RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered their second consecutive loss last night as they dropped a 2-1 decision to the Indians. With the game tied 1-1 in the eighth inning, Roberto Pérez led off the frame with a solo home run, which ended up being the game-winning tally. Jeimer Candelario had three doubles and a RBI in the loss, while Miguel Cabrera, Niko Goodrum and Victor Reyes each added one hit. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and did not factor in the decision, allowing a run on three hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 7.0 innings. Alex Wilson was saddled with the loss after giving up a run on one hit with two strikeouts in 1.0 inning. The Tigers continue their four-game series against the Indians tonight. Following the series vs. Cleveland, the Tigers return home for a 10-game homestand, which includes three games vs. New York (AL) (April 13-15), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

YEAH, BOYD: Matthew Boyd tossed 7.0 innings in last night's game, allowing just one run on on three hits with one walk and four strikeouts. In each of his first two starts this season, Boyd has thrown 6.0 innings-or-more and allowed one run-or-less, becoming the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher to do so since Kenny Rogers in 2007. In his last six starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has compiled a 2.09 ERA (38.2IP/9ER) with 26 strikeouts.

START ME UP: With Matthew Boyd's performance last night, Tigers starting pitchers have combined for a 2.93 ERA (58.1IP/19ER), which ranks fourth in the American League (see chart below). Detroit starters have allowed two runs-or-less in each of the last four games.

THE CANDY MAN CAN: Jeimer Candelario established a single-game career high with three doubles and tied a career high with three hits in last night's game. He became the first Tigers player to have three doubles in a game since J.D. Martinez on June 14, 2016 at Chicago (AL). Candelario has four doubles on the season, ranking tied for eighth in the American League.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: First baseman Miguel Cabrera is within striking distance of two Hall of Famer's on MLB's all-time hits list. He is currently only one hit shy of tying Jimmie Foxx for 78th place, and nine shy of Ted Williams for 77th (see chart below):

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS: Victor Reyes notched his first Major League hit last night with a single off Tyler Olson to lead off the seventh inning. Later in the inning, Reyes recorded his first Major League stolen base and run scored. Reyes was selected by the Tigers in the Major League phase of the 2017 Rule 5 Draft.

IGGY VS. CARRASCO: José Iglesias has had success in his career against tonight's Indians starter, Carlos Carrasco. Entering tonight's game, Iglesias is hitting .360 (9x25) with five doubles and a RBI vs. Carrasco. Among active players with at least 20 at-bats vs. Carrasco, Iglesias ranks fourth with a .448 on-base percentage, while he is tied for fifth with a .360 batting average and seventh with a .560 slugging percentage.

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers have dropped the first two games of the season series to the Indians and have now lost nine straight games to Cleveland dating back to September 1, 2017. Detroit went 6-13 against the Indians last season, including a 3-6 record at Progressive Field. The Tigers have struggled at Progressive Field in recent seasons, going 5-15 since the start of the 2016 season.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 3-2 on their first road trip of the season after sweeping three games against the White Sox and losing the first two games to the Indians. Detroit went 30-51 (.370) away from Comerica Park last season.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with an 4-6 (.400) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,045 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers successfully challenged a call in the second inning of last night's game and are now a perfect 5-for-5 in replay challenges this season. Among teams that have challenged three-or-more plays this season, the Tigers are one of only four clubs to have a 100% success rate, joining Chicago (AL), Kansas City and San Francisco.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his third start of the season tonight at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann received a no decision in his last start on Thursday at Chicago (AL), allowing six runs on nine hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 4.1 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Zimmermann has faced the Indians five times in his career and has a 0-4 record with a 10.88 ERA (22.1IP/27ER) and 18 strikeouts. He made three starts vs. Cleveland last season and went 0-3 with a 9.22 ERA (13.2IP/14ER) and nine strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Zimmermann has started 108 career games on the road and has posted a 38-36 record with a 3.79 ERA (652.2IP/275ER) and 551 strikeouts. In 15 road starts last season, Zimmermann was 3-6 with a 5.53 ERA (83.0IP/51ER) and 55 strikeouts.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Zimmermann will be making his third career start at Progressive Field tonight. In his previous two starts in Cleveland, Zimmermann is 0-1 with a 12.38 ERA (8.0IP/11ER) and eight strikeouts.

RECORD IN APRIL: Zimmermann has had success in his career during the month of April, compiling a 20-10 record with a 3.29 ERA (229.2IP/84ER) and 152 strikeouts. Among active pitchers with at least 30 career starts during the month, Zimmermann's 3.29 ERA ranks ninth. He had five April starts last season and was 3-1 with a 6.18 ERA (27.2IP/19ER) and 16 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (669x2616) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .269 (715x2656) against him. In 29 starts last season, righties hit .304 (98x322) vs. Zimmermann, while lefties had a .322 (106x329) batting average.

KEEPIN' IT 1,000: Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 50 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann leads all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.93 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

ABOUT MICHAEL: Fulmer will make his third start of the season tomorrow night in the series finale at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer earned his first win of the season on Saturday at Chicago (AL), throwing 5.1 shutout innings with six hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Fulmer has faced the Indians five times in his career and has a 2-2 record with a 6.04 ERA (25.1IP/17ER) and 15 strikeouts. He picked up the win in his only start vs. Cleveland last season on July 9, tossing 6.0 innings and giving up three runs, two earned, on seven hits with one walk and one strikeout. In four career starts at Progressive Field, Fulmer has posted a 2-2 record with a 5.73 ERA (22.0IP/14ER) and 12 strikeouts.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Fulmer allowed just 13 home runs in 164.2 innings pitched last season, leading the American League with 0.71 home runs allowed per nine innings. Fulmer posted a homerless streak of 73.2 innings during the season.
