PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (58-47) vs. BOSTON RED SOX (74-33)

Monday, July 30, 2018 – 7:10 EDT – Fenway Park – Game 106 – Road 54

RHP Aaron Nola (12-3, 2.42) vs LHP David Price (11-6, 4.17)

- **YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Cincinnati Reds, 4-0, in Cincy ... Starter Zach Eflin (L, 7-3) went 5.1 innings and allowed 4 runs on 7 hits with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts ... Philadelphia had opportunities to score early, as well as the 9th inning when they loaded the bases with 1 out ... Ultimately it was not to be as the Phils went 0-for-4 with RISP.
- **CHANGE UP:** The Phillies return to Boston for the first time since last June when they arrived 19 games under .500 at 21-40 and wound up losing both games of the two game series against the Red Sox ... My how things have changed in just over a year ... Philadelphia's last game in Boston was on June 13, 2017 and of the 15 players who appeared in that game for the Phillies, only four players are currently on either the active roster or the DL: Odubel Herrera, Maikel Franco, Edubray Ramos, Luis Garcia ... Gone are Daniel Nava (started in LF, batting 2nd), Howie Kendrick (started at 2B, batting 4th), Tommy Joseph (started at 1B, batting 5th), Ty Kelly (pinch-runner), Michael Saunders (started at DH, batting 7th), Andres Blanco (pinch-runner), Cameron Rupp (started at catcher, batting 8th), Freddy Galvis (started at SS, batting 9th) and Jeanmar Gomez (relief pitcher) ... Additionally, Aaron Altherr (started in RF, batting 3rd) and Ben Lively (starting pitcher) are both currently on triple-A Lehigh Valley's roster.
- **NEW YORK STOCK EXCHANGE:** Just before Friday night's game in Cincinnati, the Phillies announced they had acquired infielder **Asdrubel Cabrera** from the New York Mets in exchange for right-hander Franklyn Kilome ... A switch-hitter and two-time All-Star (2011-12), Cabrera, 32, has appeared in 100 games between the Phillies and Mets this season, slashing .272/.323/.478 in 415 plate appearances with 42 extra-base hits (23 2B, 1 3B, 18 HR) ... Cabrera ranks second among all major league second basemen this season in home runs and extra-base hits, trailing only Atlanta's Ozzie Albies in both categories ... A veteran of 12 major league seasons, Cabrera has appeared in 1,048 games at shortstop, 333 games at second base and 46 games at third base ... In 24 career games at Citizens Bank Park, Cabrera is slashing .387/.418/.634 in 98 plate appearances.
- **REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** The Phillies have won 17 of 28 games (6/27-current, .607 win %) and have posted a 26-17 record since June 10 (.605 win %) ... At 58-47 with a .552 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a 1.5 game lead over the Atlanta Braves (55-47, .539) in National League East and their 1.5 game lead in the division is tied for tops among all NL divisions. (other: CHI, 1.5 lead over MIL).
- **PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 105 games, The Phils are 11 games above .500 at 58-46 and have scored 464 runs and allowed 442 (+22) ... Last season, through 105 games, they were 27 games under .500 at 39-66 and had scored 422 and allowed 507 (-85) ... The Phillies didn't notch their 58th win last season until September 16 ... This season, in nine games (8.6 % of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 111-30 (-81) ... **However, in their 96 other games this year (91.4% of their season), Philadelphia has a +103 run differential, outscoring the opposition 434-331.**
- **BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 201 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .287/.373/.603 with 32 runs, 10 2B, 15 HR, 42 RBI and 23 walks ... **The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (18 HR, 29 BB).**
- **EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 101 consecutive games (since 4/4); it is tied for the second-longest extra-base hit streak in franchise history (see chart to the right)... It is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22)
- **SERIESLY:** Over their last 14 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 10-3-1 ... Philadelphia's only two series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds this past weekend in Cincinnati (1-3) ... Philadelphia's 10 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres and Dodgers.
- **IT'S HITTING SEASON:** The Phillies have slugged 58 home runs in their last 40 games (6/14-current) which is tops among all National League clubs and ranks 3rd in the majors, trailing only the Yankees (60 HR) and Athletics (59 HR).
- **AMERICAN DREAM:** The Phillies have won nine of 13 games against the American League this season and their .692 winning percentage ranks 4th among all ML teams in IL play, behind only the Red Sox (.875, 7-1), Pirates (.800, 12-3) and Reds (.769, 10-3).
- **FLAGS FLY FOREVER:** When the Phillies return home to Citizens Bank Park following their six-game road trip, they will honor the 2008 World Series Champions as part of Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, August 3-5 ... Festivities take place during the Phillies-Marlins series and feature 2008 World Champion photo opportunities, special first pitches and pregame tributes throughout the weekend ... Highlights include the retirement of Shane Victorino (Aug. 3), the induction ceremony of Roy Halladay and Pat Gillick into the Toyota Phillies Wall of Fame (Aug. 4), 2008 Phillies World Series Champions Luncheon (Aug. 4), a celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the 2008 World Champion Phillies (Aug. 5) and a 2008 World Champions' Home Run Derby at The Yard (Aug 4-5).

LAST START: 7/24 vs LAD: ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, HR ... Nola vs Maeda ... The Phillies used nine different pitchers on the night, finally going home after a Trevor Plouffe walk-off home run in the 16th.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Can't Touch This:** Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in 15 of his 21 starts, holding opponents to a .202 AVG ... **Ranks 5th among ML starters in fewest hits/9.0 IP (6.45), trailing only WSH's Max Scherzer among NL starters (5.93)**
- ML Starter Rankings:** 2nd in OPP OPS (.549), 3rd in HR/9.0 IP (0.47), T-5th in wins (12), 6th in OPP AVG (.202), 7th in ERA (2.42) and WHIP (0.99)
- Limiting Homers:** Had a 40.0-inning homerless streak snapped in his last start (2nd inning of 6/17 at MIL through 3rd inning on 7/24 vs LAD) ... His 0.47 HR/9.0 IP is 3rd among all ML starters, trailing CLE's Trevor Bauer (0.37) and NYM's Jacob deGrom (0.46)
- Pitch This:** Per Fangraphs' pitch value measurement, among all ML pitchers Nola has three pitches that all rank among the top 10 in the league: his fastball (4th), change-up (6th) and curveball (10th)
- This Means WAR:** Per Baseball Reference, Nola's WAR of 6.1 is 3rd among ML pitchers and highest by a PHI pitcher since 2014 (Hamels, 6.6)
- Aaron All-Star:** Pitched a scoreless inning with 2 SO for the National League All-Star team in D.C. ... It was his first All-Star selection both at the major and minor league level ... He was the first Phillies starting pitcher named to the All-Star team since Cliff Lee in 2013, and the youngest Phillies starting pitcher to be an All-Star since a 23-year-old Cole Hamels in 2007 ... Nola became the 5th Phillie to win 12 or more games before the All-Star break, and joined Steve Carlton (2.14 ERA, 155 SO in 1980) as the only Phillies to post a 2.30 ERA or lower and record at least 130 strikeouts before the All-Star break.
- vs AL East:** 1-2, 3.90 ERA (12 ER, 27.2 IP) in 5 starts
- vs Interleague:** 4-5, 4.45 ERA (30 ER, 60.2 IP) in 11 starts

- 2018:** 4-3, 2.86 ERA (21 ER, 66.0 IP) in 11 starts
- Career:** 14-13, 3.94 ERA (106 ER, 242.0 IP) in 42 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Reached 500 career strikeouts in 480.0 innings, becoming the fastest Phillie to reach that mark, both among pitchers who started their career in PHI and any pitcher to strike out 500 in a PHI uniform
- Became 1 of just 7 Phillies in the last 20 seasons (since 1999) with 10 wins before July 1 (Hamels in 2012, Halladay in 2011, Milton in 2004, Padilla in 2002, Byrd in 1999, Schilling in 1999)
- Per *Elias*, he had the 2nd-most strikeouts (467) through 75 career starts by any pitcher that began his career with Philadelphia (Cole Hamels, 469) and the 5th-most by any pitcher in his first 75 starts in a Phillies uniform
- Became the first Phillies pitcher 25 or younger to have multiple starts in a season with 10+ SO and no walks
- Since the NL started recording ER in 1912, the only other two Phillies pitchers (min. 10 GS) to have both a lower season ERA than his 2.18 and lower season WHIP than his 0.932 through the end of May were Hall of Famers Robin Roberts (1.99 ERA, 0.919 WHIP, 1952) & Grover C. Alexander (1.58 ERA, 0.928 WHIP, 1915) - *Elias*
- Posted a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) with 46 SO and a 0.90 WHIP in 6 May starts
- Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillies since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
