The Mariners and Rangers meet for the 11th (6-4) of 19 games this season...in their last 6 games at Globe Life Park (9/12/17-c), the Mariners are averaging 7.29 runs-per-game (51 R, 7 G)...the Mariners are 19-13 in their last 32 games against the Rangers (9/6/16-c):

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip with the second (1-0) of 3 games at Texas...will also travel to Houston (4 G) and Oakland (3 G)...went 2-5 on a recently-concluded 2-team, 7-day, 7-game homestand vs. Houston (1-2) and Toronto (1-3)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 10-17 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 25 of their last 49 games, 32 of their last 58, 36 of their last 64, 41 of their last 70 and 43 of their last 74...Seattle is 51-37 in its last 88 games, 56-40 over its last 96 games and 61-44 in its last 105 games...Seattle is 21-18 during the day and 44-30 at night...Seattle is 36-24 at Safeco Field, 29-24 on the road.

- **First Things First** - Dee Gordon is batting .362 (34x94) with 22 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 walk and 2 HBP when leading off a game this season...his 34 hits to lead off a game are the most in the Majors.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 42-17 (.712) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 28-14 (.667) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 46-13 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 19-35 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (57-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (54-0).
- **Bullpen Bullies** - Edwin Díaz has not allowed an earned run over his last 16.0 innings spanning 15 appearances (6/25-c), while Alex Colomé has an active 15.1 scoreless innings streak over 15 games (6/30-c).

ONE IS ALL IT TAKES...the Mariners improved to 28-14 (.667) in one-run games this season with last night's 4-3 victory...Seattle leads the Majors in one-run wins in 2018, while ranking 2nd in winning percentage behind Oakland (.700/21-9)... Edwin Díaz has earned the save in 22 of the Mariners 28 one-run wins this season, tops in the Majors in 2018 and tied for 2nd-most in single-season Major League history (also: Eric Gagne-LAD, 2003), behind Francisco Rodriguez-LAA (23, 2008)...with 49 games remaining in the regular season, the Mariners 28 one-run wins rank 6th-most in single-season club history (also: 2015), trailing only the Mariners clubs of 2009 (35), 1982 (31), 2016 (30), 1984 (30) and 1993 (29).

HISTORICALLY GOOD... Edwin Díaz struck out 2 in a scoreless 12th inning for his 42nd save of the season last night...he now has a 1.96 ERA (12 ER, 55.0 IP) with 91 strikeouts and 15 walks in 55 appearances this season... Díaz is currently only the 5th pitcher in American League history (done 6x) to record at least 40 saves and 90 strikeouts with an ERA under 2.00...he joins Bryan Harvey-CAL (1991), Dennis Eckersley-OAK (1992), Francisco Rodriguez-LAA (2006), Greg Holland-KC (2x, 2013 and 2014).

EXTRA, EXTRA!...with last night's 4-3 win over the Rangers in 12 innings, the Mariners improved to 9-1 (.900) in extra-inning games this season...they are 4-1 in extra innings on the road this season...their 9 wins in extra frames are T2nd-most in the Majors (also: San Francisco and Toronto), trailing only Oakland... Seattle's .900 winning percentage is tops in the Majors in extra-inning contests; they are the only team not to have lost multiple games in extras this season...the Mariners 9 wins in extra-innings are tied for 5th-most in single-season club history (also: 1980, 1982, 1991, 2001, 2009 and 2016), trailing only the Mariners clubs from 1984 (12), 2004 (11), 2002 (11) and 2015 (10).

FACE-OFF...tonight marks the 7th time that Félix Hernández and Bartolo Colon have faced off as opposing starting pitchers: May 26, 2008 vs. Boston; June 6, 2008 at Boston; April 7, 2012 at Oakland; April 13, 2012 vs. Oakland; July 8, 2012 at Oakland and Sept. 27, 2013 vs. Oakland...in the 6 previous match-ups, Hernández is 2-3 with a 3.76 ERA (17 ER, 40.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and 16 walks...he has worked at least 6.0 innings in each of those 6 games, including 3 outings of 7.0+ innings, and has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 4 of those 6 games...Hernández (168) is the all-time leader in wins among natives of Venezuela, while Colon (245) is the all-time leader in wins among pitchers born in the Dominican Republic.

Z MARKS THE SPOT...Mike Zunino belted his 89th career home run in the 4th inning last night...his 89 career home runs are the most of any Mariners catcher (career primary position) in club history, surpassing Dan Wilson (88)...since Zunino's first full Major League season in 2014, he has hit 84 home runs as a catcher, 3rd-most in the Majors behind Salvador Pérez (96) and Yasmani Grandal (91)...Zunino has hit each of his 14 home runs this season while playing catcher, T3rd-most in the Majors (also: Yadier Molina-STL and Wilson Ramos-TB), trailing Grandal-LAD (19) and Robinson Chirinos-TEX (15).

HELLO, OLD FOE...Rangers starter Bartolo Colon is making his 40th career start against the Mariners...he becomes 1 of 3 players to ever make at least 40 career starts vs. Seattle, joining Roger Clemens (44) and Frank Tanana (41)...of course, Colon is also the only active player to have appeared in a game at the Kingdome...Mariners hitting coach Edgar Martinez hit .359 (14x39) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks and a .500 on-base percentage against Colon...Special Assistant to the Chairman Ichiro Suzuki has faced Colon more than any other player (117 AB), batting .299 (35x117) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs and 10 RBI...in 6 at-bats vs. Colon, Mariners broadcaster Mike Blowers had 2 hits and 2 RBI...Mariners assistant coach Jim Brower was teammates with Colon on two occasions: with Cleveland from 1999-2000 and with Montreal in 2002.

STREAKING...Alex Colomé has an active 15.1 scoreless innings streak, dating back to June 30...during this span, he is 1-0 with 10 holds with 18 strikeouts and 5 walks in 15 games...his 15.1 scoreless innings streak is tied for the 5th-longest active streak in the Majors, while ranking 2nd among Mariners pitchers this season.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners are 28-14 (.667) in one-run games this season, leading all teams in wins while ranking 2nd in winning percentage and 2nd in games played (42)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that since Scott Sevais took the helm of the Mariners, they lead the Majors in winning percentage in one-run games?...since 2016, the Mariners are 84-59 (.587) in games decided by one run, leading the Majors in wins, winning percentage and games played (143).

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 398th career start, his 23rd start of the season and his 57th career start vs. Texas tonight.
• Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
• Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
• Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
• In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes... joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
• ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
• At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
• Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
• A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
• Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0.0,0.0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
• Is 32-22 with a 3.33 ERA (174 ER, 470.2 IP) in 70 career GS in August.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 3-7 Mariners loss to Toronto on Aug. 2...allowed 2 runs on 5 hits and 2 walks while striking out 2 batters across 5.0 innings pitched...both runs scored with 1 out in the 2nd inning on a single by Devon Travis.

CLIMBING THE RANKS...has 2,439 career strikeouts, 42nd-most in Major League history...with 2 more strikeouts, Félix will tie Jamie Moyer for 41st most strikeouts in MLB history with 2,441...Félix has struck out 4+ batters in 7 of his last 10 starts and is averaging 7.4 K's per 9.0 innings this year.

HE'S BACK...activated from the 10-day disabled list on July 21...originally placed on the DL on July 10 (retroactive to July 8) with lower back stiffness.

OUT OF THE GATE...in the 1st inning, Félix has posted a 9.00 ERA (22 ER, 22.0 IP), while earning a 4.69 ERA (50 ER, 96.0 IP) in the 2nd inning and later...Félix has allowed 3-or-more runs in the 1st inning in 4 of his 22 starts...has allowed 1 (5 G) or 0 (11 G) runs in the 1st inning of 15 of his 22 starts, including each of his last 4 starts.

IMPRESSIVE START...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (64)...the next closest pitcher is Justin Verlander with 53...during this stretch Félix has recorded 254 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (272).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

HE'S OUR LEADER...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

CAREER...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 168-123 with a 3.30 ERA (962 ER, 2620.1 IP) in 397 career starts with 25 CG, 11 SHO, and 1 Perfect Game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins, starts, quality starts (254), innings pitched and strikeouts (2,439).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP MARCO GONZALES (12-6, 3.46 ERA)

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the 2018 season tomorrow at Texas...won 5 straight starts, 6/29-7/29, allowing just 6 earned runs across 34.1 IP (1.57 ERA) over that span...is one of 7 AL pitchers with at least 12 wins...L#6 in his last start, a 2-7 Mariners loss to the Blue Jays on 8/3 (7.0,7.4,4.0,7,HR-2)...W#8 was the 1st complete game of his career, a 4-1 Mariners win on 6/29 vs. KC (9.0,6.1,1.0,7)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 16 of his last 18 starts (4/24-c), going 11-4 with a 2.87 ERA (37 ER, 116.0 IP) with 99 strikeouts and 22 walks; has 11 quality starts over that span...2017: Went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle. CAREER: Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 17-9 with a 4.20 ERA (98 ER, 210.0 IP) with 182 strikeouts in 44 games (36 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...vs. TEX: Will be making his 3rd career start vs. Texas...is 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA (3 ER, 11.2 IP) in 2 career starts against the Rangers...allowed just 1 run (0 earned) across 6.2 IP vs. Texas on May 28 (W.6.2,4.1,0,4,4).

 • **Boomstick** - From 5/26-6/22, hit 13 home runs in 26 games, including 2 multi-homer games: 6/11 vs. LAA and 6/22 at BOS...has 26 career multi-HR games.
 • **Big Day** - 4x5 (13th career 4H game) w/2 HR (25th career 2 HR G) and 7 RBI (5th career 7+ RBI G) 6/22 at BOS; had pair of 3R HR.
 • **Milestone** - Recorded his 1500th career hit (RBI-single) on 6/16 vs. BOS.
 • **DL Stint** - On the 10-day DL with a sprained right ankle from April 3 (retro to 4/1) to April 14...left game on 3/31 with a sprained right ankle.
 • **Boom** - HR #1 (off Kluber) on 1st pitch he saw in 2018; 2R HR were only runs in 2-1 Opening Night Seattle win...HR #2 3/31 vs. CLE in 2nd game.
