BALTIMORE ORIOLES (41-102) vs. OAKLAND ATHLETICS (87-57)

RHP Alex Cobb (5-15, 4.97) vs. RHP Mike Fiers (11-6, 3.36)



**WE SHALL NOT FORGET:** Major League Baseball announced plans for league-wide commemoration of September 11, 2001 with tributes at all games today... This remembrance is part of Major League Baseball's ongoing effort to honor those whose lives were lost and affected on that tragic day 17 years ago... Clubs will recognize the day with a moment of silence and pregame ceremonies... A "We Shall Not Forget" silhouetted batter ribbon will be displayed throughout ballparks, on special lineup cards, and on base jewels... Players, coaches, and umpires will wear caps with a side patch of the ribbon during games... Major League Baseball will donate all royalties from the sales of the caps to the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, the Pentagon Memorial Fund, and the Flight 93 National Memorial.

**WHAT A LONG, STRANGE TRIP IT'S BEEN:** The Orioles return home tonight from a three-city, nine-game road trip that included stops at Kansas City (0-3), Seattle (1-2), and Tampa Bay (0-3)... If driving the trip, the journey would have covered 7,058 miles between ballparks... The 7,058 total miles includes Oriole Park at Camden Yards to Kauffman Stadium (1,107 miles), Kauffman Stadium to Safeco Field (1,843 miles), Safeco Field to Tropicana Field (3,145 miles), and Tropicana Field to Oriole Park at Camden Yards (963 miles)... Again, if driving, the trip would have traversed 22 states plus Washington, D.C.

**FRESH FACES:** With his first appearance, **OF DJ Stewart** will become the 14<sup>th</sup> Oriole to make his Major League debut this season... The 14 debuts will match the most in a season in Orioles history (since 1954)... According to STATS, LLC., the mark for most Orioles to debut in a season was set in 1955 (the club's second year in Baltimore) with 14.

**PLAYERS CLUB:** With his first appearance, **OF DJ Stewart** will become the 55<sup>th</sup> player to appear in a game for the Orioles this season... The 55 players used will mark the most in Orioles history (since 1954), surpassing the 54 players used during the 1955 season... The Orioles have also used 28 pitchers this season, marking the most in O's history (2007, 2009, 2011, and 2016 teams each used 27 pitchers).

**MINOR LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE MONTH:** Class A-Advanced Frederick **LHP Alex Wells** was named the Orioles Minor League Pitcher of the Month for August... Wells went 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (7 ER/32.0 IP) in five August starts... He struck out 29 batters, while issuing only four walks, and held opponents to a .188 (22-for-117) batting average... It was Wells' second career Orioles Pitcher of the Month award, also taking home the honors in July 2017... Short-Season A Aberdeen **INF Adam Hall** was named the Orioles Minor League Player of the Month for August... Hall hit .390 (32-for-82) with four doubles, two triples, a home run, 20 runs scored, 12 RBI, nine walks, and 15 stolen bases in 23 August games... He recorded a career-high 19-game hitting streak during the month (August 4-28), and hit safely in 20-of-23 games overall... Hall was also named Player of the Month for August for the New York-Penn League by Minor League Baseball... Hall led the league in average (.390), on-base percentage (.462), OPS (.987), and stolen bases (15)... He was second in runs scored (20) and third in slugging (.524)... Hall, 19, was selected in the second round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of A.B. Lucas Secondary School in London, Ontario, Canada... Hall will receive an award from Minor League Baseball in recognition of the honor.

**EASTERN LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR:** Double-A Bowie **LHP Keegan Akin** has been named the 2018 Eastern League Pitcher of the Year... Akin is the first Bowie pitcher to win the award since 2008, when **RHP Brad Bergesen** earned the honor... Akin pitched to a record of 14-7 with 142 strikeouts and a 3.27 ERA (50 ER/137.2 IP) in 25 starts with Bowie this season... He gave up three earned runs or less in 20 of his 25 starts... Akin led the Eastern League in wins (14), strikeouts (142), batting average against (.225), and led all starting pitchers in strikeouts per nine innings (9.28)... He was named to the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Team and was the winner of the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week Award for August 13-19... Akin was a member of the Western Division roster for the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Game in Trenton and struck out two over 1.0 scoreless inning... Akin is rated by *MLB.com* as the 12<sup>th</sup>-best prospect in the O's organization, and was selected by the Orioles in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Western Michigan University.

**LEADING MAN-CINI:** **Trey Mancini** hit a lead-off home run in the eighth inning on Sept. 1, his 21<sup>st</sup> homer of the season... He is hitting .327 (50-for-153) when leading off an inning... In 46 games since the All-Star break, he is hitting .282 (51-for-181) with nine home runs and 25 RBI.

**BREAKING NEWS:** The Orioles rank among league leaders in several major offensive categories since the All-Star break, including ranking first in the AL and second in the majors in batting average at .266 (422-for-1585)... They have recorded 422 hits in 46 games since the All-Star break, ranking tied for second in the AL and tied for eighth in the majors... The O's have hit 61 home runs since the break to rank tied for sixth in the AL and tied for 11<sup>th</sup> in the majors... The O's .426 slugging percentage ranks sixth in the AL since the break.

**QUALITY OVER QUANTITY:** **RHP Alex Cobb** tossed the Orioles 59<sup>th</sup> Quality Start of the season on Tuesday... The O's 59 Quality Starts this season are tied for seventh in the AL and tied for 17<sup>th</sup> in the majors... Cobb leads the club with 15 Quality Starts... O's starters have received 327 runs of support this season, which ranks second-fewest in the majors... Overall, O's pitchers have received 554 runs of support this season, which ranks third-fewest in the majors and ranks second-fewest in the AL.

**CEDRIC THE ENTERTAINER:** **OF Cedric Mullins** went 1-for-4 on Saturday... Since making his Major League debut on August 10, he is batting .258 (24-for-93) and 10 of his 24 hits are extra-base hits... Since his debut, Mullins' .258 batting average ranks seventh among AL rookies and ranks 11<sup>th</sup> in the majors among rookies... His seven doubles since August 10 are tied for fourth in the majors among rookies.

**VS. OAKLAND:** The Orioles and Athletics play the fourth game of six matchups between the two clubs this season... The A's lead the season series, 3-0... The Orioles visited Oakland, May 4-6... The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 4-3... Baltimore trails Oakland (since 1968) in the all-time series, 265-266, with the Orioles going 130-130 at home and 135-136 in Oakland... From 1954-67, the Orioles owned a 161-116 record against the Philadelphia/Kansas City Athletics.

**TRADE WINDS:** On July 31, the Orioles acquired **RHP Evan Phillips**, **INF Jean Carlos Encarnación**, **C Brett Cumberland**, **LHP Bruce Zimmermann**, and International Signing Bonus Slot Money from the Atlanta Braves in exchange for **RHP Kevin Gausman** and **RHP Darren O'Day**... Also on July 31, the Orioles acquired **INF Jonathan Villar**, **RHP Luis Ortiz**, and **INF Jean Carmona** from the Milwaukee Brewers in exchange for **INF Jonathan Schoop**... On July 29, the Orioles traded **RHP Brad Brach** to the Atlanta Braves in exchange for International Signing Bonus Slot Money... On July 24, the Orioles acquired **RHP Dillon Tate**, **LHP Josh Rogers**, and **RHP Cody Carroll** from the New York Yankees in exchange for **LHP Zach Britton**... On July 18, the Orioles acquired **OF Yusniel Díaz**, **INF Rylan Bannon**, **INF Breyvic Valera**, **RHP Dean Kremer**, and **RHP Zach Pop** from the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for **INF Manny Machado**.

**THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY:** On this date in 1959, **RHP Jerry Walker** tossed a club record 16.0 innings in the second game of a doubleheader at Memorial Stadium, to defeat the White Sox, 1-0... Walker allowed six hits and **3B Brooks Robinson's** two-out single scored **RF Al Pilarcik** to give the O's a doubleheader sweep... **RHP Jack Fisher's** complete-game three-hitter won the first game, 3-0... Also, on this date in 1974, **LHP Ross Grimsley** earned a no-decision after pitching 14.0 innings in a 17.0-inning, 3-2 win against New York at Memorial Stadium... No O's pitcher has pitched as many innings in a game since.

**DISABLED LIST:** Five O's are currently on the DL... **RHP Pedro Araujo** (right elbow strain, since 6/11), **INF Steve Wilkerson** (left oblique strain, retroactive to 7/2), and **OF/DH Mark Trumbo** (right knee inflammation, since 8/20) are on the 10-day DL... **RHP Gabriel Ynoa** (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26) and **LHP Richard Bleier** (left shoulder latissimus strain, retroactive to 6/14) are on the 60-day DL.

**THE SKIPPER:** A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is in his ninth season as Orioles manager... He has managed the Yankees (313-268-1, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (663-671, Aug. 2010-current)... Showalter's 1,545 career wins rank 24<sup>th</sup> all-time and are third among active managers behind **Bruce Bochy**, **Mike Scioscia**, and **Terry Francona**... His 663 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only **Earl Weaver** (1,480).

**QUICK HITS:** Signed by the Orioles as a free agent on March 21, 2018...Named one of three finalists for the AL Gold Glove Award as the league's top defensive pitcher in 2017...Had spent his entire career (11 seasons) with the Tampa Bay Rays, including parts of six seasons with the Major League club...Missed the entire 2015 season due to "Tommy John" surgery...At the conclusion of the 2017 season, Cobb was the sixth-longest tenured Ray in club history (7 years, 61 days), and ranked among the franchise's all-time leaders in ERA (2<sup>nd</sup> - 3.50), wins (5<sup>th</sup> - 48), starts (6<sup>th</sup> - 115), innings pitched (5<sup>th</sup> - 700.0), and strikeouts (6<sup>th</sup> - 570)...Selected by the Rays in the fourth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST START:** Cobb earned the win in his last outing on September 4 at Seattle after allowing one run on four hits, one home run, with three walks and two strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...Was the sixth time in his last seven starts pitching at least 6.0 innings and allowing two-or-fewer runs...Was his 15<sup>th</sup> Quality Start of the year, tied for his second-most in a season... Threw 98 pitches, 57 strikes.

**CAREER VS. OAKLAND:** Cobb will be making his second start of the season against Oakland; he suffered the loss on May 6 at the Oakland Coliseum after allowing two runs (one earned) on five hits with one walk and five strikeouts; the Orioles fell 2-1...This will be his 10<sup>th</sup> career start against the Athletics...He has gone 4-3 with a 2.25 ERA (15 ER/60.0 IP) with seven Quality Starts in his previous nine outings against them...His career 2.25 ERA is the lowest against any AL West opponent...Has worked 6.0-or-more innings in seven of his nine games against them...In five starts against them at home, he is 3-1 with a 2.43 ERA (9 ER/33.1 IP), and four Quality Starts...Has made four starts at the Oakland Coliseum, going 1-2 with a 2.03 ERA (6 ER/26.2 IP) and three Quality Starts.

**AGAINST THE AL WEST:** Cobb will be making his sixth start against an AL West opponent this season; he has gone 1-2 with a 3.41 ERA (11 ER/29.0 IP) and four Quality Starts so far this season...Will be his 35<sup>th</sup> career start vs. the American League West...Holds a record of 11-12 with a 4.29 ERA (97 ER/203.1 IP); 20 of the 34 outings have been Quality Starts...Cobb has thrown 6.0-or-more innings in 23 of the 34 starts; his record when doing so is 10-6 with a 2.46 ERA (43 ER/157.0 IP), compared to 1-5 with a 10.64 ERA (54 ER/45.2 IP) when he doesn't reach the 6.0 inning mark.

**FINISH WHAT YOU STARTED:** Cobb tossed his first complete game of the season on August 18 at Cleveland...He became the second Oriole to toss a complete game this season (Bundy, May 24 at CWS)...It was his fourth career complete game and first since August 31, 2013 at Oakland; he is 2-2 with a 3.18 ERA (12 ER/34.0 IP) in these games...Both losses came in 8.0 inning complete games.

**SECOND HALF SURGE:** Cobb has made nine starts since the All-Star break, posting a 3-3 record and a 2.65 ERA (17 ER/57.2 IP)...His 2.65 ERA ranks seventh-best in the AL among pitchers with at least eight starts since the break...Seven of his nine starts have been Quality Starts...For his career, Cobb has gone 28-19 with a 3.09 ERA (136 ER/396.2 IP) in 66 starts after the All-Star break...In his career in the first half, he is 25-31 with a 4.34 ERA (219 ER/453.2 IP) in 75 starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Cobb has received three-or-fewer runs of support in 19 of his 26 starts this season...His run support average of 3.47 is the fifth-lowest in the majors...His 58 total runs of support also rank tied for fifth-fewest the majors among all pitchers with at least 130.0 innings.

**FIGURING HIM OUT:** Cobb has allowed a .247 (54-for-219) average the first time through the lineup, and a .312 (67-for-215) and .312 (49-for-157) the second and third time through respectively...Opponents are hitting .253 (25-for-99) and .255 (26-for-102) in the first and second inning respectively...In innings 3-9, Cobb has allowed an opponents batting average of .302 (120-for-398)...His 171 hits allowed on the season are the second-most in baseball since making his debut on April 14, and are fifth-most in the majors overall this season.

**BETTER WITH REST:** Cobb has made 12 starts this season on five days rest; he is 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA (29 ER/77.1 IP)...In 11 starts on four days rest, Cobb is 0-9 with a 6.94 ERA (45 ER/58.1 IP).
