SHORT MEMORY: In the hottest game at home this season for San Diego (85 degrees at first pitch), the Padres fell 5-4 to the Arizona Diamondbacks, dropping their fifth consecutive game and sustaining their sixth sweep of the season...the Friars and Marlins are the only teams to have not swept another club this year... yesterday, starter **Joey Lucchesi** was saddled with the loss, working just 4.1 innings and allowing five runs (earned) on six hits with a career-high three homers allowed... **Wil Myers**, **Eric Hosmer** and **A.J. Ellis** contributed multi-hit efforts in the contest, and Myers produced his second-straight game with multiple RBI.

IN THE CITY BY THE BEACH: Over the last five seasons, the Padres pitching staff has posted a 2.79 ERA vs. the Giants (119 er, 384.0 ip)...since 2014, that ERA ranks third-best among any team at home against a divisional opponent (behind just LAD's 2.76 ERA vs. SD in LA and LAD's 2.58 ERA vs. SF in LA).

ERIC VS. THE NL WEST: Starter **Eric Lauer** has a 3.21 ERA vs. the NL West and a 6.75 ERA against all other opposition...the 3.54 ERA difference is the third-highest of any pitcher this season (min. five starts per each split).

BARTENDER, I'LL HAVE A MYERS!: Against NL West opposition this year, **Wil Myers** has a 1.160 OPS (.410 OBP and .750 SLG), the second-highest mark of any player this season vs. his own division (min. 75 PA)...only Mike Trout (1.166 OPS vs. AL West) has a higher mark in his own division.

GETTING AHEAD BEFORE 6.0: The Padres are 30-3 (.909 winning percentage) when they have the lead through 6.0 innings, and they are 12-83 (.160) when tied or trailing after 6.0...their .749 winning percentage difference through six innings is the third-largest in the majors...SF also has the fifth-largest winning percentage difference of .726 (43-5, .896 when leading through 6.0 and 10-49, .169 when tied or trailing).

TURN THE TABLES: The Padres have a 5.70 ERA in the month of July, which is the highest mark the Friars have accrued in a calendar month since they posted a 6.40 ERA in May of 2003.

BACK WHEN I WAS YOUR AGE...: The Giants have 718 hits by players 30 years or older, which headlines the majors this season...the Padres, meanwhile, have 68 hits by players 30 or older, the fewest in the majors.

SO FLY IN JULY: **Wil Myers** has a .663 slugging percentage in the month of July, which is his highest mark in a month since he slugged .765 in June of 2016...his 23 RBI in July tie with MIL's Christian Yelich for the most in the NL and tie for second-most in the ML behind OAK Khris Davis' 25.

MARGOTING STREAKING: **Manuel Margot** is riding a career-high 10-game hitting streak, batting .378 (14-for-37) with three doubles, a triple and a home run...he needs a hit tonight to tie Christian Villanueva's 11-game spree (from April 13-28) as the longest hitting streak by a Padre this season.

PADRES ON DECK: Last night for Lake Elsinore (A), **Adrian Morejon** and **Pedro Avila** shared a four-hit shutout, while 3B **Hudson Potts** extended his hitting streak to 16 games...Morejon started and allowed one hit and two walks with three strikeouts over 4.0 innings, and Avila followed Morejon and allowed three hits and three walks with three strikeouts over the final 5.0 innings...Potts went 2-for-3 with a walk.

THIS DATE IN PADRES HISTORY: On July 30, 1984, LHP **Dave Dravecky** pitched the ninth one-hitter in Padres history, shutting out LAD on one hit and four walks with four strikeouts in a complete game, 12-0 win at San Diego Jack Murphy Stadium.

STARTING PITCHER NOTES

#46 LHP ERIC LAUER (5-7, 5.29)

LAUER HOUR: 23-year-old **Eric Lauer** is set to make his 18th career start and third against San Francisco tonight, but his first against the Giants at Petco Park.

LAST TIME OUT: After earning the win in consecutive outings for the first time in his career on 7/5 at ARI and 7/10 vs. LAD, Lauer has been saddled with the loss in consecutive outings for the first time on 7/15 at CHC and his last time out on 7/24 at NYM, allowing a career-high-tying six earned runs (3x) in SD's 6-3 defeat.

ERIC'S ARSENAL: Lauer has relied on four pitches this season: four seamer (61.1%), cutter (24.9%), curve (10.6%) and changeup (3.4%)

SAMPLE SIZE: Allowed three earned runs or less in eight consecutive starts from 6/2-7/10...his 2.33 ERA from 6/2-7/10 was the 10th-lowest mark among all ML starters and sixth-lowest in the NL.

SETTLE IN YOUNG FELLA: From innings 1-2, Lauer has compiled a 6.88 ERA compared to a 4.21 mark from the third inning on.

AN NL WEST KINDA GUY: On 7/10 vs LAD, Lauer was one out shy of becoming the first Padre rookie to throw a complete-game shutout since **Clay Hensley** in 2006...he tossed 8.2 IP of four-hit ball, allowing one run with career highs in strikeouts (eight) and pitches thrown (115).

- In his six career starts against NL West foes, he is now 3-1 with a 3.21 ERA...against all other divisions, he has posted a 6.75 ERA across 11 starts.
- Among all ML starters who have made at least five starts versus both their own division and the rest of MLB, his 3.54 ERA differential is the third-highest in the majors, behind only KC **Ian Kennedy** (4.69) and PIT **Chad Kuhl** (4.62).

JUNE BLOOM: After posting a 7.67 ERA from April-May (his first seven starts), he tallied a 2.76 mark in June (his next six outings) for a -4.91 ERA differential.

- His -4.91 ERA differential ranked first among all ML pitchers that tossed at least 25.0 IP from March-May and also at least 25.0 IP in June.
- His ERA improved -1.23 points better than the next closest pitcher (TEX's **Mike Minor**, -3.68), followed by TOR's **Marco Estrada** (-3.33), PIT's **Ivan Nova** (-3.21) and MIN's **Lance Lynn** (-3.11).

ONE TEAM, ONE DREAM: The Padres are now 5-12 when Lauer toes the rubber...his 36 total runs of support (runs scored while he's in the game) are the third-fewest in the majors (min. 17 games started).

- When the southpaw rookie gets two-or-more runs of support from the Padres offense (happened in nine of his 17 starts), he is 5-1 with a 3.24 ERA (18 ER, 50.0 IP) and a 1.40 WHIP with just four home runs allowed.
- When he gets one run or less of support (in eight of his 17 starts), he's 0-6 with a 8.53 ERA (30 ER, 31.2 IP) and a 2.18 WHIP with eight home runs allowed.

PICKOFF ARTIST: Lauer's nine pickoffs lead the majors, three ahead of SEA **Marco Gonzales'** and ATL **Julio Teheran's** six.

- Recorded pickoffs in five straight starts from 5/22-6/13, the longest pickoff streak in SD history and tied for the second-longest in ML history with four others...**Andy Pettitte** had the longest streak (eight straight in 1997).
- **Lauer** (nine) and fellow rookie lefty **Joey Lucchesi** (three) have combined for 12 pickoffs this season...it's the most pickoffs by a Padre rookie duo in franchise history.
- The Padres 16 pickoffs lead the majors, ahead of the Atlanta Braves' 14.

CHECK THE SPLITS: Lauer has walked seven left-handed batters this season and yielded 28 free passes to right-handed hitters...lefties have also accrued just 10 RBI off the southpaw, while righties have combined for 40 RBI.

HISTORIA: Earned his first career win in his third career start on 5/6 vs. LAD in Monterrey, Mexico...tossed 6.0-shutout innings behind five strikeouts and one walk in the Padres' 3-0 victory.

- Became the first and only SD pitcher to get his first career ML win in a game played outside the US and Canada...also just the second starter ever to get such a win and the fifth pitcher (starter or reliever) to do so.
- At 22 years and 337 days old on 5/6, he was the fifth-youngest pitcher in the NL to record a win this season.

WAVES OF TALENT: Lauer became just the second pitcher of the entire 2016 draft class to make their ML debut, trailing only Lucchesi, who made his big league debut on 3/30 vs. MIL.

- Only Orioles OF **Austin Hays** made it to the show quicker than Lucchesi and Lauer...Hays made his big league debut for the Orioles on September 7, 2017.

THE GOOD ONES MOVE QUICK: The Elyria, Ohio native made just 35 appearances (34 starts) prior to his MLB debut...he has posted a 3.04 ERA (58 ER, 171.2 IP) and a 9-10 record with 188 SO against 51 walks.

- In his three starts for El Paso (AAA) this season he posted a 3.00 ERA (6 ER, 18.0 IP), including a career-high-tying 10 strikeouts on April 15 vs. Las Vegas.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

CLAYTON'S TURN: LHP **Clayton Richard** is set to make his club-leading 23rd start of the season tomorrow in Game 2 of this brief two-game set vs. SF.

- Is a combined 0-2 with a 14.63 ERA (13 ER, 8.0 IP) in his two starts since the All-Star break.
- Posted a streak of tossing 6.0 innings-or-more in 11 consecutive starts from 5/8-7/3, the longest of any left-handed pitcher since 2016.
- Won four consecutive decisions for just the second time in his career from 6/4-22 (also: 6/22/2011-4/8/2012).

- Threw the second-longest perfect game bid in Padres history on May 15 vs. COL, behind only Chris Young's 7.2 perfect innings on Sept. 7, 2008 at MIL.
- Began the season holding opponents scoreless in nine of his first 11 games, posting a 2.20 ERA while limiting hitters to a .158 clip.

- In his last seven games vs. the Giants, he's hitting .467 (7-for-15) with two homers and five RBI.
- His .296 average and his .401 OBP are both his highest in a season in his career...his .401 OBP leads all ML catchers with at least 40 games played.
- Has a .423 OBP vs. right-handers (13 walks) this year and a .373 OBP vs. southpaws (seven walks).
