HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 22-12 (.647) since May 28, tied for the Majors' fifth-best record with the Red Sox, behind the Mariners (23-11, .676), Astros (22-11, .667), Yankees (22-11, .667) and Dodgers (22-11, .667).
- ♦ The D-backs are 8-5 in their last 13 games, 16-9 in their last 25 and 20-11 in their last 31.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has a franchise-record 26-game scoreless streak (22.2 innings), also the Majors' longest active streak by games and innings [see note below]...needs 1 scoreless outing to match the record for a Japanese-born pitcher (27 by Koji Uehara in 2013) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 6 games, is hitting .478 (11-for-23)/1.321 OPS with 1 double, 2 homers, 7 RBI and 3 walks...in his last 26 games, is batting .413 (43-for-104)/.500 OBP/.827 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 11 homers, 28 RBI and 17 walks...in his last 12 home games, is hitting .391 (18-for-46) with 4 homers, 10 RBI and 7 walks.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin**, in his last 2 starts, has allowed 1 run over 13.0 innings (0.69 ERA) with a .156 opponent average (7-for-45) and 17 strikeouts...has allowed 2 runs or less in 3 of his 4 career starts vs. Cardinals...will be making his second career start on the Fourth of July as his first Independence Day start was his return from Tommy John surgery in 2015, a 7-3 win vs. Rockies @ Chase Field (2 ER in 5.0 IP).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs defeated the Cardinals, 4-2.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 2-for-4 with a go-ahead, 3-run homer in the fifth inning. **Jake Lamb** was 2-for-4 with a double.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** (9-5) recorded his fourth straight win and quality start (2 R in 6.2 IP).
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** (0.1 IP) extended his franchise-record scoreless streak to 26 games and combined with **Archie Bradley** (1.0) and **Brad Boxberger** (1.0) to toss 2.1 shutout frames.

FOURTH OF JULY FODDER

- ♦ The D-backs are 11-9 all-time on the Fourth of July, having played at Chase Field 8 times (3-5).
- ♦ The D-backs scored 17 runs @ Cardinals on this day in 1999, setting a team record at the time...it's 1 of 4 17-run games (also July 27, 2000 @ Cardinals; April 17, 2001 @ Cardinals; Sept. 28, 2002 vs. Rockies) behind the franchise-record 18 runs on May 17, 2014 vs. Dodgers.
- ♦ In that 17-5 win @ Cardinals on July 4, 1999, Luis Gonzalez and David Dellucci each had 6 RBI and Steve Finley and Andy Fox each had 5 RBI.

THANKS FANS...APPROACHING 50-MILLION

- ♦ The D-backs have their third sellout of the season today, along with 48,703 fans on Opening Day/March 29 (8-2 win vs. Rockies) and 47,907 fans on Father's Day/June 17 (5-3 loss vs. Mets).
- ♦ The D-backs, entering today, have hosted 1,183,035 fans at Chase Field this season and 49,869,367 all-time, 130,633 shy of 50-million fans.

GOLDSCHMIDT NAMED NL PLAYER OF THE MONTH

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** was named NL Player of the Month for June, his first monthly award, and ninth by a D-backs position player (last: A.J. Pollock in April).
- ♦ Since May 23, Goldschmidt leads the Majors in average (.373, 53-for-142), slugging pct. (.761) and OPS (1.224), second in extra-base hits (25), third in on-base percentage (.464), tied for third in homers (13) and RBI (35).

YOSHI'S FRANCHISE RECORD SCORELESS STREAK

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 26-game scoreless streak (22.2 IP) is a franchise record, surpassing 24-game scoreless streaks by J.J. Putz (June 23-August 31, 2012) and Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008).
- ♦ His 25-gamer and 22.2-innings are the longest active streaks in the Majors...his 22.2-innings are the fifth-longest streak on the season (25.0, Daniel Mengden/OAK, May 15-31).
- ♦ His streak is the second longest by a Japanese-born pitcher [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

THROWBACK THURSDAY, PRESENTED BY CHASE: The team will wear the 2007 Home White uniform to celebrate the 2007 N.L. SNAKEBITES

- ♦ **Jake Lamb** has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games at a .348 clip (16-for-46) with 3 doubles, 1 homer, 5 RBI and 7 walks.
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** has held opponents scoreless in 10 of his last 11 outings with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER in 21.0 IP), .121 opponent average (4-for-33) and 11 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has held opponents scoreless in 16 of his last 18 outings with a 0.56 ERA (1 ER in 16.0 IP), .145 opponent average (8-for-55) and 13 strikeouts...in 22 home outings, has held opponents scoreless 19 times with a 1.59 ERA (4 ER in 22.2 IP), .177 average (14-for-79) and 19 strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME

- ♦ Since the start of 2017, the D-backs 76 home wins are tied for third most in the Majors with the Red Sox and Indians, behind the Yankees (83) and Dodgers (82)...their .608 winning percentage (76-49) is tied for fifth with the Cubs (.708, 73-47) behind the Yankees (.659, 83-43), Dodgers (.636, 82-47), Red Sox (.628, 76-45) and Indians (.628, 76-45).

- ♦ The D-backs, whose 19 June wins tied for the most in the Majors, ranked among Major League leaders in:

THROUGH 81 GAMES

- ♦ The D-backs' 47 wins through 81 games tied for fourth most in team history with 2000 (50 in 2001, 48 in 2017, 48 in 2002).
- ♦ The D-backs' 3.40 ERA is the lowest at the 81-game mark in club history, narrowly edging out the 3.41 ledger in 2017.

FROM THE TRAINING ROOM

- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** (strained right pectoral) went 2-for-5 with a 2-run homer and solo homer for 3 RBI in his fourth rehab appearance for Triple-A Reno last night @ Tacoma.
• In 6 rehab games at Triple-A Reno and Single-A Advanced Visalia, is hitting .400 (10-for-25) with 1 double, 2 triples, 3 homers, 7 RBI and 3 walks.

ON DECK: SAN DIEGO PADRES

- ♦ The D-backs are 2-1 vs. Padres this season, 3-3 in their last 6 home games and 15-7 in 22 home games since 2016.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP SHELBY MILLER (0-2, 11.42)

- ♦ Third start since returning from Tommy John surgery.
- ♦ In 7 career starts vs. Padres, is 2-2 with a 4.42 ERA (19 ER in 38.2 IP), .211 opponent average (30-for-142) and 32 strikeouts.

- Named NL Player of the Week for April 16-22 after going 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA, 2 walks, 19 strikeouts and a 0.33 WHIP in 2 starts.**
- Selected for the 2013 NL All-Star Team and was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- Is looking for his first win @ Chase Field since April 22 vs. Padres and first win overall since June 5 @ Giants.
- Owens a 0.69 ERA (1 ER in 13.0 IP) with 1 walk and 17 strikeouts over his last 2 starts.

LAST START

- Received his second straight no decision on June 29 vs. Giants, allowing 1 run on 4 hits over 6.0 innings.
- Departed with the score tied, 1-1...the Giants won, 2-1.

VS. CARDINALS

- Is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (12 ER in 24.0 IP) in 4 career starts.
- Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 3 of his 4 starts.
- Lone win came on May 20, 2016 @ Busch Stadium (2 ER in 6.1 IP).

- Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
- Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

- His 30 3-pitch strikeouts are second most in the NL...Max Scherzer/WSH is first with 39.
- Is second in the NL with 112 strikeouts swinging, trailing Scherzer (144).
