STREAKING

The Reds' 4-game winning streak is their longest of the season...during this streak are hitting .263 (36-137) with 19 runs scored (4.75 r/g) and a 1.22 ERA (37ip, 5er), including a 1.31 ERA by Reds starters (20.2ip, 3er) and a 1.10 ERA by the bullpen (16.1ip, 2er).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 3 (2-0) of a 4-game series vs Daisuke Sugiura's Dodgers and Game 3 (2-0) of a 7-game West Coast road trip that includes an upcoming visit to SF's AT&T Park...following this road trip the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for 7 games vs the Cubs (4g) and Pirates (3g), including a day/night doubleheader on Sat, 5/19.

SERIES NOTES: Thursday's 4-1 Reds win snapped their 8-game losing streak to the Dodgers and their 9-game losing streak at Dodger Stadium...in the previous 6 series over the last 3 seasons, the Reds went 0-5-1 vs LAD (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...Cin has lost 17 of its last 21 games vs LAD, including 8 of the last 10 games, and 9 of their last 11 games at Dodger Stadium...since a 3-game series sweep in June 2011, the Reds have lost the last 6 series at Dodger Stadium (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...Reds vs Dodgers information is on media guide Page 322.

GIANTS UP NEXT: The Reds won the first 4 games of the 2017 season series vs SF but lost the last 3 games...the 31 runs scored in the Reds' 13-3, 14-2 and 4-0 wins from 5/5-5/7 of last season at Great American Ball Park was their highest total for any 3-game series since they scored 32 runs from 8/19-8/21 vs Ari, 2005...beginning with the 2008 season the Reds are 40-27 vs SF (.597), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50 games) and including 29-19 (.604) over the last 7 seasons...Reds vs Giants information is on media guide Page 330.

WE LEAVE OUR HEARTS...: Beginning 6/29/12, including that 2012 season's National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 15 of the last 23 meetings at SF's AT&T Park...the Giants' 17-inning, 3-2 win there on 5/12/2016 was the Reds' longest game by inning since a 19-inning, 5-4 loss on 5/25/2011 at Phi and the second-longest game in the history of AT&T Park (5/29/2001, 1-0 Giants loss vs Diamondbacks in 18 innings).

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations Dick Williams on Thursday announced the promotion of Nick Krall to General Manager...Krall had been the club's VP, Assistant GM since November 2015...Williams will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee the organization's entire baseball operations.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 9-12 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

7-YEAR ITCH: The 10-4 Reds victory on 4/23 vs Atl was the first for Jim Riggleman as his team's full-time manager since a 1-0 Nationals win vs the Mariners on 6/23/11...since 1900, he is 1 of 14 managers to work for at least 5 Major League teams (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...Jimmy Dykes, John McNamara and Dick Williams each managed 6 teams...the others who managed 5 teams are Chuck Dressen, Bucky Harris, Rogers Hornsby, Davey Johnson, Billy Martin, Bill McKechnie, Jack McKeon, Lou Piniella, Jeff Torborg and Joe Torre.

RISPY BUSINESS: With a minimum of 35 plate apps with runners in scoring position, Joey Votto ranks fifth in the Major Leagues and third in the National League in hitting with RISP at .417 (15-36)...Votto leads all National League batters in on-base percentage with RISP (.542), second in the majors only to Bal's Manny Machado (.568).

IN A PINCH: In his last 5 pinch-hit apps, Jesse Winker walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled...he is the first Reds batter to reach base safely in 5 consecutive pinch-hit apps since Todd Frazier did it from 4/20-5/2, 2012 and the first Reds batter to produce a hit in 4 straight pinch-hit apps since Brayan Pena from 7/8-8/9, 2014...Fred Lewis was the last Reds batter to reach base safely in 6 consecutive pinch-hit plate apps (6/13-7/2, 2011)...Rick Auerbach was the last Reds batter with hits in 5 straight pinch-hit plate apps (8/14-9/13, 1978)...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

REHABBING: RHP Michael Lorenzen (right shoulder strain) and RHP Anthony DeSclafani (left oblique strain) are scheduled to begin rehabilitation assignments Monday for Class AA Pensacola...DeSclafani will start for the Blue Wahoos (4ip, 60-65 pitches), while Lorenzen will throw 1.0 inning (20 pitches)...Lorenzen on Thu threw 1.0 inning (15 pitches) in an extended spring training game at the team's player development complex in Goodyear...DeSclafani on Wed in an extended spring training game in Goodyear threw 3.0 innings (39 pitches) and finished with a 9-pitch bullpen.

HOME COOKIN': In the 9-game homestand completed Wednesday, Eugenio Suárez became the first Reds batter to produce 15 RBI in a homestand since Jay Bruce had 15 RBI in 7 games from 8/8-8/14, 2011...in his 9 apps vs the Brewers, Marlins and Mets at Great American Ball Park, Suarez hit .313 (10-32, 3 2b, 3hr, .688slg, .395obp)...courtesy Elias.

25 IN 20: With a team-high 25 RBI in his first 20 apps, Eugenio Suárez tied the franchise record for most RBI by a player in his first 20 games of a season...he played in his 20th game on Tue vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons...courtesy Elias.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' 33 Major League debuts over the last 3 seasons are the most of any team in either league and include 4 this season (3B Alex Blandino on 4/10 at Phi, RHP Tanner Rainey on 4/10 at Phi, RHP Zack Weiss on 4/12 vs StL, IF/OF Rosell Herrera on 4/26 vs Atl)...have 5 rookies on the active roster (Blandino, Herrera, OF Jesse Winker, RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens) and another rookie on the disabled list (RHP Rookie Davis)...the Reds' Opening Day roster included 5 rookies (Mahle, Stephens, Weiss, Ervin, Winker), 21 players age 30 & under, 17 players age 27 & under and 11 players age 25 & under...according to Elias Sports Bureau, the average age for the Reds' 25-man Opening Day roster (27 years, 196 days) was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the Phillies (26.334) and ahead of the Marlins (27.351).

Tonight's Pitcher - #34 Homer Bailey, RHP

RED HOTS

Homer Bailey tonight is making his team-high **ninth start of the season** and the **201st appearance** and **start of his career**...will be his **11th career appearance** and **start** vs the **Dodgers**, his first since **August 2016**, and his **sixth career start** at **Dodger Stadium**...his **3 quality starts** are **1 QS** shy of staff leader **Tyler Mahle**...Reds batters have scored **24 runs** in his **8 starts**, including **12 runs** while he is in the game...**Mon vs NYM** made the **200th appearance** and **start** of his career...in the 3-2 loss on **4/15 vs StL**, following a rain delay of 2 hours, 36 minutes, threw the **100th quality start** of his career (196th appearance)...in the 2-0 loss on **3/30 vs Wsh** made the first **Opening Day start** of his Major League career...has the **third-longest tenure** of any Major League pitcher with his current team (June 2007), trailing only Sea's **Felix Hernandez** (August 2005) and StL's **Adam Wainwright** (September 2005)...was on the Reds' **Opening Day roster** for the first time since **2014**...is approaching **1,200 innings** (1,167.1) and **1,000 strikeouts** (951).

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tomorrow will make his ninth start of the season and his **24th Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **Dodgers**...in Tue's 7-2 win vs NYM, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...left leading, 4-1, but was charged with another run scored off **Amir Garrett**...in the **10-4 win** on **4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...was charged with 2 more runs scored off **Cody Reed**...in 2017 led National League rookies in ERA and opponents' batting average (.202) while ranking eighth among rookies in strikeouts...the Reds went 7-8 in his 15 starts...with 8 quality starts ranked second on the staff behind **Scott Feldman's** 9 QS...produced all 8 quality starts in his last 12 apps beginning 7/8 (3-6, 2.84), including 6 QS in his last 8 apps beginning 7/30 (2-3, 2.37)...beginning 7/8 and among pitchers with at least 12 starts, his 2.84 ERA ranked seventh in the Major Leagues behind **Corey Kluber** (1.79), **Justin Verlander** (1.92), **Kyle Hendricks** (2.19), **Luis Severino** (2.40), **Jake Arrieta** (2.48) and **Marcus Stroman** (2.73)...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.
