PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM

• The Colorado Rockies begin a two-city, six-game road trip today with the first of three contests at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park ... the Rockies go to Texas next for another foray into Interleague play.

SOMEBODY'S GOTTA PAY

• The Rockies have dropped four straight games and eight of the past 10 ... are 11-18 since May 9 ... went 15-11 in May ... Colorado is below .500 for the first time since April 11 (6-7).
• Colorado is 11-6 the past 17 road games and 21-14 on the road overall ... the Rockies have dropped seven straight at home and are 11-19 in Denver.
• Colorado on Sunday wrapped up a stretch of 12 of 15 home games (5-10).

LONG TIME NO SEE

• Colorado has won six of the past 10 games here in Philadelphia since 2015 ... the Rockies are 19-30 at Citizens Bank Park since it opened in 2004.
• Colorado was 5-2 vs. the Phillies in 2017, 3-1 here and 2-1 in Denver.
• In 49 games, Carlos González is a lifetime .365 hitter (65-for-178) vs. Philadelphia ... that's the third-best average among active players with 150 or more plate appearances against the Phillies ... he hit safely in all seven games vs. Philadelphia last year (.467; 14-for-30) and has a hit in 14 of the past 16 games ... he is 28-for-82 (.341) at Citizens Bank Park.
• Charlie Blackmon has hit safely in 13 of his past 14 games (.410; 25-for-61) vs. the Phillies since 2016 ... he hit safely in six of the seven games against Philadelphia last year (.367; 11-for-30) ... has three career multi-home run games at Citizens Bank Park, including three home runs Aug. 12, 2016.
• Ian Desmond's 52 RBI vs. the Phillies rank 17th among active players ... Desmond played for Washington from 2009-15.

ROAD IS WHERE THE HEART IS

• Entering the six-game trip, the Rockies' 35 road games are tied for the sixth-most in MLB and rank fourth in the National League ... their 21 road wins are tied for the most in the NL and tied for third in the Majors ... the team's .600 road winning percentage is eighth in MLB and third in the NL.
• The Rockies' road ERA (3.74) ranks fifth in the National League.

PHONE HOME

• The Rockies have lost seven consecutive home games, their longest home losing streak since losing seven straight April 23-May 10, 2016 ... have been outscored 69-37 over that span ... it's tied for the third-longest losing streak in Denver.
• Overall, the Rockies are tied for 26th in MLB and tied for last in the NL with 11 home victories (11-19) ... their .367 home winning percentage is 14th in the league ... Colorado has yet to play over .500 in any of their homestands in '18.

JUST A BUMP IN THE ROAD

• The Rockies are 6-9 over their last 15 games, winning three out of five series ... the bullpen has gone 1-7 over that span with a 6.87 ERA (56.1 IP, 43 ER).
• In six of the Rockies' past nine losses, the team has had the lead entering the sixth inning.
• The Rockies lead the National League with 19 losses after leading, third-most in MLB.

THE HITS KEEP COMING

• Colorado has recorded eight or more hits in 15 consecutive games, the club's longest such streak since a string of 16 in 1997 ... have recorded double-digit hits in 10 of those 15 games.
• The Rockies have allowed double-digit hits in 12 consecutive games, the longest streak in franchise history ... it's the longest streak in the Majors since 2006 (12, Los Angeles-NL).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

• Both Sam Howard and Jerry Vasto made their Major League debuts Sunday vs. Arizona ... it was the first time in franchise history two pitchers made their big league debuts in the same game.

BE FIRST

• Colorado's 59 runs in the first inning lead the Majors with Kansas City second at 49 ... have hit a Major League-leading 19 homers in the first inning.
• Nolan Arenado leads the Majors with 17 RBI in the first inning while ranking tied for second with six first-inning home runs ... Trevor Story's 16 first-inning RBI are second-most in the Majors.
• Among NL leaders in the first inning in batting average, DJ LeMahieu (.417) ranks second and Trevor Story (.385) sixth (20 PA minimum).

LONG DISTANCE

• A total of 43 of the Rockies' 78 home runs have come on the road, the fourth-most in the NL and tied for ninth in MLB ... Colorado's 78 home runs are tied for fourth in the NL.
• Charlie Blackmon's 11 road home runs rank tied for third in MLB and are second in the NL ... Ian Desmond's eight road home runs are tied for fifth in the NL.

MEN OF IRON AND LEATHER

• Colorado and Arizona are tied for first in the National League with .991 fielding percentages ... Houston leads the Majors at .992 ... the Rockies have committed the fewest errors in the NL at 22, the second-fewest in MLB behind the Astros (20).

STEADY AS SHE GOES

• The Rockies and the Houston Astros are the only two teams in the Major Leagues that have used the same five starting pitchers all season.

REACH FOR THE STARS

• Nolan Arenado's on-base streak ended Saturday at 20 games ... has reached base safely 93.3 percent of his games this year (56 of 60), the highest percentage among NL batters with at least 60 games played.
• Had his season long 24-game on-base streak snapped on May 15 ... started his next streak the following day ... overall, they are the second and third longest streaks of his career.

NEW ERA

• Chad Bettis (2.03) and German Márquez (2.06) rank second and fourth, respectively, in the National League in road ERA.

STORYBOOK SEASON

• Trevor Story is tied for second in the National League lead with 47 RBI and is tied for fourth in the league with 14 home runs ... is batting .312 (29-for-93) since May 15, hitting safely in 18 of 23 games ... also hit in seven of nine games in June, batting .361 this month (13-for-36).

BEARD IS THE NEW BLACK

• Charlie Blackmon has hit safely in 16 of his past 17 games (.341; 26-for-76) since May 22.

GRAY DAY

- Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his 14th start of the season, his seventh on the road.
Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona on March 29, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017 ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De La Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years.

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned his sixth win of the season at Cincinnati on June 6 ... pitched five innings, allowing three runs on seven hits with three walks and five strikeouts.
Has pitched five or more innings in four of six road starts this season with the team going 3-1 over those starts.

DEAL OR NO DEAL

- Has received a decision in 12 of his 13 starts this season ... has posted a 10.13 ERA (32.0 IP, 36 ER) in his seven losses and a 1.89 ERA (38.0 IP, 8 ER) in his six wins ... has pitched at least six innings in five of six wins, going seven innings three times.

STREAKY

- Is 2-2 with a 8.49 ERA (23.1 IP, 22 ER), 11 walks and 32 strikeouts over his last five games, May 13-June 6 ... did not factor in the decision for the first time this season on May 30 vs. the Giants.
Won three consecutive games April 25-May 8 ... during the streak, allowed one run across 20 innings (0.45 ERA) with three walks and 25 strikeouts ... limited opponents to a .147 batting average (10-for-68) ... left-handers batted .071 (2-for-28) while right-handers hit .200 (8-for-40).
Prior to allowing three runs in the second inning May 13 vs. Milwaukee, had not allowed a run in 14.0 innings (May 1-13), the longest scoreless string by a Rockies pitcher this year.

HEY PHILLIE

- Will be making his fourth career start against Philadelphia, his second at Citizens Bank Park.
Took the loss in his lone start at Philadelphia, Aug. 12, 2016, a 10-6 Rockies loss ... allowed seven runs (six earned) on six hits with four walks and six strikeouts over 4.1 innings pitched.
Over three career starts is 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA (17.2 IP, 9 ER), seven walks and 18 strikeouts.

A PERFECT 10

- Has fanned 10 or more batters 10 times in his career, twice this year ... only Pedro Astacio (15) and Ubaldo Jimenez (10) have that many games with double-digit strikeouts in Rockies history.
Four of his double-digit strikeout games have come against the Padres.

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- His 418 career strikeouts are ninth in franchise history, 52 from tying Brian Fuentes (470) for eighth-most ... ranks eighth among all-time Rockies starters in strikeouts.
His 9.67 strikeouts per nine innings and 3.34 strikeout to walk ratio are the best in franchise history among pitchers with at least 20 starts.

I'M A FAN

- His strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68 ranks 12th in the National League ... has struck out 81 while walking 22 ... ranks eighth in the NL with 81 strikeouts and 10.41 strikeouts per nine innings.
Ranks ninth in the NL with a 3.12 FIP and seventh in the NL with 1.7 WAR (Fangraphs).
His .379 batting average on balls in play is the highest in the Major Leagues ... the next highest BABIP is .346 (Andrew Cashner).

THOSE WHO WANDER

- Has made six starts on the road in 2018, going 3-3 with a 4.73 ERA (32.1 IP, 17 ER) ... tossed seven shutout innings at San Diego on April 4.
Overall, in 37 starts on the road, has gone 11-15 with a 4.39 ERA (201.0 IP, 98 ER), 75 walks and 219 strikeouts ... Rockies are 13-24.
Is 8-6 with 4.12 ERA (89.2 IP, 41 ER) in his past 16 road starts with the Rockies 8-8.

#COORS

- Is 3-3 with a 6.45 ERA (37.2 IP, 27 ER), 13 walks and 49 strikeouts in seven starts at Coors Field.
In 34 career starts at Coors Field, has gone 15-7 with a 4.88 ERA (188.0 IP, 102 ER) ... his .682 winning percentage at home is the fifth-best mark in franchise history (min. 20 starts) ... the Rockies are 19-15.
In 26 starts at Coors Field since May 13, 2016, has gone 15-6 with a 4.08 ERA (158.2 IP, 72 ER), 41 walks and 172 strikeouts ... the Rockies have gone 17-10 in his home starts over that span.

MAY DAY

- Finished May 2-3 with a 5.57 ERA (32.1 IP, 20 ER), 10 walks and 41 strikeouts ... the Rockies were 3-3 over his six starts.

Left-hander will make his 14th start of the season, ninth on the road ... did not factor in the Rockies extra innings loss his last time out at Great American Ballpark on June 7 ... pitched seven innings, allowing two runs on five hits with one walk and five strikeouts ... will make his fourth career start against the Phillies, third at Citizen's Bank Park ... in two starts at Philadelphia is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (10.0 IP, 5 ER), four walks and nine strikeouts ... overall in three career starts against the Phillies, is 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA (16.0 IP, 7 ER), four walks and 15 strikeouts ... in eight road starts this season, is 2-0 with a 4.58 ERA (39.1 IP, 20 ER), 15 walks and 35 strikeouts ... over 24 road games, 23 starts is 5-7 with a 4.94 ERA (120.1 IP, 66 ER), 38 walks and 107 strikeouts.
