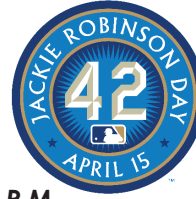

FISH BITES

The Marlins conclude a six-game homestand on Jackie Robinson Day with the finale of this three-game set against the Pittsburgh Pirates. RHP **José Ureña** is making his third career start and fifth appearance against the Pirates, posting a 1-1 record with a 7.31 ERA (16.0 ip/13 er). Pittsburgh is countering with RHP Ivan Nova, who in 15.0 career innings over two starts against Miami has surrendered just four hits and has yet to allow a run. Miami opened its current homestand by dropping three straight to the New York Mets. Following this afternoon's contest, the Marlins will hit the road for a two-game series against the Yankees (April 16-17), a four-game series in Milwaukee (April 19-22), and a three-game set at Dodger Stadium (April 23-25).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

After eight scoreless innings, the Pittsburgh Pirates were able to push a run across the plate in the ninth to come away with a 1-0 win over the Marlins. In his third Major League start, **Trevor Richards** held the Pirates hitless through the first four innings of the game, and allowed just two over his 7.0 innings of work. Miami had several opportunities to break the scoreless tie, leaving the bases loaded in both the fourth and eighth innings. Both **Starlin Castro** and **Brian Anderson** had 2x4 nights, while **Miguel Rojas** and **Justin Bour** added Miami's other two hits in the game. **Brad Ziegler** was dealt his third loss of the season.

SLIMMEST OF MARGINS

Miami suffered a 1-0 loss for the 41st time in Franchise history last night. It was just the second time in Club history that the Marlins dropped a 1-0 decision to the Pittsburgh Pirates. The other instance was a six-inning affair on September 14, 1993. Last night marked just the seventh time the Marlins have lost a 1-0 game in the ninth inning or later; the last such game was September 15, 2013 at Citi Field against the Mets (12 innings).

VS. PIRATES

Miami dropped the 2017 season series, 3-4, going 1-2 at Marlins Park and 2-2 at PNC Park. The Marlins .574 winning percentage against the Pirates at home (54-40) is their second-best winning percentage at home against any National League team, behind a .646 mark against the Colorado Rockies (64-35).

UP NEXT

Miami will travel to the Big Apple and resume Interleague Play with a quick two-game series against the New York Yankees. The two teams last met in 2015, with each team sweeping two-game home series; Miami on June 15-16 at Marlins Park, and the Yankees on June 17-18 at Yankee Stadium. The Marlins have been winners in only two of 10 games at Yankee ballparks, yet only trail the all-time series, 11-13.

A DAY IN THE LIFE

Since the start of 2016, **José Ureña** has posted an 8-4 record with 2.74 ERA (95.1/29) in 21 day appearances (15 starts). His ERA during the day is the seventh-best in the Majors (third in NL) in that span (min. 90.0 ip), behind Clayton Kershaw (1.56), Michael Fulmer (2.52), Jacob deGrom (2.55), Corey Kluber (2.57), Chris Sale (2.65), and Ervin Santana (2.69).

STARTS WITH STARTERS

Over their first eight games, Marlins starting pitchers owned a 6.75 ERA (37.1/38), reaching the 6.0-inning mark just twice; **Dillon Peters** (6.0 ip) on April 1 vs. the Cubs and **José Ureña** (7.0) on April 3 vs. Boston. Over their last six games, the starting staff has gone 6.0+ innings three times and limited opponents to three-or-fewer runs in each of those six starts, holding a 3.00 ERA (33.0/11) in that span.

AUTISM AWARENESS DAY

As part of Autism Awareness Month, the Marlins, in partnership with South Florida Ford, are hosting Autism Awareness Day powered by South Florida Ford. Steven Ramirez, who was Captain for a Day on April 10, will return to throw one of today's first pitches and recount his experience as Marlins Captain. Activities for today include: MVP Suite 41 will be designated as a Quiet Room, a sensory-controlled calming area, available to guests who require a space to avoid overstimulation; Miami Children's Museum will be on-site conducting a free autism-friendly sensory activity for kids in Section 223; and Miami-Dade County Public Schools for Autism Support will also be in Section 223 distributing collateral and other information as part of the Autism Resource Fair.

EXPERIENCED YOUTH

The two teams in this series are showcasing two of the youngest active rosters in Major League Baseball, with Miami ranking as the fourth-youngest (28 years, 26 days) and Pittsburgh as the fifth-youngest (28.041). Philadelphia's current active roster is the youngest at 26.279, followed by Cincinnati (27.225) and the Yankees (27.336). - *Stats LLC*

R32PECT THE PROCESS

Coming into this season, **Derek Dietrich** had made 371 starts at various positions over his career, posting a .249 average (322x1293). This season, his first as a full-time starter, he has gotten off to a solid start with a .290 average (18x62), one double, one triple, one home run and four RBI in 13 games. He leads the Marlins and is tied for ninth in the National League in hits (with Tommy Pham), behind Jose Pirela (21), Ozzie Albies (20), DJ LeMahieu (20), Dansby Swanson (20), Kris Bryant (19), Scooter Gennett (19), Jose Martinez (19), and Marcell Ozuna (19). Dietrich is also tied for sixth in the NL in multi-hit games (6) with seven others, behind Eric Hosmer (8), Albies (7), Pirela (7), Swanson (7), and LeMahieu (7).

TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami had the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. Using a current 2018 model, Miami has the second-toughest schedule of any team in the Majors, with opponents combining on a .579 winning percentage. The only team with a tougher schedule is the Washington Nationals, whose opponents have combined on a .588 winning percentage. - *Stats LLC*

GETTING CAUGHT RED HANDED

Marlins catchers have combined to throw out seven of 15 total attempted base stealers this season (46.7%), which ranks as the third-best mark in the Majors. The Cubs lead all teams with 57.1% (4 of-7), followed by Detroit (50.0; 7-of-14). Miami leads all NL clubs in catcher's caught stealing with seven, and is tied with Detroit for the most in the Majors. **Bryan Holaday** has thrown out four attempted base stealers, which ranks as the third-most behind Jonathan Lucroy (6) and James McCann (5).

➤ José Ureña is making his fourth start of the season at Marlins Park, going 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (16.0 ip/9 er). Finished 2018 Grapefruit League season with 2-1 record and 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip/7 er) in five starts.

➤ Making his third career start and fifth appearance against Pittsburgh, owning an even 1-1 record and 7.31 ERA (16.0/13). Last faced Pirates on April 28, 2017 at Marlins Park, surrendering two runs and 12 hits over 4.1 inning relief appearance. The 12 hits allowed were the most ever in a game by a Marlins reliever, and most since Jake Westbrook allowed 13 to the Dodgers on August 7, 2013.

➤ Took second loss of season in last start, April 9 at Marlins Park against the Mets. Allowed three runs on five hits with a walk and four strikeouts over 5.0 innings. Miami has dropped each of his last five starts, matching longest such streak of career. Club also dropped five straight from June 17 to August 6, 2015.

➤ On April 3, held Boston to one run on four hits over 7.0 innings. Walked one while struck out career high-tying seven. Also had seven strikeouts on May 28, 2017 vs. Angels (5.0 ip) and July 4, 2017 at St. Louis (5.0 ip).

➤ Earned Opening Day start against Cubs on March 29 at Marlins Park. Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took loss, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in first inning, becoming only second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).

➤ Posted team-high 14 wins last season, to go with 3.82 ERA (169.2/72) and 113 strikeouts in 34 appearances (28 starts). Established career highs in wins, appearances, innings pitched, strikeouts, and ERA.

➤ Finished season 14-7, 3.97 (154.1/68) as starter. Did not factor in a decision and had a 2.35 ERA (15.1/4) in six relief appearances.

➤ Went 6-1 with 2.40 ERA (63.2/17) in 11 day-game starts. Owned fourth lowest ERA among NL starters (min. 50.0 IP), behind Max Scherzer (1.90), Stephen Strasburg (2.06) and Jimmy Nelson (2.32). - *Stats LLC*

➤ From May 7 through end of season, led National League with 28 starts, and 14 wins in that time tied Zack Greinke and Alex Wood for second, behind only Zach Davies (15). Among NL pitchers who made at least 25 starts in that time, average against (.232) ranked sixth and ERA ranked 10th.

➤ Set career high with five-game winning streak over seven starts from May 23 to June 23. Did so despite posting a 4.58 ERA (37.1/19) in that time, as he received 7.47 runs of support during stretch.

➤ Tossed season-high 8.0 innings in loss on July 31 vs. Washington, and again in win on Sept. 20 vs. the Mets. Allowed just one run to Nationals, and two to New York. Became first Marlins' pitcher since Henderson Alvarez (4), José Fernández (2), and Nathan Eovaldi (2) in 2014 to have multiple starts with 8.0-plus innings and two-or-fewer runs allowed in a single season.

➤ Made 21 starts following a team loss, with a 12-5 record and 3.54 ERA. Only Marcus Stroman (25) had more such starts in the Majors, while Ureña's win total tied Jacob deGrom for the MLB lead.

➤ Caleb Smith is making his fourth start of the season in the series opener against the New York Yankees. Made first career Opening Day roster after going 0-2 with 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip/11 er) in six Spring outings (two starts). Acquired by Miami this offseason, along with INF Garrett Cooper on November 20, from Yankees.

➤ According to Inside Edge, has the third highest swing and miss percentage on pitches in the strike zone at 26.7%. Max Scherzer leads with 28.4%, just ahead of Chris Sale (27.4%).

➤ Is making first career start and appearance against the Yankees, and first career Interleague start. Appeared in nine games (two starts) with Yankees last season, going 0-1 with 7.71 ERA (18.2/16).

➤ In last start, April 10 vs. Mets, went 5.0 innings and allowed three runs on five hits with a walk and seven strikeouts. Leads Marlins and is tied for seventh in National League with 19 strikeouts this season.
