### FISH BITES

The Marlins open a six-game homestand tonight with the first of three games against the New York Mets. RHP **José Ureña** is making his third start of the season, and 10th career appearance (seventh start) against the Mets, going 3-3 with a 3.27 ERA (44.0 ip/16 er). The Mets will counter with RHP Noah Syndergaard, who in five previous starts against the Marlins has gone 3-0 with a 1.64 ERA (33.0/6). Following this series, Miami will enjoy an off day Thursday and close out the homestand with a three-game series against the Pittsburgh Pirates. At the conclusion of the current homestand, the Marlins will hit the road for a two-game series against the Yankees (April 16-17), a four-game series in Milwaukee (April 19-22), and a three-game set at Dodger Stadium (April 23-25).

### YESTERDAY'S RECAP

Miami snapped a four-game slide and kept from being swept in a three-game series by the Philadelphia Phillies with a 6-3 win at Citizens Bank Park. The Marlins touched Jake Arrieta for three first-inning runs, one on **Miguel Rojas**'s first home run of the season, and two on a **Braxton Lee** single to left. Philadelphia countered with two in the bottom half of the first, and tied the game in the third. With the score knotted at 3-3 after seven frames, **Brian Anderson** stroked a game-winning two-run double to center, and **Bryan Holaday** added an insurance run with an RBI single. In his second career start, **Trevor Richards** allowed three runs and six hits over 4.0 innings. **Odrisamer Despaigne** (2-0) earned the win in relief, with 2.0 scoreless innings, while **Brad Ziegler** notched his first save.

### VS. METS

The Marlins went 12-7 vs. the Mets in 2017, including a 7-3 mark at Marlins Park. The 2017 season series win was the first since going 11-8 in 2013. Miami's production against New York last season was the best against a division opponent in several years. The 12 wins were the most since 2010 (13 vs. WSH; 12 vs. NYM), their 100 runs scored were the most since 2010 (102 vs. NYM), and their 193 hits were the most since 2007 (194 vs. WSH) - **Stats LLC**. Miami has won each of the last four games against the Mets, including a three-game sweep at Marlins Park from September 18-20. The Marlins are 104-102 against the Mets in South Florida (30-27 at Marlins Park), yet trail the all-time series, 199-215.

### WHIP IT GOOD

In 10 career appearances, including six starts, against the New York Mets, **José Ureña** has gone 3-3 with a 3.27 ERA and .217 average against. His .217 opponents average against New York is his lowest against any National League opponent. Ureña owns a lifetime 0.93 WHIP (41/440) against the Mets, the second-lowest mark of any active pitcher against the Mets (min. 44.0 ip), behind Max Scherzer's 0.86). Clayton Kershaw ranks third at 0.94 and Zack Greinke fourth at 0.99. - **Stats LLC**

### LONG ROAD HOME

**Starlin Castro** has recorded at least one hit in each of his first six home games this season, extending his hitting streak at Marlins Park to 14 games. His streak is currently tied for the fifth-longest hitting streak ever at Marlins Park, equaling David Wright's run from June 2, 2013 to September 2, 2014. Castro trails a 16-game streak by Christian Yelich in 2014, and 15-game runs by Marcell Ozuna (2016), Dee Gordon ('15), and Jose Reyes ('12). - **Stats LLC**

### SHOWING HE BELONGS

Marlins rookie third baseman **Brian Anderson** leads all National League rookies in runs scored (7), is tied for the lead in hits (10, doubles (3), and RBI (8), and ranks second in go-ahead RBI (2), average (.286), on-base percentage (.419) and slugging percentage (.457).

### THE PEN IS MIGHTIER

Through the first nine games of the season, Miami's bullpen has worked a Major League-high 50.2 innings, ahead of the Orioles (48.0). Marlins relievers have recorded the most strikeouts (48) among National League bullpens, and second-most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (63).

### ROTATION BOUND

**Jarlin García**, who leads all National League relievers in innings pitched (10.0), is scheduled to make his first career Major League start on Wednesday vs. the Mets. He has just two appearances thus far, one spanning 6.0 innings on March 30 vs. the Cubs, and one of 4.0 innings on April 5 at Philadelphia. He is just the second Marlins pitcher to toss back-to-back relief appearances of at least 4.0 innings, joining **José Ureña**, who did so on April 17 (4.0) and April 28 (4.1), 2017.

### TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami will have the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. Over the first month plus, the Marlins are facing the Cubs, Boston, Philadelphia, the Mets, Pittsburgh, the Yankees, Milwaukee, the Dodgers, and Colorado in that stretch. However, from May through September, the Marlins have the third-easiest schedule, with opponents combining on a .485 record. - **Stats LLC**

### YEAR OF THE FAN

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tomorrow night, the third of 25 dates this season where a fan (or fans) will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game will be April 10 vs. the Mets.

### ROSTER RUNDOWN

According to **Elias**, Miami's Opening Day roster was the third-youngest in Baseball, with an average age of 27 years, 351 days. The Phillies featured the youngest OD roster in the Majors, with an average age of 26.334, followed by Cincinnati at 27.196.

- Miami came into the 2018 season with 12 players making their first Opening Day roster.
- Had 12 players on the OD roster born outside the U.S., most among all NL teams and third most in the Majors (Texas-14, White Sox-13). The Marlins OD roster consisted of players from seven countries and territories outside of the US, tied with Atlanta and Seattle, behind the Dodgers, who had eight.

➤ José Ureña is making third start of season at Marlins Park. Finished 2018 Grapefruit League season with 2-1 record and 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip/7 er) in five starts.

➤ Making seventh career start and 11 appearance against Mets, posting 3-3 record with 3.27 ERA (44.0/16). Last season, made five appearances (three starts) against Mets, posting 2-1 record and 2.25 ERA. In three starts, was 2-1 with 2.25 ERA (20.0/5). Allowed one run over 4.0 relief innings.

➤ In last start, April 3, held Boston to one run on four hits over 7.0 innings. Walked one while struck out career high-tying seven. Also had seven strikeouts on May 28, 2017 vs. Angels (5.0 ip) and July 4, 2017 at St. Louis (5.0 ip).

➤ Earned Opening Day start against Cubs on March 29 at Marlins Park. Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took loss, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in first inning, becoming only second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).

➤ Posted team-high 14 wins last season, to go with 3.82 ERA (169.2/72) and 113 strikeouts in 34 appearances (28 starts). Established career highs in wins, appearances, innings pitched, strikeouts, and ERA.

➤ Finished season 14-7, 3.97 (154.1/68) as starter. Did not factor in a decision and had a 2.35 ERA (15.1/4) in six relief appearances.

➤ Went 6-1 with 2.40 ERA (63.2/17) in 11 day-game starts. Owned fourth lowest ERA among NL starters (min. 50.0 IP), behind Max Scherzer (1.90), Stephen Strasburg (2.06) and Jimmy Nelson (2.32). - *Stats LLC*

➤ From May 7 through end of season, led National League with 28 starts, and 14 wins in that time tied Zack Greinke and Alex Wood for second, behind only Zach Davies (15). Among NL pitchers who made at least 25 starts in that time, average against (.232) ranked sixth and ERA ranked 10th.

➤ Set career high with five-game winning streak over seven starts from May 23 to June 23. Did so despite posting a 4.58 ERA (37.1/19) in that time, as he received 7.47 runs of support during stretch.

➤ Tossed season-high 8.0 innings in loss on July 31 vs. Washington, and again in win on Sept. 20 vs. the Mets. Allowed just one run to Nationals, and two to New York. Became first Marlins' pitcher since Henderson Alvarez (4), José Fernández (2), and Nathan Eovaldi (2) in 2014 to have multiple starts with 8.0-plus innings and two-or-fewer runs allowed in a single season.

➤ Made 21 starts following a team loss, with a 12-5 record and 3.54 ERA. Only Marcus Stroman (25) had more such starts in the Majors, while Ureña's win total tied Jacob deGrom for the MLB lead.

➤ Suffered loss on July 31, when he tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and a walk, with six strikeouts. It was just fourth time in Club history that a pitcher took a loss in a game in which he tossed at least 8.0 innings and allowed just three hits and two-or-fewer runs.

➤ Over career, has gone 18-21 with a 4.55 ERA (275.0/139) in 51 Major League starts. Has 33 career relief appearances with a 1-1 record, one save, and a 5.65 ERA (51.0/32).

➤ Caleb Smith is making his third start of the season in game two of this three-game set. Made first career Opening Day roster after going 0-2 with 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip/11 er) in six Spring outings (two starts). Acquired by Miami this offseason, along with INF Garrett Cooper on November 20, from Yankees.

➤ Is making first career start and appearance against the Mets, and just his second career start against a National League East opponent.

➤ Made first career start against Philadelphia in last outing, April 5 at Citizens Bank Park, allowing three runs and two hits with a career high six walks and four strikeouts over 3.0 innings.

➤ In first start of season, March 30 vs. Cubs, allowed just one run and four hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over 5.1 innings. Established single-game career highs in innings and strikeouts. Contest went 17 innings, tied for third-longest game by inning in Marlins history.
