AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 3-0 on their nine-game homestand after sweeping a 3G series vs. Cleveland...begin a 3G series vs. Boston tonight (through Thurs.) and finish with 3G vs. Oakland (Fri.-Sun.)...following this homestand, begin an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Have won six straight games, **the Majors' longest active winning streak**...are a season-high 14G over .500.
- ▶ At 24-10 (.706), **own the second-best record in the Majors** (Boston 25-9, .735)...trail Boston in the AL East by 1.0G, matching their smallest deficit since the close of play on 4/4.
- ▶ After a 9-9 start, are 15-1 in their last 16G, reducing their division deficit from a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston is 8-7 in this span).
- ▶ **Marks their best 34-game start since starting 25-9 in 2003** and is tied for their third-best start over the last 60 seasons since 1959 (also 26-8 in 1998 and 24-10 in 1994).
- ▶ Have a +62 run differential, third-best in the Majors (Houston, +77; Boston, +67).
- ▶ Yesterday's off day was their first since 4/18...went 16-2 in between days off.
- ▶ Just completed a stretch of 14 straight games outside the AL East (since 4/23), going 13-1...are 9-8 vs. the AL East and 15-2 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ This marks their third consecutive series against an AL division leader at the time (Houston, Cleveland, Boston).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees won their sixth straight game on Sunday vs. Cleveland, erasing a 4-0 eighth-inning deficit to win in "walk-off" fashion, 7-4...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4) hit a "walk-off" three-run HR in the ninth, becoming the youngest player in franchise history (21 years, 144 days) to hit a "walk-off" home run...**RHP Domingo Germán** made his first career Major League start and **did not allow a hit over 6.0IP** (0R, 2BB, 9K)...**Yankees pitchers** did not allow a hit until Yonder Alonso singled against **RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 2K) to lead off the eighth...**1B Neil Walker** (1-for-2, 2R, 2BB) hit a game-tying double in the ninth...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1BB) hit a two-run double in the eighth.

- ▶ Trailing by 4R after the top of the eighth, then scored 3R with two outs in the eighth and 4R in the ninth...marked their largest deficit overcome in a win this season.
- ▶ **Was the first Major League game since at least 1908 in which both starting pitchers recorded at least 9K and allowed one-or-zero hits** (Mike Clevinger: 7.1IP, 1H, 2ER, 4BB, 10K).

SANTO DOMINGO: **RHP Domingo Germán** made his first career Major League start on Sun. vs. Cleveland, **tossing 6.0 hitless, scoreless innings with 9K and 2BB in a no-decision**...retired his first 11BF.

- ▶ Per *Elias*, **was the first Major League pitcher since the mound was moved to 60'6" in 1893 to throw at least 6.0 hitless innings with at least 9K in his first career start**.
- ▶ **Was the first Yankee ever to record a hitless start of at least 6.0IP in his first career start**.
- ▶ Was the fourth Yankee ever to record at least 9K in his first career start, joining Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/1997 vs. Detroit), Dan Tripple (10K on 9/25/1915-G2 vs. Cleveland) and Russ Ford (9K on 4/21/1910 at Philadelphia-AL).
- ▶ Was the Yankees' sixth different starting pitcher in 2018, as the club had been one of four teams to use just five starters (also Chicago-NL, Colorado, Houston).

NINE STRAIGHT IN THE BRONX: The Yankees have won nine consecutive games at home (since 4/21), **tying the record for the longest winning streak at the current Yankee Stadium** (also 9-0 from 5/30-6/15/10)...last won 10 consecutive home games from 7/5-23/08 at the original Yankee Stadium...have outscored opponents, 66-25, during the current streak.

- ▶ **Are 14-5 (.737) at home in 2018, the most home wins and best home winning percentage in the Majors**.
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in three of their last four home games.
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (126), HRs (32), HR per game (1.68), XBHs (72), OBP (.364) and OPS (.842)...are second in runs per game (6.63) and slugging average (.478)...have homered in 12 of their last 13G at home.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: Newly named **New York Knicks head coach David Fizdale** will throw out the ceremonial first pitch prior to tonight's game.

LONDON CALLING: The Yankees and the Boston Red Sox will play a historic two-game series in London, England, from June 29-30, 2019, in the **MLB London Series**, Major League Baseball, the Major League Baseball Players Association and the Mayor of London jointly announced today...will mark the first Major League games ever played in Europe, the MLB London Series will be played at London Stadium, the site of the 2012 Olympic Games.

SWEET 16: The Yankees are 15-1 in their last 16 games (since 4/21), **their best 16-game stretch since going 15-1 from 9/1-17/80**...matches the best 15-game stretch in the Majors this season (Boston had three such 16G stretches, topping out with a 17-1 run from 3/30-4/20)...**with a win tonight, would match their best 17G stretch since going 16-1 from 6/3-18/1953, which was part of a larger 21-1 stretch from 5/27-6/18/1953**.

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.06 ERA (144.0IP, 100H, 37R/33ER, 40BB, 158K, 10HR) over the span...**Yankees starters** have a 1.89 ERA (95.1IP, 20ER) during the stretch.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 6.13 runs per game over the stretch, hitting .245/.326/.443 as a team with 98R, 37 doubles, 1 triple, 22HR and 65BB.

MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING: According to *Elias*, **tonight marks the first time the Yankees (24-10) and Red Sox (25-9) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since 6/2/02**, when the Yankees entered at 37-19 and Boston at 36-16.

KID CAN PLAY: **2B Gleyber Torres** hit a three-run "walk-off" home run in the ninth inning to win Sunday's game vs. Cleveland, **becoming the youngest player in franchise history (21 years, 144 days) to hit a "walk-off" home run**...previously the youngest was Mickey Mantle (21 years, 185 days on 4/23/53 vs. Boston).

- ▶ Is the seventh-youngest player to hit a "walk-off" home run in the last 20 years (since 1999)—see chart.
- ▶ Marked his second career HR...**is the sixth Yankee to hit a "walk-off" HR within his first two career home runs**, joining Clint Frazier (2017), Alfonso Soriano (1999), Mike Hegan (1967), Bob Grim (1957) and Frank LaPorte (1906)...Soriano and Hegan are the only Yankees to hit "walk-offs" for their first career HR.

Hit a three-run HR for his first MLB homer on Fri. vs. Cleveland at 21 years, 142 days, becoming **the youngest Yankee to hit a homer since John Ellis (20 years, 269 days) on 5/17/69 vs. California**...each of his 2HR are three-run HRs.

- ▶ The Yankees are a **Major League-best 14-1 since he was recalled on 4/22**, with Torres starting all 15 games...**is the first Major League position player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to start and be on the winning side in 14 of his first 15 big league games**.
- ▶ Is batting .327/.357/.500 (17-for-52) with 7R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 11RBI, 3BB and 15B in his first 15 Major League games...has reached safely in 13-of-15 games.
- ▶ **Is the second-youngest Yankee to record at least 17H in his first 15 career games**, just two weeks older than Ben Chapman, who collected 17H from 4/19-5/4/30...is one of three 21-year-olds in Yankees history to record hits in 12 of his first 15 career games (Joe DiMaggio, Frankie Crosetti)...is the youngest Yankee to collect at least 11RBI through his first 15 games.

"WALK-OFF" FAME: The Yankees **have won three of their last four home games with "walk-off" hits**: Torres three-run HR on Sun. vs. Cleveland, Andújar RBI single on Fri. vs. Cleveland, Sánchez three-run HR on 4/26 vs. Minnesota)...their three "walk-off" wins are tied for second-most in the Majors (St. Louis-5).

- ▶ Are 4-8 when trailing after eight innings this season (were 5-65 in those games in 2017)...**have outscored opponents, 21-3, in the ninth inning in 2018**.
- ▶ Have gone ahead in their last at-bat in four of their last 6G.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 8, 2010: Mark Teixeira becomes the second Yankee in franchise history to hit 3HR in a single game against the Red Sox (also Lou Gehrig), homering in the fifth, seventh and ninth innings of a 14-3 Yankees win at Fenway Park.

May 8, 1994: Danny Tartabull, Mike Stanley and Gerald Williams hit back-to-back-to-back homers in the sixth inning of an 8-4 win vs. Boston at Yankee Stadium.

May 8, 1987: Mike Pagliarulo hits a two-out, "walk-off" grand slam in the 9th inning against the Minnesota Twins, giving the Yankees an 11-7 victory. Pagliarulo and Gary Ward each homer twice in the game.

May 8, 1915: The Yankees earn a 10-3 win vs. Boston at the Polo Grounds, scoring all 10 of their runs in the fourth inning after sending 16 men to the plate.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 9, 2002: In a 3-1 Yankees victory over Tampa Bay, Mariano Rivera picks up career save No. 225, surpassing Dave Righetti (224) to establish a new franchise record.

May 9, 1999: Mike Stanton makes his first career start after 552 consecutive relief appearances to begin his career. Stanton records a no-decision vs. Seattle, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 3K).

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 1-2 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the fourth of 19 games against the Red Sox tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 15-10 in 25G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**IN 2017:** Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park...held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954...**SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Went 6-4 against the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium in 2017...matched their highest home win total vs. Boston since going 7-2 in 2009...are 10-4 in the Bronx since 7/17/16...are 44-41 vs. the Red Sox at the current Yankee Stadium, their most losses to any team at the Stadium...**AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-2 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 8-14 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-27 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-13 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-4-1)...are 498-478-4 (.510) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there...**IN POSTSEASON:** Have met in the postseason three times, going 11-8 in games and 2-1 in series (2004 ALCS, 3-4; 2003 ALCS, 4-3; 1999 ALCS, 4-1).

RHP Luis Severino will make his eighth start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Boston...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's off day...tossed his first career shutout on Wednesday at Houston (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 10K), also marking his first career complete game...is tied for the AL lead (tied for second in the Majors) with five wins...is fifth in the AL in ERA...ranks fourth in the AL with a .172 opp. BA (28-for-163)...the Yankees are 6-1 in his starts...made his first career Opening Day start in a win on 3/29 at Toronto, yielding 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings...at 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: Tossed his first career shutout on Wednesday at Houston (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 10K), also marking his first career complete game... was the second CGSHO by a Yankees pitcher over the last four seasons (also Masahiro Tanaka on 4/27/17 at Boston, 3H in a 3-0 win)...recorded a season-high 10K, his sixth career game with at least 10 strikeouts.

- ✦ Marked the most strikeouts by a Yankees pitcher in a shutout since Mike Mussina on 9/24/02 vs. Tampa Bay (12K, 2H).
- ✦ At 24 years, 71 days old, Severino was the second-youngest Yankee in the last 47 seasons (since 1972) to toss a shutout, behind Sterling Hitchcock (24 years, 22 days) on 5/21/95 vs. Baltimore (4H)...was the youngest Yankee with at least 10K in a CGSHO since Stan Bahnsen (23 years, 230 days) on 8/1/68 at Boston (12K, 3H).
- ✦ Was the second Yankee since 2004 to throw a shutout against the defending World Series champion (also Iván Nova, 6H on 9/21/13 vs. San Francisco).

VS. BOSTON: Is 2-5 with a 4.82 ERA (46.2IP, 25ER) in nine career appearances (eight starts) vs. the Red Sox.

- ✦ Faced the Red Sox earlier this season on 4/10 at Fenway and took the loss in the Yankees' 14-1 defeat (5.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 3BB, 6K, 0HR)...was just his third career start of 5ER-or-more while allowing 0HR (last: 8/9/16 at Boston).
- ✦ Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA (24.1IP, 9ER) in four starts against Boston in 2017...allowed 10R/8ER in 4.1IP on 8/12/17 at Yankee Stadium; permitted just 2R/1ER and 9H in 20.0IP in his other three turns.
- ✦ Is 1-3 with a 5.32 ERA (22.0IP, 13ER) in four starts vs. the Red Sox at home...10R/8ER of his 17R/13ER came in his start on 8/12/17 vs. Boston.
- ✦ Faced the Red Sox in his Major League debut on 8/5/15 at Yankee Stadium (L, 5.0IP, 2H, 2R/1ER, 0BB, 7K, 1HR).

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 3-0 with a 1.33 ERA (20.1IP, 3ER) and 21K in three starts at home this season...his 1.33 ERA is tied for the the sixth-lowest home ERA in the Majors (tied for third in the AL)...surrendered only 1ER in 7.0IP on 4/22 vs. Toronto (3H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP), allowed 1H in 6.0 scoreless innings on 4/16 vs. Miami (1BB, 8K) and allowed only 2ER in 7.1IP (5H, 1BB, 7K) on 4/4 vs. Tampa Bay.

- ✦ Has not lost at home in his last nine starts (seven regular season and two postseason), dating back to 9/3/17 vs. Boston (his last loss came on 8/28/17 vs. Cleveland)...is 7-0 with a 2.66 ERA (50.2IP, 15ER) in that span...has allowed 3ER-or-less in his last eight regular season starts at home...recorded at least 6.0IP in seven-of-eight of those starts.
- ✦ Went 8-5 with a 3.71 ERA (97.0IP, 40ER) in 16 home starts in 2017...the team was 11-5 in his home starts...his 114K were the second-highest single-season total in the history of the current Stadium (Sabathia-120K in 2011).

2018: Is tied for second in the Majors with five wins...is eighth in the Majors (seventh in the AL) with a 0.85 WHIP...his .172 opponents' BA (28-for-163) ranks fourth in the AL.

- ✦ Has gone at least 6.0IP in five-of-seven starts this season.
- ✦ Opponents are hitting .133 (10-for-75) with 3BB, 31K and 1HR in at-bats ending in a slider this season (Brooks Baseball).

WHAT A RUN: Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 20-of-38 starts since the start of 2017, most in the Majors in that span.

- ✦ The Yankees are 6-1 in his starts this season and 26-12 since the start of 2017.

SEVY GEMS: Made his first career Opening Day start **on 3/29 at Toronto**, allowing just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings (3BB, 7K) to earn the win...was the first scoreless Opening Day start by a Yankee since Roger Clemens (6.0IP, 3H) on 3/31/03 at Toronto...the 1H marked the fewest by a Yankees Opening Day starter since at least 1908...**on 4/16 vs. Miami** (6.0IP, 1H, 0R, 1BB, 8K) became the first Yankee to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings with 1H-or-fewer since Michael Pineda (7.1IP, 1H) on 9/22/14 vs. Baltimore.

- ✦ Was the first Yankee to post two scoreless starts in the team's first 15 games of a season since David Cone in 1997.
