## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (49-37) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-48)

Sunday, July 8, 2018 – PNC Park – 1:35 EDT – Game 87; Road 41

RHP Drew Anderson (NR) vs RHP Nick Kingham (2-4, 2.70)

- **LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies guaranteed a series win over Pittsburgh with a 3-2, come-from-behind victory at PNC Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta turned in one of his best starts of the season, going 7.0 innings and allowing 2 runs on 6 hits with 8 strikeouts ... Down by two runs late, the Phillies scored three in the seventh on hits from Nick Williams, Scott Kingery and Jorge Alfaro ... Seranthony Dominguez and Victor Arano tossed scoreless innings to lock down the series victory.
- **TRANSACTIONS:** Today, the Phillies recalled **RHP Drew Anderson** from Lehigh Valley (AAA) and optioned **RHP Yacksel Rios** to Lehigh Valley.
- **HEATING UP:** The Phillies have won six straight games, eight of nine and have posted a 17-7 record since 6/10 ... Their .708 winning percentage in that span is T-1<sup>st</sup> in the NL with CIN, and ranks T-2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB, trailing on HOU (.760, 19-6) ... Philadelphia's six-game win streak ties their season best (other: 4/9-15) ... **They have not won seven straight ballgames since 9/5-12/2012** ... They have the 3<sup>rd</sup>-best winning percentage in the NL this season (.570), trailing only MIL (.596) and CHI (.581) ... **Philadelphia is currently tied with ATL for first place in the NL East for the second straight day, marking just the second time they have had any share of first place in 2018 (sole possession for one day on 5/26).**
- **CLOSE BEHIND:** Philadelphia came from behind to win 3-2 yesterday, improving to 19-7 in one run games, the best winning percentage in baseball in such contests ... It also marked the club's 28<sup>th</sup> come-from-behind victory, tied for their 4<sup>th</sup>-most ever before the All-Star break (longer: 30 in 1977, 29 in 2001, 29 in 2004).
- **WHAT A RELIEF:** In the last six games, the Phillies bullpen has allowed 3 ER in 27.1 IP (0.99 ERA), held opponents to a .206 AVG (20-97) and stranded all 9 inherited runners, despite pitching at least 6.1 innings in 3 of those games ... The Phillies bullpen tossed 15.1 straight scoreless innings from the 7<sup>th</sup> inn. on 6/30 vs WSH through the 3<sup>rd</sup> inn. of Friday's game ... Over the last six games (since 6/30), despite having the 9<sup>th</sup>-highest innings pitched in that span, no team's bullpen has a lower ERA ... The Phillies rank 6<sup>th</sup> in the NL in save percentage (70.3 %, 26-37), doing so with eight different pitchers (Hector Neris, Seranthony Dominguez, Jake Thompson, Victor Arano, Luis Garcia, Tommy Hunter, Adam Morgan, Edubray Ramos) ... It is the first time they have had eight players with a save in a season since 2007, when they tied a franchise record with nine players recording a save.
- **WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 12 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3<sup>rd</sup>, 18.5%), **Cesar Hernandez** (10<sup>th</sup>, 14.8 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (12<sup>th</sup>, 14.5%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.4 %, next-closest: NYY: 10.1 %) and also rank 1<sup>st</sup> in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) and are 2<sup>nd</sup> in walks (340), behind only CIN (345).
- **WALK THE PLANK:** Philadelphia has won six straight games against the Pirates for the first time since winning six straight from 7/8/2006 to 8/17/2007, and have secured their first series win in Pittsburgh since 7/2-4/2013 ... **With a win today, the Phillies will have won seven straight against the Pirates for the first time since 7/6/1995 to 4/10/1996**, and will have their first sweep second consecutive sweep against Pittsburgh and second straight sweep overall ... **If they do sweep the series, it will be their first sweep in Pittsburgh in almost 20 years, with the last coming from 7/10-12/1998 (3-0)** ... With a 6-0 record against Pittsburgh this season, Philadelphia is one of four teams to have gone 6-0 or better against a single opponent (BOS 6-0 vs LAA, HOU 6-0 vs CWS and WSH 6-0 vs MIA ... The Phillies also have the best winning percentage (.667, 16-8) against NL Central teams this year (min. 10 games against).
- **WHEELS UP:** Today marks the third game of an 11-game, 10-day, four-city road trip that will take the Phillies to PIT (3 games), NYM (4 games), BAL (1 game) and MIA (3 games) leading into the All-Star break ... The trip features both a doubleheader (6/9 at NYM) and a one-game makeup (6/12 at BAL) ... It is the longest road trip of the year in terms of games, and tied for the longest in terms of days (11 day trip from 5/28-6/7) ... **Per Elias, the Phillies have not embarked on a four-city road trip since 8/22-9/4/2005, when they went 6-6 on a 12-game, four-city trip to SF, ARI, NYM and WSH** ... Their last 11-game road trip was 8/31-9/10/2017 to MIA, NYM and WSH.
- **RECORD-BREAKING MARATHON:** Friday night's game, at 4 hours, 30 minutes, was not only the longest 9.0-inning game in Phillies history (previous: 4:13 on 7/6/15 at LAD), but tied for the longest 9.0-inning affair in National League history (other: ARI at COL, 6/24/16), per Elias ... It was two minutes longer than the Phillies longest extra-inning game in 2018, a 13.0-inning, 4 hour, 28-minute win on 7/1 vs WSH... **They saw 236 pitches, the club's most in a 9.0-inning game since 6/13/2008 at STL (241), and most by any ML club since NYY on 7/28/15 at TEX (244), per Elias** ... **Their 17 runs were the club's most they scored on the road in more than 10 years (20 on 6/13/08 at STL) and tied for the club's 10<sup>th</sup>-highest road total ever** ... Philadelphia walked 10 times in the game, the third time they have done so this season (others: 4/17 at ATL, 6/18 at MIL), more such games than any other club.
