HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 6-1 start matches the best 7-game start in franchise history (also: 2000, '17)...they have never started 7-1.
- ♦ A win today or tomorrow would give the D-backs 3 consecutive series wins to start the season for the first time in club history.
- ♦ A win would give the D-backs just their second series win in new Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006 (also: 2016)...Arizona is 1-8-3 in series all-time @ Busch Stadium.
- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** has 99 career managerial wins, and is looking to become the fastest manager in D-backs history to 100 wins.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 12-4 with a 3.17 ERA (39 ER in 110.2 IP) in 18 career games (16 starts) vs. Cardinals...is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (13 ER in 48.1 IP) in 8 career games (7 starts) @ Busch Stadium.

THURSDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs defeated the Cardinals 3-1, extending their winning streak to 4 games.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** (2-0) earned the win, allowing 1 run in 6.0 innings (9 K, 2 H)...**Yoshihisa Hirano**, **Andrew Chafin**, **Archie Bradley** and **Brad Boxberger** combined to throw 3.0 perfect frames.
- ♦ **David Peralta** was 2-for-3 with 2 RBI and a double...**Chris Owings** went 3-for-3 with 2 runs scored and a double...**Ray** drove in a run on a sacrifice fly.
- ♦ Owings has had at least 1 hit and is 7-for-17 (.411) in his last 5 games...Peralta has a 4-game hitting streak batting .333 (6-for-18) with 3 RBI and 2 runs scored.

YESTERDAY'S TRANSACTIONS

- ♦ Yesterday, the D-backs claimed RHP **Troy Scribner** off waivers from the Angels and optioned him to Triple-A Reno...to make room on the 40-man roster, Arizona designated OF **Jeremy Hazelbaker** for assignment.

FAST START

- ♦ Arizona's 6-1 record is tied for the best 7-game start in team history (also: 2000, '17), and is tied with the Red Sox and Pirates for the best record in baseball.

TOREY TRYING TO KEEP IT "100"

- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** has 99 career wins in 169 regular season games as a Major League manager, and is looking to be the fastest active manager to reach 100 wins [source: Elias]:

ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 20 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 14-6 (.700), the best winning pct. in the NL and third-best in baseball, behind only the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 10-5 with a 2.59 ERA (32 ER in 111.1 IP), 126 strikeouts and 48 walks.

BATMEN

- ♦ Arizona's .258 team average ranks fourth in the NL behind the Braves (.298), Pirates (.282) and Mets (.265).
- ♦ **Chris Owings** ranks third in the NL with a .429 average, tied for fourth with a .500 on-base pct. and seventh with a 1.167 OPS.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is tied with Eric Hosmer for the NL lead with 4 doubles, and is tied for second in the Majors with Didi Gregorius/NYY and Dixon Machado/DET, behind Xander Bogaerts/BOS (6).

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE

- ♦ The D-backs are tied with the Yankees for second in the Majors with 36 walks, behind the Nationals (39).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** ranks third in the Majors with 9 walks, trailing Freddie Freeman/ATL (12) and Bryce Harper/WSH (10).

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

ARCHIE BRADLEY BOBBLEHEAD: The first 20,000 fans to Chase Field on April 21 vs. Padres will receive an Archie Bradley audio bobblehead, courtesy of Gila River Hotels and Casino. The bobblehead will commemorate Bradley's triple in the 2017 National League Wild Card Game and will feature audio clips from D-backs radio broadcasters Greg Schulte and Tom Candiotti.

START ME UP

- ♦ Arizona's starters have combined to go 5-0 with a 3.02 ERA (14 ER in 41.2 IP), tied for the most wins (also: Pirates) and the second best ERA in the NL (Dodgers, 1.99).
- ♦ Over the last 5 games, D-backs starting pitchers have gone 3-0 with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER in 31.0 IP), 37 strikeouts, 9 walks and a .183 opponents average, allowing 1 or fewer runs 4 times.

BACK WHERE IT ALL STARTED

- ♦ **Daniel Descalzo's** career began with the Cardinals spanning 5 seasons from 2010-14, highlighted by a pair of trips to the World Series (2011 champions, 2013 runner-up).
- ♦ In his last 10 games against his former team, he is hitting .333 (12-for-36) with a .442 on-base pct., .997 OPS, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer, 6 RBI and 7 walks.
- ♦ **Fernando Salas** (2007-13) and **David Peralta** (2005-09) each pitched in the Cardinals' organization and **Dave McKay** was St. Louis' first base coach from 1996-2011.

EARLY BIRD GETS THE WORM

- ♦ Arizona has scored 10 runs in the first inning this season, tied for the third most in the Majors with Cleveland, behind Washington (12) and Atlanta (12).
- ♦ The D-backs have 6 extra-base hits in the opening frame, tied for second most in the Majors with the Rockies, trailing only the Braves (7).

NATIONAL BEER DAY

- ♦ The D-backs celebrate National Beer Day today by highlighting new additions to the craft beer experience at Chase Field:
 - Expanded Game Seven Grill with the addition of The Craft Attic in the second story of the restaurant...The Craft Attic will feature several craft beer brands including Four Peaks, Elysian, Ten Barrel and Golden Road, among several others, and grab n' go pub-inspired bites.
 - The Draft Room at Chase Field will include the Four Peaks Porch on the lower terrace and will host several VIP winners of the Four Peaks, Four Seats promotion throughout the season.
 - The D-backs have also added the Hop Valley Hop Box, located at section 110 along the main concourse and a growler fill station at the beer portable at section 107.

D-BACKS TO CELEBRATE 20TH ANNIVERSARY

- ♦ Arizona will celebrate its 20th anniversary in 2018 with a series of events allowing fans to look back at the club's first 20 years while focusing on the next generation...elements include:
 - Vote for the D-backs All-Time Team at dbacks.com/20.
 - The logo (top L corner) features the team's historic and current colors (Purple and Sedona Red) and 6 stars, each representing a D-backs playoff team (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11 & '17);
 - A commemorative patch, featuring the logo, will adorn the team's jerseys throughout the season and caps during the first homestand;
 - The "D-backs 20th Anniversary Experience," a 2,000 square-foot exhibit at Chase Field features memorabilia and photography.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (0-0, 5.40)

- ♦ Did not factor into the decision in his first outing on April 2 vs. Dodgers (3 ER in 5.0 IP)...did not allow a run on 4 hits over his final 4.0 innings.
- ♦ Is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER in 12.0 IP) in 2 starts vs. Cardinals.
- ♦ Was sixth in the NL with a 2.92 road ERA in 2017...allowed 1 run or fewer in 4 of his last 5 road starts, going 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER in 26.1 IP) during that span.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Is in his third season with Arizona...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser)
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

FIRST START

- ◆ Tossed 5.2 innings with 1 run on 5 hits with 9 strikeouts on March 31 vs. Rockies and did not figure in a 2-1 loss.

DID YOU KNOW?

- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

SNAKEBITES

- ◆ Has won his last 2 starts @ Busch Stadium (1.20 ERA, 2 ER in 15.0 IP; .170 OPP AVG, 2 BB, 16 K).
- ◆ In his last 7 starts vs. NL Central (team is 5-2), he is 4-1 with a 3.30 ERA (17 ER in 46.1 IP), .214 opponent average, 9 walks and 51 strikeouts.
- ◆ Did not issue a walk in his last start...last time he had back-to-back starts with 0 walks was in 2015, July 4 vs. Mets and July 9 vs. Phillies.

VS. CARDINALS

- ◆ In 18 career games (16 starts), is 12-4 with a 3.17 ERA (39 ER in 110.2 IP), a .255 opponent average, 22 walks and 97 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 8 games (7 starts, 6 quality) at Busch Stadium, is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (13 ER in 48.1 IP), .236 opponent average, 14 walks and 38 strikeouts.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,245 career strikeouts are tied for sixth among active pitchers with Cole Hamels behind C.C. Sabathia (2,850), Bartolo Colon (2,458), Justin Verlander (2,430), Felix Hernandez (2,347) and John Lackey (2,294).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- ◆ In his last 10 road starts, since June 1 last season, he is 3-3 with a 3.25 ERA (22 ER in 61.0 IP), .253 opponent average, 16 walks and 61 strikeouts (team is 6-4).

2018 SPRING TRAINING

- ◆ Was 2-1 with a 1.04 ERA in 3 starts.

2017 RECAP

- ◆ Went 17-7 with a 3.20 ERA, 215 strikeouts, 45 walks and a .230 opponents average in his second season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Named to his fourth All-Star team (2009, '14-15, '17), and his first with Arizona.
- ◆ Ranked third in the NL and seventh in the Majors with 5.3 pitchers WAR, trailing Chris Sale (8.1), Corey Kluber (7.5), Max Scherzer (5.9), Carlos Carrasco (5.7), Stephen Strasburg (5.6) and Luis Severino (5.5).
- ◆ Logged his fifth career season of 200.0+ IP/200 strikeouts, tied with David Price, Clayton Kershaw, Max Scherzer and Cole Hamels for the third-most in baseball since 2008, behind Justin Verlander (7) and Felix Hernandez (6).
- ◆ Rated by *Baseball America* as possessing the NL's Best Changeup, Best Control (No. 2) and Best Pitcher (No. 3).
- ◆ Went 14-1 with a 3.24 ERA (46 ER in 127.2 IP) when he received 3+ runs of support, including 11-0 with a 3.16 ERA (29 ER in 82.2 IP) at home.

#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R

STL Series: 1-1 SV, 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has an 11-game scoreless streak (11.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Save on March 30 vs. Rockies was his first since Oct. 1, 2015.
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R

STL Series: HLD, 0 ER/0.1 IP, K

- ◆ Since last season, has held NL Central opponents scoreless in 13 of 14 outings (0.61 ERA, 1 ER in 14.2 IP) with .120 opponent average (6 H, 2 BB) and 13 strikeouts.
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA.
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

#40 • ANDREW CHAFIN • R/L

STL Series: HLD, 0 ER/0.2 IP, K

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
