2017

- Made his Braves debut while spending the majority of the season pitching out of Triple-A Gwinnett's bullpen...Also spent time with Double-A Mississippi and went a combined 1-3 with a 2.65 ERA (16 ER/54.1 IP) in 36 relief appearances at the minor league level.
- Recalled to Atlanta on 7/6 and made his Braves debut two days later at WSH in a 13-0 win... Tossed a perfect inning with one strikeout.
- Six of his eight MLB outings were 1.0 inning or less...Went 2.1 innings on 7/26 at ARI and 1.1 innings on 7/17 vs. CHI.
- Optioned to Triple-A on 8/1, where he finished out the season.
- Began the year with Double-A Mississippi, serving as the team's closer...Did not allow a run over 7.2 innings in six games before moving to Triple-A Gwinnett on 4/25, where he remained until his recall.
- Limited Triple-A righties to a .187 average (17-for-91) with no home runs and a .491 OPS.
- Went more than 1.0 inning in 19 of his 30 Triple-A outings...Tossed a season-best 3.0 innings twice: 4/28 at Pawtucket and 5/25 vs. Buffalo.

2016

- Split the season between Atlanta's and New York's (NL) organization after a midseason trade between the clubs...Combined to go 5-3 with a 3.25 ERA (22 ER/61.0 IP) in 47 minor league games out of the bullpen.
- Began the season with Double-A Binghamton, compiling a 2-2 record and a 4.62 ERA (13 ER/25.1 IP) in 22 games.
- Traded to Atlanta on 6/8 in exchange for INF/OF Kelly Johnson.

- Spent one day with Atlanta at the MLB level after the club recalled him on 8/12...Did not appear in the game and the team optioned him back to Double-A Mississippi.
- Appeared in 25 games with the M-Braves, going 3-1 with a 2.27 ERA (9 ER/35.2 IP)/
- Did not allow a home run while with Mississippi.

2015

- Made his MLB debut after beginning the season with Single-A St. Lucie...Became one of 12 players from the Virgin Islands to reach the majors...Others include Midre Cummings, Calvin Pickering, and Jerry Browne.
- Recalled from St. Lucie on 6/15 and made his debut on 6/17 at TOR...Pitched 0.2 innings, and allowed three hits, three walks and surrendered five earned runs...Became the 12th player from the Virgin Islands to reach the majors.
- Optioned to Double-A Binghamton on 6/18.
- Named to the mid-season Florida State League All-Star team after going 0-1 with 13 saves and a 1.69 ERA (6 ER/32.0 innings) in 24 games.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP

- Appeared in 215 minor league games, 26 starts, since making his professional debut in **2010**... Owns a 18-19 record, a 2.82 ERA and 43 saves... Paced the South Atlantic League with 16 saves in **2014**, while also leading all SAL relievers with 14.05 strikeouts per nine innings (89 strikeouts in 57.0 innings)...Also named a SAL All-Star.

2017

- Opened the season as the Padres third baseman, his first career Opening Day roster...From the start of the season through the end of May, he led the club and tied for fifth in the National League with 14 home runs...Was optioned to Triple-A El Paso on 6/9 and remained there for the rest of the season.
- Among major league batters with at least 150 at-bats, his .158 avg. (26-for-165) was the lowest in the majors and lowest by a Padre since Nick Hundley (.157) in 2012.
- Over 61% of his hits went for extra bases...Clubbed two doubles and 14 home runs in 26 base hits.
- Appeared in 53 games with 47 starts (46 at third base, one as DH)...At the time of his option, his seven errors were most among NL third basemen.
- On Opening Day at LAD, homered off Clayton Kershaw in the seventh inning...Became the first Padres third baseman to homer on Opening Day since Phil Nevin in 2000.
- Drew a career-high four walks, 4/7 vs. SF.
- Hit a go-ahead, three-run homer off Diamondbacks closer Fernando Rodney in the ninth inning on 4/26 at ARI...It was the seventh time since data is available (1974) that a Padre homered to turn a multi-run deficit into a lead in the ninth inning or later...He was the first Padre to do this since Justin Upton on 6/30/15 at NYM.
- From 4/26-28, homered in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- Hit .202 (49-for-242) with 19 home runs and 44 RBI in 69 games for Triple-A El Paso.

2016

- Split the season between Triple-A El Paso and San Diego, making his Major League debut for the Padres at the age of 28...Hit .217 (60-for-276) with 17 doubles, five triples, 20 home runs, 51 RBI and 48 runs scored to go along with an .869 OPS (.336 OBP, .533 SLG) in 89 games played.

- After signing a minor-league contract with the Padres prior to the season, he began the year with Triple-A El Paso and hit .355 (59-for-166) with 17 doubles, 15 home runs and 48 RBI in 51 games before having his contract selected on 6/14 for his first career call-up.
- Over his first 13 major league games from 6/14-29, he hit just .103 (3-for-29) before hitting .231 (57-for-247) with 20 home runs and 50 RBI from 7/1 through the end of the season.
- Of his 60 hits on the season, 42 were for extra-bases with 17 doubles, five triples and 20 home runs, a ratio of 69.5 percent of his hits going for extra-bases.
- Earned National League Rookie of the Month honors in July...Was just the fourth Padres rookie to win the monthly award and first since Josh Barfield in July 2006...Joined Khalil Greene (April, '04 and August '04) and Xavier Nady (May '03).
- His 20 homers were the third-most all-time by a Padres rookie in a single season, behind Nate Colbert (24 in 1969) and Jedd Gyorko (23 in 2013)...Twenty homers were also the second-most ever by a Padres second basemen in a single season, behind only Gyorko's 23 in 2013.
- Had three multi-homer games, hitting two on 7/6 at ARI, 8/12 at NYM and 8/19 vs. ARI.
- Collected a career-high six RBI on 8/12 at NYM, at the time the most by a Padre in 2016 before Hunter Renfroe's seven RBI game in September... Schimpf's six RBI that day was also, at the time, the most ever by a Padres rookie in a single game before Renfroe's seven.
- After receiving his first career call-up on 6/14, his 20 home runs from 6/14 through the end of the season were tied for the most in the majors by a rookie, with Gary Sanchez also hitting 20 for the Yankees over that time...Schimpf's 42 extra-base hits over that time ranked second most by a rookie behind only Corey Seager's 43 such hits over that span.
- His .869 OPS on the year ranked third-best among qualifying rookies from 6/14 through the end of the regular season, behind Trea Turner (.922) and Corey Seager (.886).

2015

- Combined to hit .250 (92-for-368) with 26 doubles, 23 home runs, 63 RBI and 55 runs scored in 107 games played between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo.
- Began the season with New Hampshire, spending the majority of the season there with 76 games... Also played in 31 games for Triple-A Buffalo.

- Missed time while on the seven-day disabled list from 7/17-24.

2014

- Hit a combined .227 (90-for-397) with 24 doubles, two triples, 24 home runs, 58 RBI and 64 runs scored in 117 total games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo.
- Named an Organization All-Star for Toronto by MiLB.com following the season.
- After the season played in 26 games for Venados de Mazatlan in the Mexican Winter League, hitting .242 (24-for-99) with three home runs and 12 RBI.

2013

- Spent the entire season with Double-A New Hampshire, hitting .210 (93-for-442) with 21 doubles, three triples, 23 home runs, 65 RBI and 67 runs scored in 126 games played.
- Named an Organization All-Star for Toronto by MiLB.com after the year.

2012

- Split the campaign between Single-A Dunedin and Double-A New Hampshire, hitting .269 (127-for-472) with 37 doubles, three triples, 22 home runs, 76 RBI and 80 runs scored in 129 games played.
- Named on Organization All-Star for Toronto by MiLB.com, following the season.
- Named a Florida State League Mid-Season All-Star for Dunedin.

2011

- Played in 57 games for Single-A Dunedin, missing time while on the disabled list from 4/7-6/9 with patella tendinitis of the right knee.

2010

- Split time between Single-A Lansing and Single-A Dunedin, spending the majority of the season with Lansing...Combined to hit .237 (96-for-405) with 26 doubles, 11 triples, eight home runs, 52 RBI and 56 runs scored in 110 total games played.
- Named a Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star for Lansing.

2009

- Made his professional debut by splitting time between Rookie-Level Auburn and the Gulf Coast League Blue Jays, hitting a combined .293 (39-for-133) in 36 total games.

- Attended Louisiana State University where his father, Craig, also attended...Hit .336 (88-for-262) with 19 doubles, 22 home runs and 70 RBI as a junior to earn second team All-SEC honors.
