NEW YORK METS (18-17) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (22-15)

Friday, May 11, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 38; Home 21
LHP Steven Matz (1-3, 4.23) vs RHP Jake Arrieta (3-1, 3.15)

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the San Francisco Giants, 6-3, on a beautiful day in South Philly ... Starter Vince Velasquez (W, 3-4), went 6.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 5 hits with 1 walk and 12 strikeouts ... Velasquez allowed two home runs early and the Phils were down 3-0 after the Giants half of the 2nd inning ... Velasquez was dominant after the second home run and retired 11 of the next 12 batters he faced, 10 by strikeout ... The four-game sweep was Philadelphia's first over the Giants since 1982.
- SWING AND A MISS:** The Phillies just completed a four-game sweep over the Giants where they struck out 55 of the 140 hitters faced, a 39.3 % strikeout rate that set a new franchise record in a four-game series (previous: 34.8 %, April 2016 vs SD) ... The 55 punchouts were the club's most ever in a four-game series and the second-most in any series in franchise history, shy of only a 59 strikeout performance in a five-game series against the New York Mets, May 29-June 2, 2014 ... **Aaron Nola** (5/8, 12 SO) and **Vince Velasquez** (5/10, 12 SO) combined for 24 of the 55 strikeouts in the series ... It marked the first time the Phillies had two starting pitchers combine for a double-digit strikeout game in single series since 2012, when **Cliff Lee** (9/17, 10 SO) and **Cole Hamels** (9/19, 10 SO) did so against the Mets at Citi Field.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start, the Phillies have gone 21-11 in their last 32 games (4/5-current) and their .656 winning percentage over that span is tops in the National League and ranks 3rd in the majors behind only the Yankees (.710) and Red Sox (.677) ... The Phillies enter this evening's game seven games above the .500 mark for the fourth time this season ... **With a win tonight, Philadelphia would move to eight games over .500 for the first time since the end of the 2011 season.**
- RAGING BULL:** **Odubel Herrera** has now reached base safely in a career-best 39 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .356/.417/.537 slash line over 168 plate appearances during the streak ... Herrera, who has reached base safely in each of his 35 games to start the season, has the longest on-base streak to begin a season by a major league player since Matt Holliday began the 2015 season reaching base in 45 straight (*Elias*) ... Overall, Herrera's 39-game on-base streak is the longest of any major league player since 2016 when Freddie Freeman reached in 46 straight ... It is the 8th-longest streak in Phillies franchise history, and if he can reach safely tonight, Herrera will tie Willie Montanez (40 G, 1974) for 7th on the Phillies all-time list.

- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 26-10 in their last 36 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .722 win percentage over that stretch ranks 3rd in the majors behind the Yankees (.750) and Cubs (.731) ... This season, the Phillies own the best home record in the majors at 15-5 (.750 win %) and the second-best run differential (+49) behind only the Yankees (+54) ... **The 15-5 start at home is the best 20-game start in Citizens Bank Park history and overall the best start by a Phillies team at home since 1993, when they opened 16-4 (.900) at Veterans Stadium** ... Offensively, among all NL clubs, the Phils lead the league in runs at home (114 R, next: CHI, 90 R) and home runs (27 HR, next: WSH, 25 HR) ... On the mound, Philadelphia's 28.5 % strikeout rate at CBP is tops in the NL (next: WSH, 28.4%) and their 3.02 ERA at home is 3rd in the NL (best: ARI, 2.76).
- SLAMTANA:** First baseman **Carlos Santana** collected 13 RBI in the four-game series against San Francisco, tying a Phillies franchise record for most RBI in a series of any length, per Elias (others: Mike Schmidt – 13 RBI, 7/6-9/79 vs SF and Cliff Lee – 13 RBI, 7/25-28/22 vs CIN) ... Santana has now recorded an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games which is the longest streak by a Phillies player since 2009 when **Ryan Howard** did so in seven straight (5/27-6/3) ... **Chase Utley** had an eight-game XBH streak from April 16-23, 2008 and a nine-game streak from May 25-June 3, 2008.
- FEELING LEFT OUT:** Today will be the 11th time this season the Phillies have faced a left-handed starter ... In the first 10 games, those starters have combined for a 6.39 ERA (31 ER, 43.2 IP), surrendered 45 hits and 24 walks (1.58 WHIP) while lasting past the fifth inning just twice (completing 6.0 IP just once) ... Philadelphia has won 7 of those 10 games.
- FORTUNE .500:** The Phillies enter play tonight with an all-time record of 500-470 against the Mets ... Since the New York's inaugural season in 1962, Philadelphia's 500 wins are their most versus any club (next: WSH/MTL franchise, 431 wins) ... Conversely, New York's 500 losses against the Phils are their most versus any opponent (next: Braves franchise, 449 losses) ... However, since 2014, the Phillies have a 25-53 record against the Mets (.321 win %) and have been outscored, 425-301 (-124 run differential) ... From 2007-2013, the Phillies were 68-59 against the Mets (.535) with a +35 run differential (589-554).

LAST START: 5/6 at WSH: ND, 6.0 IP, 2 H, R, ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, HR ... Arrieta vs Scherzer ... Max Scherzer held the Phillies bats in check for the length of his outing, striking out 15 in 6.1 innings ... Philadelphia scored 3 times off the bullpen in the seventh on RBIs from Nick Williams, Rhys Hoskins and Odubel Herrera ... Maikel Franco hit his sixth home run of the season in the eighth but the bullpen surrendered four runs in the final 2.0 innings as Washington took the series.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Citizens Bank Spark:** His 1.09 ERA (3 ER, 18.0 IP) at CBP is the lowest by any pitcher ever to make at least 5 starts at CBP and his lowest ERA in any park in which he has made more than 1 career start
- Impressive Feat:** His last start was the 28th of his career in which he went at least 6.0 innings and allowed 2 hits or fewer (197 career starts) ... For comparison, since 2015, the Phillies have had 21 such starts from pitchers in 523 starts
- From the Ground Up:** Arrieta's 60.4 ground ball percentage is by far most among NL starters (next: Ty Blach, 57.6%) and 4th among all ML starters in 2018
- Rough for Righties:** Since the 2017 All-Star Break, RHH are slashing just .168/.239/.292 against him with just 5 HR in 224 plate appearances ... **Among all pitchers to face at least 200 RHH in that span, his .168 OPP AVG is the lowest**
- NL Starter Rankings:** 8th in fewest HR/9.0 IP (0.52), 9th in fewest H/9.0 IP (6.55) and OPP SLG % (.314)
- vs NL East:** 13-8, 3.55 ERA (80 ER, 203.0 IP) in 34 starts

- 2018:** 2-0, 1.50 ERA (3 ER, 18.0 IP) in 3 starts
- Career:** 42-26, 3.38 (219 ER, 584.0 IP) in 97 games (95 starts)

2018 SEASON:

- Did not allow a homer in 28.1 straight IP in parts of 6 starts, 4/8-5/6
- Had a stretch of 18 straight starts allowing 3 ER or fewer from 7/2/17-4/25/18, the second-longest such streak of his career
- Struck out 10 batters on 4/19 vs PIT, his 14th career double-digit strikeout game and first start of 10+ SO, 1 H or fewer by a Phillie starter since Cole Hamels' no-hitter in his final start as a Phillie, 7/25/15 at CHI
- Pitched in his 200th career game on 4/19 vs PIT

2017 SEASON:

- Led the team in wins (14) and totaled at least 30 starts for the third consecutive season
- In 12 starts following the All-Star break, posted a 2.28 ERA (17 ER, 67.0 IP), which ranked 6th among qualifying NL pitchers (3rd among starters) in that span
- Named NL Pitcher of the Month for August (4-1, 1.21 ERA), when he led all NL starters in ERA and T-1st in wins
- Made 20 road starts, the most by a CHI pitcher since 1980 (Rick Reuschel, 21)
- Walked 3 or fewer batters in 29 of 30 starts, averaging 2.94 BB/9.0 IP (55 BB, 168.1 IP)
- Had a stretch of 72 consecutive starts (9/2/14-4/22/17) of at least 5.0 innings snapped, 4/28 at BOS (4.1 IP); that was the longest stretch by a CHI pitcher since 1908
- Collected his 1,000th career SO (Trea Turner) on 6/27 at WSH
- Went 1-1 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER, 10.2 IP) in two postseason starts: Game 4 of the NLDS, 10/11 vs WSH and Game 4 of the NLCS, 10/18 vs LAD

CAREER:

- Was the 2015 National League Cy Young Award Winner (5th in CHI history), and in 2016 earned his first career All-Star selection and Silver Slugger Award
- Has tossed two career no-hitters: 8/30/15 at LAD and 4/21/16 at CIN
 - Became the 8th pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter in consecutive seasons ... His second came in his 10th start after tossing his first, the third-shortest time between no-hitters in MLB history
- Recorded a career and CHI franchise-best 20 consecutive wins from 8/4/15-5/25/16, which tied for the third-longest streak in MLB history (since 1913)
- In 9 career postseason starts, is 5-3, 3.08 ERA (18 ER, 52.2 IP), 66 SO (most in CHI postseason history), .189 OPP AVG and hit a HR as a batter ... Allowed just 3 ER in 11.1 IP (2.38 ERA) in two starts during the 2016 World Series
- Signed by PHI as a free agent on 3/12/18 ... Originally selected by BAL in the 5th round of the June 2007 draft
