BALTIMORE ORIOLES (5-9) at BOSTON RED SOX (11-2)

RHP Alex Cobb (2018 debut) vs. RHP Hector Velázquez (1-0, 3.12)

KEEPING UP WITH JONES: OF Adam Jones went 1-for-3 with a sacrifice fly on Friday night at Boston...His 181 career hits against the Red Sox rank third-most among active players (Robinson Canó, 220; Evan Longoria, 184)...His 98 career RBI against the Red Sox rank fourth among active players (Robinson Canó, 116; Evan Longoria, 106; José Bautista, 103).

NO MINOR FEAT: Double-A Bowie Manager Gary Kendall will manage his 1,000th game with the Baysox on tonight at Harrisburg...He owns a record of 508-491 in eight seasons at the helm of the Baysox...Kendall has led the Baysox to three of their seven playoff appearances in franchise history, including their first and only league title in 2015...He is the longest tenured and winningest manager in franchise history...It is Kendall's 19th overall season in the Orioles organization, having previously managed at Short-Season Aberdeen (2008-10), Class-A Delmarva (2005-07), and Rookie Level Bluefield (2004), as well as being a Field Coach at Aberdeen (2002-03) and Bluefield (2000-01)...Kendall is a 1981 graduate of Sparrows Point High School in Baltimore and went on to play at the Community College of Baltimore (MD) and at Atlantic Christian College (NC), where he received his degree in 1987.

42: On Sunday, all of baseball will commemorate the 71st anniversary of Jackie Robinson's first Major League game for the Brooklyn Dodgers on April 15, 1947...Robinson's uniform No. 42 was retired by the Dodgers in 1972 and in 1997, the 50th anniversary of his breaking of baseball's color barrier, Major League Baseball permanently retired his uniform number league-wide...Jackie Robinson Day has been celebrated throughout baseball on April 15 each year since 2004 and every player and all on-field personnel has celebrated Robinson's legacy by wearing his No. 42 during games scheduled on Jackie Robinson Day since 2009...Each player's game-worn No. 42 jersey will be authenticated, autographed, and auctioned to benefit the Jackie Robinson Foundation.

MAKE MINE A DOUBLE: In the 12th inning of Sunday's game at New York, the Orioles turned a 1-2-5 double play when a bases-loaded grounder to RHP Brad Brach was thrown to C Caleb Joseph and was completed with a throw by Joseph to 3B Tim Beckham...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 1-2-5 double play was the first of its kind in the majors since September 7, 2012 when the Houston Astros (RHP Lucas Harrell, C Chris Snyder, 3B Matt Dominguez) did so against the Cincinnati Reds...Also, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Sunday's 12th-inning two-out play marked the first 1-2-5 double play in Orioles history.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones hit his 250th career home run as a center fielder last Thursday night at Yankee Stadium...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 250 homers hit while playing center field rank 13th all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails Mickey Mantle (432), Ken Griffey, Jr. (382), Fred Lynn (266), and Bernie Williams (261)...Willie Mays is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

OPENING DAY: The Orioles defeated the Twins, 3-2, in 11 innings on Opening Day at Oriole Park...The O's have won eight consecutive Opening Day games (since 2011) and have won 15 of their last 18 openers...The O's are now 43-22 all-time on Opening Day...According to STATS, LLC., the O's eight consecutive Opening Day wins are tied for sixth all-time and rank first in Orioles history...The Orioles won seven straight Opening Day games from 1970-76...Adam Jones hit a walk-off home run in the 11th inning in the season opener...Last year, Mark Trumbo also hit an 11th-inning walk-off homer in the Orioles season opener...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Orioles are the first team in Major League history to hit an Opening Day walk-off home run in consecutive seasons...The Orioles also won in walk-off fashion on Opening Day in 2016 when Matt Wieters hit a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning on April 4, 2016 vs. Minnesota.

VS. BOSTON: The Orioles and Red Sox play the second game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 1-0...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 489-564, with the O's trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 240-284 at Boston.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1954, the Orioles won their first game ever, a 3-2 victory at Detroit...RHP Duane Pillette went the distance and the Orioles scored all three runs in the first inning...Maryland native 2B Bobby Young doubled and scored the club's first run on a CF Gil Goan single.

DISABLED LIST: Four Orioles are currently on the disabled list...INF/OF Mark Trumbo (right quad strain, retroactive to 3/26), RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shin stress reaction, retroactive to 3/26), and OF Colby Rasmus (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7) are on the 10-day disabled list...LHP Zach Britton (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15) is on the 60-day disabled list.

SIX PACK: Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Orioles hitters lead the majors with 1,352 home runs hit and also lead the majors in fewest number of errors committed with 505...Several current hitters rank among Major League leaders in home runs since 2012...Chris Davis ranks second with 224, Adam Jones ranks seventh with 179, and Mark Trumbo is tied for 11th with 172 home runs...Also since 2012, the Orioles rank first among American League clubs with 288 wins at home.

FEEL THE DRAFT: The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own three picks in the top 100 of the 2018 Draft; the No. 11, 37, and 87 overall selections.

SPRING TRAINING WRAP: The Orioles finished third in the Grapefruit League with a 17-12-2 record, posting a 4.86 ERA in 274.0 IP and batting .271/.450/.332, scoring 171 runs in 31 games...The Orioles drew a total of 103,294 fans for 15 home games in Sarasota...It was the eighth time in nine seasons that the Orioles have welcomed more than 100,000 fans at Ed Smith Stadium...The Orioles had six sellouts this spring, including the second-highest single-game attendance total at Ed Smith Stadium with 8,782 in attendance on March 14...Ed Smith Stadium was recently recognized by USA Today as the top Spring Training venue in Major League Baseball.

ORIOLES HALL OF FAME: Former 2B Brian Roberts has been elected to the Orioles Hall of Fame...Additionally, long-time Orioles Radio broadcaster Fred Manfra will be inducted as this year's Herb Armstrong Award winner...Roberts and Manfra will be honored at a luncheon at Oriole Park on August 10, as well as during an on-field ceremony prior to the August 11 game...Roberts played 13 seasons with the Orioles from 2001-13, compiling a .278 batting average and 1,452 hits...He ranks first in O's history among second baseman in all major offensive categories...Drafted by Baltimore in the first round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft (No. 50 overall), Roberts was a two-time All-Star (2005 and 2007)...Roberts will provide analysis for select games on the Orioles Radio Network this season...Before retiring in 2017, Manfra spent 24 years with the Orioles Radio Network...The East Baltimore native and Patterson High School graduate joined Orioles Radio broadcasts in 1993...In his 47-year broadcasting career, Manfra covered numerous O's highlights and other marquee sporting events.

COACHING STAFF: The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for Howie Clark (assistant hitting), Roger McDowell (pitching), and Alan Mills (bullpen); the fourth for Scott Coolbaugh (hitting); and sixth season for Bobby Dickerson (third base) and Einar Díaz (coach); while Wayne Kirby (first base) and John Russell (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (627-578, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,509 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 627 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Signed by the Orioles as a free agent on 3/21/18...Is two wins away from 50 career wins...Had spent his entire career (11 seasons) with the Tampa Bay Rays, including parts of six seasons with the Major League club...Missed the entire 2015 season due to "Tommy John" surgery...At the conclusion of the 2017 season, Cobb was the sixth-longest tenured Ray in club history (7 years, 61 days), and ranked among the franchise's all-time leaders in ERA (2nd - 3.50), wins (5th - 48), starts (6th - 115), innings pitched (5th - 700.0), and strikeouts (6th - 570)...Selected by the Rays in the fourth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

2017 RECAP: Made a career high 29 starts for the Rays in 2017, going 12-10 with a 3.66 ERA (73 ER/179.1 IP)...Established career highs innings pitched (179.1) and wins (12)...Led the Rays in victories and ranked second to Chris Archer in starts, innings pitched, and strikeouts (128)...Worked at least 6.0 innings in nine straight starts from 6/9-7/26, the longest streak of his career...Tossed 8.0 shutout innings on 6/27 at PIT, allowing two hits with one walk and four strikeouts; had a no-hitter until Josh Harrison and Andrew McCutchen opened the seventh inning with back-to-back singles...Posted a 2.82 ERA (12 ER/38.1 IP) in seven starts from 8/1 through the end of the season...Spent 16 games on the disabled list from 8/6-23 due to turf toe on his right big toe...Named one of three finalists for the AL Gold Glove Award as the league's top defensive pitcher.

SEASON DEBUTS: Has gone 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA (13 ER/34.0 IP) in six career season debuts...Made his 2017 season debut on April 5 vs. New York-AL in Tampa Bay's third game of the season, earning the win after holding the Yankees to one run on four hits in 5.2 innings...Began the 2012 and 2016 seasons on the disabled list.

CAREER VS. BOSTON: Cobb will be making his 15th career start against the Red Sox, having gone 6-4 with a 3.43 ERA (31 ER/81.1 IP) in his first 14 starts...His last start against Boston came on September 16, 2017 in Tampa Bay when he suffered the loss after tossing 5.1 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, one home run, with five strikeouts...In seven career starts at Fenway Park, he has gone 5-1 with a 3.15 ERA (14 ER/40.0 IP)...He has won his last three decisions at Fenway, including his last start there on September 10, 2017 while with Tampa when he worked 5.0 innings, allowing one run on four hits with three walks and five strikeouts...Red Sox catcher, Christian Vázquez is a career .727 (8-for-11) hitter against Cobb; his eight hits are tied for the fourth-most by any batter against him.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Owns a career record of 21-13 (.618) with a 3.08 ERA (100 ER/292.1 IP) in 48 career starts against AL East opponents...Among all pitchers with at least 250.0 innings pitched against the division since his rookie season of 2011, Cobb ranks second in ERA and fourth in winning percentage...Has made 22 career starts on the road against the division, going 11-5 with a 3.68 ERA (53 ER/129.2 IP).

HITTING THE ROAD: Cobb is a career 25-16 in 57 road starts with a 3.91 ERA (149 ER/343.1 IP)...In 2017 he went 6-5 with a 4.72 ERA (50 ER/95.1 IP) in 16 road starts, eight Quality Starts...40 of his 65 career home runs allowed have come on the road.

HOME SWEET HOME: Posted a 2.46 ERA (23 ER/84.0 IP) in 13 starts at Tropicana Field in 2017, marking the third-best home ERA in the AL behind Corey Kluber (1.81) and Justin Verlander (2.45)...It was also the fourth-best mark in Rays history...Made Quality Starts in seven of his 13 home games...For his career, owns a 3.10 ERA (123 ER/356.2 IP) in 58 career home starts, the sixth-best home ERA in the AL since 2011.

AT ORIOLE PARK: Has made seven career starts at Oriole Park, posting a record of 3-1 with a 4.62 ERA (19 ER/37.0 IP) with two Quality Starts...Worked 6.0-or-more innings on three occasions, including each of his last two starts here (7/02/17 and 9/22/17).
