **Texas** (June 1-3) and **Kansas City** (June 4-6)...**Halos are 14-6 vs. A.L. West foes**...Angels went 4-6 on the 10-game road trip to **Toronto** (2-1), **New York Yankees** (1-2) & **Detroit** (1-3)...**LAA sits a season-high 5.5 games back of division lead (3rd time)**...Angels went 14-15 in May and is 18-24 since a club-record 13-3 start...**Angels are 9-7-2 in 18 series**...Following the home stand, LAA heads out to **Minnesota** (June 8-10), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17).

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** LAA posted 4<sup>th</sup> shutout of season... Second time every starter on the team recorded a hit (also, April 10 at Texas)...**Albert Pujols** recorded his 3,023<sup>rd</sup> hit, tying **Lou Brock** for 27<sup>th</sup> all-time...**RHP Oliver Drake** made his Halo debut, first in club history to attend the US Naval Academy.

**ABOUT BARRIA:** Last night, **Jaime Barria** became the first LAA pitcher to win four consecutive decisions in 2018...Leads A.L. rookies (min. 30 IP) in ERA (2.48) and wins (5)...4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (29.1 IP – 7 ER) and 26 strikeouts over his last five starts

**SIMBA STAYS HOT:** **Andrelton Simmons** boasts a 10-game hit streak...Has hit safely in 30 of his last 34 games hitting .359 (47-for-131) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span.

**SAY WHAT?** Angels' starters limited opponents to three earned runs-or-less in 25 of 29 games in May but the Club finished with a losing record (14-15)...**Starter ERA of 2.86 (167 IP – 53 ER) for May ranked second in A.L.**...229 BAA was fourth lowest in A.L. for the month...Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for the month was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

**SHO-KKKKK:** **Shohei Ohtani** has 57 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first seven career starts...57 Ks are already a club record through nine starts as well.

**KINSLER CLIMBING:** **Ian Kinsler** is riding a five-game hit streak going 10-for-19 (.527) to raise his season average from .178 to .216...Has logged three doubles, two HRs and five RBI in the stretch...Was in a 4-for-46 skid before the hit streak.

**MIKE'S MILESTONE:** **Mike Scioscia** posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons **Tommy Lasorda** (1,599) for sole possession of 20<sup>th</sup> all-time.

**MUY BIEN!** **Martín Maldonado** has hits in eight of last 10 games...10 RBI his last 10 games...Hitting .329 (25/76) with six doubles and three home runs since May 1 after entering month with a .156 average...**Already has five 3-hit contests in 2018 - first Angels' catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009.**

**YOU READ THAT RIGHT:** **Mike Trout** is on pace for a 15.4 WAR season – would be the best ever by a position player...**He is on pace for a career-best 50 homers.**

**FAST AND FAR:** With two stolen bases May 20th, **Mike Trout** reached 175 for his career...**One of six players to tally 200 HRs & 175 SBs in their first eight seasons joining Willie Mays, Barry/Bobby Bonds, Darryl Strawberry & Rafael Soriano**...**Trout** is the lone player to do prior to age-27 season.

**MORE THAN GLOVE:** **Andrelton Simmons** has reached base safely in 37 of last 38 games...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 23.4 (234 PA/10 K) and ranks T3rd in A.L. batting .335**...Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

**TWO-WAY SHOHEI:** **Ohtani** leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (57) and ranks tied for second in wins (4)...Quality starts in five of eight outings on the mound...Has a hit in 22-of-31 games with an at-bat...Tied for second in A.L. among rookies in extra base hits with 15...His six HRs are third-most in A.L. amongst rookies (all six hit at home) while his 20<sup>th</sup> RBI rank fourth...Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April.

**PUJOLS POINTS:** **Pujols** sits at 629 career two-baggers (11<sup>th</sup> all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632)...**Pujols** has 3,023 career hits – tied for 27<sup>th</sup> all-time with **Lou Brock**.

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 26 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through first 58 games...**Halos have issued 209 free passes, second-most in A.L.**...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 218.1 IP to rank second in A.L.**

**THIS N' THAT:** Last Saturday, **C Jose Briceño** became the seventh player in LAA history to homer in MLB debut (3<sup>rd</sup> catcher)...**Halo outfielders lead MLB with 14 OF assists (Calhoun leads MLB with 7)**...**Halos' average home attendance (37,295 ranks second in A.L.)**...Club boasts seven sellouts thru 30 home games...**LAA has 24 errors thru 58 games (third-fewest in A.L.) and rank third in circuit with a .988 fielding pct.**...Angels are 29-9 all-time when **Trout** and **Pujols** homer in same game.

**June 2**  
**(1964) Dean Chance** struck out 15 batters at Chavez Ravine in a 1-0 win over the Boston Red Sox, en route to winning the Cy Young Award that year...The shutout was one of a club-record 28 for the Angels in 1964; **(2004) Vladimir Guerrero** sets a single-game club record with nine RBI in Angels' 10-7 win over Red Sox... Finished the night going 4-for-4 with two home runs and a double...The mark would be broken by **Garret Anderson's** 10 RBI-night on August 21, 2007 vs. the Yankees.

**(2003) Angels** hit 13 HRs in the first two games of the Montreal series in Puerto Rico (June 3-4) to tie the A.L. record for home runs in consecutive games set by the New York Yankees, June 28, 1939 at Philadelphia (doubleheader).

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS**

**4-4, 3.67 ERA**

Since 2014, is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (68.2 IP – 20 ER) in month of June

- Making 12th start of the season and sixth at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Texas.
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in nine of last 10 games...is pitching to a 2.39 ERA (26.1 IP – 7 ER) across last five starts.
- **RUNS OF SUPPORT:** Angels have scored 37 runs while Richards was in the game across his 11 starts (54 IP) this season...That average of 6.17 runs per nine innings ranks as sixth best in the American League (min. 40 IP).
- **HAPPY JUNE!** In 11 June starts since 2014, is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (68.2 IP – 20 ER)...In June of 2014, went 4-0 with a 1.05 ERA (34.1 IP – 4 ER) and established a franchise ERA record (min. 30 IP) for the month, breaking **John Lackey's** mark of 1.16 (38.2 IP – 5 ER) in June of 2008.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks third in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (399/1820) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind **Chris Sale** (.217) and **Corey Kluber** (.217).
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 13 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2-3 record and 2.60 ERA (62.1 IP – 18 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in 10 of the 13 starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start on Sunday at New York (A.L.) after pitching 2.1 innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with five walks and three strikeouts...Exited game trailing 1-0, but two runners on base would score.
- **SCORELESS START:** Tossed 6.2 shutout innings on May 4 at Seattle, marking 15<sup>th</sup> career scoreless start (first of 2018); 11<sup>th</sup> scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 20-17 record and 3.22 ERA (316 IP – 113 ER) in 59 games (50 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 20 wins are eighth most in the Majors in that span.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, ranks third among A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.8 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 40 IP), ranks fifth in the A.L. with a 95.8 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, NYY (97.6 MPH), **Shohei Ohtani**, (96.9 MPH), **Gerrit Cole**, HOU (96.2 MPH) and **Charlie Morton**, HOU (96.1 MPH).
- **VS. TEXAS:** Is seeking first winning decision vs. Rangers since Sept. 4, 2015...In 22 career games (18 starts) against the Rangers, is 9-4 with a 3.11 ERA (104.1 IP – 36 ER) and 90 strikeouts...Nine wins over Rangers are his most against any opponent...Has been winning pitcher in seven of last 12 starts vs. Rangers...Has allowed 17 ER in last 69 innings pitched (2.22 ERA) vs. Rangers and has yielded two-or-fewer earned runs in 10 of last 11 starts vs. Texas...As a starter, is 8-4 with a 2.92 ERA (101.2 IP – 33 ER)...Angels went 2-8 in the 10 games he pitched vs. TEX from 2011-2013 but are 9-3 since.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Owns a 24-16 career record with a 3.45 ERA (363 IP – 139 ER) in 80 appearances (53 starts) at Angel Stadium...In five starts at home this season, is 2-2 with a 4.21 ERA (25.2 IP – 12 ER)...Since 2014, is 18-12 with a 3.11 ERA (246 IP – 85 ER)...Overall as a starter, is 24-14 with a 3.36 ERA (331.2 IP – 124 ER) at the Big A...Angels are 33-20 in his home starts.
- **CAREER-HIGH K'S:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **2017 SEASON:** Exited first start of year (Apr. 5, 2017 at OAK) after five scoreless innings with right biceps strain...Missed 135 games on disabled list...Returned to Angels on Sept. 5, 2017 at OAK...Made five September starts and pitched to a 2.74 ERA (23 IP – 7 ER) for the month...Allowed one-or-fewer runs in four of six starts on the season.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 165 career games (110 starts), is 44-38 with a 3.54 ERA (722.1 IP – 284 ER) and 618 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 33-25 with a 3.13 ERA (492.1 IP – 171 ER).

Making 12<sup>th</sup> start of the season and sixth at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Rangers... Charged with the loss in last start on Monday at Detroit after pitching five innings and allowing five earned runs on six hits with three walks and five strikeouts...In nine career starts vs. Texas, is 3-2 with a 6.00 ERA (42 IP – 28 ER)...The ERA is highest of any A.L. opponent and wins are second most against any opponent...Earned the win in first start of 2018 vs. Rangers on April 10 at Globe Life Park after tossing five innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with four walks and seven strikeouts.
