**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees wrap up their seven-game road trip tonight at Chicago-AL...are 2-4 so far, winning the first two in Chicago after being swept in 4G at Boston...return to New York tomorrow to begin a season-long 11-game homestand, with 4G vs. Texas (Thurs.-Sun.), 1G vs. the Mets (Mon.), 3G vs. Tampa Bay (8/14-16) and 3G vs. Toronto (8/17-19).

- ▶ Have won two consecutive games after a season-long five-game losing streak.
- ▶ At 70-42 (.625), have the Majors' third-most wins and third-best record behind Boston (80-34, .702) and Houston (73-42, .635)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 97 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Marks their fewest games needed to record their 70th win since starting 70-39 in 2004.
- ▶ Are 28G over .500...are 2-5 since reaching their season high watermark of 31G over at the end of play on 7/31...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are 9.0G behind first-place Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Have lost just five of their last 33 series, going 22-5-6 since 4/19 (incl. this series)...are 61-33 in their last 94G...are 8-10 in their last 18 games.
- ▶ Are 51-9 (.850) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 43-6 (.878) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 3-5 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the White Sox, 4-3, in 13 innings on Tuesday...**LHP CC Sabathia** recorded 12K in 5.2IP (4H, 1ER, 3BB) but took a no-decision...**Yankees pitchers** recorded 20K, reaching the mark in a game for the second time in franchise history...**DH Miguel Andújar** (3-for-5, 1HP) hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh and a go-ahead RBI single in the 13th...**RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-6) hit a go-ahead two-run HR in the 10th before Chicago tied it in the bottom half...**RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 1K), **RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 3K) and **RHP Jonathan Holder** (1.0IP, 1BB) each worked a scoreless inning.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters have hit 2HR in each of the series first 2G after recording just three multi-hit efforts in their first 15G after the All-Star break.

- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 179HR...are on pace to hit 259HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Six Yankees have hit at least 15HR this season: Aaron Judge (26), Giancarlo Stanton (26), Didi Gregorius (20), Aaron Hicks (18), Gleyber Torres (18), Miguel Andújar (15)...the Dodgers are the only other team with six 15HR hitters.
- ▶ Rank second in the Majors in runs (575), runs per game (5.13), SLG (.452), OPS (.782) and XBH (396).

**50/50:** The Yankees are one of two Major League clubs (Boston) that have six-or-more hitters with at least 50RBI this season: Giancarlo Stanton (69), Didi Gregorius (66), Aaron Judge (61), Gleyber Torres (52), Aaron Hicks (50), Miguel Andújar (50).

- ▶ Despite the Yankees ranking second in the Majors in runs scored, Stanton's 69RBI are tied for just the 13th-most among players who lead their team...just one Yankee has reached the 100RBI mark in a season since 2014 (Judge-114 in 2017) after the team had at least one 100RBI player in 18 consecutive seasons from 1996-2013.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** 2B Gleyber Torres and 3B Miguel Andújar are the first pair of Yankees rookies to hit at least 15HR in the same season...Torres ranks second among MLB rookies with 18HR and Andújar is fourth with 15HR.

**DELLIN DONUTS:** RHP Dellin Betances has allowed just 1R in 26.0IP (0.35 ERA, 8H, 13BB, 46K, 4HP) over 27 appearances since 5/27...opponents are hitting .096 (8-for-83) in that span.

- ▶ His current streak of 26 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K (since 5/29) is the second-longest in Yankees history, behind Andrew Miller's streak of 28G from 5/6-7/17/16...has at least 1K in 44-of-46 appearances this season.

**20K LEAGUES UNDER CC:** Led by 12K from CC Sabathia, **Yankees pitchers** recorded 20K in 13.0IP on Tuesday at Chicago-AL...marked just the second time in franchise history that they reached at least 20K in a game; tied a Major League record with 26K in 18.0IP on 5/7/17 at Chicago-NL.

- ▶ Have a 9.99 K/9.0IP ratio (1122K/1,010.1IP), which would be the third-highest single-season figure in Major League history, behind the 2018 Astros (10.59) and 2017 Indians (10.08)...have struck out 26.6% of batters faced.
- ▶ With 31K over the first 2G of this series, need at least 9K tonight to reach 40K in a three-game series for the fourth time in franchise history: 42K from 5/5-7/17 at Chicago-NL, 40K from 6/17-19/08 vs. San Diego, 40K from 5/17-19/02 vs. Minnesota.
- ▶ Have 48K in 31.2IP over the last three games.

**CC DOZ' IT:** **LHP CC Sabathia** recorded 12K in 5.2IP (4H, 1ER, 3BB) on Tuesday at Chicago-AL...at 38 years, 17 days, became the second-oldest pitcher in Yankees history to collect at least a dozen strikeouts in a single game, joining Roger Clemens, who had 13K twice, on 6/3/02 vs. Baltimore (39 years, 303 days) and 5/19/02 vs. Minnesota (39 years, 288 days).

- ▶ Marked his sixth career game with at least 12K, his first since 8/17/16 vs. Toronto (L, 6.0IP, 7ER, 12K).
- ▶ With his strikeout of Tim Anderson in the fifth inning, surpassed Mike Mussina (2,813) for fifth place on the American League strikeout list.
- ▶ Has 2,945 career strikeouts and needs 55K to become the 17th member of the 3,000-strikeout club.

**BRIGHT LIGHTS, MIG'S CITY:** 3B Miguel Andújar hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning and a go-ahead RBI single in the 13th inning on Tuesday at Chicago-AL.

- ▶ Is the first Yankee with multiple go-ahead/game-tying hits in the seventh inning or later since Gary Sánchez on 6/15/17 at Oakland (game-tying double in seventh, game-tying single in ninth)...is the first Yankees rookie to accomplish the feat since Bernie Williams on 10/5/91 vs. Cleveland (go-ahead single in seventh, game-tying single in ninth).
- ▶ Was tied for the latest go-ahead hit by a Yankees rookie since Mike Blowers hit a two-run single in the 15th inning on 6/22/90 at Toronto (Brett Gardner also hit a "walk-off" single in the 13th inning on 8/16/08 vs. Kansas City).
- ▶ Is 4-for-8 with 2 doubles in extra innings this season...are the third-most extra-inning hits by a Yankees rookie since 1974, behind Derek Jeter (5-for-8 in 1996) and Willie Randolph (5-for-19 in 1976).

**STANTON ISLAND:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** has four multi-hit games in 6G this road trip, batting .320 (8-for-25) with 5R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI and 2BB.

- ▶ His 26HR are the most by a Yankee in his first season with the team since 2009, when Mark Teixeira hit 39HR and Nick Swisher hit 29HR.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees have clinched their first road series win since taking 2-of-3 at Toronto from 7/6-8 snapping a four-series drought (0-2-2).

- ▶ Are 8-2-2 in 12 road series outside the AL East, with the only losses coming on 5/15 at Washington (0-1) and 5/21-13 at Texas (1-2).
- ▶ A win tonight would give them their second road series sweep of at least 3G this season (4/27-29 at Los Angeles-AL).
- ▶ Have not won more than two consecutive road games since going 4-0 from 6/5-9.

**CENTRAL PERK:** The Yankees are 18-5 (.783) vs. the AL Central this season, the highest winning percentage of any AL team against an AL division this season (next-best: Oakland, 21-6, .778 vs. AL Central)...are 22-5 in their last 27G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 44-18 (.710) outside the AL East and 26-24 (.520) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ Are 77-44 (.636) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, the highest winning pct. by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 23-8-5 in 36 series over the span (min. 2G).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 8, 1972:** The Yankees sign a 30-year lease to play in the remodeled Yankee Stadium, with completion scheduled in 1976.

**Aug. 8, 1958:** A Jehovah's Witnesses convention draws a single-day Yankee Stadium-record 123,707 people.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 9, 2015:** The Yankees are blanked by Toronto in Yankee Stadium for the second straight day, ending a streak of 2,665 straight games without being shut out in consecutive games, a Major League record.

**Aug. 9, 2014:** The Yankees hold "Paul O'Neill Day," honoring him with a Monument Park plaque.

**Aug. 9, 1919:** Ralph Houk is born in Lawrence, Kansas. He played eight seasons as a backup catcher with the Yankees (1947-54), then managed the club for 11 seasons (1961-63, '66-73), winning World Series titles in 1961 and '62.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (14-5, 3.08 ERA)

**RHP Luis Severino** will make his 24th start of the season in tonight's finale at Chicago-AL...the 24-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...took the loss in his last start on Friday at Boston (5.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR)...has lost three straight starts for the first time since losing six straight from 4/26-8/14/16...on 7/23 at Tampa Bay, became just the third Yankees pitcher to reach 500K prior to his 25th birthday...**his career-high-tying 14 wins are tops in the AL and second-most in the Majors behind Washington's Max Scherzer (15)**...his 3.08 ERA is eighth-lowest in the AL...is seventh in the AL and 10th in the Majors with 159K...did not earn his 14th win in 2017 until his 31st start and his final start of the season (9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...**the Yankees are 18-5 in his starts, the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018**...was named to his second career All-Star Game and tossed a scoreless second inning (1H, 2K)...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

**LAST START:** Lost his third straight start on Friday at Boston (5.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR)...allowed three first-inning runs after giving up just 6R in the first inning in 22 previous starts this season...gave up a first-inning two-run home run to Pearce, setting a new career high with five straight starts allowing at least 1HR (7HR total)...also allowed a run-scoring single to Nunez in the first...gave up one run in the fifth on a Moreland single...threw a season-high 115 pitches...has not completed 6.0IP in any of his last five starts after completing 6.0IP in 14 of his last 17 starts...his five straight starts of less than 6.0IP is tied for the second-longest streak of his career (6GS from 5/13/16-4/7/17).

**THE WIN IS IN:** Has tied his career high with 14 wins (14-6 in 2017), all prior to the All-Star break...is tied for the AL lead in wins and is tied for second in the Majors (Max Scherzer-15)...the Yankees are 18-5 in his starts, the most *team wins* started by one pitcher in 2018.

- ✦ Is 0-3 in his last three starts, this after going 32 consecutive starts from 7/20/17-7/7/18) without going winless in consecutive starts.
- ✦ Did not earn his 14th win in 2017 until his 31st start and his final start of the season (9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay).
- ✦ His 14 wins match the most in a season by a Yankees pitcher since 2013...the last Yankees pitcher to record more than 14 wins in a season was Phil Hughes (16-13), Hiroki Kuroda (16-11) and CC Sabathia (15-6) in 2012.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** During his four-start winless streak, opponents are 9-for-16 (.563) with 3BB and 2HR with RISP...had hit .150 (12-for-80) in his first 19 starts of the season...overall, carries a .219 opponents' BA with RISP.

**ROAD RULES:** Is 6-4 with a 3.80 ERA (73.1IP, 31ER) in 12 road starts this season...his six road wins are tied for ninth-most in the Majors...has thrown at least 5.0IP in each of his last 27 regular season road starts since the start of 2017...has allowed at least 1HR in each of his last four road starts (7HR total) after permitting just 2HR total in his first eight road starts.

- ✦ Is 10-4 with a 2.76 ERA (114.0IP, 99H, 38R/35ER, 29BB, 127K, 11HR, 2HP) in 18 road starts since the 2017 All-Star break.
- ✦ Recorded only 5K on 7/7 at Toronto, snapping a streak of 23 road starts with at least 6K (4/7/17-6/26/18)...**was the fourth-longest streak in Major League history**...was triple the length of the next-longest streak in Yankees history (eight, by Roger Clemens and Melido Perez).
