RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped their fifth straight game as they lost to the Angels, 11-5, on Tuesday night at Angel Stadium of Anaheim. Jeimer Candelario had a pair of hits, including a two-run homer, and drove in three runs, while Nicholas Castellanos and Victor Martinez each added two hits. JaCoby Jones also had a hit and a RBI in the game. Jacob Turner started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing seven runs, five earned, on six hits with one walk and one strikeout in 1.0 inning. The Tigers and Angels conclude their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game and an off day tomorrow, the Tigers return home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Minnesota (August 10-12) and three games vs. Chicago (AL) (August 13-15).

ROSTER MOVES: The Tigers today announced the following roster moves:

- * Placed C John Hicks on the 10-day disabled list, retroactive to August 7, with a right groin strain.
- * Optioned LHP Daniel Stumpf to Triple A Toledo.
- * Recalled C Grayson Greiner and RHP Artie Lewicki from Triple A Toledo.

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits in last night's game to record his team-leading 37th multi-hit effort of the season. Castellanos enters today's game ranked seventh in the American League with 37 multi-hit games. With his two hits last night, Castellanos has now hit safely in 10 straight games vs. the Angels. Over the 10-game streak, Castellanos is batting .395 (17x43) with six runs scored, five doubles, two home runs and five RBI.

HAIL TO THE VICTOR: Victor Alcántara threw 2.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed and one strikeout in last night's game. Alcántara has not allowed a run in nine-of-10 appearances this season, posting a 0.71 ERA (12.2IP/1ER), a 0.87 WHIP and limiting opponents to a .213 (10x47) batting average.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 55th day game of the season (out of 115 games, 47.8%). Detroit has posted a 26-28 (.481) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 21-39 (.350) at night. The Tigers have lost 13 of their last 19 day games.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-5 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Oakland (0-3) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (0-2). Detroit is 18-40 (.310) on the road this season and has lost 20 of its last 25 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .228 (453x1988) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.80 ERA (493.1IP/263ER).

TIGERS AND ANGELS: The Tigers and Angels have split the first six games of their season series. Detroit is looking for its first season series win over Los Angeles (AL) since 2010. The Tigers have lost 30 of its last 42 games vs. the Angels (.286 since September, 2012), their worst winning percentage vs. any team in that time frame. Detroit has not won a series at Angel Stadium of Anaheim since 2009, going 0-7-2 in that stretch. Since 2010, Detroit is 7-23 against the Angels in Anaheim.

WESTWORLD: Detroit is 10-20 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 35 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-82, .364).

ON DECK: Following tomorrow's off day, the Tigers begin a six-game homestand on Friday as they open a three-game series against the Minnesota Twins. Detroit and Minnesota have split their first six games this season, including the Tigers taking two-of-three games in the first series at Comerica Park. Detroit has won the season series over Minnesota in four of the last five seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 47-67 (.412) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,115-1,106 (.502) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks tied for 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

TIGERS TO RETIRE JACK MORRIS' NO. 47 ON SUNDAY:

Following his recent induction to the National Baseball Hall of Fame, the Detroit Tigers are proud to honor Jack Morris by retiring his No. 47 at Comerica Park on Sunday, August 12. There will be a special pregame ceremony prior to that day's game vs. Minnesota. Additionally, the first 10,000 fans in attendance will receive a Jack Morris 1984 replica road jersey. ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his 22nd appearance and 12th start of the season this afternoon in the series finale at Los Angeles (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy did not factor into the decision in his last start on Friday at Oakland, throwing 7.0 shutout innings with one hit allowed, two walks and six strikeouts. Hardy carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning until it was broken up by an infield single from Jed Lowrie.

VS. LOS ANGELES (AL): Hardy has faced the Angels six times in his career, all in relief, posting a 0-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (6.0IP/1ER) and five strikeouts. He made two relief appearances against Los Angeles (AL) last season and had a 5.40 ERA (1.2IP/1ER).

ON THE ROAD: Hardy has pitched in 90 games, including four as a starter, in his career on the road and has a 4-5 record with one save, a 3.72 ERA (104.0IP/43ER) and 92 strikeouts. In 13 road outings, including four starts, this season, Hardy has a 1-2 record with one save, a 2.81 ERA (32.0IP/10ER) and 23 strikeouts.

AT ANGEL STADIUM OF ANAHEIM: Hardy is making his fourth career appearance at Angel Stadium of Anaheim tonight. In three previous outings in Anaheim, Hardy has not allowed a run in 3.2 innings and struck out three.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Hardy has pitched in 47 games, including three starts, in his career against American League West teams and has a 1-1 record with a 2.29 ERA (59.0IP/15ER) and 59 strikeouts. In eight appearances, including three starts, against AL West opponents this season, Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 2.11 ERA (21.1IP/5ER) and 21 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST : Hardy has appeared in 27 games, including one start, in his career during the month of August, posting a 2-0 record with a 2.00 ERA (36.0IP/8ER) and 34 strikeouts.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed three runs-or-less in eight of his 11 starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 4-2 record with a 3.53 ERA (58.2IP/23ER) and 40 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .229 (76x332) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .280 (152x542) against him. In 21 appearances, including 11 starts this season, lefties are hitting .217 (15x69) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .249 (47x189).

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 (11x81) opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

FIRST WIN AS A STARTER: Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann turned in a quality start, but suffered the loss on Saturday at Oakland, allowing two runs on six hits with three walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings.

VS. MINNESOTA/AT COMERICA PARK: Zimmermann has faced the Twins seven times in his career, posting a 3-3 record with a 6.87 ERA (36.2IP/28ER) and 33 strikeouts. He made four starts against Minnesota last season, going 0-3 with an 11.49 ERA (15.2IP/20ER) and nine strikeouts. Zimmermann has made 31 appearances, including 30 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 12-13 record with a 6.15 ERA (165.1IP/113ER) and 115 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Zimmermann is 2-1 with a 3.67 ERA (34.1IP/14ER) and 36 strikeouts.
