RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped the series opener to the Rangers, 7-5, on Thursday night at Comerica Park. Ronny Rodriguez had three hits and drove in a run, while Jim Adduci, John Hicks and Victor Reyes each had two hits and a RBI. Niko Goodrum added a solo home run, his eighth of the season. Matthew Boyd started for the Tigers and suffered the loss, allowing seven runs, six earned, on seven hits with three strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Detroit's bullpen combined to throw 5.0 scoreless innings, giving up just one hit with two walks and three strikeouts. The Tigers and Rangers play the second game of their four-game series tonight. Following this weekend's series vs. Texas, Detroit closes the first half of the season next week with a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Tampa Bay (July 9-11) and three games at Houston (July 13-15).

TIGERS AGREE TO TERMS WITH 11TH ROUND PICK

KACEY MURPHY: The Tigers announced today that they have agreed to terms with 11th round selection LHP Kacey Murphy from the University of Arkansas. Murphy made 18 appearances, including 17 starts, with the Razorbacks this season, posting an 8-5 record with a 3.20 ERA (101.1IP/36ER) and 85 strikeouts. The Tigers have now agreed to terms with 38 of their 40 draft picks.

GOODY TWO SHOES:

Niko Goodrum hit a solo home run, his eighth longball of the season, in last night's game to extend his hitting streak to five games. Over that stretch, Goodrum has a slash line of .429/.429/.810 with six runs scored, three doubles, one triple, one home run and two RBI.

FARMER'S ALMANAC:

Buck Farmer threw a scoreless inning in last night's game to extend his shutout streak to 11 appearances. Over the 10.2 inning stretch, Farmer has allowed just five hits, limiting opponents to a .139 (5x36) batting average, while striking out eight.

TIGERS AND RANGERS:

The Tigers are 1-3 against the Rangers this season. Detroit has lost the season series to the Rangers five times in the last six seasons, with the Tigers only series victory coming in 2014. Detroit has dropped nine of its last 10 games vs. Texas played at Comerica Park.

AT COMERICA PARK:

The Tigers are 0-1 on their current four-game homestand. Detroit is 23-22 at Comerica Park this season, but have lost a season-high five straight games at home. The Tigers are hitting .259 (400x1542) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.15 ERA (416.0IP/192ER).

WEST SIDE STORY:

Detroit is 7-12 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 30 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (44-74, .373).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:

Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 38-51 (.427) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,106-1,090 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his

13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ROBSON, FUNKHOUSER EARN MINOR LEAGUE HONORS FOR JUNE:

OF Jacob Robson and RHP Kyle Funkhouser have been named the Tigers Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for June. Robson spent most of the month with Double A Erie, before being promoted to Triple A Toledo and hit .304 (31x102) with 22 runs scored, eight doubles, three triples, three home runs and 19 RBI in 24 games. Robson is ranked as the 26th-best prospect in the Tigers organization. Funkhouser started five games for Double A Erie in June, compiling a 4-1 record with a 0.94 ERA (28.2IP/3ER) and 31 strikeouts. Funkhouser is rated as the seventh-best prospect in the Tigers organization.

THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY:

1971 - Norm Cash belted a pair of three-run home runs as the Tigers defeated the Yankees, 12-7. Mickey Lolich threw a complete game to pick up the win. **1997** - The Tigers win their third straight game, defeating the Orioles, 14-9. Bobby Higginson hit a two-run, inside-the-park home run, his fifth round-tripper of the week.

VERHAGEN INJURY REHAB UPDATE:

RHP Drew VerHagen made an injury rehab appearance with Triple A Toledo last night at Columbus and took the loss after throwing 2.0 innings and allowing two runs on three hits with five strikeouts in 2.0 innings. In three injury rehab outings with the Mud Hens, VerHagen has a 0-1 record with a 4.15 ERA (4.1IP/2ER) and nine strikeouts. VerHagen has been sidelined since June 20 with a nasal fracture.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his 11th start of 2018 tonight vs. Texas.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann improved his record to 3-0 by earning the win on Sunday at Toronto, allowing just one run on five hits with six strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

VS. TEXAS: Zimmermann's only career start against the Rangers came on May 6, 2016, when he took the loss after giving up three runs on seven hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 8.0 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Zimmermann has appeared in 29 games, including 28 starts, at Comerica Park and has an 11-12 record with a 6.24 ERA (154.1IP/107ER) and 102 strikeouts. In four home starts this season, Zimmermann is 1-0 with a 3.09 ERA (23.1IP/8ER) and 23 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Zimmermann has made 12 starts in his career against teams from the American League West and has a 4-4 record with a 3.17 ERA (76.2IP/27ER) and 44 strikeouts. His only start against an AL West team this season was on June 25 vs. Oakland, when he threw 5.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Zimmermann has made 35 career starts during the month of July, posting a 10-12 record with a 4.27 ERA (198.1IP/94ER) and 173 strikeouts. In five July starts last season, Zimmermann was 1-3 with a 6.23 ERA (26.0IP/18ER) and 17 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (689x2691) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .266 (725x2725) against him. In 10 starts this season, righties are hitting .271 (26x96), while lefthanded batters are hitting .209 (19x91).

KEEPIN' IT 1,000: Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 53 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann ranks second among active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.92 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 17th start of 2018 tomorrow afternoon vs. Texas.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers turned in his longest outing of the season on Monday at Toronto, but did not factor into the decision after allowing one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 8.0 innings. The outing was Fiers' longest since he threw a no-hitter on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

VS. TEXAS/AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made seven appearances, including six starts, in his career against the Rangers, posting a 1-3 record with a 8.10 ERA (36.2IP/33ER) and 33 strikeouts. He faced the Rangers earlier this season on May 8 and picked up the win, giving up two runs on six hits with five strikeouts in 5.1 innings. Fiers has started 10 games in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 3-2 record with a 2.85 ERA (60.0IP/19ER) and 45 strikeouts. In eight home starts this season, Fiers is 3-2 with a 3.19 ERA (48.0IP/17ER) and 36 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fiers currently ranks seventh in the American League with 1.94 walks per nine innings.
