THE CAPTAIN: The Mets and David Wright announced that the captain will be activated for the Mets final homestand, September 25-30 and will start at third base on Saturday, September 29... Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87).

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 5-5 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 26-19 in their last 45 games and 38-34 since July 1 ...New York is 33-33 vs. the NL East...The Mets were shut out for the 12th time this season last night in Philadelphia.

SERIES STREAK: New York is 9-3-2 in its last 14 series.

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 11-7 this month, the eighth-best winning percentage (.611) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.45 ERA this month, the seventh-lowest in the majors...The Mets have 25 homers in September, the second-most in the majors, behind the Dodgers (29).

ON THE ROAD: New York is 37-40 on the road this year... The Mets rank fourth in the majors with a .330 road on-base percentage, fifth with 385 runs scored and sixth in the majors with a .754 OPS on the road.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Mets have won eight games vs. Washington this year with four games remaining...New York won six games all of last year vs. the Nats and seven games in 2016... The Mets have had one winning season series vs. Washington since 2010 (11-8 in 2015)...The Mets are 16-16 at Nationals Park since 2015...The Mets have hit 42 home runs in their last 26 games at Nationals Park.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has hit 12 home runs since August 12 (in 38 games), tied for the second-most homers in the majors during that span...Christian Yelich is first (13)...Conforto has 75 RBI, extending career-high...Conforto has 15 homers (sixth in the NL) and 45 RBI (tied for third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is one of three lefthanded hitters with double-digit homers off a lefty (Joey Gallo and Freddie Freeman are the others)...Overall, he is tied for 10th in the NL with 73 walks.

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto leads all major leaguers with 22 RBI this month (four more than Stephen Piscotty who is second)... He is tied for the most homers (seven) this month...He is also tied for the major league lead with 12 extra-base hits in September.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in a career-high 26 straight games (.486 OBP)...Nimmo is batting .344 (33-96) with a .479 OBP, 12 doubles, three homers, 15 RBI and 23 runs scored over his last 29 games dating to August 7... He has drawn 17 walks in September, the second-most in the majors and is third in the majors with a .458 OBP this month... Overall, Nimmo is tied for third in the NL with a .398 OBP, 11th with a .891 OPS, tied for third with eight triples and is tied for first in the majors with 21 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...He has a career-high 17 homers.

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 7-3 with a 2.94 ERA (35 earned runs/107.0 innings), the third-lowest ERA in the majors this month.

HISTORIC STREAKS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 27 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...Research courtesy of Elias... DeGrom has hurled 22 straight quality starts, tied for the longest single-season streak in major league history with Bob Gibson (1968) and Chris Carpenter (2005)...Also courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.78)... According to FanGraphs, he leads major league pitchers in WAR (8.0), RA-9 WAR (8.3), FIP (2.05), opponent's slugging percentage (.288) and a .540 OPS and leads the NL in HR/9 (0.45), DRA (2.17), ERA+ (207) and .257 xwOBA (expected weighted on-base)...He is second in the NL and fourth in the majors in strikeouts (251).

JASON VARGAS: Is 4-1 with a 3.09 ERA (11 earned runs/32.0 innings) and 27 strikeouts over his last six starts dating to August 14.

VS. SCHERZER: Max Scherzer is 1-0 in one start vs. New York this year...He allowed three runs over 7.0 innings on July 12 at Citi Field...Scherzer is 9-4 with a 2.34 ERA (27 earned runs/104.0 innings) in 16 career games, 15 starts vs. the Mets.

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has hit safely in 27 of his last 31 starts...His .335 (62-185) batting average since his debut on July 24 is seventh in the majors (min. 170 PA)...Is tied for second in the majors with 24 hits this month...Has the sixth-highest batting average (.364) this month (min. 60 PA)...He is tied for 10th in the majors in hits since his debut...McNeil has 62 hits through his first 54 career games with the Mets...Only José Reyes (65) and David Wright (63) had more...McNeil's .335 average in his first 54 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 170 PA).

MULTI-HIT MAN: Jeff McNeil has tied the Mets rookie record for most three-hit games after the All-Star break in one season (seven), a mark set by David Wright in 2004...Courtesy of Elias... McNeil has 17 multi-hit games since July 24 (his ML debut).

AMED ROSARIO: Is hitting .324 (23-71) with four doubles, two triples, two homers, six RBI, 12 runs scored and five stolen bases this month...Rosario became the 33rd player in team history with 20 or more stolen bases in a season last night...He's hitting .327 (51-156) with a .354 OBP, eight doubles, two triples, five homers, 20 RBI and 28 runs scored in his last 36 games.

DINGERS: The Mets have hit 50 home runs since August 12, the fourth-most in the majors during that span.

- » Non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right hand...Underwent surgery on March 20, 2018 to remove the bone.
- » Tommy John Surgery (2015)...On D.L. from July 22, 2015-September 17, 2016.

LAST START: Vargas tonight makes his 19th start of the season and second against Washington...Earned the win in his last start on September 13 vs. the Marlins in the second game of a doubleheader at Citi Field...Picked up his third quality start, pitching 6.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, on three hits while walking two and striking out seven in the Mets' 5-2 victory...Vargas singled to leftfield in the fifth inning and went on to score on a Michael Conforto double... Was his first hit since August 19 in the Williamsport Little League Classic and his first run scored since June 20, 2012 at Arizona as a member of Seattle.

VS. WASHINGTON: Defeated Washington for the first time in his career on August 24 at Citi Field...Tossed 6.0-scoreless innings and allowed three hits while striking out eight and not walking a batter in the Mets' 3-0 victory at Citi Field...In six career games, three starts against the Nationals, Vargas is 1-3 with a 0.83 ERA (two earned runs/21.2 innings) with six walks and 18 strikeouts...In those three starts, Vargas is 1-2 with a 1.00 ERA (two earned runs/18.0 innings pitched) with four walks and 16 strikeouts...Vargas' 0.83 ERA versus Washington is his lowest against any opposing team.

RECENT VARGAS: Owns a 3.09 ERA (11 earned runs/32.0 innings) over his last six starts, a stretch that includes all three of his quality starts in 2018...Has won four of his last five starts and has lasted at least 5.1 innings in five of his last six starts...Had pitched no more than 5.0 innings in any of his first 12 starts this season.

VARGAS ON THE ROAD: Vargas will be making his 12th road start of the season... Is 3-5 with a 7.61 ERA (40 earned runs/47.1 innings) through six starts at visiting ballparks this season...In his last road start, Vargas pitched 3.1 innings, allowing five runs, four earned, on six hits...Gave up two home runs and walked one while striking out two in the Mets' 11-4 loss to the Dodgers...Overall, Vargas is 40-49 on the road in 135 career games, 124 starts...Owns a 4.89 ERA (395 earned runs/726.2 innings) with 245 walks and 461 strikeouts.

PITCH BREAKDOWN: This year, Vargas has generated a 37.4 percent and 37.2 percent whiff rate (swinging strikes per swings) with his curveball and changeup, respectively, this season according to Statcast...Conversely, Vargas has a 14.2 percent whiff rate on his sinker and a 16.4 percent whiff rate on his four-seam fastball.

1,000 K'S: Vargas joined the 1,000-strikeout club last month...In doing so, he became the 141st southpaw in MLB history to reach the milestone...He is also one of 16 active lefthanders and one of 59 active pitchers overall to rack up 1,000 strikeouts in his career.

VARGAS' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
- » Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
- » From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only Mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
- » Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
- » Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
- » Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
- » Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017... Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
- » Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
- » Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.
