A pre-game, on-field ceremony will take place to encourage young fans and their families to take a pledge against bullying. Each ticket package purchased for the event includes a donation to **Defeat the Label**, which is a Michigan based and internationally known non-profit organization dedicated to empowering students in classrooms around the globe.

Ceremonial First Pitch: The ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by 2018 Winter Olympic Big Air Snowboarding Silver Medalist **Kyle Mack**.

National Anthem & God Bless America: The national anthem and God Bless America will be performed by vocalist **Rachel Miltimore**.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers scored seven runs in the first inning and cruised to a 7-1 win over the Rangers on Saturday afternoon at Comerica Park. Niko Goodrum reached base in all five plate appearances, going 4x4 with a double, a RBI and a walk, while José Iglesias and Mikie Mahtook each added two hits and a RBI. Nicholas Castellanos belted a solo home run, his team-leading 15th of the season. Mike Fiers started for the Tigers and improved his record to 6-5, allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers and Rangers conclude their four-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, Detroit embarks on a six-game road trip to wrap-up the first half of the season. The road trip includes three games at Tampa Bay (July 9-11) and three games at Houston (July 13-15).

GREAT BALLS OF FIERS: Mike Fiers earned his sixth win of the season yesterday, allowing one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Fiers has allowed one run-or-less in three consecutive starts, which is tied for the longest streak of his career. Over his last eight starts, Fiers has compiled a 2.54 ERA (49.2IP/14ER) with 42 strikeouts. He has posted a 1.09 WHIP and limited opposing hitters to a .226 (43x190) batting average. He ranks third in the American League with 49.2 innings pitched during the stretch, while he is sixth with a 2.54 ERA.

START ME UP: With Mike Fiers' outing yesterday, Tigers starting pitchers have thrown 6.0-or-more innings in 10 of the last 11 games, dating back to June 27. Prior to June 27, Detroit starters had gone at least 6.0 innings just once in the previous 12 games. Since June 27, the Tigers starting rotation leads the Majors with 72.0 innings pitched, while they are second in the American League with a .226 (61x270) opponents batting average and fifth with a 3.38 ERA (72.0IP/27ER).

GOODY TWO SHOES: Niko Goodrum recorded his second four-hit game in a week yesterday as he went 4x4 with a double, a RBI and a walk. Goodrum has hit safely in six-of-seven games in July and has a slash line of .464/.483/.786 with seven runs scored, four doubles, one triple, one home run and two RBI during the month.

FIRST INNING TOUCHDOWN: The Tigers put together their biggest offensive inning of the season in the first inning yesterday, scoring seven runs. The seven runs were the most Detroit has scored in a first inning since May 16, 2016, when the Tigers scored eight runs in the opening inning vs. Minnesota. For the season, the Tigers have scored 61 runs in the first inning, which is the second-most in the American League, trailing Cleveland (65).

TIGERS AND RANGERS: The Tigers and Rangers have split the first six games of their season series. Detroit has lost the season series to Texas five times in the last six seasons, with the Tigers' only series victory coming in 2014. Detroit has dropped nine of its last 12 games vs. the Rangers played at Comerica Park.

WESTWORLD: Detroit is 9-12 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16) and they are 28 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (46-74, .383).

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 2-1 on their current four-game homestand. Detroit is 25-22 at Comerica Park this season. The Tigers are hitting .259 (417x1607) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.04 ERA (434.0IP/195ER).

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their Major League leading 46th day game of the

season (out of 92 games, 50%). Detroit has posted a 23-22 (.511) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 17-29 (.370) at night. The Tigers have lost seven of their last 10 day games.

ON DECK: The Tigers tomorrow open a six-game road trip, which begins with three games at Tampa Bay. Detroit won two-of-three games from the Rays earlier this season at Comerica Park from April 30-May 2. The Tigers were swept in a three-game series at Tropicana Field last season and have an all-time record of 36-36 in Tampa Bay. Detroit is 3-2-2 in season series against the Rays since 2011.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 40-51 (.440) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,108-1,090 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 18th start of 2018 this afternoon in the series finale vs. Texas.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer turned in a quality start on Tuesday at Chicago (NL), but did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on seven hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. TEXAS: Fulmer has faced the Rangers three times in his career, compiling a 1-1 record with a 4.58 ERA (19.2IP/10ER) and 18 strikeouts. He faced Texas earlier this season on May 7 in Arlington and received a no decision, giving up five runs on four hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has made 32 career starts at Comerica Park, posting a 10-11 record with a 3.55 ERA (205.1IP/81ER) and 144 strikeouts. In nine home starts this season, Fulmer is 1-5 with a 4.13 ERA (56.2IP/26ER) and 37 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Fulmer has started 16 games in his career against teams from the American League West, compiling a 5-8 record with a 3.79 ERA (99.2IP/42ER) and 81 strikeouts. Fulmer has allowed three runs-or-less in 10 of his 16 career starts vs. AL West teams. In five starts vs. AL West teams this season, Fulmer is 0-3 with a 7.48 ERA (27.2IP/23ER) and 25 strikeouts.

DOMINANT IN THE DAY TIME: Fulmer has pitched well in day games this season, posting a 3-4 record with a 2.67 ERA (70.2IP/21ER) and 56 strikeouts. In 30 career starts in the day time, Fulmer is 12-8 with a 2.70 ERA (200.0IP/60ER) and 153 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Fulmer has started 12 games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 5-3 record with a 3.79 ERA (78.1IP/33ER) and 51 strikeouts. In six July starts last season, Fulmer went 3-3 with a 4.66 ERA (38.2IP/20ER) and 22 strikeouts.

TURNING IT AROUND: Michael Fulmer has allowed three runs-or-less in four of his last five starts. After posting a 6.89 ERA (31.1IP/24ER) in six starts from May 7-June 3, Fulmer has a 3.21 ERA (33.2IP/12ER) with 30 strikeouts over his last five starts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .240 (189x787) batting average in his career, while lefties have also hit .239 (192x800) against him. In 17 starts this season, righties are hitting .271 (46x170), while lefthanded batters are hitting .233 (49x210).

AMONG THE BEST SINCE HIS DEBUT: Fulmer has been among the best pitchers in the American League since making his debut on April 29, 2016. Among active American League pitchers with at least 400.0 innings pitched since April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks fifth with a 3.63 ERA, trailing only Corey Kluber (2.55 ERA), Justin Verlander (2.82 ERA), Chris Sale (3.05 ERA) and Carlos Carrasco (3.57 ERA).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 14th start of the season tomorrow night in the series opener at Tampa Bay.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano turned in his seventh quality start of the season, but suffered his fourth consecutive loss on Wednesday at Chicago (NL), allowing three runs on five hits with five walks and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. TAMPA BAY/AT TROPICANA FIELD: Liriano has faced the Rays 15 times in his career, including 13 as a starter, compiling a 3-4 record with a 5.40 ERA (68.1IP/41ER) and 69 strikeouts. He made five appearances, including four starts, against Tampa Bay last season and went 1-1 with a 6.61 ERA (16.1IP/12ER) and 21 strikeouts. In seven career appearances, including five starts, at Tropicana Field, Liriano has a 1-2 record with a 9.43 ERA (21.0IP/22ER) and 22 strikeouts.
