TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 2-game series vs **John Nelson's Tigers** and **Game 2** (0-1) of an 9-game road trip that includes upcoming series at Wsh's **Nationals Park** (4g) and at NYM's **Citi Field** (3g)...the Redlegs came out of the **All-Star break** with a **5-5 homestand** vs the **Pirates** (0-3), **Cardinals** (2-1) and first-place **Phillies** (3-1)...their **4-game series win** was their **first vs Phi** of that length since **9/12-9/14, 1997**...following this trip return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 9-game homestand vs the **Diamondbacks** (3g), **Indians** (3g) and **Giants** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **13-12** all-time vs Det, including a **2-game series sweep** in **June** at **Great American Ball Park**...are visiting **Comerica Park** for the first time since a **2-game series split** in **June 2015**...Cin's **Joey Votto** (8 years) and Det's **Miguel Cabrera** (11) and **Victor Martinez** (8) are 3 of only 5 active players who hit at **least .300** in at **least 8 seasons**...that list also includes LAA's **Albert Pujols** (10) and Sea's **Robinson Cano** (8)...the Reds beat the Tigers, 4 games to 3, in the **1940 World Series** (see media guide **Page 441**)...**Reds vs Tigers** info is on media guide **Page 333**.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: The Reds are **10-4** vs the **American League** (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox, 2-1 at Cle, 0-1 at Det), tied with the **Yankees**, **Brewers** and **Phillies** for fourth-most interleague wins this season (Pit 12, Col 11, Oak 11) and including a **6-game winning streak** vs the **AL** from **4/29-7/2** that ranks as their **longest interleague winning streak**...the Reds have won both of this season's **3-game interleague road series** (2-1 at Min, 2-1 at Cle)...prior to this season hadn't won an interleague road series of at least 3 games and **4-23** in games in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the **Indians** (3g, 8/13-8/15) and **Royals** (2g, 9/25-9/26)...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **148-201** all-time vs the **AL**, at **.424** the **second-lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record** vs the **American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **33-61** vs **AL** (.351)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **45-44** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387** (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: Beginning **6/19** the Reds went **8-2-1** in their **previous 11 series** (22-13, .629) with **2 sweeps** (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs CWS, 1-2 at Chc, 2-1 at Cle, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 vs Pit, 2-1 vs StL, 3-1 vs Phi)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at **Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

REHABBING: **OF Scott Schebler** (sprained AC joint, right shoulder) is 6 games into a rehab assignment at Louisville (6-21, .286, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 4bb, 2k, 2r)...made all 6 of his starts as the Bats' **designated hitter**...in last night's **2-0 win** at **Toledo** he went **3-for-4** with a solo HR off **Tyler Alexander**...suffered the shoulder injury on **7/14** at **StL**, when he ran into the outfield walk while making a catch...the Bats are at **Toledo** again tonight.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (480), **batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.366)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in **on-base percentage** and ranks second in **walks**...**All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett** ranks among the leaders in **hitting** (4th), **RBI** (T9th), **multi-hit games** (35, T5th), **hits** (3rd) and **total bases** (10th)...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** leads the National League in **RBI** and ranks among the leaders in **hitting** (11th), **HR** (T5th), **total bases** (11th), **on-base percentage** (10th), **slugging percentage** (3rd), **hitting with RISP** (.330, 10th), **fewest AB per RBI** (4.2, T1st) and **fewest AB per HR** (14.1, 4th)...**SS José Peraza** leads the National League in **most at bats per strikeout** (9.8) while ranking among the leaders in **hits** (T7th), **stolen bases** (8th) and **overall hitting** (22nd).

TRANSACTIONS: Late Monday night the Reds acquired from the Braves **OF Preston Tucker** (#12), **RHP Lucas Sims** (#39) and **RHP Matt Wisler** (#41) in exchange for **LF Adam Duvall**...**Tucker** join the Reds here mid-game last night, while **Sims** and **Wisler** have been optioned to Class AAA Louisville.

SLAMMING: The Reds and Red Sox are tied for the Major League lead with **9 grand slams**, tying Cin's **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...

the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit 5 in **June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23** vs **Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the **WSox** on **5/16/1953** at **NY**.

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on 5/10 announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...this afternoon is making his 23rd appearance and 21st start of the season and his **39th Major League appearance**...will be the second appearance of the season and his career vs the **Tigers**...in **6 career starts** vs **American League** teams is **2-2, 3.75** (36ip, 30h, 17r, 13er, 13bb, 19k, 7hr)...with **7 quality starts** is tied with **Tyler Mahle** for the staff lead...in the seventh inning of Sat's 6-2 win vs Phi made his second relief appearance of the season, retired his only batter to strand an inherited base runner and preserve the 4-2 lead...made the only other relief appearance of his Major League career in the final game prior to the **All-Star break**...in the fourth inning of that 6-4 loss at StL on 7/15, pitched out of the bullpen for the first time after **35 career starts**...pitched in relief of starter **Anthony DeSclafani**...during the first 3 games of the second half was available out of the bullpen but did not pitch, then started the Reds' sixth game after the **All-Star break**...from **6/12-6/24** produced a career-high **14.2-inning scoreless streak**...in the 10-inning, 5-1 win on **6/12 at KC** threw **8.0 innings**, tying his career high and tying **Homer Bailey** for the most by a Reds pitcher this season.

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow at Wsh will make his 22nd start of the season and 26th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Nationals**...leads the staff with **7 wins** and is tied with **Sal Romano** for the staff lead with **7 quality starts**...from **6/1-7/6** went in the **4-0, 2.04** in the **first winning streak** of his career, tying **Anthony DeSclafani's** and **Matt Harvey's** for the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...leads National League rookies in **wins, starts, innings pitched** and ranks second in **strikeouts** (Jack Flaherty, 111)...ranks second in the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger** (Col's **German Márquez**, 120).

- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Homestand: 10-39 (.256), 5 2b

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.8)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).
- Is hitless in consecutive apps for the first time since 5/24-5/25...hasn't gone hitless in 3 straight games since a 4-game stretch from 5/18-5/20 in the middle of a career-high 0-for-18 skid.
- Beginning 5/26 has reached base safely in 47 of his last 53 apps (69-209, .330, 11 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 24rbi, 9sb, 28r, .455slg, .384obp).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In the batting order hit first (34gs), second (36gs), seventh (22gs) and eighth (8gs).
- Produced 11 hits at StL in the series preceding the All-Star break, tying the club record for most hits over any 3-game span (Vada Pinson vs Mil/Phi, 8/12-8/14, 1959)...Peraza is the only player in Reds history with 11 hits in a 3-game series.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Homestand: 7-38 (.184), 5hr, 9rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Last night doubled in his first plate appearance to snap a season-high 0-for-11 skid.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks second in the National League in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Became only the third Reds batter since 2000 with at least 70 RBI (71) prior to the All-Star break, joining Ken Griffey Jr. in 2000 (72) and Brandon Phillips in 2013 (74).
- Sat vs Phi went 0-for-4, snapping a streak in which he had homered in a career-high 5 straight apps to tie the club record...produced an RBI in 7 of his last 8 apps (10rbi).
- In his last 59 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .310, raising his season BA from .274 (70-226, 10 2b, 1 3b, 17hr, 49rbi, .588slg, .395obp, .982ops)...this stretch includes a pair of career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10), the longest hitting streaks by any Reds batter this season and when snapped were the longest active hitting streaks in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/7/17 is hitting .283 with 29 doubles, 2 triples, 38 HR and 119 RBI (.534slg, .378obp, .912ops).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

12 PRESTON TUCKER, OF

Braves: 62g, .256, 10 2b, 4hr, 22rbi

- When he plays will make his Reds debut...arrived here mid-game last night.
- Was acquired on Mon from the Braves, along with RHP Lucas Sims and RHP Matt Wisler, in exchange for LF Adam Duvall.
- This season made 62 apps for the Braves (.256, 10 2b, 4hr, 22rbi) and 15 apps at Class AAA Gwinnett (.232, 4 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...for Atl, made all 25 starts in LF.
- Made his last appearance Thu vs LAD, pinch hit and doubled in the Braves' 8-2 loss.
- Originally was selected by Hou in the seventh round of the 2012 first-year player draft...was traded to Atl in December 2017 in exchange for cash considerations.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Homestand: 8-28 (.286), 2rbi, 9bb, 3r

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (6-12, .500, 1 2b, 2rbi) and hit safely in 4 of his last 5 apps (8-18, .444, 1 2b, 2rbi).
- Reached base safely in 92 of the 105 apps in which he has a plate appearance...from 5/20-6/12 produced a season-high 20-game on-base streak...current streak is 9g.
- In the Reds' 107 games has made 106 apps and 103 starts...missed his 4 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 5/24 vs Pit and 7/20 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Homestand: 4g, 3gs in RF, 4-12 (.333), 3-run HR

- Was promoted from Louisville on Thu, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- Started 3 of the last 4 games in RF and hit safely in each (4-11, .364, 3-run HR).
- Fri vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- Thu vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
