**THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY**

**July 1**

(1994) Baltimore (6 HR) and the Angels (5 HR) tied a MLB record by combining for 11 home runs in the Orioles' 14-7 victory.

**July 2**

(1983) Rod Carew plays his last game before the All-Star Break, ending his first half with a .402 average (92/229)...He is one of just seven ML players to reach the break with a .400 mark, the last player to do so. (2016) C.J. Cron became the 20th player over the past 104 years to score at least five runs, get at least five hits and register at least five RBI in a big-league game; the Angels' first baseman posted the impressive line in his team's 21-2 blowout of the Red Sox.

**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the seventh contest (2-4) of a four-city, 10-game trip to Kansas City (makeup; 0-1), Boston (0-3), Baltimore (2-0) and Seattle (July 3-5)...With a win today, Halos would claim all six games vs. Orioles this season – would mark first time in club history sweeping season series vs. O's (min. 6 G)...Angels are off tomorrow...Club is in fourth place, 11.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (10.0 games behind Seattle for second Wild Card spot)...Angels are 30-38 since a club-record 13-3 start...Club went 13-14 in June to finish with a sub-.500 month for second straight month and in four of last six months spanning to 2017...LAA is 6-14 when a left-hander starts (37-27 vs. RHS)...Halos are 12-19 on road since a club-record 11-1 start...16 of 24 games in July are at home.

**WE GET GAUSMAN:** Following Halos have excellent career numbers vs. today's starter Kevin Gausman: Luis Valbuena (.556; 5/9, 4 HR, 6 RBI – 4 HRs are most Gausman has allowed to any MLB hitter), Ian Kinsler (.533; 8/15, 2 2B, 1 HR, 1 RBI) & Mike Trout (.538; 7/13, 3 HR, 3 RBI).

**DOUBLE DUTY:** With his game-tying RBI double in the 8<sup>th</sup> inning yesterday, Albert Pujols moved into a tie with David Ortiz for 10<sup>th</sup> on the all-time doubles list with 632...Pujols is the only MLB player in the all-time top 10 in HRs (626) and doubles.

**SIMBA SIZZLIN'** Andrelton Simmons matched a career high with four hits Friday night (5<sup>th</sup> time, 2<sup>nd</sup> in '18)...He has hit safely in eight straight (.438; 14/32) raising his season average from .306 to .322 during stretch...His .367 (51/139) road clip is second-best in MLB.

**SCIOSCIA 3000:** Yesterday marked the 3,000<sup>th</sup> career game for Mike Scioscia as manager for the Angels...He's the 21<sup>st</sup> manager all-time to reach the plateau in games managed and the sixth to have at least 3,000 games with one team (Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston and Tommy Lasorda).

**MEDICAL UPDATES:** LHP John Lamb underwent an MRI on his left elbow revealing a torn ulnar collateral ligament. He will undergo UCL reconstruction surgery with Dr. Neal ElAttrache in Los Angeles in the coming days...RHP Jake Jewell underwent successful right ankle surgery Friday. A typical return to play from this procedure is approximately six months...INF Zack Cozart underwent successful repair of the labrum in his left shoulder Friday. A typical return to play from this procedure is 6-8 months.

**WE LIKE IT HERE:** Following players have strong career numbers at Camden Yards: Ian Kinsler (.351; 68/194, 9 HR 28 RBI in 47 games), Chris Young (.324; 22/68, 5 HR, 7 RBI in 26 G) and Mike Trout (8 HR and 15 RBI in 24 games; 1<sup>st</sup> MLB HR on 7/24/11 here).

**OHTANI UPDATE:** Shohei Ohtani (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7<sup>th</sup>. On June 28<sup>th</sup>, an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. He has started taking batting practice and yesterday faced live pitching (10 at-bats) in a simulated game (ran bases as well). He will not partake on a minor league rehab assignment but rather continue to hit in a controlled environment. In approximately three weeks (from June 28th) he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.

**THEY KNOW O'S:** Justin Upton has four home runs and 15 RBI in his last nine games vs. Orioles...Ian Kinsler is batting .342 (126/368) with 13 HRs & 52 RBI in career vs. Baltimore...Andrelton Simmons has a .382 career clip vs. O's (26/68; 2 HRs) and is hitting .526 (10/19; 5 2B, 6 RBI) in five games vs. Orioles this season.

**FROM THE START:** Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 45 of last 56 games...LAA starters have fashioned a 3.20 ERA (306.1 IP – 109 ER) since May 1, tops in MLB in span...Today, Deck McGuire becomes the 12<sup>th</sup> pitcher to start for LAA in 2018.

**MAKE WAR:** Trout's 6.9 WAR this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is Jose Ramirez (CLE) at 5.5...On pace for a 13.5 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 61.1 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,009 games.

**SHELVED:** Angels currently have 14 players on the D.L...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...48 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (Club record is 55 in 2017)...27 pitchers have played for LAA, most in team history thru 84 games (STATS).

**MVP x 3?** Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 3 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HRs (T2nd; 24), runs (T1st; 66), times on base (1<sup>st</sup>; 171), total bases (2<sup>nd</sup>; 186), walks (1<sup>st</sup>; 74), OBP (1<sup>st</sup>; .461), OPS (2nd; 1.102) & OPS+ (1<sup>st</sup>; 205.0)...Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (11).

**GLOVE STORY:** LAA has gone errorless in 54 of 84 games...Club has 38 errors thru 84 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .988 fielding pct...Catchers own a 47.1 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB)...Trout is one of four MLB CFs with a 1.000 fielding pct.

**BATS ARE BETTER:** Despite being held to two runs or less in five of last nine games, LAA has posted 4+ runs in 11 of last 16 and in 16 of 27 games for June...Club's 39 HRs ranked fifth in A.L. last month.

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 38 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 84 affairs (LAA ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in A.L. with 754 Ks)...290 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 313.2 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L...Halos have allowed 109 HRs, third-most in A.L.

**HOT HALOS:** Chris Young has connected for four HRs and seven RBI over his last 10 starts (2 HR & 6 RBI first 22 starts)...David Fletcher has hit safely in six of his first eight MLB starts (4 multi-hit games)...Over his last 30 contests, Ian Kinsler has 19 runs, eight doubles, nine HRs and 16 RBI...Jose Briceño has opened his big league career batting .333 (9/27) in nine games with an AB...Luis Valbuena has three home runs and seven RBI his last eight starts...Martin Maldonado has 12 RBI his last 11 games...Tyler Skaggs went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP – 3 ER) in June (5 GS)...His 0.84 ERA led all MLB starters last month...He has allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of his 16 starts...His 2.64 ERA ranks ninth in A.L.

**A BIT ON ALBERT:** Albert Pujols is 38 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two other players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.

**TRIPLE THREATS at 1K:** June 21st marked the 1,000<sup>th</sup> career game for Mike Trout...He joins Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez as only players in MLB history with at least a .300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases at the 1K milestone.

**NOT A FAN:** Andrelton Simmons has struck out just six times since May 1 (196 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He Leads MLB in PA per SO with 21.50 (301 PA/14 K) while teammate Ian Kinsler ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.23).

**ALWAYS ON:** Since his call-up in 2012, Mike Trout has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His 74 walks are most in Angels' history through 84 games.

**ALBERT ALERT:** Albert Pujols is 27<sup>th</sup> all-time with 3,044 hits...Rod Carew is 26<sup>th</sup> at 3,053...His 3,000<sup>th</sup> hit came May 4<sup>th</sup> at Seattle to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,962 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

**AT BALTIMORE:** LAA leads 2018 season series 5-0 (have outscored O's 38-15) and have won seven straight and nine of 10 overall...Halos swept Baltimore in three-game series May 1-3 at Angel Stadium...LAA holds slight lead in last 28 matchups (17-12).

**SEATTLE ON DECK:** Mariners lead 2018 series 4-2, sweeping Angels in last trip to SAFECO (June 11-13)...Halos took two of three at Seattle in first meeting (May 4-6)...LAA is 10-8 in last 18 games at SAFECO...Angels are 100-77 over M's since 2009...Trout's 20 HRs at SAFECO are his most in career at any road ballpark, and most ever by a visiting player at SAFECO.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP DECK MCGUIRE**

**0-0, 6.08 ERA**

First Major League start of the season

- **BACK TO STARTING:** Today's start marks his first of the season after first six outings came in relief (four with Blue Jays and two with Angels)...First Major League start since Oct. 1, 2017 for Cincinnati at Chicago (N.L.) when he earned his first Major League win (W; 5 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO)...In two career starts, is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (14 IP – 6 ER).
- **A NEW HALO:** Acquired from Texas on June 19 in exchange for cash considerations or a player to be named later...He was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake after the trade and recalled from Salt Lake the following day (did not appear in a game for Bees)...Made one appearance for Triple-A Round Rock during four day stint in Rangers organization.
- **FAMILIAR FOES:** Made Angels debut on June 24 vs. Toronto after having previous Major League appearance come on May 24 for Blue Jays vs. Angels...**He became the first pitcher to have consecutive appearances come in this fashion since Francisco Liriano in 2012** (pitched for Twins at White Sox on July 23 and then pitched for White Sox at Twins on July 31)...Additionally, the last pitcher to appear for and against the Blue Jays in the same season also happens to be **Francisco Liriano** in 2017. (STATS LLC)...The last pitcher to appear for and against the Angels in the same season was **Fernando Salas** last year.
- **STARTER #12:** Becomes 12<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher for Angels this season, which is tied with Oakland for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 13).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched four innings in last relief appearance on Tuesday at Boston, marking longest relief appearance of career and longest relief outing by any Angels pitcher this season...Allowed three HR in the game after having allowed three HR total in his previous 11 Major League appearances.
- **2010 DRAFT, ROUND 1:** Was selected 11<sup>th</sup> overall by Toronto in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...Is one of three players from that round of the draft to appear for Angels this year (**Kaleb Cowart** – 18<sup>th</sup> overall and **Cam Bedrosian** – 29<sup>th</sup> overall).
- **WITH THE JAYS:** Appeared in four games (all in relief) for Toronto earlier this season...Did not record a decision and pitched to a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP – 6 ER) with five walks and seven strikeouts...Two of four outings were scoreless...Was designated for assignment by Blue Jays on June 9.
- **WITH BUFFALO:** Appeared in eight games (all starts) for Triple-A Buffalo this season, going 4-2 with a 3.22 ERA (44.2 IP – 16 ER) and 40 strikeouts...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in six of eight starts and tossed eight innings in back-to-back starts on May 4 vs. Syracuse and May 9 vs. Rochester.
- **VS. BALTIMORE:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Orioles.
- **AT CAMDEN YARDS:** Tonight marks first appearance at Camden Yards.
- **2017 WITH THE REDS:** Made Major League debut on Sept. 12, 2017 for Cincinnati vs. St. Louis (1.2 IP, 1 H, 1 SO)...In six total games for the Reds (two starts), went 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2 IP – 4 ER).
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2011 (Florida State League) and 2017 (Southern League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Toronto in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Georgia Tech...Has played in minor with affiliates of the Blue Jays (2011-14, '18), A's (2014), Dodgers (2015), Cardinals (2016), Reds (2017) and Rangers (2018).

**TUESDAY'S STARTER AT SEATTLE**

**LHP ANDREW HEANEY (4-5, 3.95 ERA)**

Making 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season and eighth on the road...Second start of the season vs. Mariners...Did not factor in decision in last start on Wednesday at Boston after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing a season-high six earned runs (all in the 2<sup>nd</sup> inning) on eight hits with three walks and four strikeouts...In four career starts vs. Seattle, is 1-2 with a 4.42 ERA (18.1 IP – 9 ER) and 16 strikeouts...Was charged with loss in first start of the year vs. Mariners on June 11 at Safeco Field after pitching three innings (shortest start of season) and allowing five earned runs on seven hits (three HR) with one walk and two strikeouts...This season, is 0-3 with a 6.14 ERA (36.2 IP – 25 ER) on the road compared with a 4-2 record and 2.18 ERA (45.1 IP – 11 ER) at Angel Stadium.
