AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 5-4 on their season-long 11-game homestand...won the opener of their three-game series vs. Toronto on Friday...went 3-1 vs. Texas, 0-1 vs. the Mets and 1-2 vs. Tampa Bay...after an off day Monday, will begin a six-game road trip with 2G at Miami (Tues.-Wed.) and 4G at Baltimore (8/24-26, incl. an 8/25 doubleheader).

- ▶ **Elias** confirms this is their longest homestand since playing home games on 13 consecutive days from 6/14-26/05, and going 8-5 vs. Pittsburgh (3-0), Chicago-NL (3-0), Tampa Bay (1-3) and the Mets (1-2).
- ▶ Are 8-4 in their last 12G...are 67-37 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 76-46 (.623), have the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (87-36, .707)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 93 of the last 107 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 30G over .500, 1G below their season-high watermark (31G over .500, three times, last at 75-44 at the end of play on Tuesday)...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are a season-high-tying 10.5G behind first-place Boston in the AL East...matches their largest division deficit since they were 11.0G out on 9/27/16.
- ▶ Are 9-9 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).
- ▶ Are 5-4 in their current stretch of playing 18-of-24 games at home...are also in the midst of playing 19 of their first 29G following the All-Star break at Yankee Stadium (are 14-13 so far: 10-7 at home and 4-6 on the road).
- ▶ Have lost consecutive series for the second time all season (also 4/5-12: 1-3 vs. Baltimore, 1-2 at Boston)...have still lost only seven of their last 36 series, going 23-7-6 since 4/19...last lost three straight series from 6/30-7/9/17.
- ▶ Are 55-9 (.859) when scoring first, second in MLB to Boston (59-9, .868)...are a Major League-best 47-7 (.870) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.

STANTON ISLAND: Of Giancarlo Stanton hit his 31st HR of the season on Fri. vs. Toronto...has 6HR in his last 11G...10 of his last 14H have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 6HR).

- ▶ Is sixth in the Majors with 31HR...is the ninth-highest HR total by a player in his first season as a Yankee, the most since Mark Teixeira hit 39HR in 2009.
- ▶ Has 298HR in 1,107 career games...needs 2HR to join 12 other active players with 300HR...at 28 years, 283 days old today, would be among the youngest players in Major League history to reach the mark, and one of the quickest in terms of career games played (see charts at right).
- ▶ In 21G since Aaron Judge went on the D.L. on 7/27, is hitting .289/.351/.663 (24-for-83) with 18R, 7 doubles, 8HR, 17RBI and 8BB...his 8HR are tied for second in the Majors in that span and his 17RBI are tied for 12th.

PICKING UP HICKS: CF Aaron Hicks walked twice in 4PA on Fri. vs. Toronto...has walks in seven of his last nine games and 19-of-26 since 7/15...his 23BB in 25G since the All-Star break are tied for second in the Majors (tied for first in AL).

- ▶ Is batting .304/.456/.507 (21-for-69) with 17R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI and 20BB over his last 21G.
- ▶ Has reached safely (via H/BB/HP) multiple times in 16-of-20 home games since the start of July, batting .359/.512/.688 (23-for-64) with 19R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 15RBI, 21BB and 2SB.

CITY SLICKERS: Friday's 7-5 win in seven innings marked the Yankees' first rain-shortened game since playing two in a 10-day span on 7/23/14 vs. Texas (W, 2-1, in five innings) and 7/13/14 at Baltimore (L, 3-1, in five innings).

- ▶ Have had 19 of their 122 games this season (15.6%) affected by weather (9 postponed, 5 delayed pre-game, 4 delayed in-game, 1 rain-shortened).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won a rain-shortened, seven-inning game, 7-5, in the opener of a three-game series vs. Toronto on Friday at Yankee Stadium...RHP Lance Lynn (4.0IP, 6H, 5ER, 3BB, 5K, 1WP) started and took a no-decision...DH Giancarlo Stanton (2-for-4) hit his 31st HR of the season in the seventh...3B Miguel Andujar (2-for-3, 1RBI) hit his 35th double in the first...RF Neil Walker (1-for-3) hit a go-ahead three-run HR in the fourth inning...RHP Chad Green (2.0IP, 1H, 1K) earned the win...RHP David Robertson (1.0IP, 2K) tossed a perfect seventh to earn his third save.

- ▶ Trained, 4-0, after the top of the first...was their first win when allowing at least 4R in the top of the first inning since 5/3/17 vs. Toronto (gave up 4R in the first, won, 8-6).

HOME COOKING: The Yankees are 43-20 (.683) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the Majors' second-best home record (Boston, 43-15, .741)...are 38-15 in 53 home games since 4/21.

- ▶ Have lost consecutive home series for the first time since 7/31-8/13/17 (1-2 vs. Detroit, 1-2 vs. Boston)...were 20-1-4 in their previous 25 home series (8/31/17-8/12/18).

BEASTLY EAST: After starting 18-9 against the AL East (through 6/16), are 10-17 in their last 27G vs. the division...are 2-7 in August vs. the AL East...are 28-26 in divisional play and 48-20 outside the division.

- ▶ Have not won a series against an AL opponent since 7/6-8 at Toronto, going 0-3-2 in five series.

EARNING THEIR PINSTripES: The Yankees have won all six starts by LHP J.A. Happ and RHP Lance Lynn, with the two starting pitchers acquired by the Yankees in July combining to go 4-0 with a 2.55 ERA (35.1IP, 10ER) in those outings.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters hit 2HR on Fri. vs. Toronto, snapping a four-game streak with one-or-zero HRs...have combined to hit 22HR in the last 12G overall (since 8/6).

- ▶ Neil Walker's three-run HR was the Yankees' 23rd this season, second-most in the Majors to Philadelphia (25).
- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 197HR...are on pace to hit 262HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Have homered in 15-of-16 games at Yankee Stadium since 7/21 (25HR total)...homered in 14 straight home games from 7/21-8/15, tied for the fourth-longest streak at the current Yankee Stadium...have hit 109HR in 63 home games this season, on pace for 140HR at home, which would tie their record set in 2017.

FAN FAVORITES: Through 63 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (2,729,732) and average attendance per home gate (43,329), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,901,681 / 46,801).

- ▶ Their 22 sellouts this season are a single-season record for the current Yankee Stadium (previous: 20 in 2011).

JUST DÚ IT: 3B Miguel Andujar went 2-for-3 with his 35th double of the season on Fri. vs. Toronto.

- ▶ Leads MLB rookies and is tied for sixth overall in the Majors in doubles...are fifth-most by a Yankees rookie in a season, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936), Hideki Matsui (42 in 2003), Bob Meusel (40 in 1920) and Earle Combs (36 in 1925)...are the most by any Yankee since Robinson Canó had 41 in 2013...his 37 career doubles are tied for seventh-most in Major League history through 116 games.
- ▶ Has 10XBH in his last 11G (since 8/7), batting .364 (16-for-44) with 9R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 12RBI, 1BB, 1HP and 1SB...has at least 1RBI in 8-of-11 games.
- ▶ His 56XBH are tied for sixth-most by a Yankees rookie.
- ▶ Leads MLB rookies and is eighth in the AL with 39 multi-hit games...are tied for the most by a Yankees rookie since 2006 (Judge-39 in 2017)...has multiple hits in 3-of-4, 6-of-9, and 7-of-11G.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 18, 2006: The Yankees win at Boston the second game of a day-night doubleheader, 14-11. The game takes 4 hours, 45 minutes, setting the all-time MLB mark for the longest ever nine-inning game.

Aug. 18, 1983: The "Pine Tar" game from July 24 resumes from the point after George Brett's HR with Billy Martin putting Ron Guidry in CF and the lefthanded Don Mattingly at 2B. Royals closer Dan Quisenberry retires the Yankees in order as the Yankees lose 5-4.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 19, 2000: In the third inning of a 9-1 win vs. the Angels, the Yankees record three sacrifice flies in the same inning thanks to a Ron Gant error (George Posada, Scott Brosius and Clay Bellinger).

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 10-4 vs. the Blue Jays in 2018...will play the 15th of 19 games vs. Toronto today (10G in the Bronx, 9G at Toronto)... **IN 2017:** Went 9-10 vs. Toronto in 2017, including 5-4 in the Bronx and 4-6 at Rogers Centre... **IN SEASON SERIES:** Before winning this season's series... had lost the last three season series, their first streak of consecutive season series losses to Toronto since 1990-94 (9-10 in 2017, 7-12 in 2016, 6-13 in 2015)... have still won 13 of the last 18 season series since 2001 (also went 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...had double-digit losses vs. the Blue Jays just twice in 38 seasons from 1977-2014... **AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 4-1 at Yankee Stadium in 2018...went 5-4 at home vs. Toronto in 2017...are 12-5 in the last 17 home matchups after going 3-11 in the previous 14...have won three of the last four home series after losing the previous five...are 58-31 vs. Toronto at the current Yankee Stadium, the most wins vs. any opponent at the venue (second: 57-34 vs. Baltimore).

LAST START: Started on Monday vs. the Mets and took his sixth loss of the season (4.0IP, 7H, 4ER, 1BB, 6K, 2HR)...marked his shortest start of the season...is 1-4 with a 7.84 ERA (31.0IP, 27ER) in his last six starts after winning his previous six starts with a 1.67 ERA (32.1IP, 6ER)...has allowed at least 1HR in a career-high seven consecutive starts...allowed his first career leadoff HR to Amed Rosario, then allowed a run-scoring single in the first to ...gave up a two-run HR to Bautista in the fourth.
