LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the fourth game of a nine-game (2-1) road trip to **Minnesota** (June 8-10; 2-1), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17)...LAA is 15-7 vs. A.L. West foes in 2018...Halos have won six of seven affairs (six-game win streak snapped yesterday)...Angels are 24-26 since a club-record 13-3 start...Halos' 20-11 record thru 31 road games is best in club history...15 of next 21 games are on road...LAA is 12-7-2 in 21 series (7-2-1 in 10 road series).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME! On his 27th birthday Tuesday (June 5th), tonight's starter **Andrew Heaney** tossed his first career complete game and shutout...First complete game one-hitter for LAA since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona... First Angels' lefty with a one-hit SHO since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Heaney has allowed just two earned runs or less in seven of his 10 starts...In his last three starts in month of June, is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (22 IP – 2 ER)...In three career starts vs. **Mariners**, is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (15.1 IP – 4 ER).

JUNE BOOM: **Ian Kinsler** has homered in three of last four games (streak of three straight games snapped yesterday)... Over his last 12 games, he is batting .388 (19/49) with 12 runs, four doubles, six home runs and 11 RBI.

OHTANI TO D.L. On Friday, **Shohei Ohtani** was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a Grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection Thursday with **Dr. Steve Yoon** in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks... His 61 Ks are a club record through first nine career starts & lead 2018 A.L. rookies...Ranks third among A.L. rookies in ERA with 3.10 mark (behind teammate **Jaime Barria's** 2.48 ERA)...202 average against leads A.L. rookies.

BABY BOOMERS: Youngest players with 10+ HRs in 2018 across all minor league levels: **JO ADELL** - (19 y, 63 d) 10 HR, levels A, A+; **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** - (19 y, 86 d) 11 HR, level AA; **Fernando Tatis Jr.** - (19 y, 159 d) 11 HR, level AA (courtesy of Alex Mayer – Louisville Bats PR).

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 32 of last 38 games...LAA starting pitchers have fashioned a 2.74 ERA (220.1 IP – 67 ER) since May 1, tops in A.L. and second in MLB in span...Angels are only team in MLB to boast five starters with 3.50 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts)...Team ERA of 2.86 for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

MVP x 3? **Mike Trout** ranks tied for second in MLB with 19 HRs...With his next HR, he will be first player in LAA history with 20+ HRs in seven straight seasons...Can join **Alex Rodriguez** and **Mickey Mantle** as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 campaign...On pace for a career-best 47 HRs...Ranks tied for second in MLB with 148 total bases and leads MLB with 52 runs...431 OBP ranks third in MLB.

HOT HALOS: **Justin Upton** has opened June 11-for-30 (.367) with four home runs and five RBI (4 HR his last 7 G)...He is the first Angel with 15 home runs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) in a season since **Vernon Wells** (25 HRs) in 2011...**Martin Maldonado** has hits in 13 of last 16 games...12 RBI his last 16 games...Hitting .320 (31/97) with seven doubles and three HRs since May 1.

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? **Andrelton Simmons** (10-day DL) has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...He has struck out just twice since May 1 (139 PA)...Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fourth in A.L. batting .330.

WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 34 of 66 games on season and in 18 of last 30 contests...Held to two runs or less nine times in May...LAA has six 10+ hit efforts in last 28 games...Angels hitting .240 (74/309) with RISP since May 1 (35 G).

PUJOLS POINTS: **Albert Pujols** has 3,029 career hits – good for 27th all-time...**Rod Carew** is next on the hit list at 3,053...Pujols collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just fourth player to log 600 HRs and 3,000 hits (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**)...Ranks seventh all-time in RBI with 1,954...**Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI (Baseball-Reference.com)...Pujols sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

3-4, 3.12 ERA

Tossed first career complete game and shutout in last start on Tuesday vs. Royals

- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 11th start of the season and fifth on the road...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on his 27th birthday on Tuesday vs. Kansas City after tossing a one-hit shutout...Marked first complete game and shutout of career...First shutout by an Angel since Ricky Nolasco on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...It was the first CG one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Became first Major Leaguer to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.
- **MONTH OF JUNE:** In his last three starts in month of June, is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (22 IP – 2 ER).
- **RECENT QUALITY:** Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in seven of last eight starts, while pitching to a 1.93 ERA (51.1 IP – 11 ER) in that span...*His 1.93 ERA since April 27, ranks as third best in the A.L., behind Justin Verlander (1.51) and James Paxton (1.87)*...Had streak of five consecutive quality starts snapped on May 31 at Detroit.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** Opponents have swung at the first pitch 35.4% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the second highest rate in the Majors (min. 50 IP) and the highest in the American League (**Max Scherzer** – 36.6%).
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has allowed just four home runs this season (three came on April 20 vs. SF)...Rate of 0.59 HR/9 innings ranks fourth in the A.L. (min. 50 IP)...Among left-handers, the 0.59 HR/9 inning rate leads the Majors...Eight starts of 5+ innings and zero HR allowed this season are tied for the Major League lead. among lefties.
- **HOT AT HOME:** In last five starts at Angel Stadium, is 3-1 with a 0.79 ERA (34 IP – 3 ER) and 32 strikeouts...His home ERA leads the American League in that span (since April 27).
- **VS. SEATTLE:** In three career games vs. Mariners, is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (15.1 IP – 4 ER)...Made one start vs. Seattle last season (Sept. 9 at Safeco Field) and exited after 2.1 innings with a sore left shoulder (he would not pitch again in 2017).
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** In two career starts at Safeco Field, is 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (9.1 IP – 2 ER).
- **9 K's IN 5 IP:** On April 27 vs. New York (A.L.), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **STARTING NINE:** With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP:** Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
