TALE OF TWO SEASONS: On 6/28 the Padres found themselves heading into the finale of a four-game series at HOU a season-high tying 22 games under .500 (27-49 through 6/27)...Andrew Cashner was recalled that day to make his first full-fledged start for the Padres and took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before allowing the Astros first hit with one out in the seventh, followed by a two-run homer to give HOU a 2-1 lead...heading into the ninth inning down 3-1 the Padres rallied with a six-run frame, capped off by a game-winning grand slam from Alexi Amarista, his first career grand slam.

• From 6/28 on through the end of the season the Padres posted a 49-37 (.570) record, the fifth-

- best record in the National League and second-best in the NL West, two games behind the Giants.
- From 6/28 through the end of the season, the Padres hit .261 as a team and scored 397 runs in the final 86 games, fifth-most in the NL over that time span.

CHASING GLORY: Named the Padres Most Valuable Player by the San Diego chapter of the BBWAA, Chase Headley had a season to remember...the Padres third baseman finished fifth in National League Most Valuable Player voting following the season...he started 159 of the club's 162 games in 2012, all at third base, hitting .286 on the year...set career-highs in hits (173), HR (31), RBI (115), runs (95), walks (86)

- and tied his career-highs in doubles (31) and stolen bases (17).
 Led the National League with 115 RBI, becoming just the second Padre in history to lead the league in RBI (also, Dave Winfield, 118 in 1979)...his 115 RBI ranked tied with Joe Carter (1990) for seventh-most in a season on the Padres all-time list.
 - Had the 18th 30-homer campaign in Padres history, the 12th different Padre to do so...first Padre to hit 30 homers in a season since Adrian Gonzalez also hit 31 homers in 2010...prior to Gonzalez (who had 30+ homers from 2007-10 for SD), the last Padres to hit 30 homers in a season were Phil Nevin (41) and Ryan Klesko (30) in 2001.
 - Reached base safely (via hit, walk or HBP) in 146 games, setting a new Padres record (previous: 144 games by Tony Gwynn in 1987), per ELIAS.

MR. AUGUST & SEPTEMBER: Headley was named National League Player of the Month by Major League Baseball for both August and September, becoming the first Padre to win Player of the Month since Tony Gwynn in May of 1997 and only the second Padre in team history to win the monthly award twice in one season (Ken Caminiti also won both August and September of 1996).

• In August, Headley hit .306 (33-for-108) with 10 home runs and 31 RBI in 28 games played, lead-

- ing all of MLB with 31 RBI and tying for the lead in home runs...became the second player in club history to lead MLB in both HR and RBI in any calendar month each team played 10 games (also, Caminiti, who led MLB with 14 HR and 38 RBI in August of 1996), per ELIAS. In September, he hit .324 (33-for-102) with nine HR and 30 RBI in 26 games played, becoming the
- only player in Padres history to have two months with 30-or-more RBI, also per ELIAS. After the All-Star Break, hit .308 (89-for-289) with 23 HR and 73 RBI, leading all of MLB in RBI in the second-half and ranking second in HR (1st in NL).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: Yonder Alonso, in his rookie season, started 144 of the Padres 162 games at first base in 2012...at the plate, he hit .273 (150-for-549) with 39 doubles, nine HR, 62 RBI, 47 runs scored and 62 walks for a .348 on-base percentage.

• Led all rookies in MLB with 39 doubles, setting a new Padres club rookie-record...the most doubles

- in a season by a Padre since Brian Giles hit 40 in 2008.

 Also ranked among MLB rookie-leaders with 150 hits (T2nd) and 62 walks (2nd), trailing only Mike Trout (LAA) in both categories.
 Had 10 games with multiple doubles, setting a new Padres record, passing the previous mark of six
- multi-double games in a season by Tony Gwynn (1993) and Adrian Gonzalez (2007)

MAN ON THE RUN: Everth Cabrera became the first Padre in history to lead the National League in SB in a season, stealing 44 bags in 48 attempts, the third-most steals in MLB and fourth-best SB percentage.

- Cabrera was recalled from Triple-A Tucson on 5/17, having gone 15-for-15 in SB attempts for Tucson...was 59-for-63 in SB attempts overall in 2012, including his time with Tucson.
- Was successful on his first 24 SB attempts with San Diego, a Padres franchise-record to start a season...before his first CS of the year on 8/25, had not been caught since September of 2010,
- snapping a streak of 28-straight successful attempts, also a Padres franchise-record.

 His 44 SB in 2012 were the most by a Padre since first base coach Dave Roberts stole 49 in 2006.

LIKE A ROCK: Clayton Richard was unanimously voted the Padres Pitcher of the Year (Clyde McCullough Award) by the San Diego chapter of the BBWAA after going 14-14 with a 3.99 ERA over 33 starts, leading the club with a career-best tying 14 wins and a career-best 218.2 innings pitched...the southpaw finished with the fourth-most innings pitched by any NL pitcher...the Padres won 13 of his final 21 starts as he went 12-7 with a 3.68 ERA from 6/12 through the end of the season.

STRANGLEHOLD: Huston Street was named to the 2012 National League All-Star Team, his first career All-Star selection...the Padres closer was nearly perfect on the season, converting his first 23 save opportunities until the last home game of the season, finishing 23-for-24, the best save percentage in the NL (95.8 %) and second-best in MLB...posted a 1.85 ERA with 47 strikeouts against just 11 walks and 17 hits allowed over 40 games pitched.

VOL-"K"-EZ: Edinson Volquez in his first season with the Padres went 11-11 with a 4.14 ERA and 174 strikeouts over 32 starts, with the Padres 16-16 in his starts...finished with the ninth-lowest opponents batting average (among qualifiers), holding hitters to a .236 mark on the season...in 17 starts at Petco Park he went 6-5 with a 2.95 ERA, including tossing a one-hit shutout on 7/19 vs. HOU.

IN THE PEN: The Padres bullpen featured 19 different pitchers making at least one relief appearance, posting a 3.24 ERA in 2012 with 524 strikeouts in 505.1 innings (9.3 K/9) and a .224 opponents batting average...through the season the pen featured seven rookies, including RHPs Brad Boxberger (2.60 ERA in 24 games), Brad Brach (3.78 ERA in 67 games), Dale Thayer (3.43 ERA in 64 games) and Nick Vincent (1.71 ERA in 27 games)...Luke Gregerson returned from last season to go 2-0 with nine saves and a 2.39 ERA in a club-leading 77 games in 2012, while Joe Thatcher returned to go 1-4 with a 3.41 ERA in 55 outings.

CALL ME MAYBIN: Cameron Maybin set career-highs in games played (147), RBI (45) and tied a careerhigh in walks (44, also 2011)...the Padres CF got off to a slow start this past season, hitting .198 (50-for-252) over his first 71 games from 4/5-6/28 but finished strong by hitting .286 (73-for-255) over his final 76 games from 6/29 through the end of the season.

GRAND ENTRANCE: Yasmani Grandal made his Major League debut for the Padres in 2012 and hit .297 (57-for-192) with 16 extra-base hits and 36 RBI in 60 games played, starting 52 games behind the plate with the Padres 31-21 in his starts...led the club with a .297 average (no minimum).

• In his first career start on 6/30 at COL, he clubbed a pair of home runs for his first career hits...

- switch-hitter became the first player in history to homer from both sides of the plate for his first two career hits in the same game, the second Padre to homer twice in his first career start.
- In fact, Grandal collected home runs for each of his first three career hits, becoming just the seventh player since 1900 to do so and first since Keith McDonald did so for the Cardinals in 2000 and Alfonso Soriano did so for the Yankees in 1999-2000, per ELIAS.

2012 Summary

- Made his first career Opening Day roster for San Diego in 2012.
- Began the season in the bullpen, making two relief appearances in the first week before making his first start of the season on 4/12 vs. ARI. Went 1-2 with a 2.31 ERA (6 ER/23.1 IP) over his first four starts, all in April.
- Was 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (43 ER/80.1 IP) and a .255 (78-for-306) opponents batting average over his first 14 starts from 4/12-6/20 after joining the rotation and before landing on the 15-day DL on 6/24 with right shoulder inflammation.
- On the DL from 6/24-9/4, having been transferred to the 60-day DL on 7/31. Made three rehab starts for Triple-A Tucson from 8/23-9/2 before being reinstated from the DL.
- Returned from the DL on 9/4 to join the bullpen, making seven relief appearances from 9/7-28, posting a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) in that stretch. Earned his first career save in his first career opportunity on 9/20 at ARI, striking out his only batter faced to end the game. Posted a 1-1 record with a 3.52 ERA (15 ER/38.1 IP) in seven starts at Petco Park in 2012, with the Padres 3-4 in those starts.

- Made his 15th and final start of the season on 10/2 at MIL.
- Posted a 2.63 ERA (4 ER/13.2 IP) in nine total relief outings overall in 2012. Had the first complete game of his career on 4/28 at SF, taking the loss after working 8.0 innings of two-run ball...took a perfect game into the sixth inning of that start before allowing the first hit of the game to opposing pitcher Tim Lincecum, an infield single.

- Held right-handed hitters to a .208 (11-for-53) average while holding lefties to a .239 (11-for-46) average for San Diego
- Posted a 1.45 ERA (1 ER/6.1 IP) with eight strikeouts against seven walks in his first five career outings before being optioned back to Tucson on 6/26.
- Recalled for his second stint on 7/30 and posted a 5.00 ERA (5 ER/9.0 IP) with 12 strikeouts against six walks over eight outings before being optioned back to Tucson on 8/22.
- Recalled the next day on 8/23 and optioned back to Tucson on 8/26 without making an appearance.
- Recalled for his fourth and final time on 9/4, posting a 1.46 ERA (2 ER/12.1 lp) and 13 strikeouts against five walks over his final 11 outings

- Held right-handed hitters to a .188 (28-for-149) average while lefties hit .239 (22-for-92) off him for San Diego.
- Allowed 11 home runs on the season, tied for third-most among NL relievers.
- Went 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER/5.1 IP) in five outings to start the year before being optioned back to Tucson on 4/16.

- Allowed seven home runs total on the year, with five of those coming in a 19-game stretch from 5/14-6/25 in which he posted a 5.19 ERA (10 ER/17.1 IP)...following that span, went on to post a 1.17 ERA (5 ER/38.1 IP) and a .190 (27-for-142) opponents average from 6/26 through the end of the season.
- Recorded 72 strikeouts in his 71.2 innings pitched for a 9.0 K/9, the second-most strikeouts among Padre relievers in 2012.

At the plate, collected his first Major League hit in his debut with a single.
- Earned his second career victory on 9/15 vs. COL in his fourth Big League start, working 6.0 innings that day, allowing three runs, two earned. Missed time in the minors in 2012 from 4/12-7/23 due to a right elbow injury...began rehab stint with Rookie-Level Peoria on 7/23, making three starts for Peoria from 7/23-8/4.
- After being reinstated from the DL in the minors, made three starts for Double-A San Antonio before being selected by the Padres on 8/27.
- Including his rehab starts, made eight starts total in the minors in 2012, going 0-2 with a 3.35 ERA (14 ER/37.2 IP) and 39 strikeouts against just three walks over those eight starts.

- Did not allow a run over his first 11 appearances and 8.2 innings pitched from 8/14-31, striking out 14 batters while allowing just two hits and one walk over that stretch.
- Earned his first career save in his first opportunity on 8/22 vs. PIT, saving the game for LHP Andrew Werner's first career victory, who made his Major League debut with a start that day.
