The Mariners have a 3.28 ERA (182 ER, 499.0 IP) at Safeco Field this season, which ranks 2nd in the AL/3rd in the Majors in home ERA...trails Tampa Bay (2.95/146 ER, 446.0 IP) and Los Angeles-NL (3.28/176 ER, 483.0 IP).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-team, 7-day, 7-game homestand with the second (1-0) of three games against Houston...will also face Toronto (4 G) this homestand...just concluded a brief 3-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 16 of their last 28 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have also won 23 of their last 42 games, 30 of their last 51, 34 of their last 57, 39 of their last 63 and 41 of their last 67...Seattle is 49-32 in its last 81 games, 54-35 over its last 89 games and 59-39 in its last 98 games...Seattle is 20-17 during the day and 43-26 at night...Seattle is 35-19 at Safeco Field, 28-24 on the road.

- **Whiff - Edwin Díaz** has struck out his first batter faced 24 times this season, tied with Adam Ottavino-COL for most in the Majors...Díaz has struck out his first batter in 45.3% (24x53) of his appearances this season.
- **As Easy as 1-2-3 - Edwin Díaz** retired the Astros in order in the 9th inning last night for his 40th save of the season...in 24 of his 40 saves, he has faced the minimum 3 batters in an outing of exactly 1.0 inning, the most such saves in the Majors...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 17 saves of 1.0 inning and 3 batters faced.
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .360 (32x89) with 21 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 walk and 2 HBP when leading off a game this season...his 32 hits to lead off a game are the most in the Majors.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 41-17 (.707) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 27-14 (.659) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 44-13 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 19-30 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 3 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (56-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining New York-AL (57-0) and Oakland (50-0).
- **Bullpen Bullies - Edwin Díaz** has not allowed an earned run over his last 14.0 innings spanning 14 appearances (6/25-c), while **Alex Colomé** has an active 12.2 scoreless innings streak over 13 games (6/30-c).

TRADE WINDS...the non-waiver trade deadline was today at 1:00 pm PT...since Opening Day, the Mariners have made 6 trades affecting the 40-man roster, including 4 trades in the last 5 days...in those 6 deals, the Mariners have acquired 5 pitchers and 2 position players: LHP **Roenis Elías** (4/23 from BOS), RHP **Alex Colomé** (5/25 from TB), OF **Denard Span** (5/25 from TB), RHP **Sam Tuivailala** (7/27 from STL), LHP **Zach Duke** (7/30 from MIN), RHP **Adam Warren** (7/30 from NYY) and OF **Cameron Maybin** (today from MIA).

THE EDWIN DÍAZ FILE...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his Major League-leading 40th save of the season last night...he becomes the 4th pitcher in single-season club history to notch at least 40 saves, joining Fernando Rodney (48, 2014), Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001) and J.J. Putz (40, 2007)...Díaz has 87 strikeouts this season, 3 shy of setting a single-season career-high; he had 89 strikeouts last season after recording 88 punchouts in his rookie campaign of 2016 (appeared in 49 games after being called up to the Majors in June)...with his next strikeout, Díaz will join Dick Radatz (1962-64 w/BOS) as the only pitchers in Major League history to record at least 88 strikeouts in each of their first 3 seasons while making at least 80 percent of their appearances out of the bullpen.

MANAGERIAL MILESTONE...with last night's win over the Astros, manager **Scott Servais** surpassed Darrell Johnson (226) for 3rd-most managerial wins in club history (see chart at left)...it marked Servais' 227th managerial win; he now trails only Jim Lefebvre (233-253) and Mariners Hall of Famer Lou Piniella (840-711) among all Mariners skippers...since 2016, Servais ranks 5th among all managers with 227 wins, trailing Joe Maddon (256), Dave Roberts (254), Terry Francona (253) and AJ Hinch (252).

SPAN-TASTIC...since joining the Mariners on May 28, **Denard Span** is batting .294 (45x153) with 19 runs, 8 doubles, 2 triples, 4 home runs, 18 RBI, 11 walks, a .333 on-base percentage and a .451 slugging percentage (.784 OPS)...among Mariners with at least 150 plate appearances over that span, he ranks 2nd in slugging, 2nd in OPS and 3rd in batting...in 6 games batting 3rd in the order, Span is batting .385 (10x26) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI...in 18 career games hitting 3rd, he is batting .339 (21x62) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI and 5 walks.

WHAT A RELIEF...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues in saves (42) and holds (78)...since 1973, only 6 clubs have led the Majors in saves and holds in the same season, most recently the 1992 Oakland Athletics...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 40 saves, while **Juan Nicasio** is T9th in MLB with 19 holds, and **Alex Colomé** is T11th with 18 holds.

HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners have the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...Seattle is 35-19 (.648) at Safeco Field...only Boston (.731/38-14), New York-AL (.712/37-15) and Philadelphia (.654/34-18) have a higher winning percentage at their home ballparks...since May 18, the Mariners are 26-9 (.743) at Safeco Field, the 2nd-best home winning percentage in the Majors in that span (Boston, .758/25-8).

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 40 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 87 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 99)...of Díaz's 40 saves, 21 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 12)...his 21 1-run saves are only 2 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 48-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 23-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 21-for-23 in 1-run save opportunities (91.3%) with a 0.77 ERA (2 ER, 23.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 5 walks.

CONNECT FOUR...the Mariners are averaging 3.41 runs-per-game (75 R, 22 G) in the month of July, after posting 4.74 runs-per-game in March/April, 4.07 in May and 4.50 in June...dating back to July 6, the Mariners have been held to 3 or fewer runs in 13 of 17 games, going 7-11 during that span...when the Mariners score at least 4 runs this season, they are 44-13 (.772), which ranks as the 9th-best winning percentage in the Majors when plating 4+ runs...Seattle is 19-30 (.388) when held to 3 or fewer runs, which is 2nd in winning percentage in the Majors when scoring 3 or fewer (Colorado, .390/16-25).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his 40th save of the season in the Mariners 106th team game last night...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Díaz is the 2nd-fastest pitcher ever in the Major Leagues to reach the 40-save plateau in season?...he trails only Francisco Rodriguez, who earned his 40th save in the Angels 98th team game in 2008; Rodriguez finished with a single-season Major League record 62 saves in '08...*ESPN Stats & Info.*

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 22nd start of the season, 27th Mariners start, 260th career appearance (255th career start) and 14th career appearance/11th start vs. Houston today.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University... went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning *Baseball America* First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 18-17 with a 3.99 ERA (117 ER, 264.0 IP) in 44 career games (all starts) in July.

LAST OUTING... did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 3-2 Mariners win vs. San Francisco on July 25...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed 2 runs on 4 hits and 0 walks with 2 strikeouts...held SF scoreless into the 7th inning before a single and an RBI-double put the Giants on the board; runner came around to score after Leake was relieved by Nicasio.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY... 9 of his last 12 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only **James Paxton** (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE... his 3 starts this season of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2-or-fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB and 6/23 at BOS) are T3rd-most in the Majors (8 others), trailing only Trevor Bauer-CLE (4) and Max Scherzer-WAS (4).

GETTING LOOSE... through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .338 (44x130) with a .377 on-base percentage and a .446 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .250 average (93x372) with a .295 OBP and a .438 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE... has exited 15 of his 21 starts with a lead (12 games) or a tie score (3 games)...in 2 of his other 6 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 14-7 in his 21 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE... since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-7 with a 3.83 ERA (68 ER, 160.0 IP) in 26 starts (16 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in innings pitched and quality starts...in 19 of his 26 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 17-9 in Leake starts since his Mariners debut.

STAYING GROUNDED... is ranked 4th in the American League with a ground ball rate of 49.3%, trailing only Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (55.4%), Dallas Keuchel-HOU (54.5%) and Charlie Morton-HOU (50.0%).

TAKING HIS TURN... since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 254 starts, T12th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1574.1).

2017 SEASON RECAP... went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE... made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE... recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE... became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER... has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 91-83 with a 4.00 ERA (699 ER, 1574.1 IP) with 1,062 strikeouts and 371 walks in 259 career games (254 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
